The later papers which are included in this volume comprise the letter addressed to Local Governments upon the encouragement of technical and industrial education in November 1901 after the Simla Conference; the despatches in which the Secretary of State sanctioned a scheme for State technical scholarships; and the resolutions in which the Government of India reviewed the reports of Sir E. Buck and Colonel Clibborn's committee upon technical and industrial education.
