SIR,

In submitting for the consideration of Government the following proposals for the revision settlement of 78½ Government villages of the Shrigonda Táluka I have the honour to premise that the introduction of revised rates would in ordinary course have been provided for in the year 1883-84 when the original lease ran out, but that Government then, on the representation of the Survey

Commissioner, decided\* to defer revision settlement No. 5901 of 23th August 1882, for a time in order to allow of full recovery from the paragraph 4.

effects of the famine, which had been severely felt in the Shrigonda and Karjat Tálukas. A consideration of the statistics brought together in this report will, I believe, show that the time has now arrived when an enhancement of the Government demand may be made with advantage.

2. The 78½ Government villages dealt with in this report were settled in the years and under the authority shown below. In 3 villages formerly belonging to the Sirúr Táluka the survey settlement was introduced in 1874-75, the term of guarantee being fixed to expire with the rest of the táluka :—

The remaining 7½ villages which make up the 86 villages composing the táluka are inám, and will be dealt with separately hereafter in the usual manner.

3. With the exception of the 3 villages alluded to above, which were settled so recently as 1875, and in which therefore the existing measurement has been confirmed in its entirety, the re-measurement of the táluka has been conducted on what is now known as the partial system, which utilises to the full

extent possible the original measurement work, bringing it up to present requirements by supplementing all necessary details, and correcting in the maps all alterations of boundaries which have been caused by changes in the beds of streams, the construction of new roads or the extension of irrigation: all separately recorded khátas also have been measured and defined, and fields of unwieldy size broken up into convenient areas.

4. The result of the above operations in the 75½ villages partially remeasured was as follows:—

In 16 per cent. of the remeasured numbers, therefore, differences were found exceeding 5 per cent., which shows that the old measurement work was inaccurate in detail. The causes to which the larger differences may be attributed are shown in the following table:—

6. In dealing with the old classification it was decided to adopt at the outset the system of partial re-classification followed in most of the Southern Marátha Country revisions, where a percentage of the old work in each village was classed afresh with a view to determining the old standard of soil classification and then making any required modification village by village. After some villages had been done on this plan, however, the quality of the old classification was found to be sufficiently good to allow of the adoption of the more recent method followed last year in the case of the Bijápur Táluka Revision, under which the standard of each old classer is ascertained by a percentage test in all descriptions of soil, taken either by the Assistant Superintendent himself or by a specially qualified classer. In the result it was found that in all the villages classed in and after the year 1863-64 the old standard was correct, and in those classed at an earlier period some not very considerable adjustments were necessary,

in the general direction of enhancing the valuation of the best soils. While re-classification for standard is under the system here alluded to confined to about 20 per cent. of the villages only, and a large saving in time and expenditure thereby effected, in all other respects the old classification record has been thoroughly examined and brought into accord with the alterations made in the measurement record.

7. In the course of re-classification operations conducted in the way just explained the numbers and area actually re-classed were as shown in the subjoined table :—

The percentage re-classed therefore amounts to 27·1 of numbers and 10·3 of acres. It would have been smaller than this of course had it been possible to commence the work from the beginning on the system subsequently adopted, but this was not considered advisable until by more extended test in the villages first taken up the quality of the old work had been generally ascertained to be uniform and reliable.

8. The area obtained by revision survey is contrasted below with that of the old settlement record, under all heads :—

The total old area is less than that now ascertained therefore by 0·7 per cent. which is not considerable, but in internal areas there were as shown above material differences.

9. There has been considerable transfer going on from the unirrigated to the irrigated head, which latter has more than doubled in area owing mainly to the larger utilization of the water in nálas and streams. The dry-crop area has been supplemented it appears by the inclusion of land hitherto unassessed, part of which was already included in occupied numbers and part, no doubt, has been encroached on and taken in from Government waste.

10. The Shrigonda Táluka lies on the south-western border of the Ahmednagar Collectorate and is of irregular shape, having an extreme length from north to south of about 30 miles while its breadth varies from 35 miles across the northern portion to only 15 miles in the south. It is bounded on the north by the Párner and Nagar Tálukas, on the south by the River Bhima beyond which lies the Bhimthadi

Táluka of Poona, on the west by the Sirúr Táluka (also of Poona) from which it is divided by the Ghod River, and on the east by the Karjat Táluka.

11. In character it is a typical tract of the Deccan plain country with level stretches, rich, black and uninteresting, along the Bhima, stony upland country in the north, and a belt of varied character in the centre, where the streams are much used for irrigation so long as their water-supply lasts, and wells keep up some green cultivation throughout the hot weather.

12. The rainfall is not uniform throughout the tract, but varies rather in regularity than in quantity : in the north it is regular and sufficient for all ordinary plain crops ; but southwards towards the Bhima the fall is uncertain and sometimes scanty. In addition to the usual information given in Appendix A I have received monthly details from the Agricultural Department. These show that September is the month of heaviest fall, while July has a smaller average than any other month of the monsoon season. Thus the climate is more suitable for late than early crops.

13. In Appendix B will be found, compiled in average for the last five years, the proportionate areas covered by the different crops grown in the district, the figures being taken from the village papers. The following is a précis of the Appendix :—

The late harvest, it will be seen, is much the most important, and the principal product grown is the late jowári (*shálu*), which supplies the bulk of the food consumed in the district by man and beast. The more valuable products raised for export are the oil-seed Kardai or safflower, and wheat and gram ; also linseed, til and earthnuts are raised for export, and chillies which are grown in small quantities without irrigation where the soil and situation are favourable. The very considerable area which is commanded by small *páts* from various streams has not in this return been shown as garden cultivation, because this irrigation is almost entirely new since the existing revenue record was prepared. The proportion of land retained for grass and fallow is devoted to grazing for the cattle which are numerous.

14. From the old settlement report\* it appears that at that time (1851-52) there were no made roads in the tract now under discussion, though the old main road from Poona to Ahmednagar passed then as now through the town of Sirúr which lies just outside the north-west corner of the Shrigonda Táluka. A most important change has therefore, it will be seen, taken place in the communications of the district, which has now a railway passing through its entire length with three stations within its boundaries. Several lines of road also have been made which much facilitate intercourse and traffic. These for brevity's sake are noted in the margin.

Communications.

1. Provincial road from Nagar to Dhond Railway Station, traversing the whole táluka from north to south.
2. Provincial road from Nagar to Sholapur passes through the north-east corner of the táluka for a few miles only.
3. Local Fund road from Kashti on the Ghod River in the south-west corner of the táluka, crosses the breadth of the district through Shrigonda town and leads on over the western border to the Jámkhed Táluka.
4. Local Fund road from Shrigonda town to the Pimpri Railway Station.

15. Shrigonda itself is the one considerable market of the táluka and has some importance as a depôt where merchants collect the produce of the country to the eastward and despatch it towards Poona and the coast from the neighbouring station of Pimpri. A good many Telis also are settled here, and much oil is expressed from Kardai seed and exported to Bombay. Besides oil, wheat and gram are the principal exports, and the imports are principally cotton manufactures, both English and Native, with cocoanuts, rice and groceries from below gháts.

Weekly markets are held also at the villages named in the margin, but none of these have more than local importance.

16. In making the usual comparison between the former and present condition of the táluka it will be necessary to omit 7 villages for which the old statistics are not forthcoming; the following figures therefore refer to 72 villages only. In the detailed appendices totals have been shown separately for the 57 villages originally settled between 1851 and 1856 and for the 15 villages settled in 1863-64 and subsequently, but in the general précis now given the whole have been lumped together in order to give as full a view as possible:—

17. Population is seen to have increased by 20.6 per cent. and now represents a density of 89 in the square mile.\* Houses are shown to be more numerous by 30 per cent. than they were before, and it is satisfactory to notice the large proportion of houses of a superior description. The average number of head of population per house is between 5 and 6 and the proportion of occupied land per head of population is 5.3 acres.

18. Working cattle have increased by 27·7 per cent. and calculating in the usual way are found to bear the proportion of 1 pair to 18 cultivated acres, which is amply sufficient. Breeding and milch cattle have also multiplied and are 29·3 per cent. in advance of their former numbers. Sheep and goats show but a small increase of 11·5 per cent. which seems strange, for Shrigonda contains much land suitable for grazing, and the increase in non-working cattle shows that live stock are much raised.

19. Carts have increased by 52·0 per cent. and average now about 16 to each village, a high proportion. Horses and ponies are and were always rather numerous in these parts. Their present number in the 72 villages is shown to be 6 per cent. more numerous than at settlement.

20. Wells and budkis are increased in number by 48 per cent. Of the total number in the 72 villages, viz., 2,792, 428 are out of repair and 899 are for drinking purposes, and the remainder for irrigation. The old data afford no means of distinguishing the different kinds of wells, but judging from the increase in garden cultivation it is probable that most of the new wells have been built for irrigation.

21. In the following table the same figures which have just been given as a whole for 72 villages are re-compiled under heads of the two groups into which it is proposed to divide the tract under report for assessment purposes, as will be explained later on in this report. The two groups or divisions will be readily distinguished on the map where they are separately coloured\* :—

22. The table last given shows conclusively that the progress in wealth and prosperity indicated by the figures taken in total has not been confined to one part of the district, but has been evenly distributed. Satisfactory, however, as that progress must no doubt be considered its significance is much enhanced by the fact that this is one of the talukas in which the famine of 1876-77 was severely felt. The following figures, which have been taken from the taluka



records for the year preceding and that following the famine, will serve to illustrate this point and may be given here without further comment:—

23. From information furnished by the Educational Department it appears that there are 14 Government boys' schools in the district with an average attendance of 666; and 1 Government girls' school where on the average 60 girls are instructed. Besides these there are 4 private schools reported by the classing establishment, where the total average attendance is 72 boys. It appears from columns 10 and 11 of Appendix D that the proportion of the general population able to read has risen during the lease from 4·9 to 7·4 per cent.

24. In Appendix I will be found in the usual form some information regarding sub-tenures, from which it will be seen that 78·2 of the total numbers are cultivated by the khatedárs either by themselves or in partnership with others, 6·6 per cent. are let out on money rents, while 10·7 per cent. are sublet for a share of the produce. As the man whose name still stands as khatedár has in a large proportion of cases ceased to retain any right in the land, the figures just given lose much of their interest.

25. The appendices noted in the margin are an abstract from the Registrar's record of all cases of sale, lease or mortgage transactions during the last three years, in which land alone was concerned. Cases in which houses or other property was involved have been carefully eliminated. Three hundred and one sales are shown in which 7,115 acres of land paying an average assessment of Re. 0-5-11 per acre were concerned; the total sum realised was Rs. 32,427 which is equivalent to 12 years' purchase of the Government rent. The cases recorded are all of private sales and the figures may therefore be affected by past transactions and factors of which we have no knowledge; the above calculation therefore is not to be accepted unreservedly.

26. Leases are very few, only five in number, which is not sufficient to afford material for any general conclusion.

27. Mortgages afford no precise information for reasons often explained, but some general inference as to the high value of the land may be formed from the fact that 8,066 acres, assessed at Rs. 3,726, stand as accepted security for a debt of Rs. 34,225.

28. The course of prices of produce during the period of the lease will be found in annual detail in Appendix N together with the prices for three years preceding, which is all that can be obtained for years anterior to the settlement. The statement is divided into four periods, the average rates prevailing during each of which in the Shrigonda market are shown in the subjoined table:—

29. During the first decade of the lease it will be seen that there was but a moderate rise over the prices which prevailed when the pitch of assessment for the original settlement was decided on, yet it was during these years (as the revenue history discussed later in this report will prove) that the main portion of the available waste was brought under cultivation. During the second decade, the American War and its attendant influences brought about a great rise in the value of produce, and the average prices of the ten years are seen to range nearly 150 per cent. above those of the first decade of the lease. The last seventeen years which are placed in the third period contain both the high prices which ruled during the famine and succeeding years and the low prices of the re-action which then followed; on the whole the average rates for the seventeen years are not very much lower than those of the second decade of the lease, and may be described as between 100 and 150 per cent. higher than the prices which obtained when the existing rates of assessment were fixed.

30. The Revenue History of the tract under report has been made out as usual in separate tables for each batch of villages settled in separate years, and owing to the fact that the Shrigonda Taluka has been made up of villages taken from other talukas at different times, the record of its history is somewhat more complicated than usual. If we take, however, for the purposes of comment the two first tables, which contain 29 and 23 villages respectively, settled in consecutive years, we shall obtain a view sufficiently comprehensive to afford safe ground for inference. In both batches of villages the increase in cultivated area and revenue was immediate and within the first five or six years amounted to 50 per cent. and upwards, after that progress was more gradual for about ten years, towards the close of which the revenue may be said to have reached its highest point; no material change then occurred for another period of nearly ten years, when the famine ensued, and caused during the four following years a falling off of 26,467 acres and Rs. 7,355. In 1881-82, however, land was again in demand, and since then the re-action has been marked annually. The following table containing the figures of the most salient years in the Revenue History of the 52 villages here commented on gives as it were a birds-eye view of the subject:—

Outstandings and remissions may practically be said to have been non-existent since the settlement was introduced, and on the whole, though the check imposed by the famine was severe, the history of the lease has been very prosperous.

31. An examination of the remaining tables shows the revenue history of the several batches of villages later settled to have been very similar to that which has been reviewed in the last paragraph, and it seems unnecessary therefore to go into further detail.

32. The following details furnished by the Mámlatdár illustrate the ease with which the revenue has been collected :—

33. It will probably be admitted, on a review of all the information which has been set forth in this report that though in the year 1881-82, before the re-action from the famine had fairly declared itself, there was reason why Government should hold its hand and defer for a time its right to revise the lease, ample reason has now been shown for a revision and enhancement of the assessment which was fixed in the bulk of the villages under report no less than 37 years ago. Communications which were of the roughest description have been supplemented by railways as well as roads, one of the former having three stations within the taluka, the value of produce may be said at a moderate estimate to have doubled, while the prosperity of the population is evidenced by the increase in their numbers and in their wealth, by the great extension of cultivation, and the ease and regularity with which the revenue has been realised. I will proceed therefore to deal with the question of the revised rates of assessment.

34. In the original scheme of assessment both climate and communications were considered, and on both considerations the northern villages were treated as more favourably situated. The climate is still admitted to be best in the north of the taluka, the rainfall being there undoubtedly more regular than elsewhere; but communications at the time of the first settlement were considered mainly in connection with the military stations of Ahmednagar and Sirúr, and the main road which, passing outside the northern boundary of Shrigonda, connects these stations to Poona. Since those days, on construction of the G. I. P. Railway, the stream of traffic has changed its course southwards, and followed first the made road from Nagar to the Dhond Station, and later the branch railway which has been constructed along almost the same route to the same destination. In the matter of communications, therefore, the western half of the taluka from north to south is now the best situated, and indeed as the district is much narrower in the south than in the north, it may be said that with the exception of the north-eastern corner the whole is within very easy reach of the railway. The north-western portion just referred to is a high-lying somewhat rugged tract which, shut-off by hills on the south and east, relies chiefly for its communications on a made road leading north-eastwards to Nagar, distant about 25 miles. The more regular rainfall of this part, however, places it on the same plane for assessment purposes with the southern villages where the rail is more easily accessible.

35. Two groups then will suffice to provide for the different degrees of advantage found in the district, and rates are proposed for them as follows :—

**GROUP I.—Maximum Dry-crop rate Rs. 1-4.**

31 villages forming the north-west portion of the district, where the best climate is combined with the best communications. The existing rates range from Rs. 1-2 to Rs. 1-4 and in one village the maximum is Rs. 1-6.

**GROUP II.—Maximum Dry-crop rate Rs. 1-2.**

48 villages comprising both the southern portion of the taluka where the rainfall is irregular and the communications are good, and the north-east corner where these circumstances are reversed. The old rates ranged from Re. 0-12 to Re. 1 and in nine villages the rate was Rs. 1-2.

The maximum rates here proposed for the Shrigonda Taluka approximate, it will be seen from the map, to those already introduced in adjoining villages on the north, south, and east, where their suitability has been tested for some years; the revenue history of these revised rates in adjoining villages is given in Appendix P.

36. Of garden land there were shown in the original survey record 4,088 acres of which the Government area was 3,833 acres assessed at Rs. 9,597, i. e., on the average Rs. 2-8-1 per acre. By the revision survey there are in all 11,145 acres of which 10,529 acres are Government land assessed at Rs. 21,370 or an average of Rs. 2-0-6 per acre. This area is divided as follows into Patasthal and Motasthal :—

The Patasthal land has been assessed on the maximum rate of Rs. 8 which has been commonly used for similar talukas.

37. The orders of Government have been duly followed in the matter of well assessment. In the case of wells sunk during the lease no additional assessment has been placed on the irrigated area, while land watered from old wells has been assessed within the highest dry-crop rate.

38. The estimated revenue under the proposed rates is shown in the subjoined précis of Appendix Q where all details will be found :—

The increase of revenue estimated amounts, it will be seen, to Rs. 33,036 or 30.7 per cent. over the existing demand. The increase in each individual village is shown in the last column of Appendix Q, and will be seen to vary much, the main reason being the new arrangement of the maximum rates resulting from the change in the course of traffic and the construction of railways which have reversed the relative advantages of the bulk of the villages; other reasons exist in the assessment now newly placed on lands brought under Patasthal irrigation since the original settlement, in the practical remission of the old well assessment, and in some villages the adjustment of the old classification.

39. In the villages named in the margin the limit of 66 per cent. has been over-stepped from the effects of one or more of the above special causes. In the first two the abnormal increase is entirely due to the new Pátasthal assessment now placed on lands which had not originally utilized the natural advantage of irrigation from neighbouring streams. In No. 60 the increase in assessment but for the cause just alluded to would amount to 39.2 per cent. only. In the remaining villages the main cause is found in the great change in the maximum dry-crop rate necessitated by the new grouping, the reasons for which have already been explained. It is also to be noted that these villages are on or near the river and have a large proportion of deep black soil, which was depreciated in the old classification and has now been assessed at its proper value.

40. The results of the original and revision surveys are contrasted below under every head :—

41. The average rate of assessment on Government occupied land of all descriptions was by original survey settlement Re. 0-6-10 and by the proposed settlement will be Re. 0-8-11. The increase therefore is equivalent to Re. 0-2-1 per acre.

42. In conclusion, I have the honour to recommend that in the event of the proposed rates meeting with the approval of Government they may be sanctioned in time for introduction during the current revenue year and guaranteed for the usual term of 30 years.

Forwarded to the Commissioner, C. D. The report does not call for any special remark.

With reference to Mr. Fletcher's remark in paragraph 18 as to the small increase in sheep and goats, this is probably attributable to the exclusion of these animals from areas reserved as forest.

The division of the taluka into two groups for purposes of assessment will meet all requirements, and looking to the conditions as summarized in Mr. Fletcher's 33rd paragraph an enhancement of assessment is now perfectly justifiable; the proposed rates both for dry-crop and garden lands are moderate.

With reference to paragraph 42 of the report the rates if sanctioned might be introduced during the current year; but looking to the poorness of the crops this season it is likely that though if the rates if given out now will be leviable on next season's crops, their actual imposition may have to be postponed till the succeeding year.

SIR,

I have the honour to forward the proposals of the Superintendent, Deccan Revenue Survey, for the revision settlement of 78½ Government villages of the Shrigonda Taluka of the Ahmednagar Collectorate. The proposals have been reviewed and fully approved by the Collector of the district, Mr. George Waddington.

2. The Shrigonda Taluka was one of those tracts which suffered very severely from the famine of 1876-77, and as Collector of the district in 1878-79 I had an unusually good opportunity of witnessing the havoc caused by the catastrophe. While the number of crumbling and deserted houses in the villages showed how greatly the population had succumbed or become dispersed, the heavy outstanding balances of revenue and fields lying uncultivated bore witness to the temporary paralysis of the resources of the people and the destruction of their agricultural stock. It was not, however, till the years 1879-80 and 1880-81 that the balances of defaulting rayats were finally written off and their lands entered as waste; and although many of those who had absconded in the crisis of the famine subsequently returned to their villages, the revenue history of the principal groups (Appendices O<sup>1</sup> and O<sup>2</sup>) shows clearly that when the time came to wind up accounts there was a marked falling off in the occupied area, notwithstanding the light rates of the original settlement and the many advantages of railway and road which had in the meanwhile altered the face of the country and had caused a total revolution in the prices of produce.

3. It was at a time when cultivation in this taluka was at a very low ebb and the people were moving heaven and earth to replace their stock so as to bring the abandoned lands under cultivation, that I, as Survey Commissioner, was called upon to decide whether it would be wise to commence the revision



of the settlement and to put Government to expense which could only be justified by a raising of the Government demand. Having been a witness on the spot to the difficulty with which even a portion of the balances of the ante-famine year's revenue had been collected, I felt that to increase the revenue at this juncture might be a disastrous policy. Accordingly in my No. 1599, dated 17th August 1882, I recommended Government to put off revision operations for a while and this recommendation was sanctioned by Government Resolution No. 5901, dated 28th August 1882. Knowing the marvellous recuperative power of Deccan districts, if favoured by even a few years of fair rainfall, I trusted that by a little judicious delay Government might obtain a justifiable addition to its revenue without nipping progress in the bud by undertaking operations which the cultivators could only look upon as certain to add largely to their burdens. I think that the present report shows that the delay has been most successful in its results and we can now safely increase the revenue of this tract to an extent which would have been impossible when the original rates fell in.

4. I will proceed to review the report in detail. Mr. Fletcher has explained the field operations which were considered necessary to place the record on a suitable footing for revision purposes. With the exception of 3 villages which had been surveyed at a comparatively recent date, the system adopted was that of partial remeasurement on the Southern Marátha Country rules so often described in late settlement reports. The re-classification was commenced on the system of testing each village for ascertainment of standard, but it was continued on the system more recently followed of testing the standard of each old classer and adjusting the values according to the correct standard if it was found to be seriously at fault. By the system of partial operations a great saving of time and expense has been attained, while there has been no chance of good original work being unnecessarily reviewed or upset.

5. The revision operations have shown that garden land has increased from 4,088 to 11,145 acres or by 172.6 per cent. Besides newly constructed wells, much of this is due to the utilization of the water of streams led by *páts* or water-channels from more or less rude dams constructed by the villagers. Wherever running streams are found the utilization of this advantage for irrigation is becoming every year more common.

6. The rainfall of Shrigonda is on the whole fitful and irregular, being greater and more certain in the hilly portions to the north, as evidenced by the streams with springs lasting into the fair season from which *pátasthal* cultivation is carried on, while to the south the rainfall becomes lighter and more precarious as the Bhíma River is approached. The most dependable rainfall is late in the season, and provided that fall is seasonable and assisted by a few subsequent showers the whole country becomes a sea of *shálu* here and there interspersed with gram and oil-seeds. Last November the crops were very promising but for want of one moderate fall of rain in December the late *jowári* has almost entirely failed.

7. A reference to the original survey correspondence\* will show that at the time when the vast majority of the villages now under revision were settled there were no made roads at all in the *táluka*. Mr. Fletcher's paragraph 14 shows how very different the state of affairs is now when the railway from Nagar to Dhond on the G. I. P. Railway runs through the heart of the tract, when no less than three regularly constructed through lines intersect it and a feeder road connects its capital town and most important market with Pimpri Matar, the nearest railway station.

8. The statistics given in paragraph 16 of the report show that, notwithstanding the terrible experiences of 1876-77, there are increases under each of the heads ordinarily quoted to show the progress of a tract in agricultural wealth and resources. Although between 1875-76 and 1877-78 population was reduced by 12,844 souls, it has risen since the latter year from 41,004 to 48,229 and is now 20.6 per cent. in excess of what it was at the original settlement. In the same way, agricultural cattle, which numbered 19,116 at the original survey census, had

increased to 25,378 in 1875-76, but the famine reduced the number to 15,182. The seasons, however, of fair prosperity since 1878-79 have enabled the cultivators to bring up the number to 24,420 and there is now one pair of oxen to every 18 cultivated acres, a more than sufficient proportion. In the matter of non-agricultural cattle the figures are equally satisfactory, showing that since 1877-78 the people have more than replaced the heavy losses of the famine. Houses of the better class have considerably increased, as also carts and wells. The somewhat small increase in sheep and goats compared to other districts of this Collectorate recently settled is supposed by the Collector to be due to the closing of the forest grazing grounds against animals of this class.

9. The separate statements for the two groups given in paragraph 21 show that progress has been fairly equally maintained in all parts of the taluka, except in the matter of superior houses in which, as might have been expected, the first group with its greater certainty of seasons and crops takes a decided lead.

10. I will not say much in this place on the subject of the indebtedness of the cultivators and how far they have succeeded in getting out of the clutches of the sávkár during the period of the expired settlement, as I know that the results of special enquiries made by Mr. Woodburn, C.S., into the circumstances of the rayats in many of the villages where they were heavily burdened with debt will soon be available to throw light on the question. So far as I was able to judge the debts of the cultivators will be found to have been reduced, but to what extent this result can be attributed to the working of the Dekkhan Agriculturists' Relief Act is a matter upon which the recent special enquiries should prove very interesting.

11. In order to see for myself how far the condition of the taluka had improved since I saw it last as Collector of the district under disastrous circumstances in 1878-79, I have recently travelled through it, revisiting localities with which I was familiar before. I was very much struck with the improved appearance of the villages, the greater air of comfort about the houses, the more plentiful dress of the people and the tone of confidence and self-reliance which prevailed throughout. Looking to the marked increase in the range of prices shown in paragraph 28 there can be no doubt that the land can well afford to pay the additional burden of taxation which it is proposed to lay upon it.

12. As regards the grouping of the villages it is little wonder that the former scheme, which was arranged at a time when there was no railway and no made roads, had to be considerably set aside in consideration of the altered circumstances of traffic which the opening of the railway with three stations in the limits of the taluka and the construction of new lines of road have brought about. There is a general consensus of opinion that the climate in the hilly country to the north of the taluka is the best, the rainfall being more regular and suitable to the prevailing light soils, and this is in accordance with my own experience. It is in this portion that the most important streams which contain water sufficient for pásthal cultivation during the early months of the fair season take their rise. It is equally a matter of experience that in the southern part of the taluka, where the soils are the deepest and finest in quality, the rainfall is more capricious and the outturn of the crops uncertain. If we were to group the taluka for climate alone a line drawn from Vadgaon Shindodi in the west to Koregaván in the east would probably effect the required distinction. In considering the question, however, by the light of communications, it is not possible to place the villages in the north-east corner on the same level as those to the north-west. Mr. Fletcher, therefore, proposes to group the former villages with the southern villages on a maximum rate of Rs. 1-2, considering that their distance from the railway and their scanty communications warrant their being ranged in the second class. I think, however, that this scheme might be im-

proved upon by removing the 12 villages marginally noted, which are situated in the elbow of land on the north-east, and constituting them a group by themselves on an

intermediate maximum rate of Rs. 1-3-0. While these villages being near the hills have the precious advantage of a fair rainfall, which may be judged from the fact that they are traversed by two affluents of the Sina River, the water in which is sufficiently durable for pátasthal cultivation, yielding a revenue to Government in these villages of Rs. 1,048, they are by no means unusually isolated. They are all within six miles of a good made road from Ahmednagar to Sholápur which even in 1878-79, when as Collector of the district I was encamped at Ghogargaum, was easily and conveniently traversable by wheeled vehicles. In addition to this communication with Ahmednagar 25 miles distant, the villages are within easy reach of Mándavgan, a local market which is resorted to not only by the cultivators of these villages, but by the residents of the villages of the Nagar Táluka to the north (*vide* paragraph 15 of Colonel Laughton's report on the revision settlement of the Nagar Táluka). Mándavgan, moreover, is connected by a rough road with Walki, about 16 miles distant, where the finest cattle market in the Ahmednagar Collectorate is held, while it is also connected with Shrigonda by a road constructed as a famine work and passable for carts although not regularly repaired. The placing of these twelve villages in an intermediate group causes their rating to blend somewhat more harmoniously with the rating of the villages of the Nagar Táluka to the north which bear a maximum rate of Rs. 1-6. Even a drop from Rs. 1-6 to Rs. 1-3 is scarcely warranted by the circumstances of the several villages, but it is advisable at this settlement that the arrangement of the groups should be as perfect as possible, even if the desire to avoid heavy increases should tie our hands in making the rating all that could be wished.

13. I would therefore recommend strongly that the alteration I propose should be adopted. The general financial results as compared with those given in Mr. Fletcher's paragraph 38 will be as follows :—

14. I would here explain that in this revision of settlement we are not bound down by any prescribed limits of enhancement, the táluka being in a district to which the orders of Government Resolution No. 5739, dated 29th October 1874, do not apply and to which, as the original settlement fell in 1881-82, the orders of March 1884 are equally inapplicable. As far as possible however the spirit which dictated these limitations of enhancement has been kept to. The total additional burden on the táluka after giving effect to the altered grouping is increased by Rs. 33,733 equivalent to 31.4 per cent. only, and the limit applicable to single villages in such revisions is in no case exceeded.

15. It is unfortunate that just as the revised rates are ripe for introduction the táluka should be suffering from a failure of the late crops which makes Mr. Waddington doubtful as to whether, even if the rates are announced this year, it will be possible to levy them in full upon next year's crops. But seeing the wide authority for regulating collections and granting postponements which the Collector is invested with under Rules 138 @ 143 of the Famine Code, there seems no objection to announce the revised rates during the current revenue year and leave the question of collection to be considered after the rains when the effect on the crops can be to some extent gauged.

16. I beg to recommend that the same concessions as to gradual levy of the assessments on khátás which have been largely increased, which have been granted in recent Deccan revision settlements, should be extended to Shrigonda also. This will of itself to some extent temper the

weight of the demand for the years following the partial failure of the present season.

17. If early sanction is received to these proposals the Akárbands will be prepared and the rates announced during next month. As a special case the date for receiving resignations under Section 74 of the Land Revenue Code may be postponed for this year until the 5th June.

18. A fresh map illustrating the slight alteration in grouping recommended by me is appended to these remarks. Also an amended form of Appendix showing the detailed assessments for each village.

19. Up to this date no petitions against the proposed standard of revised rating have been received. The period for presenting such petitions extends to the 24th instant, and any that may be presented meanwhile will be forwarded to Government in due course.

2. The information supplied in these papers clearly shows that, notwithstanding the famine of 1877, which seriously affected the condition of the taluka, the rayats have rapidly regained their lost ground during the ten following years, and the improvement shown by the figures given by Mr. Fletcher in Appendix F (1) (Statistics of Houses, Chávdís, Wells, &c.) for this year and at the time of the previous settlement is very surprising and satisfactory.

3. Mr. Fletcher proposes to divide the taluka into two groups—the first comprising the north-western villages with a maximum rate of Re. 1-4-0, and the second including the southern division of the taluka, together with certain villages in the north-east corner, with a maximum rate of Re. 1-2-0. Mr. Stewart generally agrees in the facts stated by Mr. Fletcher, but considers that the 12 villages situated in the north-eastern corner are neither so good as to be included in the first group, nor so bad as to be thrown into the second. Mr. Stewart, therefore, suggests an intermediate group for the 12 villages, with a maximum rate of Rs. 1-3-0, and strongly recommends its adoption.

4. Mr. Moore has not had the opportunity of visiting the taluka and acquainting himself with the condition of its different parts. Mr. Stewart, however, has known the taluka and its people for years past; and, what is more important, he, as Collector of the district, has come into contact with the people, not only in their prosperity but also in their adversity. Mr. Stewart's opinion is, therefore, entitled to much weight; and the Officiating Commissioner, C. D., has no hesitation in supporting the modification proposed by him in Mr. Fletcher's grouping.

5. The result of the original proposals as modified by Mr. Stewart would be an increase of Rs. 33,733 or 31·4 per cent. over the original survey assessment, which appears moderate and fair.

6. The early sanction of Government is solicited to the proposals made in paragraphs 13, 16 and 17 of Mr. Stewart's letter.

RESOLUTION.—Proposals are now submitted for the revision survey settlement of the 78½ Government villages comprised in the Shrigonda Taluka of the Ahmednagar District. The term of their original settlement expired in 1883-84 but revision was deferred by Government for a time to allow of the full recovery of the taluka from the effects of the famine.

2. The partial system of both measurement and classification was found sufficient at the survey under report, and its results, which are clearly described, call for no special notice.

3. At the original settlement assessment groups of villages were as usual formed on consideration of their respective advantages as regards climate and communications. The same principles have been followed in the formation of the groups now proposed, but there is a difference in results, due to the fact that communications have much improved since the original settlement. In particular a railway now traverses the western portion of the taluka from north to south, and several good roads have been constructed during the term of the lease which has expired. Mr. Fletcher only proposes two groups, but the Honourable Mr. Stewart gives good reasons for recommending that three constituted as shown in the margin should be formed.

The proposed maximum dry-crop rates, which fit in with those sanctioned for adjoining talukas, are, with one exception, either the same as or but little in excess of the present rates. Patasthal garden land has been assessed on the maximum of Rs. 8 which has been applied to similar talukas. There is no rice land.

4. The statistics furnished indicate that the taluka has fully recovered from the effects of the famine. Its revenue history is favourable. It has been much benefited by the improved communications. The marked rise in prices since the original settlement also shows that the enhancement of assessment by 31·4 proposed by the Survey and Settlement Commissioner is justified. The revenue results of the proposed and existing settlements are given in the following table :—

5. The petitions of objection submitted in accordance with Government Resolution No. 7447, dated 21st October 1886, disclose no reasons for withholding sanction to the proposed rates. They are accordingly sanctioned as are also the Honourable Mr. Stewart's proposals in paragraphs 15 and 16 of his letter. With reference to the recommendation in paragraph 17 the Acting Survey and Settlement Commissioner should be requested to state up to what date the period for receiving resignations under Section 74 of the Land Revenue Code in the current year should be specially extended. A guarantee for the usual term of thirty years may be given.
