Page 164 of the Appendices.

I.

To Rule 14-A

add after "preceding rule."

"The scale of remuneration proposed will be sanctioned by the Collector, except when extra allowances are proposed for pátels, in which case the sanction of the Commissioner should be obtained to the grant of the extra allowances."

II.

To Rule 14-B at end

add—

"The revised salaries will be communicated to the Collector for sanction, and when necessary under Rule 14-A, the Collector will obtain the previous sanction of the Commissioner."

III.

In foot-note (1)—

Substitute

(1) the words "sanctioned by proper authority" *for* the words "sanctioned by Government" and (2) the words "(G. Rs. No. 4951, dated 1st July 1895, and No. 5941, dated 26th August 1902)" *for* the words (G. R. No. 4951, dated 1st January 1895).
