## PREFACE.

---

THIS book has been written mainly from the standpoint of a practising lawyer. Its chief object is to place before the legal profession an edition of the Oudh Estates Act (Act I of 1869) showing at a glance the amendments made therein by Act X of 1885 and U.P. Act III of 1910, and explaining the reasons for and effect of the changes introduced by the Amending Acts. The amendments made in the text have, therefore, been printed in italics and are followed by notes in which the original Act and the case law have been fully discussed. For facility of reference I have also reproduced *in extenso* the Amending Acts of 1885 and 1910, and as the latter Act introduces many important amendments in Act I of 1869, I have, in my notes to the Act of 1910, quoted at some length from the proceedings of the Legislative Council showing the changes made in its draft stages before it passed into law. The alterations made by the Select Committee in the Bill as originally introduced into the Legislative Council are indicated by the use of the italics and the history of the Act as passed is told in the words of the Legislature itself.

While the book was in course of preparation it was suggested by some of my friends that I

might with advantage reproduce in it, with short notes, parts of the Indian Succession Act applicable to the Oudh Taluqdars, the Oudh Settled Estates Act, the Crown Grants Act, and the Oudh Sub-Settlement Act, and I have complied with their wishes.

I had not proceeded far in my work when I found that I was compelled to make frequent references to the late Mr. Sykes's valuable "Compendium of the Law specially relating to the Taluqdars of Oudh" and in particular to his elaborate and learned Introduction which is a work of abiding interest to every lawyer in Oudh. The Compendium, however, is now out of print. It seemed to me that short references to Mr. Sykes's Introduction would be of little use to my readers, mostly lawyers—and we all know a lawyer's fondness for the original authority—as it would be impossible for them to obtain copies of the work. I therefore applied to the representatives of the late Mr. Sykes (his daughters) for permission to incorporate his Introduction in my book, and for the permission readily granted by them my best thanks are due. In view of later legislative enactments and judicial decisions, I have made some slight amendments in the Introduction which are printed within rectangular brackets. I have also given in the margin the corresponding pages of the Introduction as originally published.



I have spared no pains to make the book as complete and practical as I could, and for any mistakes or omissions that I may have made I must rely on the indulgence of my professional brethren. It now only remains for me to acknowledge the valuable assistance rendered to me in the preparation of the book by Babu Rudra Narain, B.A., B.Sc., Babu Madho Prasad, B.A., Babu Sidh Prasad, B.A., Babu Uman Prasad and my other friends of the local Bar and to all of them I offer my most hearty thanks. I also avail myself of this opportunity to express my sense of obligation to Mr. H. J. Bell, I.C.S., the District Judge of Sitapur, for the interest he has taken in the work.

## APPENDIX A(a).

*Lord Canning's Proclamation of the 15th March 1858.*

### PROCLAMATION.

The Army of His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief is in possession of Lucknow, and the city lies at the mercy of the British Government, whose authority it has for nine months rebelliously defied and resisted.

This resistance, began by a mutinous soldiery, has found support from the inhabitants of the city and of the Province of Oude at large. Many who owed their prosperity to the British Government, as well as those who believed themselves aggrieved by it have joined in this bad cause and have ranged themselves with the enemies of the State.

They have been guilty of a great crime and have subjected themselves to a just retribution.

The capital of their country is now once more in the hands of the British Troops.

From this day it will be held by force which nothing can withstand and the authority of the Government will be carried into every corner of the Province.

The time then has come at which the Right Hon'ble the Governor-General of India deems it right to make known the mode in which the British Government will deal with the Talookdars, Chiefs, Landholders of Oude, and their followers.

The first care of the Governor-General will be to reward those who have been steadfast in their allegiance at a time when the authority of the Government was partially overborne, and who have proved this by the support and assistance which they have given to British Officers.

Therefore the Right Hon'ble the Governor-General hereby declares, that Drigbyjeye Singh, Rajah of Bulrampore, Koolwunt Singh, Rajah of Padbaha, Rao Hurdeo Buksh Singh of Kutiaree, Kashee Pershad, Talookdar of Sissaindee, Zuber Singh, Zemindar of Gopal Khair, and Chundee Lall Zemindar of Moraon (Baiswarah) are henceforward the sole, hereditary proprietors of the land, which they held when Oude came under British Rule, subject only to such moderate assessment as may be imposed upon them; and that these loyal men will be further rewarded in such manner and to such extent as, upon consideration of their merits and their position, the Governor-General shall determine.

A proportionate measure of reward and honour, according to their deserts, will be conferred upon others in whose favor like claims may be established to the satisfaction of the Government.

The Governor-General further proclaims to the people of Oude that, with the above-mentioned exceptions, the proprietary right in the soil of the Province is confiscated to the British Government, which will dispose of that right in such manner as to it may seem fitting.

To those Talookdars, Chiefs, Landholders, with their followers who shall make immediate submission to the Chief Commissioner of Oude, surrendering their arms and obeying his orders, the Right Hon'ble the Governor-General promises that their lives and honor shall be safe, provided that their hands are not stained with English blood murderously shed.

But as regards any further indulgence which may be attended to them, and the condition in which they may hereafter be placed, they must throw themselves upon the justice and mercy of the British Government.

To those amongst them who shall promptly come forward and give to the Chief Commissioner their support in the restoration of peace and order, this indulgence will be large and the Governor-General will be ready to view liberally the claim which they may thus acquire to a restitution of their former rights.

As participation in the murder of Englishmen or Englishwomen will exclude those who are guilty of it from all mercy, so will those who have protected English lives be specially entitled to consideration and leniency.

The Major-General Chief Commissioner of Oudh in sending you this Proclamation wishes to inform you that if you at once come in ready to obey his orders, provided you have taken no part in the atrocities committed on helpless Europeans, none of your lands will be confiscated, and your claims to lands held by you prior to annexation will be heard.

## APPENDIX C.

*Translation of a circular addressed to the Taluqdars of Oudh, dated 7 June 1858.*

All the Taluqdars of Oudh are hereby informed that provided they present themselves at Lucknow and tender their allegiance, all their offences will be forgiven. Many Taluqdars have presented themselves and have been pardoned and their estates have been re-settled with them for three years; but some are still at large in rebellion, and have not yet tendered their allegiance.

The Chief Commissioner has been given to understand that some persons, from ignorance and evil tendency, are trying to mislead Taluqdars and others with evil reports and false representations to the effect that the Government should not be trusted as all the persons returning to the city will be made Christians, and those who will not present themselves will be hanged. These groundless rumours are spread by those only who, from complicity in the murder of Europeans, are beyond the pale of mercy and pardon; and because they are well aware of this, they wish to mislead you also into the belief that the Government is equally severe upon you, and by keeping you back will deter you from taking advantage of the period of amnesty, for which, as a matter of course, you will be charged with protracted rebellion.

The object with which this letter is written to you is to assure you that the Government will preserve to you your life and property and confirm you in the estates possessed by you during the nawabee. "A Rahdaree Perwanah" (safe

conduct pass) is hereby enclosed to pass you without any hindrance to the city; and on your presenting yourself, the conditions of the puttahs and kupooliyat will be made known to you, which if not acceptable, you will be at liberty to return unmolested.

The term allowed in the pass is 30 days, within which period they should attend, if not, the Government forces will proceed against the estates of recusants and destroy them as they have done the city of Lucknow, and such recusants will meet with the punishment which their protracted rebellion will entail upon them.

This is the last invitation to be issued, and if you do not take advantage of its liberal provisions, the result will be unfavourable to you; but the Chief Commissioner confidently trusts you will see the advantage to be gained by rendering your allegiance and the consequent benefit resulting to yourself therefrom.

## FORM OF GRANTEES' SANAD.

"Translation of a Zamindari Sanad in the name of Kashee Purshaud, son of Gunesh Purshaud, granted by His Excellency the Governor-General and signed by the Secretary to the Government of India.

As during the days of mutiny good services of Kashee Purshaud, and his loyalty to the British Government have been proved, His Excellency the Viceroy and Governor-General of India with great kindness and mercy has bestowed on him and on his heirs, the proprietary rights of the Elaqua of Doolhah, consisting of fourteen villages in the parganah of Futtehpur, district Oonao, and that of Lalgunj, &c., consisting of three villages in the parganah of Daundia Khera, on conditions that he and his heirs shall pay the revenue, which from time to time shall be fixed by the Government on the said Elaqua, and shall always continue firm and constant in obedience, good service and loyalty to Government.

## APPENDIX E.

*Chief Commissioner's Circular No.  $\frac{148}{2421}$ , dated  
11th October 1859(a).*

I am directed to call on you to furnish a list for your Division, in the subjoined form, of the Talookas in which the law of primogeniture prevails in opposition to the Hindoo Law of succession, such as are known as having a guddee, and resemble the magnates of Continental Europe.

2. The Chief Commissioner considers this custom highly to be esteemed and most conducive to the maintenance of the Talokdaree settlement. He therefore desires that all influence of the authorities may be directed to uphold it, should, as is sometimes the case, efforts be made by the younger branches to subvert it. Sufficient provision is made for them in a few villages of the Talooka held as Nankar.

3. Any departure from it where it has prevailed, and the consequent division of the Talooka, has always been accomplished by violence. Thus Bbinga was separated from Gonda, and Esanuggur from Dourera; such means cannot be employed now, but we must be careful that this end is not attained under cover of our laws.

4. Should then any younger son or collateral (heir) sue for possession of his share, his claim should be summarily rejected wherever the rule of succession above described prevails.

5. In other Talookas where the custom does not prevail, it is still desirable to prevent sub-division as far as

possible; and when the present settlement has been made with one person as the representative, the Authorities should be cautious of allowing others to be recorded as sharers of fractional interests, and participating in the profits without his consent. But when they are so recorded, separation of their shares should not be granted, not by imperfect partition even, except by mutual consent. If properties are split up the vital principle of a Talookdaree settlement which is to have great landholders instead of a peasant proprietary will be destroyed; the Talookdars will become petty Zemindars.

## APPENDIX F.

*Chief Commissioner's Circular No.  $\frac{1}{1217}$ , dated 18th January 1860(a).*

With reference to Circular No.  $\frac{100}{2715}$  of 1st December, and No.  $\frac{143}{2281}$  of 11th October, I am directed by the Chief Commissioner to observe that it is quite certain that, if the Hindu Law of succession, by which sons share equally, is allowed to prevail in the Talookdaree families where there is no Guddee, the property will ultimately be split up, and we shall have a numerous beggared proprietary instead of a few great landlords, and the distinctive features of a Talookdaree settlement and its great advantages will be quite lost.

2. Where Talookas have become putteedaree, that is, where they have become divided, it is impossible to reunite them now, but the Chief Commissioner is anxious to preserve Talookas now intact from that fate. It is far more likely to befall them under our rule unless some preventive measures are adopted than under the former Government, because then the most energetic of the heirs often took and kept possession of the estate, and a sense of common danger from the Government Officers made the other claimants acquiesce in his ascendancy. Under our Government, the tendency will be for each to try and set up for himself, and moreover their numbers will increase greatly.

3. The Chief Commissioner thinks the object we have in view may be attained if the present Talookdar, who hold the property by gift of the British Government (for, all estates are held by no other title in Oude), were to file a

written declaration, expressing his desire that his estate should not be sub-divided at his death, or in any future generation; the observance in all ages of this desire being inserted in the sunnuds as one of the conditions of the grant.

4. The Chief Commissioner requests that you will explain to all the Talookdars entitled to receive sunnuds the advantages of the proposed measure, how it will preserve the name and importance of their families to all time, which must otherwise soon be obliterated; and invite them to submit applications of the nature above detailed. To ensure uniformity of practice, the Chief Commissioner submits a form for conveying this desire on the part of the Talookdars and a translation of it.

5. Pending the result of these instructions the Chief Commissioner will suspend giving sunnuds to those Talookdars who were not summoned to Durbar, and a list for (sic) whom he has called for.

6. From those Talookdars who have received sunnuds and in whose families the law of primogeniture does not prevail, a similar expression of their wish should be invited and the condition can be inserted as a supplementary clause in their sunnuds.

7. The Chief Commissioner calls early attention of officers to this important matter.

It is my desire and will that, on my death, my Illaqua descend entirely by the rule that governs succession to landed property where there is a *gudde* in the family, the younger being supported by the head of the house.

## APPENDIX J.

### Rules framed by the Local Government. (a)

#### REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

*The 3rd January 1901.*

No. 1-<sup>25</sup>/<sub>256</sub> B.—In exercise of the powers conferred by section 20 of the Oudh Settled Estates Act (II of 1900), the Lieutenant-Governor and Chief Commissioner is pleased to make the following rules for the purpose of carrying out the said Act:—

#### RULES.

1. Every application under section 3 of the Act shall be signed by the applicant, and shall be presented by him in person, or by a duly authorized agent, or sent by post registered to the Secretary to the Local Government, in the Revenue Department.

Before submission of the application to the Government, the applicant's signature shall be verified by a Magistrate of the 1st class exercising jurisdiction in the district in which the applicant resides, and the fact and date of such verification shall be endorsed on the application, and the Magistrate shall attach his signature thereto.

2. Every such application shall be in Form I annexed to these rules, and shall be accompanied by statements in Forms II and III annexed to these rules and by such documents or certified copies of documents as will show in what



manner the immovable property in respect of which the applicant seeks for permission became "estate" within the meaning of the Oudh Estates Act, 1869, and shall also be accompanied by such verified extracts from the registers prepared and maintained by the Collector under Chapter IV of the Oudh Revenue Act (XVII of 1876 as may be sufficient to establish the nature and extent of the rights of the applicant in the estate to which his application refers.

3. (1) If the Government rejects the application under section 4 of the Act, the applicant shall be so informed.

(2) If the application is not so rejected, the notice required by section 5 of the Act to be published in the Gazette shall be so published in Form IV annexed to these rules: and the inquiry referred to in section 6 of the Act shall be made through the Collector of any of the districts in which the property to which the application relates is situated.

4. (1) The Collector shall, when such a course is practicable, serve a copy of the notice referred to in rule 3 (2) upon all persons known or appearing, from the application or other information received, to be interested in opposing the application; and

(2) shall make such inquiry as may be necessary to ascertain the accuracy and completeness of the entries made in Forms II and III attached to the application; and

(3) shall, as soon as may be after the time limited by section 5 of the Act, submit to Government through the Commissioner and Board of Revenue a report on the application and on any claims made or cause shown under that section and on all proceedings taken by him under this rule.

5. Every application under section 7 (1) of the Act shall be in Form V annexed to these rules, and Rules 1, 3,

and 4 shall apply, to it in the same way and to the same extent as if it were an application under section 3 of the Act. The application shall be accompanied by such verified extracts from the registers prepared and maintained by the Collector under Chapter IV of the Oudh Revenue Act (XVII of 1876), and such other documents as may be sufficient to establish the nature and extent of the rights of the applicant in the immovable property to which the application refers.

6. Every application under section 8 of the Act shall be in Form VI annexed to these rules, and shall be signed, presented, or sent, and verified as required by rule 1.

7. The permission under sections 6, 7, and 8 of the Act shall be granted in the forms appended to these rules, as Forms VII-A, VII-B and VII-C.

8. The declaration to be made under section 10 of the Act that property shall be held subject to the provisions of the Act shall be in Form VIII appended to these rules, or to the like effect. The declaration under the same section that property shall be held exempt from the provisions of the Act shall be in Form IX, or to the like effect.

9. Upon the receipt from the registering officer of the copy of the declaration under section 10, the Collector shall make a note of such declaration in the register prescribed in Form X appended to these rules, and in the registers maintained under clauses (b) and (c) of section 56 of Act XVII of 1876 (The Oudh Land Revenue Act), namely, the *khewat* of each *mauza* concerned and the *malguzari* register of the *pargana*. He shall also, in accordance with section 13 (2) of the Act, cause a copy of such declaration to be published in the Gazette in English and in the Vernacular.

10. There shall be payable in respect of every notice served under section 5 of the Act, and of every notice or

summons which it may be necessary to serve or issued for the purposes of the Act and of these rules, and for every commission which it may be necessary to issue for the purpose of verifying any application, or to make any inquiry or to take evidence under the Act or under these rules, the fees specified in the "Schedule of fees" attached to these rules, and such fees shall be payable by the applicant under sections 3, 7 or 8 of the Act (as the case may be). Such fees shall be levied by means of Court-fee stamps, and such stamps shall be attached to the duplicate copy of the notice or summons or to the order for the issue of the commission on account of which the fee is paid.

If the Government considers it desirable to take legal advice in respect of any application or any proceeding in connection with any application under the Act, the applicant shall deposit the fees payable for such advice. The amount of such fees shall in each case be fixed by Government, but shall in no case exceed Rs. 500.

11. There shall be payable for every entry made by the Collector in the register to be maintained under section 13 a fee of the same amount as if the entry were one relating to an alteration in the lists and registers prepared and maintained by him under Chapter IV of the Oudh Revenue Act, 1876, and such alteration had become necessary by reason of succession or inheritance. Provided that no fee levied under this rule shall exceed Rs. 100. Every fee payable under this rule shall be recovered and credited in the same way as if it were a fee prescribed under section 60 of the Oudh Revenue Act, 1876.

12. Where any expenses, other than the fees payable in respect of notices and summonses under Rule 10 are incurred in or in connection with proceedings held under this Act, the Collector is empowered to recover such expenses

from the applicant under the Act, or from such other person as the Collector may consider liable for their payment in the same way as if they were arrears of land revenue. An appeal shall lie to the Commissioner from the order of a Collector under this section, and the order of the Commissioner upon such appeal shall be final.

13. All applications under the Act, or under these rules, and all forms which by these rules are required to be attached to such applications shall be in the English language, or, if they are prepared in the vernacular, they shall be accompanied by a correct English translation.

14. Any notice, summons or order, issued under the Act, may be served either—

- (a) by delivering it to the person to whom it is addressed, or to any agent of such person authorized to accept service of a summons issued by a Court of Revenue or to any adult member of such person who is residing with him, or
- (b) by leaving it at or affixing it to the outer door of the usual or last known place of abode of such person, or
- (c) by forwarding it by post registered addressed to such person at his usual or last known place of abode.
