#### **PREFACE**

In Volume II of the series of studies on Wages, Cost of Living and National Income in Sweden 1860—1930 are published the results of the investigations on Wages in Sweden 1860—1930, carried on at the Institute for Social Sciences in the University of Stockholm. The volume is published in two parts of which Part One is contained in the present publication.

As is true of all the studies of this series, Wages in Sweden 1860—1930 is a joint product of the Staff of the Institute, and it is not possible to ascribe to each member of the Staff a definite part in the results. Among the authors of Volume II, I am responsible for the planning and management of the investigations as well as for the final shape and content of the publications, Mr Lundberg and Mr Svennilson for the preparation of text and tables.

As regards Part One of the study, published in the present volume, Professor Erik Lindahl and Dr Bertil Nyström. the head of the Social Board's department of wage statistics, have taken an active part in the planning of the investigations. Professor Lindahl was for some time in charge of the collection and compilation of the primary material. Mr Nils Lagerström has assisted in preparing Chapter IV and the monographs on wages and labour conditions in the iron, steel and mining industries; Mr Sven Bouvin has composed the summary of the official wage statistics regarding manufacturing and mining for the years 1913-1930 and the combination of these statistics with the wage series of the Institute in Chapter XIII. The exacting task of checking figures and seeing the book through the press was accomplished by Miss Mai Ahlberg. Professor Dorothy Thomas has kindly read the whole book in proof.

The study could not have been undertaken without

the cooperation of many persons in the different concerns and institutions which have opened their records to us. They have answered innumerable questions, given advice at all stages of the investigation and, as experts, checked different parts of the final text. Their number is, in fact, so large that an enumeration is impossible, and only a general acknowledgement of the value of their contributions and the indebtedness of the Staff of the Institute can here be expressed.

As already mentioned in Volume I, all the studies on Wages, Cost of Living and National Income at the Institute have been financed by the Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial.

Lastly, it may be mentioned here (although it is more fully explained in the Introduction) that this volume consists mainly of material compiled with a view to constituting a beginning and a basis for further detailed and analytical studies of the movement of wages in Sweden during the period under consideration. Even from this point of view, however, certain important complements to a statistical study of wages, such as e.g. measures of changes in the volume of unemployment and in the efficiency of labour, are lacking.

For the convenience of the reader it may be pointed out, that the principal results and generalizations are published in Chapters III and XIII (p. 255—267) and that the main wage series are to be found in the beginning of each of the chapters on the different industries (viz. chapters IV—XII). The details regarding the material and the wage series are in approximately the same order in all chapters. Still further details are to be found in the monographs on special concerns, which form the last part of the volume. Through this arrangement it is hoped that the reader will be able rapidly to acquaint himself with the contents of the publication and to find the desired information without having to go through the whole, not very readable volume.

#### APPENDIX.

## LIST OF OCCUPATIONAL TERMS USED IN THIS VOLUME, WITH SWEDISH EQUIVALENTS.

One of the greatest difficulties in translating this volume from Swedish to English has been caused by the different practices in the two languages in regard to occupational terminology. In Swedish industries there is a multiplicity of very detailed occupational sub-classes, each of which has a special name descriptive of its function, whereas in English and American industries the general rule seems to be to call by a single name many such occupational sub-classes. We have therefore found it necessary to construct special English equivalents (in many cases merely literal translations of the Swedish) for these Swedish occupations, and we therefore present the following list of our constructed English terminology with the exact Swedish equivalents in order that our Swedish readers may the more easily identify these English terms.






