## **PREFACE**

As a part of the observance of International Child Year Programme, the Labour Bureau has undertaken a rapid Survey into problems of child labour. The present report is based on this survey conducted in certain organised and un-organised sectors of industries. It presents an account of the various aspects of child labour such as employment, wages and earnings, working conditions and welfare facilities, etc. A discussion on protective labour laws concerning child labour together with the suggestions for combating the problems is also given. It should be noted that this was only a diagnostic study.
