AHMADNAGAR.

NOTES FOR THE REVISION OF VOLUME XVII.

Area.—Four villages with an area of 27 square miles were transferred to the Poona Collectorate in 1887 and one village with an area of 6 square miles was added to this district from Poona. To meet these changes, and to accord with the measurement of the Revision Survey carried out in 1875—1900, the area of the district has been reduced from 6,666 (1882-83) to 6,586 square miles. Revision Survey.—The Revision Survey, of which the rates were introduced between 1875—1900, showed an increase in the total culturable area of 105,223 acres in the 9 talukas of the district out of 11 for which the figures of the Original Survey are available. The total culturable area of the district ascertained at the Revision Survey was 2,516,785 acres. By the revised settlement the total assessment on the Government occupied land in the 9 talukas noted, was raised by Rs. 2,30,386 from Rs. 8,95,337 to Rs. 11,25,723 equal to an increase of 25 per cent. The assessment for the district under this settlement was Rs. 13,10,563. The taluka variations are shown below:—

Plague.—The first indigenous case of plague appeared in Ahmadnagar Cantonment in September 1897. The epidemic soon spread to the city, causing 250 deaths. It thence attacked the villages in Parner and Shrigonda talukas. The district suffered severely in 1903-04. The total mortality up to the end of that year was 28,651 or 3 per cent of the total population:—
