I have the honour to submit the Annual Report of the Department of Land Records for the year ending 31st July 1910.

2. I have pleasure in repeating the commendations made by me last year on the work of the Superintendents. I am under special obligations to Mr. Gordon, Superintendent of Land Records and Registration, Northern Division, who has rendered me much personal assistance in the solution of practical difficulties. The appointment of the Personal Assistant was abolished during the course of this year (Government Resolution No. 2945 of 30th April 1910) and I have already brought to the notice of Government the good work done by Mr. Anjangaonkar in the Department.

Department of Land Records.

CHAPTER I.

PREFATORY.

The office of the Settlement Commissioner and Director of Land Records was held by me throughout the year except from 23rd April to 26th May 1910, during which period the Hon'ble Mr. G. S. Curtis, I. C. S., was in charge of the Department.

2. The personnel of the Department consisted of the following officers :---

(1) Superintendent, Land Records and Registration, Northern Division.—Mr. G. Wiles, I. C. S., Assistant Collector, Broach, was in charge of the office in addition to his own duties from 1st August to 3rd September 1909, during the absence of Mr. R. G. Gordon, I. C. S., on privilege leave. Mr. Gordon held charge of the Division for the remainder of the year.

(2) Superintendent, Land Records and Registration, Central Division.—Ráo Bahádur H. V. Sathe held charge of the Division throughout the year except for a period of three months (from 26th April to 26th July 1910) during which time he was on privilege leave, the charge being held by Mr. G. H. Anjangaonkar.

(3) Superintendent, Land Records and Registration, Southern Division.—Mr. A. W. W. Mackie, I. C. S., held charge of the Division up to 30th October 1909 from which date he proceeded on furlough. Mr. W. Greer, I. C. S., held charge of the Division for the remainder of the year.

(4) Assistant Settlement Officer, Talukdári Survey.-Khán Bahádur P. R. Mehta was in charge of the office throughout the year.

(5) Superintendent, Government Photozinco Department.—Mr. J. A. McIver was in charge of the Department throughout the year.

3. In October 1939 I visited Ahmedabad for personal discussion of Gujarát Lard Record problems with the Superintendent. In November I attended a Conference of Sind Officers in the camp of the Commissioner in Sind for the discussion of the Record of Rights and other Land Record matters affecting Sind and subsequently inspected the Central Record office at Hyderabad. In December I toured in the Dhárwár District for the examination of the Revision Settlement proposals of the Ránebennur and Bankápur Tálukás and also inspected the District Survey office at Dhárwár. In January and February 1910 I toured in the Ratnágiri and Kánara Districts for the inspection of the Record of Rights and the new Village Account Forms. I inspected the Village Accountants' classes and the District Survey office of the Kánara District and examined the Watap Survey work in Ratnágiri. I again toured in the Dhárwár District in the month of February 1910 for the examination of the Settlement proposals of the Kod and Hangal Tálukas. In March I visited East and West Khandesh and inspected Pot Hissa measurement work, the Record of Rights and the new Village Account Forms and also visited the District Survey office at Dhulia. In April I visited Surat and in July Alimedabad, in order to consult with the Collector about the surveys required to introduce a suburban extension and development scheme.

Superintendents' movements and supervision.

4. All the three Superintendents visited all the Districts in their Divisions for the supervision and inspection of the work of the Land Records Staff, Survey classes, Record of Rights and Mutation Registers and the examination of Survey work in progress in their respective Divisions.

CHAPTER II.

LAND RECORDS ESTABLISHMENTS.

5. Establishments under the Superintendents of Land Records and Registration.—These establishments are principally employed on survey work and the outturn of their work is described in Chapter III of this report.

6. Training of Junior Civilians in Survey.—In accordance with the orders contained in Government Resolution No. 12119, dated 27th November 1908, arrangements were made for the first time for instructing Junior Civilians in their own Divisions under the supervision of the Divisional Superintendents instead of in a Central Class at Poona. Four Junior Civilians and one probationary Deputy Collector went through the survey course and all were granted certificates of qualification.

Training of Circle Inspectors in Survey and Settlement.

7. Central classes for training newly appointed Circle Inspectors in survey were opened in September 1909 at the head-quarter towns in all the three Divisions under the supervision of the Superintendents, Land Records and Registration. The method of conducting the class was as an experimental measure varied from that employed in previous years, mainly with the object of allowing the learners a longer period of independent measurement work.

The course was divided into three parts-

- (1) preliminary training,
- (2) instruction in the field under Surveyors of the Field Parties, and
- (3) entirely independent measurement work.

The course succeeded fairly well in imparting a good field training, but it entailed much practical inconvenience and expense. The views expressed by the Honourable Mr. Gibb as to the right way of getting the district measurement work done are now held, I believe, without exception not only by the Commissioners but by all the Collectors in the Presidency and by all superior Land Record officers.

The subjoined table shows the result of the classes held during the year in the three Divisions :---

Training of Village Accountants.

8. Classes for the training of Village Accountants in survey were as usual held at convenient centres and supervised by the District Inspectors and General Duty Inspectors, specially selected Circle Inspectors acting as Instructors. The practical course of instruction adopted during the past year was that approved in paragraph 2 of Government Resolution No. 12085, dated 14th December 1969. Under this course the preliminary test of Village Accountants was dispensed with and in lieu of the final examination prescribed by rule 14 of the rules sanctioned in Government Resolution No. 628, dated 31st January 1901, each candidate was required to measure and map the sub-divisions of 5 Survey Numbers in his own village—the work to be subsequently examined by the District Inspector and tested by the Superintendent.

In most districts the District Inspectors have not had time to test the work turned out and the final certificates of competency have therefore not been issued. No useful comparison can therefore be made of columns 4, 5, 6 and 7 with column 3 in the attached return of the training classes :—

9. The expenditure incurred on the Village Accountants' Classes during the year ending 31st March 1910 was Rs. 4,953-15-9 against Rs. 10,768-6-4. The decrease in the expenditure is mainly due to the fact that all the classes in the Northern Division and those in Ahmednagar in the Central Division were postponed till May 1910.

District Survey Offices.

10. District Survey Offices were the same in number as in the previous year. The Superintendents made a detailed inspection of all the offices in their respective Divisions and their notes of inspection were forwarded to the Collectors and Commissioners concerned through this office.

11. The Central Record Office at Broach which has charge of the Survey Records of the five Gujarát Districts, was found to have turned out a creditable amount of work. An important piece of work carried out by this office was the preparation and completion of a detailed list of the measurement record saved from the Surat fire, referred to in paragraph 15 of the report for 1908-1909. The Daftar of this office requires re-arrangement and a new "Ferist" or Index List and the work will be undertaken as soon ascertain structural additions to the stands have been carried out by the Public Works Department.

12. Special attention was given by the Superintendent and by myself to the Thána District Office and arrangements are in progress for sorting and reducing the bulk of the Records which is swollen by large quantities of obsolete and useless matter.

13. Special enquiries were also made into the condition of the Land Records known in the Konkan as the Suds, and proposals will shortly be submitted for their improvement. There is a general consensus of opinion that they are now in a state of great confusion and that therough revision and rewriting in a new shape are very necessary.

14. The work of the Central Division offices was found to be generally satisfactory and there has been an improvement in Násik where the work was badly reported on last year.

The work done by the District Survey Offices in the Southern Division was satisfactory.

15. Detailed instructions have been issued with a view to prevent the needless disintegration of survey numbers which will, it is hoped, reduce correction work greatly.

District Inspectors.

16. The routine work performed by District Officers is exhibited in Statement IV of Appendix C. In West Khándesh a District Inspector whose work was found to be bad was reverted and replaced by another man. The District Inspectors of Kaira and Sátára do not appear to have examined the work of the repair of marks in any village while the examination of such work by the District Inspector, Ahmedabad, was confined to 2 villages only. The rest appear to have taken a larger test of the work.

From column 7 of Statement II it appears that classification work was carried out by Circle Inspectors in Ahmedabad, Kaira, Sátára, Belgaum and Bijápur, but no test of the work appears to have been taken by the District Inspectors concerned.

With one or two exceptions their work is well reported on.

In pursuance of the orders contained in Government Resolution No. 6348, dated 1st July 1909, a class was held in Poona in September-October 1909 for the training of Junior District Inspectors in theodolite and plane table. The class was conducted by the late Mr. B. H. Pavri, Lecturer in Engineering in the College of Science. Four District Inspectors and one Assistant District Inspector attended the class and all obtained certificates of qualification.

Circle Inspectors.

17. Statement I of Appendix C shows the routine inspection performed by Circle Inspectors. The details of their measurement and classification work will be found in Statement II of Appendix C and their work in connection with the Record of Rights will be noticed later.

18. The repair of boundary marks (vide columns 10—13 of Appendix C) was generally carried out as in the preceding year in accordance with the old system sanctioned in Government Resolution No. 10527, dated 27th November 1906, but the year under report was, in this as in other respects, a period of transition. The grouping of villages for repair work is being revised on the lines mentioned in paragraph 21 of last year's report and the full effects of the change will not be apparent until some years have passed. But it seems clear that considerable improvement has already resulted and still more may be expected in the future, especially if care is taken to prevent any friction in the accounts offices and consequent delay in the provision of funds.

Measurement Work.

19. The details of measurement and classification work performed by Circle Inspectors are given in Statement II of Appendix C. The measurement work is in arrears in every district but notably so in the Southern Division.

20. The new system devised for exercising control and supervision over the measurement work of Circle Inspectors, reference to which was made in paragraph 26 of the report for 1908-1909, was introduced as an experimental measure in 8 or 10 districts in all three Divisions.

It appears to have worked well in facilitating supervision and control and has already been finally approved and generally adopted in the Northern and Southern Divisions.

The result of the test taken by Sub-Divisional Officers of the work of Village Accountants and Circle Inspectors is contained in Statement III of Appendix C.

Measurement of Sub-Divisions.

22. The amount of work turned out during the year under report was small. The work which has up to now been done has been largely of an experimental nature conducted by efforts of individual officers on a basis of voluntary contributions. The experiments have been successful: the work done has been a valuable addition to the Record of Rights and is likely to be most useful to the ryots who have paid for it. But this experimental method cannot be continued indefinitely and no substantial or uniform progress may be looked for until the law has been amended so as to legalize the levy of charges to cover the cost of survey.

23. In Gujarát a special reason for delay has been the special difficulties arising out of the fact that the original survey field books have mostly been destroyed. Much of the sub-division measurement work already done has had to be discarded as useless because it was based on the bad system of a mere scale enlargement of the village map.

24. In the Southern Division it is only in one taluka of the Bijapur District (Hungund) that any substantial amount of work was done (5,342 sub-divisions).

25. The work done in the Central Division was as follows :--

26. It is hoped that early orders will be passed on the question of the method to be followed in the distribution of the assessment of a Survey Number (vide Government Resolution No. 10524 of 21st November 1910, end of paragraph 8) as this question is closely connected with the question of Survey.

Circle Books.

27. In Ahmedabad, Kaira, Panch Maháls, Broach, East and West Khándesh, Ratnágiri and Kolába the compilation work was fully up-to-date. In the rest of the districts the work was more or less in arrears as will be seen from the details given in Statement V of Appendix C.

CHAPTER III.

SURVEY AND SETTLEMENT WORK.

REVENUE SURVEY WORK.

Northern Division.

28. Two special establishments continued to be entertained in this Division :-

(1) A Field Party consisting of 6 permanent surveyors and 3 temporary hands.

(2) A staff of 5 Register Writers at the Central Record Office, Broach. The Field Party were fully employed during the field season and the amount of work done by them was adequate.

29. The temporary staff of five Register Writers was chiefly employed on the preparation of Himáyat statements, copying of Kachha and Pakka classification books and Akarbands. An additional establishment of 11 temporary hands and one daftarband was also entertained from January to May last for indexing the fair field books of some of the tálukas of Gujarát.

30. The Central Record Office at Broach which has charge of the survey records of the five Gujarát Districts, in addition to its work of carrying out corrections in survey records and supplying extracts of survey papers to Government Officers and private individuals, was also employed on the preparation of the Revision Settlement papers of the Kálol Táluka in the Panch Maháls District and other miscellaneous work of arranging the measurement and classification books of the Hálol Mahál and entering revision survey numbers in the fair field books of the Hálol and Dohad Maháls.

31. The District Survey Office at Thána carried out similar correction and miscellaneous copying work in respect of that District. The services of the temporary hands entertained under Government Resolution No. 2367, dated 6th March 1908, Revenue Department, for preparing copies of Warkas Phalni Classification books for the Thána District, were dispensed with from 6th Juno last when that work was finished. At present there are two special Circle Inspectors, one appointed for preparing "Kam Jasti Patraks" or Survey Record Mutation slips regarding Udafa survey numbers and the other appointed for measuring the villages of Valnai and Wadhwán in this District.

32. The surveyors worked under the general supervision of the Superintendent who during the course of his tour tested their work, made inquiries regarding Himáyat assessments and measurement cases. He also supervised the measurement of Sub-Divisions in Bárdoli and tested the City Survey Work of Bándra and Godhra.

SURVEY OF THE TALUKDARI ESTATES.

Ahmedabad.

33. One classing and three measuring parties continued during the year to work on the survey of the Ahmedabad Tálukdári Estates. Two of the measuring parties carried out field work in 54 villages of the Dhandhuka Táluka, while the third did similar work in 30 villages of the Gogha Mahál till the end of the season. The total area measured by all the three parties amounted to 121,935 acres in Dhandhuka and 64,678 acres in Gogha Mahál or a total of 186,613 acres as against 290,434 acres in the preceding year. The exceptionally large outturn of the preceding year was due to the fact that of the villages measured many were measured in detail at the time of the original survey. The number of working days fell from 12,401 in 1908-1909 to 10,475 in 1909-1910, the measurers being sent to the Head-quarter Office and employed on clerical work at the end of the season since it was too late to commence fresh measurement work in new villages. These facts account for the decrease in the year's measurement work.

The operations of the classing party were confined to the Dhandhuka Táluka, where an area of 229,121 acres was classed in 65 villages. The outturn was nearly double the average of the previous years owing to the fact that the Bhál traot of Dhandhuka is remarkably uniform and most of it is waste formed into large survey numbers. The work was tested by the superior officers concerned. It is expected that the remaining field work in Ahmedabad, which chiefly consists of the measurement of 25 villages and classification of 98 villages, will be accomplished in the current season, and that the whole of the Ahmedabad survey will be brought to a close by March 1912. The expenditure incurred on the erection of boundary marks amounted to Rs. 870 as against Rs. 24,035-10-9 in the preceding year. The decrease in the expenditure is due to the fact that stone-quarries were available in the vicinity of the villages from which the occupants dug out the required stones.

The Panch Mahals.

34. A mixed party consisting of 15 measurers and 5 classers was employed in this District. The field work done by the 15 measurers till the end of March last in the 17 villages of the Mehtral Estate in the Godhra

Táluka, consisted of the measurement of 21,887 acres; while the remaining 5 classers classed an area of 47,474 acres in the villages of the Mehtral Estate of the Godhra Táluka and in the villages of the Limdi and Golana Estates of the Dohad Táluka. Both these operations were duly tested by the officers concerned. In this District no amount was spent on the

erection of boundary marks. The field work in the Panch Maháls as originally proposed has now been completed, but in view of the orders in Government Resolution Nó. 7203, dated 10th August 1910, survey operations are being extended to the Tálukdári Estates in the Western Maháls.

The recess examination of the field work done during the season of 1909-1910 was completed during the last rains both in Ahmedabad and Panch Maháls Districts.

REVENUE SURVEY WORK.

Central Division.

35. The special establishments which continued to work in this Division during the year were :---

(1) The Central Division Field Party consisting of measurers and surveyors retained under Government Resolution No. 7156, dated 14th July 1908.

(2) Two additional Field Parties entertained under Government Resolution No. 9516, dated 21st September 1909.

(3) The Survey Daftardár, Central Division's Office Establishment.

(4) The establishment employed in prep aring scale remuneration statements under the Survey Daftardár, Central Division.

(5) The temporary establishment attached to the Survey Daftardár's office for the preparation of Waslewar books of the Newasa Táluka in the Ahmednagar District.

(6) Temporary establishment for recess examination of the measurement and classification work done by the Nandgaon Field Party sanctioned under Government Resolution No. 10989, dated 13th November 1909.

(7) Temporary establishment for the preparation of duplicate copies of skarbands of certain villages of the Sángli State and of the Sátára, Násik and East Khándesh Districts.

36. The survey work turned out by the Central Division and the two additional Field Parties may be summarised as follows:—

(1) Thirty-four villages were completely measured and classed; eight villages were only completely measured; four villages were partly measured; while a rough survey of four villages was also completed by these parties. Over and above this, the second additional field party measured and classed the disforested lands in 49 villages of the Nándgaon Táluka covering an area of 37,786 acres. This party was also employed on the sub-division measurement work.

The total area measured by the Central Division Field Party amounted to 36,513 acres; while that measured by the two additional Field Parties was (18,295 + 51,860 =) 70,155 acres. Similarly the classification work turned out by the Central Division Field Party covered an area of 34,198 acres and that by the two additional parties an area of (14,722+51,595=) 66,317 acres. As compared with the preceding year, the outturn is smaller due chiefly to the fact that the number of villages as also the total area dealt with during the year under the original survey system was much larger than in the preceding year.

All the three Field Parties worked under the immediate supervision of the Head Surveyors and the Superintendent himself tested their work in 17 villages and found it to be satisfactory.

In addition to the survey work the Surveyors of the Central Division Field Party were deputed to instruct the Circle Inspectors' Class at Poona.

A special establishment consisting of 2 Surveyors, one of whom belonged to the Southern Division Field Party, was employed during the year in checking the map of the Nagar Cantonment and 8 measurers were employed on the work of demarcating the roads in the Násik District under the orders contained in Government Resolutions No. 6275 of 8th December 1909, General Department, and No. 2529, dated 18th March 1910, Revenue Department.

37. The work of calculating assessments on revision settlements, for which the offices of the Survey Daftardárs were principally created, has now been very much simplified by the orders contained in Government Resolution No. 10380, dated 27th October 1909, and the work can be performed in the District Survey Offices concerned. I have accordingly proposed to Government the abolition of the post of the Survey Daftardár, Central Division, and his establishment from 1st January 1911. The Survey Daftardár, Southern Division, will continue for the present as a considerable number of settlement reports is due from the Southern Division in the course of the next two or three years.

REVENUE SURVEY WORK.

Southern Division.

38. The Field Party in this division consists of 6 permanent Surveyors. They were fully employed during the field season and the monsoon and the work done by them was adequate.

In the Ratnágiri District in addition to the Field Party Surveyors, special establishments were employed on the measurement of Párdi lands as also on the correction of Survey Records according to partitions in 15 villages. Another temporary establishment of 6 men recopied Suds in several villages of the tálukas of Chiplún, Sangameshwar and Ratnágiri and of the Guhágar Petha and also prepared Botkhats of 7 villages of the Rájápur Táluka. Four temporary men were engaged on preparing duplicates of revised Botkhats of the Vengurla Táluka. A further establishment of 2 temporary hands sanctioned by this office entered assessment figures in Botkhats and Jangal Khardas of the Gaonkhadi Village in the Rájápur Táluka.

A temporary clerk was entertained for copying Tippan Books of 490 Survey Numbers of the Inám village of Sankeshwar in the Belgaum District and a temporary establishment of 3 hands was employed on the work of repairing torn survey papers in the Dhárwár District for a period of 7 months. In the Kánara District one measurer was employed for preparing tank lists for the Haliyál, Sirsi, Siddápur and Yellápur Tálukas.

39. The work turned out by the Survey Daftardár, Southern Division, and the temporary establishments under him, consisted of the calculation of revised assessments and entering them in the A'kárbands of 130 villages of the Karajgi Táluka of the Dhárwár District as also of the calculation of assessments and preparation of the Sud and Kayam Dar Takta of the Gaoakhadi Village of the Rájápur Táluka in the Ratnágiri District.

40. The Superintendent's test in respect of measurement and classification work extended to the survey work of two Inám villages, the reclassification work done in connection with certain irrigated lands in 3 villages of the Karajgi Táluka, the water classification of the survey numbers irrigated by the Jekkeri Hond Tank at Belgaum and the Párdi measurement work. He also tested the measurement of sub-divisions and the partition work carried out under Civil Courts' decrees.

REVENUE SETTLEMENT WORK.

Northern Division.

41. Revised rates were announced in the Kálol Táluka of the Panch Maháls District, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,353 and the Revision Settle-B 1535-3 ment proposals for the Government villages of the Jhálod Mahál of the same District, submitted last year, were sanctioned by Government.

Central Division.

42. Settlement proposals were submitted for 9 Inám villages and 1 Government village by the Superintendent, Land Records and Registration, Central Division, and those submitted during the preceding year for the Nandurbár Táluka of the West Khándesh District, received the sanction of Government at the close of 1909-1910. Individual Settlements were introduced in 13 alienated villages in the Central Division.

Southern Division.

43. Second Revision Settlement proposals were submitted for the talukas of Kod, Hangal and Dharwar in the Dharwar District by the Superintendent, Land Records and Registration, Southern Division, along with the original settlement report of the village of Narsapur in the Gadag Taluka; while revised rates were announced in the Karajgi, Muddebihal and Gadag Talukas and also in the Narsapur Village of the Gadag Taluka with the result specified as under:--

Revision Settlement proposals for the Kárwár Táluka were also sanctioned during the year; while those for the Ankola Táluka were submitted by Ráo Bahádur Yennemadi.

City Survey.

44. City Survey operations were in progress at Bándra and Godhra in the Northern Division and Ahmednagar and Igatpuri in the Central Division during the year under report. The survey work has been completed in Bándra, Ahmednagar and Igatpuri and inquiry work is proceeding. The survey work at Godhra is taking much longer time than was expected and it is not likely to be closed till March next as the amount of survey work to be done has turned out to be nearly double of what was originally estimated. The City Survey operations were supervised by the Superintendents concerned, who paid frequent visits to test the work in progress.

Government Photozinco Department.

45. The work turned out by the Department during the period of 12 months from 1st August 1909 to 31st July 1910, was 2,481,241 pulls valued approximately at Rs. 1,36,488-1-0 at a total cost of Rs. 1,01,834-1-0 leaving a balance of Rs. 34,654 in favour of this Department. This is above the average of the past ten years and the management of the Department is highly satisfactory.

During the year under report an important addition was made to the personnel of the Department by the appointment of a European Third Assistant Superintendent in the Photographic Branch and proposals for effecting certain alterations in the cadre of the Photographic and Drawing Branches with the view of increasing the efficiency of the establishment have been recently submitted to Government.

CHAPTER IV.

RECORD OF RIGHTS.

46. The preparation of the initial Record was undertaken and completed in the Mulshi Petha of the Poona District, in the Bágevádi and Sindgi Tálukas of the Bijápur District and in the Vengurla Táluka of the Ratnágiri District. It was also undertaken in a number of Sharakati villages in the different districts of the Presidency in pursuance of the orders contained in Government Resolution No. 2568, dated 12th March 1909.

47. The Records completed in the previous year were announced in-

The preparation of the initial Record is now complete in talukas and pethas as a whole throughout the Presidency Proper.

48. During the year under report good progress has been made in the removal of some of the mechanical difficulties in the maintenance of the Record and its Mutation Register. New and simpler forms have been approved and are now in process of introduction; circular orders have been issued which will greatly simplify the method of recording mutations; the mutations in ordinary tenancies are now to be separated both as regards procedure and as regards the place of record from other more important mutations; and the instructions for the maintenance of the Registers are in future to be executive instructions free from the inconvenient rigidity of the old remarks and instructions which were embodied in the Rules under the Act and therefore had the force of law. The coincidence of all these changes with the first general periodical revision and re-writing of the Record and also with radical changes in the whole system of Land Revenue collection and accounting have rendered the past year a year of special strain and difficulty for the revenue establishments, and the strain and difficulty will continue until the period of transition has been passed through. We will however emerge with a new or amended Land Revenue Code and Record-of-Rights Act and newly prepared Records; and when these Records have been linked up with those parts of the Village and Táluka Accounts Machinery, which are still sound and useful, an all-round increase of efficiency and accuracy may be expected.

Revised rates of assessment were introduced in the Lírkána, Kámbar and Ráto-dero tálukas during the year under report. Appendix A shows the financial results of the new rates in these tálukas. Proposals for the revision of rates in the tálukas referred to in the previous year's report are under the consideration of the Commissioner and some of them will shortly be submitted to Government.

2. Appendix B shows the nature and amount of work done during the year under report and in 1908-1909 in the Survey and Map Department of the Head Record Office. The figures in columps 2 to 16 show that, in spite of increased demands, the arrears were appreciably reduced. Unfortunately, owing to the carelessness of the late Head Record-keeper, the number of maps of which no copies remain and which, in consequence, have to be prepared for the Photozinco Office, is very large. This is slow work requiring considerable skill and care, and, though under pressure the draughtsmen have produced 203 maps during the year under report as compared with 115 in the previous year, it is not expected that the arrears will be worked off in less than 3 years.

Five hundred and forty-eight survey registers were prepared (columns 25 to 27) as against 915 in 1908-1909. Of these 266 were written up in full, while in the case of the remaining 282, those columns only which relate to assessment and canal clearance rebate were filled up. These registers and those shown in column 33 refer to tálukas Sánghar, Khipro, Mirpurkhás and Cháchro in the Thar and Párkar District, Ghotki and Mirpur Máthelo in the Sukkur District, Labdaria, Ráto-dero, Nasirabad, Dádu and Sehwan in the Lárkána District, and Sháhdadpur and Sákrand in the Hyderabad District.

3. The first, second and third copies of 184, 269 and 77 survey registers respectively were completed with the exception of the assessment column. The three copies are intended respectively for the use of the Record Office, the táluka offices and the village establishment. These registers belong to tálukas Lárkána, Ráto-dero, Nasirabad, Labdaria, Badin, Guni, Tando Bago, Garhi Yásin and Sukkur. In addition to these the first copies of 197 registers for tálukas Sháhdadpur, Sánghar, Khipro and Labdaria were completed, while in those of 123 others the names of occupants were entered.

4. The comparatively small amount of survey register work done during the year under report is due to the fact that the preparation in the Record Office of fresh survey registers for talukas where new rates of assessment had to be introduced was held up until it was decided definitely in what talukas survey registers were to be prepared on the basis of the Record-of-Rights.

5. Corrections were carried out in 5,261 survey numbers, due, in the case of 2,163 survey numbers, to reservation under sections 37 and 38 of the Land Revenue Code, and in the remaining 3,098 to survey work by tapadárs in revenue employ. As usual two copies of the *Ghat-wadh* register for all these numbers were prepared, one for Head Record Office and the other for taluka offices. Entries with regard to 415 survey numbers were tested in the Superintendent's office; and mistakes, which were found in 4 numbers only, were duly corrected. There was, besides, the usual miscellaneous work in connection with enquiries and references from the various districts, and the entry of new measurements in the office copies of maps in the Head Record Office.

6. Appendix C shows the details of survey work done by tapadárs (apart from that done by survey parties), the papers of which were received for scrutiny in the Head Record Office. Of the 4 Zabits on the temporary establishment appointed to do the work of scrutiny in the Record Office, one has been employed since May 1909, in the verification, sorting and arranging of survey papers received from táluka offices. In spite of censiderable assistance (in the case of 3,211 survey numbers) from tapadárs of the Survey Party, the result of which is evidenced in the larger outturn of work, the arrears rose during the year from 3,413 to 3,469 survey numbers. This is due to the increased amount of work received for scrutiny. The Zabits had, in addition to their own work, to copy 638 survey numbers from survey registers and 532 from Ghat-wadh registers for Mukhtiárkars.

The Superintendent asked for the services of a temporary Munshi for the examination of papers received by him from taluka offices. The provisional sanction to the appointment accorded by the Commissioner in Sind was approved by Government in their Resolution No. 10324, dated the 14th November 1910.

7. The number of Revenue Surveyors employed was 6. Of these one has Survey work. usual, employed in the office of the Colonization Officer, Jámráo Canal. Of the remaining three, one was in charge of a Survey Party, and the other two did survey work in the Shikárpur táluka independently of the party.

8. Appendix D gives details of the work done by the Survey Party and tests thereof taken by the Superintendent and the Surveyor in charge. 3,547 survey numbers, with an area of 19,015 acres, were measured by the Survey Party, as compared with 11,397 survey numbers measuring 61,888 acres done by three parties in the previous year. The causes of the more than proportionate decrease in the amount of work done were (a) the scattered nature of the work and the presence of jungle on the land to be measured, and (b) the fact that the lands which were to be measured in the Upper Sind Frontier District were cut up by new canals, thereby making the work difficult and tedious. The test taken by the Surveyor (512 survey numbers) and the Superintendent (163 survey numbers) showed that the measuring was on the whole correct and accurate, the errors discovered being few and small.

9. The Survey Party commenced field work on November 1st as usual and completed it on April 18th. Recess work commenced on April 25th. The tapadárs attached to the Party plotted 3,547 survey numbers on to maps. Entries and plotting in the case of 205 survey numbers were tested by the Superintendent. Errors and omissions were discovered in 19 survey numbers and duly corrected.

10. The two Surveyors working independently of Parties had to measure lands in taluka Shikarpur through which the Choi canal passes. 862 survey numbers measuring 2,457 acres were completed. The Superintendent tested 22 survey numbers and discovered no error of consequence. Of the 862 survey numbers plotted and entered in registers during the rocess, 42 were tested. No error was found. The Superintendent also tested 27 survey numbers out of the 1,079 survey numbers (covering 12,635 acres) measured by the Hab Survey Party of Special Tapadárs, and found no error of importance. The survey papers of a Revenue Surveyor who had done measurement with the theodolite in the preceding year in Mirzapur jághir were also examined. 4 blocks measuring 1,052 acres were comprised in this test.

11. During his tour, the Superintendent also tested some of the field work of the village establishment in tálukas Moro, Naushahro, Kandiáro, Lárkána, Dádu, Sehwan and Kotri, and Mahál Mánjhand. Of the 41 numbers examined, an error of 4 per cent. and over was discovered in 4 survey numbers.

12. The examination by the Superintendent of Survey papers of revenue tapadárs in the Thar and Párkar, Hyderabad, Sukkur, Lárkána and Karáchi Districts relating to 1,671 survey numbers showed errors, more or less slight, in 884 survey numbers. These were corrected. 13. Nine táluka Munshis and clorks were sent up for three months' survey training. At the end of the period they were examined, and all qualified. They were attached to the Survey Party and measured 91 survey numbers in the Sháhdadpur táluka of the Hyderabad District. A test of 18 survey numbers was taken by the Superintendent and no error exceeding 1 per cent. detected.

14. The usual survey class was attended by 2 Assistant Collectors, 7 Mukhtiárkars and 1 Mahálkari. At the end of a six weeks' course they were examined and all qualified with the exception of one Mukhtiárkar.

15. Those tapadárs who had received only two months' tuition or were said to have forgotten survey work were required to join the Survey Party to remedy their deficiencies. They were relieved on September 15th and returned to duty in the Revenue Department.

16. The offices of the District Registrars of Karáchi, Lárkána, Upper Sind Frontier and Hyderabad (the last after the end of the year) were examined by the Superintendent and the results communicated to the Inspector-General of Registration.

17. The subjoined table shows the results of the Superintendent's examination of Táluka Forms Nos. 35 and 36. Details of the errors and omissions were communicated to the Sub-Divisional Officers for transmission to the táluka officials concerned :—

Most of the errors discovered were of a slight nature.

18. The total cost of the Land Record Office including the cost of measurement and demarcation by the Survey Party and the Revenue Surveyors was Rs. 40,521-13-9. This excludes the pay, etc., of the tapadárs in the Survey Party which is met direct by the Revenue Department.

In addition to this the arrears of enquiry and test work, existing at the end of the previous year in the Hala taluka of the Hyderabad District, Kandhkot and Sháhdadpur tálakas of the Upper Sind Frontier District and Sinjhoro táluka of the Thar and Párkar District, and in the Lárkána táluka, were disposed of during the year under report. In the Shikarpur taluka of the Sukkur District the work which remained to be done at the end of 1908-09 was finally completed shortly after the close of the year. In the course of the year under report it came to the Commissioner's notice that a record had been inadvertently prepared in the case of agricultural lands situated within municipal areas in the Sukkur District. Proposals were submitted to Government for the withdrawal of the exemption of all the municipal areas in this district from the operation of the Record-of-Rights Act, and these proposals were sanctioned in Government Resolution No. 7373, dated the 16th August 1910. The Collector now reports that a record has yet to be prepared for (1) the survey numbers within the municipal limits of Sukkur and Rohri, (2) unoccupied survey numbers in all the talukas of the district except Shikarpur and Garhi Yásin and (3) in a deh in the Garhi Yásin táluka which has been recently surveyed. This work will be finished as soon as possible.

20. The following statement shows the progress of the work in the fiteen talukas in which it was undertaken in the year of report :---

At the end of the year work remained in arrears in Sháhbandar, Sháhdadpur, Nasrat, Digri, Johi, Kambar and Khipro. In the first six tálukas the inquiry and test work has since been completed, while in the seventh 2,835 survey numbers were completed up to the end of January 1911, leaving a balance of 271 survey numbers only.

21. Appendix E shows the extent of the test work performed by Mukhtiárkars and Sub-Divisional Officers. The former were aided by their Head Munshis. Tests were also taken by almost all the district officers or their Daftardárs. The Collector of Karáchi made no tests during the year, but he states that the record was inspected by him in the Jati, Shahbandar and Mirpur Sakro tálukas some time after the close of the year, with, on the whole, satisfactory results. The Collector of Hyderabad, aided by his Daftardár, tested 363 entries in 8 villages of the Guni, Tando Allahyar and Shahdadpur talukas. In addition to this the Collector's Daftardar is reported to have performed some test work in the Kandiáro, Moro, Sakrand and Badin tálukas. The Daftardár to the Collector of Lárkána tested 334 and 398 entries in 22 and 15 dehs of the Kambar and Johi tálukas respectively, in addition to 50 and 41 entries in 4 and 2 dehs of the Labdaria and Lárkána tálukas in which the record had already been completed. The Collector of Sukkur verified entries with regard to 571 survey numbers in 9 dehs of the Shikárpur táluka. The Deputy Commissioner, Thar and Párkar, tested some of the entries in one deh of the Khipro taluka, and the few irregularities discovered by him in the writing up of the form were pointed out to the Mukhtiárkar and the tapadárs concerned. The Colonization Officer, Jámráo Canal, tested 5,752 entries in 18 dehs of the Digri táluka, and the Deputy Commissioner, Upper Sind Frontier, 1,764 entries in the Jacobabad and 694 in the Shahdadpur talukas. The tests taken by Mukhtiárkars are much in excess of the percentage prescribed. Those taken by the Sub-Divisional Officers also exceed the prescribed minimum, except in the case of the Mirpur Sakro, Ghorabari, Kandiáro, Guni and Khipro tálukas. Steps are being taken to bring the tests in these tálukas up to the prescribed standard. As regards the test work in the Khipro taluka the Deputy Collector, Nara Valley, states as under :--

"My predecessor, Mr. Hanson, did not do any testing as the work had not made fair progress at the time he camped in the Khipro táluka. I succeeded him on the 30th May last and proceeded at once to Sanghar for the Jamábandi settlement. Thence I went to Khipro for the same purpose by about the end of June 1910. As the village officers were engaged in the Jámabandi settlement and khátedárs in cultivation operations (in Khipro as well as in other tálukas) and the inquiry work being still in progress much of testing work could not be done by me. 154 entries were, however, tested and found correct. The remaining test work will be und staken and completed by me about the beginning of the ensuing cold season."

The test work, which was mentioned in last year's report as remaining to be done in two tapas of the Umarkot taluka, was finished by the Deputy Collector, Nara Valley, during the year under report. The Superintendent, Land Records and Registration in Sind, examined the Record-of-Rights work in talukas Hala, Shahdadpur, Tando Allahyar, Naushahro Feroz, Kandiáro, Moro, Sukkur, Kotri and the Manjhand Mahal. But, as no record was kept, figures showing the extent of the work actually performed are not available. It is, however, reported that corrections in entries were mide and verbal instructions given by him where found necessary.

22. The subjoined table gives the details of the temporary establishment entertained in connection with the preparation of the record :—

No extra establishment was entertained for this work in the Kandiáro, Sákrand, Sháhdadpur, Tando Allahyar and Guni tálukas of the Hyderabad District, Kambar táluka of the Lárkána District and Kashmor táluka of the Upper Sind Frontier District.

23. Except in the case of the Shahbandar taluka of the Karachi District the Mukhtiarkars were assisted by their Head Munshis in test work and for this purpose portions of talukas within easy reach of the taluka head-quarters were constituted into temporary mahals under section 7 of the Land Revenue. Code.

24. The work is reported to have been done satisfactorily on the whole in all the districts. The Colonization Officer, Jámráo Canal, states that in some cases entries in column 9 of form I-C were made without proper authority where presession of land held under Act III of 1899 had changed hands, while in other cases the names of khátedárs and the conditions of the grants, "zamindári" or "capitalist", were incorrectly shown. The necessary corrections have been effected in the record.

25. The Record-of-Rights work did not interfere with the punctual performance of other work to any appreciable degree, but it is reported to have proved a great strain on the taluka and village establishments in many places. These establishments are now realizing that this work forms an integral portion of their regular duties.

26. The maintenance of the record is being attended to where the permanent record has been prepared. The people do not yet fully realize the

importance of the record, and in a few cases fines are reported to have been inflicted under section 8 of the Record-of-Rights Act for failure to report acquisition of rights.

27. The work of preparing fair copies of the record in tálukas in which it was undertaken in 1908-09 was taken up and completed in the year under report, with the exception of tálukas Shikárpur, Kandhkot, 23 dehs comprising the Sir Amani tract of the Sháhdadpur táluka in the Upper Sind Frontier District and tálukas Sanghar and Umarkot. In the Shikárpur, Sanghar and Umarkot tálukas the work has since been completed, while in the remaining two tálukas it was postponed pending the introduction of the revised forms of Record-of-Rights and Mutation Register. The work of fair copying was also postponed for the same reason in tálukas in which the initial record was undertaken and completed during the year. The Collector of Karáchi, bowever, reports that the record has been fair-copied in the Ghorabari and Mirpur Sakro tálukas of his district.

28. The provisions of sections 10 to 12 of the Record-of-Rights Act were extended during the year to the Tando Bago and Badin tálukas of the Hyderabad District, Răto-dero, Lárkána, Dádu and Nasirabad tálukas of the Lárkána District, Sukkur, Ghotki and Ubauro tálukas of the Sukkur District and Thul táluka of the Upper Sind Frontier District. They have been extended since the close of the year to the Hyderabad, Naushahro and Hála tálukas of the Hyderabad District, Kambar táluka of the Lárkána District, and Sanghar and Umarkot tálukas of the Thar and Párkar District. Proposals with regard to the Snikárpur táluka have been submitted to Government under this office memorandum No. 1005, dated the 29th March 1911, while those for the Sinjhoro táluka will be submitted shortly.

29. A conference of some of the district officers and the Superintendent, Land Records and Registration in Sind, at which the Honourable Mr. Pratt was present, was held by the Commissioner in November 1909 to discuss certain questions in connection with the Record-of-Rights. As a result of the conference an experiment for the utilization of the Record-of-Rights for the purposes of assessment and collection of revenue was carried out in certain tálukas by selected Sub-Divisional Officers. The experiment was reported to have proved a success though it involved a very considerable addition to the work of the village establishments concerned. It was, however, decided at the recent conference held in November last that in view of the census work the repetition of the experiment should be confined to those tálukas only where it was last carried out.
