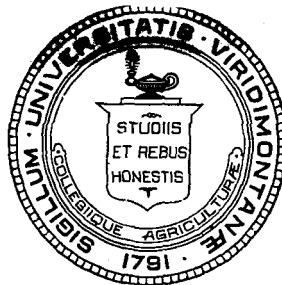
AGRICULTURAL SEED

The agricultural seed sold in Vermont in 1935 was as a whole of excellent quality, comparing well with that sold during most of the years since the seed law first went into effect in 1913. More than 600 samples were tested. Only 3 lots were deficient in respect to purity and 29 in respect to viability.

Clearly good seed may be purchased in Vermont. The discriminating farmer should be sure that the seed he buys is properly labeled and that its purity and germination guaranties are high.
