CORRECTION SLIPS

TO THE BOMBAY CRIMINAL TRIBES SETTLEMENTS
DEPARTMENT MANUAL, 1933.

At the end of the Volume will be found a number of blank quarter pages numbered consecutively. Instead of issuing separate correction slips for each rule amended, the Back-ward Class Office Dharwar will send out periodically one or more full pages of corrections. Each such page will bear a number corresponding to the number of the blank quarter page to which it is to be attached. Eventually each such quarter page will have attached to it three pages of corrections bearing the same page number with the addition of the letters A, B, and C. On each correction page the correction to each separate rule will be given a separate item number, so that, by quoting both the page and item numbers, the correction can be readily traced.

The system of correction to be adopted is as follows :—

When correction slips are accumulated in sufficient number, the B. C. O. will send them to the Press (through Government for approval where necessary) in pages duly numbered. When the slips are received from the Press, the officers supplied with the Manual will make reference to the correction page and the item number in ink in the margin of the rule affected, or where an additional rule is issued, in the margin opposite to the place where such rule should be read, and attach the correction pages in their proper place at the end of the book.
