LAND UTILISATION IN MADHYA PRADESH

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In a developing economy the management of land in an efficient way is assuming greater importance to feed the increasing population and also to accelerate the growth of industrial sector.

In this article an attempt is made to study as to how far the land in Madhya Pradesh has been put into use by its peasantry in 1972-73.** The year chosen for study pertains to the fourth year of the Fourth Five-Year Plan. The data needed for this paper have been collected mostly from the "Agricultural Statistics, Madhya Pradesh—1973" published by the Directorate of Agriculture, Government of Madhya Pradesh.

Land utilisation

As an important factor of production, the land has a special significance and land utilisation study forms a part and parcel of the broader field of "Land Economics". Table I throws light on the pattern of land utilisation in Madyh Pradesh during 1972-73.
