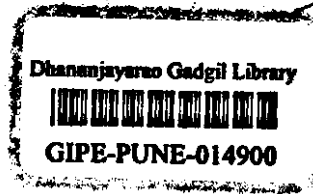

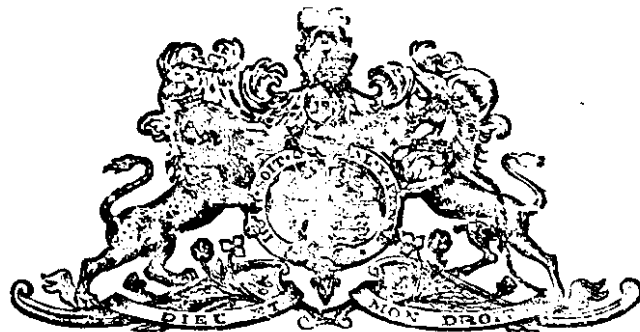

[THE BOM. U. S. FAMILY PENSION FUND.]

Rule 37 of the Fund requires that a person, on admission, shall pay a month's subscription in advance within 14 days from the date of the letter admitting him. If a person is admitted after the pay abstracts of the office in which he may be employed are closed, the subscription may be paid in cash. Members absent on leave may also make the payment in cash.

Rule 59 requires full 12 months' subscription to be paid up, either monthly, or in advance, to entitle a subscriber's widow to the pension subscribed for. To prevent risk, subscribers generally pay on admission 12 months' subscription in advance. A person whose month's salary will not cover the amount of 12 months' subscription may make the payment of his subscription in cash. (G. R. No. 3163, dated 27th August 1881.)

12. In the case of a subscriber to the Fund who is on Foreign Service, and who, under Article 841 of the Civil Service Regulations, is required to pay to the British Government an additional contribution of one-fourth of the premium which he pays to the Fund, the additional contribution should be calculated upon the premium as it stands after any abatement to which he may be entitled under the rules of the Fund, and not upon the original tabular rate. (G. I., F. & C., No. 1773, dated 30th June 1883; *vide* G. R. No. 2693, dated 24th July 1883.)

13. A privileged rate of interest at 6 per cent. a year shall be granted on a reserve not exceeding one-tenth of the net liabilities of the Bombay Uncovenanted Service Family Pension Fund (excepting always the Life Assurance Branch), the excess carrying interest at the market rate. The rate of interest allowed under the designation of "market rate" shall, until further orders, be $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum. (G. I., F. & C., Nos. 4096, dated 31st October 1883, and A.-5657, dated 28th December 1893; *vide* G. R. Nos. 4233, dated 29th November 1883, and 132, dated 11th January 1894.)

14. The Secretary of State has the right to alter the privileged rate of 6 per cent. interest and has asked the Government of India to examine carefully the yearly reports of the Fund in order to ascertain what effect the continuance of the privilege has upon it. The continuance of the privileged rate must not be held to guarantee the stability of the Fund, or to involve any responsibility for its proper management and maintenance. (S. of S. No. 12 Fin., dated 19th November 1896; *vide* G. R. No. 1150, dated 13th March 1897.)

15. The balances of the Life Assurance Branch of the Bombay Uncovenanted Service Family Pension Fund, which banks with Government at Savings Bank rates, will be held by Government at the rate of $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum. (G. I., F. & C., No. A-534, dated 31st January 1894; *vide* G. R. No. 600, dated 13th February 1894.)
