It is hereby notified for public information that Sir William Morris Carter, Kt., C.B.E., B.A., B.C.L., Sir Herbert John Taylor, Kt., Chief Native Commissioner, and William John Atherstone, Esquire, Director, Department of Lands, have been appointed a Commission to enquire into the expediency and practicability of setting apart defined areas outside the boundaries of the Native Reserves within which Natives only shall be permitted to acquire ownership of or interest in land and within which only Europeans shall be permitted to acquire ownership or interest in land.

The terms of reference to the Commission are published in the annexure hereto.

COMMISSION

By His Excellency Sir John Robert Chancellor, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, Lieutenant-Colonel in the Reserve of Officers of the Corps of Royal Engineers, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Southern Rhodesia.

To Sir William Morris Carter, Kt., C.B.E., B.A., B.C.L., Sir Herbert John Taylor, Kt., Chief Native Commissioner, and William John Atherstone, Esquire, Director, Department of Lands.

Greeting.

Whereas under the constitution of the Colony of Southern Rhodesia Europeans and Natives may acquire individual ownership in land in any part of the said Colony save and except in Native Reserves which are vested in the High Commissioner and set aside for the sole and exclusive communal use and occupation of Natives;

And whereas it is deemed expedient to appoint a Commission (1) to enquire into and report upon the expediency and practicability of setting apart defined areas outside the boundaries of the Native Reserves (a) within which Natives only shall be permitted to acquire ownership of or interest in land, and (b) within which only Europeans shall be

permitted to acquire ownership of or interest in land; and (2) should the Commission consider that the above proposal is expedient and practicable, to report generally as to the manner in which effect should be given to such a policy and the steps necessary to carry it out, and further to indicate any areas in which it seems desirable in the light of present conditions that early action should be taken with a view to limiting and the method of limiting the rights of acquisition to Natives or Europeans:

Now know ye that I, the Governor aforesaid, reposing great confidence in your knowledge, discretion and ability, have authorised and appointed and by these presents authorise and appoint you, the said Sir William Morris Carter (Chairman), Sir Herbert John Taylor, Chief Native Commissioner, and William John Atherstone, Director, Department of Lands, to be Commissioners for the purposes aforesaid; and for better effecting of the purposes of this my Commission I do give and grant unto you or any two of you full power and authority to call before you or any two of you such persons as you shall judge necessary by whom you may be better informed of the subjects herein submitted for your consideration and every matter connected therewith, and also to call for, and have access to and examine, all such official books, documents, papers and records as may afford the fullest information on the subjects of the enquiry and to require of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And I further will and direct, and by these presents ordain, that you or any two of you do report to me, with all convenient speed, your opinion on the matters herein submitted for your consideration.

And I further will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this my Commission shall continue in full force and virtue until you or any two of you shall have finally reported upon the several matters aforesaid or otherwise until this my Commission shall be by me revoked; and that you or any two of you may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment; and that you or any two of you shall have liberty to report to me your several proceedings from time to time as the same or any part thereof may respectively be completed and perfected.

In witness whereof I, the Governor aforesaid, have caused this my Commission to be issued on this eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.

Appendix II.

LANDS COMMISSION.

The Executive Council of the R.A.U. sent a deputation to the Lands Commission to ascertain from them the particular points upon which the Farmers' Associations could usefully give evidence.

The Executive is anxious that each Association, after reaching a decision on the points hereunder, should appoint one or two delegates to meet the Commission when they visit your district.

It is most important that a copy of your decisions be forwarded to this office to enable the Executive at an early date to advise the Commission of the views of the farming community as a whole.

1. Opinion is required on the main issue. At present Natives and Europeans can purchase land anywhere.

Is it advisable that this should continue, or should separate areas be allocated for Native and other areas for white settlement?

2. Give reasons for view expressed.

3. If you agree to areas being set aside, upon what principle should the amount of land be fixed?

4. How much of the unalienated land should be reserved for whites; how much for Natives?

Note.—Alienated land, 31,486,095 acres.

Native Reserves, 21,203,498 acres.

Unalienated, 43,529,880 acres.

5. What areas in your district should be set aside?

Note.—If white areas are fixed, farms in that area could not be sold to Natives.

6. If a white man has a farm in an area set aside for Native occupation, should he be allowed to stay or should he be expropriated by the Government?

7. What would be the effect of this policy on the labour supply in your district?

8. What limitation, if any, should be imposed in Native titles—i.e., should they be allowed to purchase or the land be leasehold?

Note.—Under Glen Grey Act, land is forfeit in case of rebellion.

9. Give your views as to quality of land in the Native Reserves as compared with the rest of your district.

10. Value of land here as compared with the Union? That is, in relation to size of allotment necessary.

11. Average production of grain per acre and average acreage required per head of (1) large, (2) small stock?

12. If land is allocated for Native settlement and not required immediately for that

purpose, it might be leased to Europeans temporarily. What length of lease would be advisable?

13. Would it be possible to abolish or control kraals under Private Locations Ordinance on private land near townships and mines, as complaints have been made in regard to these?

14. Should Natives be allowed to buy small allotments near towns or mines?

15. What is the proportion of alien to local Natives employed on farms in your district?

16. What is average area worked by a Native family at present?

17. What acreage could they work efficiently: (1) on their own, (2) under white supervision?

18. Should alien Natives be allowed to purchase land with a view to encouraging them to make their homes in Southern Rhodesia?

If this were done, and Natives in other parts knew, would there be a rush by them to take advantage of the arrangements made? Should such settlement be restricted or limited to alien Natives already in the country?

19. What acreage can be ploughed per day by different types of ploughs?

20. What area can a Native cultivate on his own?

21. Give number of whole time Natives employed: (1) alien, (2) indigenous.

22. To what extent, if at all, and in what localities, should European land owners be expropriated?

23. Could the present method of occupying land in Native Reserves be improved?

24. Should the aim of policy be in the direction of individual tenure?

25. Should a Board be established to consider Native application to purchase land?

26. Should there be any limitation as to size of holding?

27. Should steps be taken to discourage Natives holding large numbers of stock regardless of quality by limiting their land holdings?

28. Indicate what areas should be retained for white settlement in your area.

29. It is pointed out that the Commission will only make recommendations, which will be placed before Parliament and if approved will then be considered by the Imperial Government.

PORTIONS OF DISTRICTS LEFT FOR FUTURE DETERMINATION.

Wankie District.

(1) The Crown land bounded on the north by the Zambesi River, on the south by the Wankie Native Reserve and Reserve Area B, on the south-west by a line from the westernmost point of Reserve Area B to a point on the Zambesi River five miles below the Victoria Falls.

Area: 233,000 acres.

(2) The Crown land bounded on the north by a line following the south-eastern boundary of the Wankie Coal Concession to its southernmost beacon, thence to the southernmost beacon of Sinamatila Ranche, thence to the south-west beacon of Tom's Extension and continuing in the latter direction to the Pandamatenka Road, on the north-east by a line five miles to the south-west of and parallel to the Bulawayo-Victoria Falls railway line, on the south-east and south-west by the Wankie district boundary.

(1) The Crown land in the Zambesi Valley north of the line running along the escarpment through the points Mahara, Nyanuswa, Mokore, Ntondongwe, Chizwiti and Kaiora, west of the line from Kaiora through

Chidoma to the north-west beacon of the Urungwe Native Reserve, and north of the line from the latter point westwards to the Sanyati River at the Matusadona Mountains.

(2) The Crown land bounded by a line drawn from beacon S.R. 1 of the Shangani Native Reserve along the southern boundary of that Reserve to beacon S.R. 20, thence southerly to a point on the northern boundary of Stephenson Block about midway between its north-east and north-west beacons, thence westerly along the northern boundaries of that block and the New Bulawayo Syndicate Block, thence along the western and southern boundaries of the latter block to its south-east beacon, thence southerly to the Gandi Hills and continued in that line to the Shangani River, thence down the Shangani River to beacon S.R. 6, thence northerly along the Shangani Native Reserve boundary to beacon S.R. 1.
