APPENDIX I.

A Synopsis of certain of the Older Laws relating to Importation, Exportation, and the Regulation of the Customs.

SUBJECT.	STATUTES,
One measure of wine shall be through the realm: one measure of ale and one measure of corn, viz., the quarter of London. SUBJECT. STATUTES. No merchant native or stranger, nor other, shall carry out of England, 27 Ed. III., st. 2, c. 12. wool, leather, or woolfells, to Berwick-upon-Tweed nor elsewhere, nor into Scotland, nor sell them to a Scotch man, nor to any to carry them into Scotland; the transgression thereof made felony accompanied with forfeiture. How merchants robbed on the sea, whose goods be brought into this 27 Ed. III., st. 2, c. 13. realm, shall be relieved; also touching ships wrecked, and wrecked Merchants may bring in gold and silver to the King's exchange, and 27 Ed. III., st. 2, c. 14. carry out as much new money, but not old sterling; and all false money shall be forfeited to the King. Merchants of enemies' countries shall have convenient time by pro-27 Ed. III., c. 13. here abide against the will of the merchant, master or mariners; they may sell part of their loading, paying custom for the same, and carry the remainder where they please without paying custom, and he that disturbs them shall incur a grievous forfeiture to the King, according to 20 Rich. II., c. 4. the quantity of the trespass. A sack of wool contains 26 stones, and every stone 14 pounds 31 Ed. III., c. 8. according to the standard of the Exchequer; all wools shall be brought to the staple. Herrings shall not be sold at sea, but in harbour after the cable of 31 Ed. III., st. 2, c. 1. the ship is drawn to land, the 100 herrings declared to be 120; the last 10,000. Merchandise may be carried into and brought out of Ireland, the 34 Ed. III., c. 17. King's customs and other duties being paid as well by aliens as denizens. They who have lands in Ireland may carry corn, beasts and victuals 34 Ed. III., c. 18. to Ireland, and recarry their goods and merchandise back to England, freely without impeachment, paying custom for them, and their duties to the King. The Clerk of the Remembrance, and Clerk of the Pipe shall be 37 Ed. III., c. 4. assigned to sit together: their office and duty defined. 1 Rich. II., c. 5. STATUTES.

Certain merchandizes wrought are not lawful to be brought into the realm of England or Wales, from foreign parts, to be uttered and sold, upon penalty of forfeiture, as often as they are found in the hands of persons to be sold; viz., woollen caps, woollen cloths, laces, corses, ribbons, fringes of silk or of thread, laces of thread, silk twined, silk in anywise embroidered, laces of gold, tires of silk or gold, saddles, stirrups, or any harness pertaining to saddles, spurs, bosses for bridles, andirons, gridirons, any manner of locks, hammers, pincers, firetongs, dripping-pans, dice, tennis-balls, points, laces, purses, gloves, girdles, harness for girdles of iron, latten, steel, tin, or of alkemine; anything wrought of any tawed leather and tawed furs, buskins, shoes, galoches or corks, knives. daggers, wood-knives, bodkins, shears for tailors, scissors, razors, sheaths, chessmen, playing cards, pins. combs, pattens, pack-needles, any painted ware, forcers, caskets, rings of copper, gilt, or of latten, gilt chafing dishes, hanging candlesticks, chaffing-balls, sacring-bells, rings for curtains, ladles, scummers, counterfeit basins, ewers, hats, brushes, cards for wool, blanche iron thread, commonly called and named white wire.

Half the penalty is to go to the person who will seize the goods.

Provided, that Robert Stillington, Dean of St. Martin's le Grand, London, nor his successors, nor the inhabitants of St. Martin's Lane, shall be prejudiced by this Act.

Provided also, that if any of the said wares come into this realm by way of wreck they are exempted from forfeiture by this Act and may be sold.

No woollen cloths wrought beyond sea shall be brought into England to be sold upon pain of forfeiture of the same.

Four bow-staves shall be brought into this Kingdom for every ton of merchandize brought in by strangers in ships and vessels belonging to Venice or any other place from whence they are or have been usually brought, upon forfeiture of 6s. 8d. for every bow-staff deficient.

APPENDIX II.

The Debt to the Farmers of the Customs contracted by King Charles I.

The following statement relates to the debt to the Farmers of the Customs which was contracted by King Charles I. It is quoted in House of Commons paper 443 of 1858, from Lord Clarendon's Continuation of the History of the Rebellion:—

"Before the late troubles, and at the very first entry into them, Charles the First was necessitated to borrow very great sums of money from his then farmers of his Customs, and to oblige them to stand personally bound for many other great sums of money, which other men lent to His Majesty upon their security. For the repayment of these sums, His Majesty, with the advice of the then Lord Treasurer and the Chancellor of the Exchequer, granted a further lease of his Customs to those farmers for three or four years to come after the expiration of their former lease, with a covenant on His Majesty's part to pay the just interest for all moneys advanced by them, or for which they stood bound, and that they should out of their growing rent deduct such sums of money by the year, according to such proportion as was agreed upon. In 1640, the House of Commons took from the farmers their new lease, granted to them by the King, and so left them without any capacity of reimbursing themselves of the money they had lent, and at the mercy of the creditors to whom they stood bound. Many of the poor gentlemen had their estates extended upon judgments and recognizances, and their persons taken and committed to prison, where some of those who had been known to have great estates, as Sir Paul Pindar and others, were forced to end their lives. . . .

"Upon His Majesty's (Charles the Second) happy return, those gentlemen who were alive of the old farmers, Sir John Jacob, Sir Job Hardy, Sir Nicholas Crispe, and Sir John Harrison, applied themselves to the King, having lain several years, and at that time remaining in execution in several prisons, and having had their estates sold upon the prosecution of those creditors to whom they were bound for money lent to His Majesty.

"As soon as measures were taken for collecting the revenue, these four gentlemen named before, and two others, were appointed commissioners for collecting the customs, in which commission they continued a year or thereabouts, during which time many of their creditors, who had forebore to prosecute them whilst they were in prison and undone, began now to commence their actions against them, presuming that they were then, or shortly would be, able to satisfy them.

"His Majesty shortly after found it best for his profit to determine the collection by commission, and to let the whole to farm The propositions made by the old farmers were at least as much, if not more, for the King's profit than any others which had been made. He declared that the farm should be let to them The farm being thus settled, the old farmers were directed to bring their accounts to the Lord Treasurer and Chancellor of the Exchequer, by which it would manifestly appear how much the King was justly and truly indebted to them, and how the debts were incurred; so that, upon a just computation, such satisfaction might be made to them as was consistent with the present state of His Majesty's affairs and occasions.' Many months, if not a whole year, were spent in the examination of those accounts before the apditors

"The Lord Treasurer declared 'he should never advise the King, on the contrary, "he should always dissuade His Majesty from paying or allowing any interest, though paid by "them, which would swell the debt to such a proportion that His Majesty could never undertake "the payment of it."

"Upon the whole matter, and upon all the doubts stated to His Majesty, and after the rejection of several of the sums of money which were demanded by them, and for the payment whereof such direct proof was not made as is required by the course of the Exchequer (though he said he thought most persons who were present were, in their private consciences, well satisfied that those sums had been in truth paid to His Majesty's use, as had been alleged), there appeared to His Majesty to be justly due to them the sum of £200,000 principal money, for almost twenty years, and for which they had paid the interest for many years out of their own estates. And His Majesty thought it very just; and, with many gracious expressions of his purpose and resolution further to repair them as he should be able, gave order to the Lord Treasurer, 'that the said debt of £200,000 should be paid them in five years, that is, by £40,000 for every year, out of the rent of 'the farm; and that all instruments necessary for their satisfaction and security should be presently 'given to them, whereby they might be able to comply with their creditors and avoid their 'importunity,' wherewith His Majesty began to be troubled as much as themselves

"There were many other considerable debts incurred by His late Majesty (Charles the First) and for which many persons of honour, who adhered to him during the war, were personally bound for him, and whose estates had been extended and their persons imprisoned for the same. The many of whom were in execution and in prison for the same when His Majesty returned, and there were then sued in Westminster Hall, in His Majesty's own courts. His late Majesty having granted, under his Great Seal in England, to several persons entrusted for the rest, many of his forests, parks, and other lands, for their security and indemnity, who were or should stand bound for him, for money that was then borrowed for and applied to the necessary support of himself and his army, and to no other purpose; in that grant he (Clarendon) had been particularly trusted, as well by the desire of the persons particularly concerned, as by His Majesty's command to be solicitous for their satisfaction. And he did not deny that he never was more glad than when he was able to secure satisfaction for those persons who were so bound and secured; nor more troubled than that he could do no more, than that there remained still so many unsatisfied and almost undone for those debts so contracted, of which number he believed there were still too many."

These are, by Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, to give Notice to all His Majesty's Officers of the Customs, That whereas His Majesty hath been pleased to take His Customs and Duties arising by the last Wine Act into His Own Hands, from the 29th of September instant, and to put them into Commission, their Lordships do expect and require all His Majesty's said officers, both in the Port of London and Out-ports, that they and every of them, do diligently attend, execute and perform the Duty of their respective places; and that they do obey and observe such Rules, Orders, and Instructions, as from time to time they shall receive from their Lordships, or from the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty for the managing, levying, and collecting His Majesty's said Customs, and the Duties arising by the said Wine Act; and that they do not trade as Merchants for themselves, or as Factors or Agents for others, according as by the Law in those cases is provided; and that whoever of them shall offend against these Rules, their Lordships will suspend them from their Employment, and put others in their stead.
