STATISTICAL ABSTRACT FOR BRITISH INDIA.

Foreword.

In this publication, the statistics relating to Agriculture and Co-operative Societies generally relate to the year running from July to June. All the other tables relate either to the fiscal year ending 31st March or to the calendar year, and where the latter is the case the fact is clearly indicated in the tables. The alterations made in the present issue of the Abstract are stated below :—

No. 70—*Quantity and Value (excluding duty) of Salt Produced.*—Figures of production of Salt at Aden have, for the first time, been incorporated in this table.

No. 90—*Tributes from Indian States.*—The title of the table has been altered to "Tributes and Contributions from Indian States". The form of the table has been recast so as to show 'Tributes', 'Contributions' and 'Peshkash and Subsidy' separately. Figures for nine previous years have been revised.

No. 164—*Area of Forest Lands, Outturn of Produce, and Revenue and Expenditure of Forest Department.*—The three columns for Revenue, Expenditure and Surplus have been deleted. Figures of Forest Revenue and Expenditure are given in tables Nos. 87 and 88.
