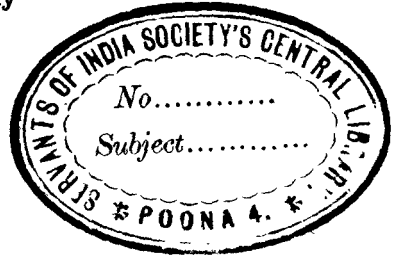

P R E F A C E .

THE first edition of the Mysore Revenue Manual was issued in the year 1874. Subsequent editions followed in 1886, 1901 and 1911. Though the last of these editions aimed at bringing together all orders of general importance on every topic, connected with revenue administration and law in force at the time, the arrangement of the matter was not on quite a logical basis. The Government Orders were mostly reproduced *in extenso* in it, with the result that material instructions intended for guidance were lost in a mass of unimportant matter.

Further, though two supplements were subsequently issued—the first in June 1913 and the second in May 1915, a large number of Government Orders subsequently issued have had to be codified, and a revised edition of the Manual has been in demand for some time past.

Advantage has been taken of this demand to bring out a new manual avoiding the imperfections of the last edition, instead of merely re-printing it, incorporating subsequent Government Orders. The division of the Manual into chapters has been revised. The first 15 chapters of the Manual follow the numbering of chapters in the Land Revenue Code and comprise Government Orders and Rulings bearing on the respective sections of the Code. Chapters on other matters concerning Revenue administration and the work of Revenue Officers follow next, namely, Inams, Cesses and Taxes, Revenue Accounts, Returns and Statistics, Irrigation, Loans, Land Acquisition, Rural Development and the various other miscellaneous matters for which a revenue officer is held responsible.

A glossary of terms in use in revenue correspondence is also appended and the index has been made more exhaustive.

An attempt has been made throughout the book to codify and summarise the instructions contained in Government Orders, leaving out, as far as possible, discursive portions. It has thereby been found possible to reduce very materially the size of the Volume, in spite of its wider scope, as compared with the previous editions.

Appendices and forms referred to in this Volume are printed in Volume II, and all miscellaneous Regulations and Rules required for reference by a Revenue Officer have been, for the first time, collected together and published in a handy form in Volume III.

A comparative table showing in parallel columns the respective chapters of the previous editions of the Revenue Manual and the corresponding chapters of the present edition is attached.

Suggestions for the improvement of this Manual and intimation of errors and omissions will be thankfully received by the undersigned.
