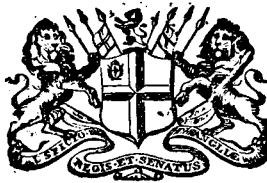

The Right Honorable the Governor in Council having addressed the subjoined Orders to His Excellency the Commander in Chief to be published to the Army, they are accordingly published in Military Orders.

FORT ST. GEORGE, 7th January 1837.

No. 26 of 1837.—The Right Honorable the Governor in Council having approved of a compilation of Orders for the conduct of the Clothing Department of the Army of Fort St. George, hereby establishes the same as a Code of Regulations, for the guidance of all Corps and Departments concerned.

All existing Regulations militating against any part of the Code now established, are hereby abrogated.

Forms.

Great Coats.

1. Great Coats of Cloth of Manufacture are supplied gratuitously to Non-Commissioned Officers and Sergeants of the European Foot and Regiments of European Infantry His Majesty and the Royal Company's Service.

2. These Coats are under no obligation to be replaced under any circumstances nor are they to be supplied to a Regiment or to individuals as a matter of course at the expiration of that period, but as the necessity for such supply is not satisfactorily established by the Report of a Committee of Survey, unless otherwise intended they shall remain the property of the Soldier, and in the case of his death be disposed of in the same manner as other necessaries, and loss occasioned by his death to be made good from his Pay, as whenever any Great Coats are considered unserviceable the Survey Report should state the date or dates of issue, and they be returned into Regimental Stores held at the disposal of the Clothing Officer for the advantage of the State. And the Soldier who is condemned to wear

3. The month and year, when issued from the Clothing Board to be marked on the great coats in such a manner as not to be removed.

4. Quarter Masters of Regiments, to be held responsible for the number issued on Indent, and that in the event of any Casualties the great coats to be returned into the Regiments (where), and carefully preserved for issue to recruits. A Special Report is to be made by the Officer commanding the Regiment to the Secretary to the Clothing Board, in which the number in store is to be stated, and any detriments or inconveniences to the Service.

5. The particular attention of Officers commanding Regiments, is requested, be necessary of passing the tubs and buckets of the great coats issued, and especially in damp climates they are to be immediately dried, and the fur whenever opportunity offers to be frequently brushed, as a protection from moths.

SECTION V.

INSPECTION OF CLOTHING.

1. All Clothing shall be examined previously to its being packed for despatch by a Committee which will be assembled at the Presidency by the Adjutant General, on application from the Contractors or Agent.

2. For the guidance of this Committee there will be laid before them the Patterns established by the Commander in Chief under the authority of Government, authenticated by the seal and signature of the Adjutant General and of the Secretary to the Clothing Board. The Committee will compare the Clothing before them with the Patterns, and have all Jackets fitted on blocks of the sizes specified in the Review Certificates—they will also carefully examine the workmanship—and they will peremptorily reject every article which may be found not to correspond in all respects with the Patterns.

3. It will likewise be the duty of the Committee after having examined and approved the Clothing furnished for any Corps or Department to see the same counted and packed in Bales, accompanied by an Invoice specifying the number and description of articles in each bale, which Invoice is to be signed by the Members of the Committee. The bales are then to be sealed in the presence of the Committee and delivered to the Contractors or Agent for despatch.

4. For all Clothing approved and passed, the Committee shall grant Certificates of Survey in Triplicate—one copy to be transmitted to the Clothing Board for record—and the others to be delivered to the Contractors or

Agent, in order that one may be sent with the Cloth and the remaining one be kept in the Office for reference.

5. The Certificates or reports of Survey are to be made out according to Form No. 6 in the Appendix.

6. All Clothing examined and despatched as above shall upon reaching its destination be opened and inspected by a Regimental Committee. It will be the duty of such Committee to ascertain that the Clothing received no damage on the road and that the quantities are correct. Their report is not to extend to other particulars unless circumstances render it absolutely necessary.

7. The report of the Regimental Committee is to be made out agreeably to Form No. 6 with the substituted the following heading—Report of a Committee of Survey held by order of the Officer Commanding the ——— Regiment on Clothing received from the Contractors for the use of the ——— Regiment for the year 18

The report is to be countersigned by the Officer Commanding the Regiment. *and forwarded to Clothing Board.*

8. The issue of the Clothing, which is on no account to be delayed unless *by order* or permission of the Commander in Chief, is to be reported to the Clothing Board by Commanding Officers who will at the same time forward copy of the Distribution Statement according to Form No. 7.

9. Officers in charge of Lascars are to forward their acquittance Rolls to the Quarter Master General through the Staff of his Department attached to the Divisional Force, or direct to the Secretary to the Military or Medical Board as the case may be, for transmission to the Clothing Board.

SECTION VI.**EUROPEAN RECRUITS.**

1. Each European Recruit on landing from Europe is entitled to an allowance of Rupees 14 5 4 for the purpose of providing him with clothing for present use.

2. This allowance is to be drawn for Artillery Recruits by the Officer Commanding the Artillery at the Mount, and for Infantry Recruits by the Officer appointed to take charge of them.

3. The bills are to be accompanied by nominal Rolls of the men, and both are to be countersigned by the Adjutant General, copies being transmitted for record to the Corps to which the men may be drafted.

4. The entry of the above allowance and of its disbursement is to be regularly made in the mens' account books, which Reviewing Officers will ascertain to have been correctly done by personal inspection.

5. Each European Recruit shall be supplied on joining his Corps with a Regimental Jacket and Cap. He will not be entitled to any further issue of clothing until the 31st December of the succeeding year.

6. The clothing above directed to be given to Recruits will be furnished by the contractors on Indents accompanied by nominal rolls prepared by the Officer Commanding the Corps and forwarded to the Secretary to the Clothing Board.

7. The expense of this clothing supplied to the Recruits to be charged in a separate bill to be defrayed by the Government, the account of Recruits with the Off-Reckoning Fund beginning only from the following year, from which period their stoppages are carried to the credit of that Fund.

8. Men to whom clothing has been issued in advance as above, are not to be included in the indents until the 31st December of the succeeding year.

9. They are not entitled to half mounting for the year in which they receive the above clothing and kit money.

SECTION VII.

DISCHARGED MEN OR CASUALTIES.

1. No Soldier whether European or Native, except as provided for in the next Section, shall be transferred, discharged, or become a casualty in any manner whatever without having his clothing claims adjusted previous to his quitting his Corps.

2. It is therefore ordered that when clothing for the year due may not be available from the Regimental Stores, and it is in consequence necessary to draw compensation, abstracts be forwarded to the Clothing Board as soon as the casualty occurs, and that on all occasions of discharging men, abstracts for compensation, in default of Clothing in Store as already explained, shall be forwarded by the same tappal by which the Discharge Certificates are transmitted to Head Quarters, and the Adjutant General will apprise the Clothing Board of the Commander in Chiefs sanction to the discharge, when the abstracts will be forthwith passed and returned.

3. Abstracts for compensation, whether for casualties or otherwise, are invariably to be drawn by the Officers concerned immediately on their being returned by the Secretary passed for payment.

4. Removals in the Artillery from one Battalion to another are not to be considered as casualties within the meaning of the preceding regulation.

5. Compensation is not to be drawn in any case when there may be Clothing in Store, either Jackets or Trowsers, to satisfy the claim.

SECTION VIII.

TIME EXPIRED MEN, &c. PROCEEDING TO EUROPE.

1. European Invalids, and Time-expired and Discharged Men proceeding to England, will be supplied by the Contractors with the following articles at the expense of Government, on Indent from the Town Major passed by the Clothing Board.

- 1 Pair Woollen Cloth Trousers.
- 2 Long Flannel Waistcoats.
- 2 Pairs Socks or Stockings.
- 2 Pairs Strong Shoes.
- 1 Straw Hat Covered with Linen.

2. Time-expired and Discharged Men, and men pensioned, cease to have any claim for clothing or Half Mounting, from the date of their being returned as "Time-expired" or of their being passed for discharge or pension.

3. Whenever individuals of the above description are placed under the orders of the Town Major for the purpose of being embarked for Europe, compensation in lieu of any clothing which may be due to them is to be drawn by that Officer, the Officers Commanding the Corps to which the men belong, being required to furnish the Town Major with the necessary certificates.

Any surplus clothing which may in consequence accumulate in Regimental Stores is to be deducted from the next annual Indent, without reference to its description whether Jackets or Trousers.

SECTION IX.

SURPLUS CLOTHING.

1. Whenever the Commander in Chief may direct that Surplus Clothing remaining in Regimental Store shall be issued either to individuals who may have been recently promoted or to Recruits, it will be issuable under the following regulations.

2. Officers Commanding Corps, &c. who may receive the authority of the Commander in Chief to that effect, shall recover from the individuals for whom Surplus Clothing may be required, the value of the Jackets or Trousers according to the established rates of compensation, by such instalments as may be sanctioned by Head Quarters, which sum is to be remitted by a transfer receipt in favor of the Secretary to the Clothing Board.

3. Indents for the Surplus Clothing, authorised as above, are at the same time to be forwarded to the Secretary to the Clothing Board, by whose order they will be passed and returned to the Officer Commanding the Corps or Detachment for the purpose of being complied with.

SECTION X.

INDENTS.

1. Indents for the regular clothing of the Army are to be made out agreeably to the actual strength on the 31st December, and are to be prepared according to Form No. 1. in the Appendix. They are to be forwarded to the Secretary to the Clothing Board ^{so as to reach} ~~as soon after the 1st~~ ^{five or before the 15 January} ~~January in each year as practicable.~~

2. The Secretary after registering the Indents will transmit them to the Departments with the returns of which they are respectively connected, where having been compared and if necessary corrected, they will be certified as under, and then returned to the Secretary.

3. Indents for Boots, Pantaloons, Helmets, Girdles or Sashes, Watering Caps, &c. are to be made out according to Forms 2, 3, 4 and 5, in the Appendix.

4. Indents are not required for Tent, Store, or Medical Store Lascars—clothing for whom will be issued by order of the Secretary upon the distribution statements furnished to him by the Quarter Master General and

Secretaries to the Military and Medical Boards respectively.

5. All abstracts for half mounting money to Europeans and compensation in lieu of clothing, and all Bills or abstracts for claims against the Off-reckoning Fund, are to be transmitted in the first instance to the Secretary to the Clothing Board, by the Officers under whose authority the respective vouchers are prepared, accompanied by separate rolls.

6. Abstracts for half mounting money, compensation in lieu of clothing and all other claims against the Off-reckoning Fund are to be made out in the usual manner and form; separate Bills or abstracts for each year being invariably required in cases of claims for more years than one being prepared. These when passed for payment by the Secretary to the Clothing Board are to be charged by Paymasters and entered in their accounts under the head of "Off-reckoning Fund" for the years to which the charges may have reference.

7. The established allowance for half mounting to European Troops will be payable on the 1st May of each year.—Abstracts according to the strength of Corps on that date will accordingly be despatched to the Clothing Board, in order that they may be passed for payment. Claims to this allowance on account of men promoted with back rank are to follow the same rule as laid down for clothing in para. 11 page 8.

8. It occasionally happens that arrears due to individuals on account of compensation and half mounting

remain undrawn when the accounts of the periods to which they have reference are completed. It is directed that the amount of such arrears shall be drawn previously to the closing of the accounts on abstract from the Paymaster at the Presidency by the Secretary to the Clothing Board, and deposited in the General Treasury, subject to be redrawn therefrom, under the orders of the Clothing Board, should the claims be subsequently admitted.

9. In order to ensure the adjustment of the clothing claims of Medical Subordinates, Non-commissioned Staff, and others not attached to Corps—Staff, and Medical or other Officers under whose orders they may be serving will be held responsible for the transmission of Indents at the prescribed periods, if attached to a Corps or Detachment, but not borne upon its Returns, the clothing is to be indented for, by the Officer Commanding the Corps or Detachment, in a separate indent.

10. Rolls are to be furnished to the Clothing Board on the 1st January annually by Officers Commanding Corps and Heads of Departments, of all men for whom Half mountings may have been received for the previous year and who have become Casualties on or before the 30th December.

11. Indent of Corps are to be accompanied by Distribution Rolls exhibiting the stations and strength of all fixed Detachments, in order to allow of the Clothing being despatched by the Contractors direct to the Detachments, and in all cases of alterations taking place in the Stations and the of fixed Detachments prior to the issue of the Clothing at Regimental Head Quarters, Distribution Rolls are to be forwarded to the Clothing Board, in order that Clothing may be despatched by the Contractors direct to the Detachments.

12. In forwarding the Annual Incident for Clothing, Officers, Commissioned Corps and Departments are to transmit at the same time an amended Report of the Sizes of the Men, exhibiting the number of Men of each size present with the Head Quarters and fixed Detachments respectively.

13. Any Casualties that may have occurred among the individuals for who Measurement Rolls may have been forwarded, are then to be notified, and additional Measurement Rolls for individuals of extraordinary size or make, undertaken, subseguently to the preparation of the Rolls despatched in April, are to be transmitted with the Annual Incident, in order that, so far as circumstances permit, Clothing of proper dimensions may be supplied.

14. It must also be notified to the Clothing Board in forwarding the Annual Incident, when the individuals for who the Measurement Rolls refer, are serving - whether at Head Quarters at certain fixed Detachments, incl^d those periodically relieved.

15. The ~~number~~ number of individuals of the ~~number~~ number required of each of the several sizes is to be discontinued.

16. Clothing will continue to be made up in this as laid down in para 11. Section II, but instead of being issued in the proportions therein presented

prescribed, will be supplied to the actual numbers of each size in Regiments.

17. In forwarding to the Adjutant General for the sanction of Government, Orders for Carriage for the conveyance of Clothing to Detachments, Commanding Officers are required to state that Form 11 of this Regulation has been attended to.

18. Cases will sometimes occur wherein the amended (Distribution) Roll could not have reached the Clothing Roads in sufficient time for admission, the Clothing being sent direct to the Detachments, and in such cases only will the Government sanction its transport at the public expense.

19. Officers neglecting to give the necessary information to the Clothing Roads will be held personally responsible for any charges that may be incurred to their account.

20. Orders for Great coats for Camp for Non-Commissioned Officers and Rank and File of the European Artillery and Regiments of European Infantry in the Majesty's and the Honourable Company's Service are to be prepared according to Form 11

SECTION XI.

CLAIMS.

1. All claims upon the clothing department whether for clothing, half mounting, or compensation, shall be sent into the Clothing Board within the space of one year after such claims become due, and all claims which may not be so preferred shall be *peremptorily* rejected from the Off-reckoning accounts.

2. The entire responsibility for the due observance of this Regulation rests with Commanding Officers of Corps and other Regimental Officers, heads of Departments, or Officers of the Staff, who may hold separate and independent Command, or charge of any number or description of Troops, Lascars or other Public followers, entitled by Regulation to half mounting or clothing—and it is to be understood that any individual Soldier, Lascar, or other follower entitled to half mounting or clothing, but whose claim may not be forwarded to the Clothing Board within the prescribed period, shall be re-imbursed, and the amount be charged against the Officer who held the command or charge of such individual, and whose duty it therefore was to have brought forward the claim within the proper time.

SECTION XII.

RETAIL STORES.

1. Officers requiring supplies of cloth for private use are to forward their indents prepared agreeably to form No. 10 to the Secretary to the Clothing Board—who having filled up the amount of the articles, or of such of them as can be supplied, will return them to the parties, who will then re-transmit them to the Secretary with the money, if at the Presidency, or if at out-stations, with transfer receipts for the amount.—No indents will be complied with until payment has been made as above.

2. All supplies of cloth issued upon private indents will be charged with Commission at the rate of 6 per cent together with the expenses of package and carriage.

3. Officers Commanding are allowed to indent for supplies of cloth for the use of the Troops, agreeably to the following scale.

HORSE ARTILLERY AND CAVALRY.

Blue or Grey Woollen Cloth for Cloaks to the extent of one Cloak per man once in six years.

ALL EUROPEANS.

Regulation broad cloth for one pair of Trousers and six yards of Flannel annually.

European Pensioners—on indent from the Officer Commanding the Depôt or Staff Officer of Stations.

1½ yards Ordinary Blue.

1½ yards Ordinary Grey.

ALL NATIVE CORPS.

4. Broad Cloth for Turbands, Trousers, and Cloaks, as required.

5. These supplies will be charged at the invoice price of the year, with the addition of packing expenses and carriage—and the indents, prepared agreeably to Form No. 11, are to be forwarded to the Secretary through the Adjutant General, by whom they are to be passed.

6. The Secretary on receipt of the indents duly passed, will immediately comply therewith, and forward a bill for the amount to the Officer indenting, who is required to adjust the demand, without delay, by a transfer receipt.

7. Cloth required for private use, as in Para. 1, is never to be included in indents prepared under the preceding rules according to Form No. 11.

SECTION XIII.
