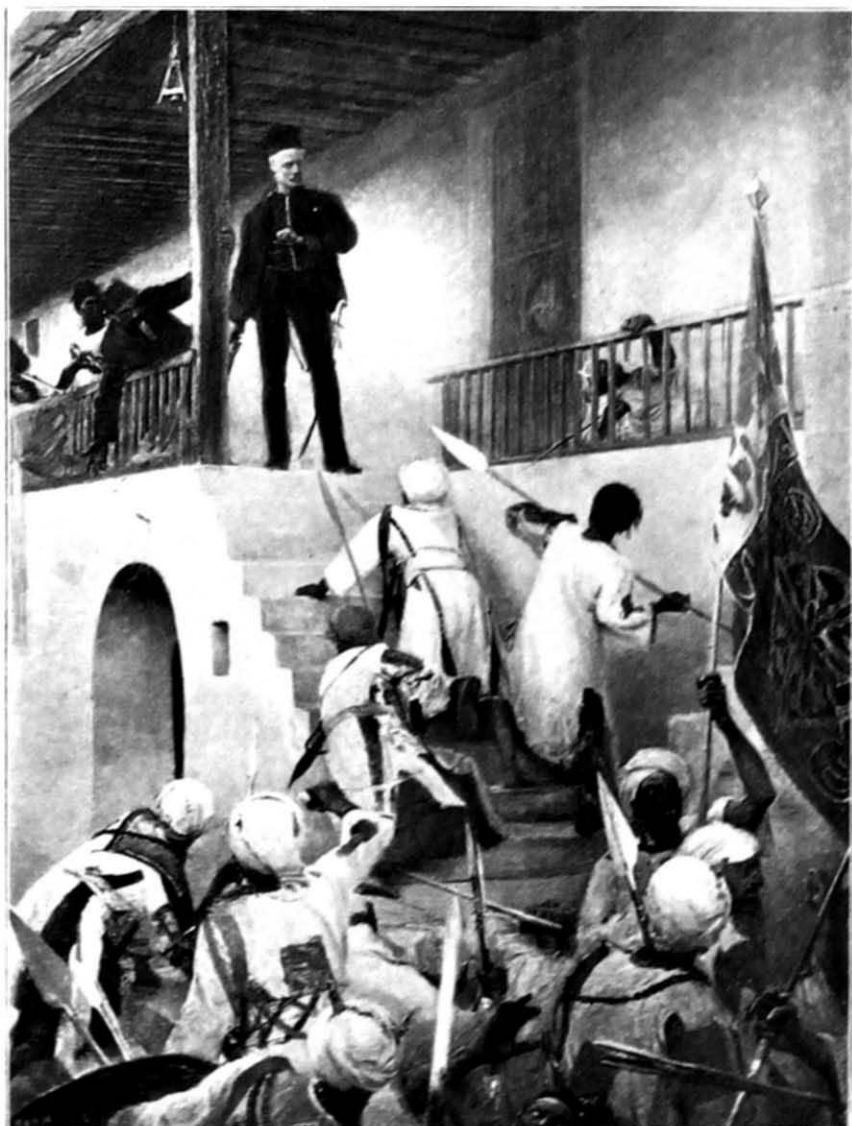

## PREFACE

ALL that has been attempted in this book has been to put before the public, in a readable and concise form, the events in the Egyptian Soudan which have led up to, and resulted in, the downfall of the Dervishes.

Every one knows that Gordon was killed at Khartoum and that Kitchener has avenged his fate, but comparatively few understand—for instance—why Gordon was ever in the Soudan at all, or why the British have reconquered that country. As for *Pasha, Bey, Sirdar, Bimbashi*—people seem to shy at the very sight of these words, and to almost wonder how an Englishman can belong to the Egyptian Army and yet retain his nationality! The sequence of events on the Nile, has extended over so long a period, in such an apparently disjointed fashion, that it is perhaps only natural there should be some vagueness on the subject.

This book is not put forward in any way as a

---

professional study of the Campaigns herein dealt with. Whilst endeavouring to be as complete and accurate as possible in every point that can interest the general reader, all those minor technical details which belong to a military treatise, or an official Blue-book, rather than to a popular history, have been purposely omitted.

Part II. is merely a plain unvarnished tale of our experiences during the Dongola Expedition, and we would not have ventured to intrude them on the public, were it not for the fact that we were urged to do so by friends, on the ground that an insight into the actual details of active service on the Nile would be of interest to the general reader.

With regard to the Appendices, the lists of officers who have served in the recent Expeditions forms a record which will doubtless be appreciated by those who took part in them, whilst the roll of British officers and men who lost their lives cannot fail to have a certain melancholy interest attached to it.

Our thanks are due to the following gentlemen. To Messrs. Bassano (for portraits of the Sirdar and Major-General Hunter), Russell and Sons (Major-General Rundle), Lekegian—Cairo—(the Dervish Emir and the officers of the 21st Lancers): to the proprietors of the *Graphic* and *Black and White*, for
