Report on the working of the Co-operative Credit Societies Act in Coorg for the year 1906-1907.

I.—ADMINISTRATION AND TOURS.

1. During the year under report five new rural societies were registered. There are now 11 rural Co-operative Credit Societies in Coorg, namely:—

- 2. Each Society was administered by a President and by 2 or more members of Committee, aided by the same number of controllers. These office-holders assembled once a month for the disposal of important business; they assisted also at the General meetings, where members of the Society were given an opportunity of discussing matters of general interest: partaking in elections, alterations or framing of bye-laws, etc. The work of the Committee members did not, however, end with the meetings; in the interim they have much special work, such as disposal of applications for loans, preparation of security bonds, and work of ephemeral character. Loans under Rs. 50 were disposed of by the Committee members, while those exceeding this amount were confirmed by the Registrar. The time, responsibility and labour of the Committee is often considerable in view of the fact, that each loan applied for, requires careful scrutiny, not only with regard to the solvency of the person applying for it, but chiefly on account of the intricate question arising for the right and title to a share in family lands, offered as security. The management of these societies requires, therefore, shrewed business men, with tact and forboarance to no small an extent, since in every society there are a few members, who wilfully, or wantonly, want to stir up dissentions, or try to find fault with the best conducted business. The presidents have naturally to bear the brunt of this more than any one else.
- 3. There is no full time Registrar appointed for Coorg, nor is any establishment paid for by Government. The writer of this report carried out the duties of Registrar in addition to his ordinary work, i.e., Assistant Director, Land Records and Agriculture, and Settlement Officer, Coorg.

II.—SOCIETIES.

4. Each Society employed a Secretary who was responsible to the President for routine work, such as keeping of accounts and ledgers. All expenditure, including stamps paper, has been borne by the societies themselves, so that, indeed, there has been no expenditure incurred by Government on behalf of these societies in Coorg. Not only have they paid their own way, but two of them (Padinalknad and Bengunad) have contributed Rs. 19-5-7 towards a charitable institution (a native travellers' home at Napoklu).

(ix) Class of business done by each type of society.

17. Only money transactions were undertaken. It is too early as yet to contemplate:
stores of grain, seed or other Co-operative business. There is still very much to be done
in the present business lines.

(x) Custody of funds.

18. A floating advance of Rs. 50 was left with the Secretary of each society. All other funds are deposited in the Post Office Savings Banks.

IV.—RESERVE FUND.

- 19. The Reserve Fund is Rs. 2,437-13-6 and has been disposed of as follows:—
 - Rs. 1,376-0-8 utilized for purchase of Government securieties at 31 per cent.
 - Rs. 297-15-0 invested in the Post Office Savings Bank.
 - Rs. 763-13-10 has been utilized for current business.

It has been resolved that in future all the reserve fund should be invested in . Government securities.

V.-AUDIT AND INSPECTION.

20. The accounts of the societies in Coorg were audited by moonce in about 3 months. I found them carefully kept. They have also been inspected by the Revenue officers during their tours. Much trouble has also been taken by the Committee members and Controllers of most societies in examining their accounts.

VI.—RESOURCES.

21. In paragraph 7 ante details of the resources are shown. Of these Rs. 3,657-12-10 are Government loans, repayable in ten annual instalments. It is noteworthy, that, although these loans were offered for repayment 20 annual instalments, all societies preferred ten years. The 1st instalment was promptly repaid. The most important resource is the capital raised by shares. It is incumbent upon each member to take at least one share of the value of Rs. 20 payable in 5 annual instalments of Rs. 4. These shares carry no interest, but when the reserve fund has reached 25 per cent. of the aggregate capital, 75 per cent. of the annual profits will be distributed as bonus. All members who joined in 1905 have paid three instalments, the others proportionately less.

VII.—WORK DONE BY SUPERVISORS, COMMITTEE, OFFICERS, AND MEMBERS.

22. As mentioned in paragraph 4 there are no supervisors, or any officers paid by Government who work for these societies. All work was done by the Committee and the President of the societies. The under-mentioned gentlemen served on the Committee and as Controllers during the year under report:—

VIII.—DISPUTES, LITIGATION.

23. None were carried to Courts of Law.

IX.-ACTS, RULES AND BYE-LAWS.

- 24. Under section 27 of the Co-operative Credit Societies Act X of 1904, the Chief Commissioner was pleased to make rules on the following subjects:—
 - (a) On the working of the Co-operative Credit Societies in Coorg. Notification No. 27, dated 25th April 1905.
 - (b) Conditions for the grant of Government loans. Notification No. 65, dated Bangalore, 30th September 1905.
 - (c) Rules referring to disputes in respect of business. Notification No. 97, dated Bangalore, 21st December 1906.

The bye-laws were framed on the basis of those of the select Committee's report, and after approval by the Commissioner of Coorg, were proposed to the Societies, who adopted them with a few modifications, as necessity occurred.

X.—ATTITUDE OF THE PUBLIC, ETC.

- 25. These societies were on the whole favourably received by the public. There has been and is, of course, some opposition, both active and passive, which will take some time as yet to disappear. I am greatly indebted to all Revenue officers and subordinates of the Revenue Department, especially to Subedars for all help rendered. The interest taken by Revenue officers, fosters to a very great extent the confidence of the public in these societies. It is not necessary, nor advisable, to interfere with the internal management of a society. Such interference would do more harm than good; but friendly advise and sympathy, is the most valuable assistance that can be afforded. I trust, I may be permitted to mention the Subedar of Padinalknad, Mr. P. Belliappa who has always taken very keen interest in the Co-operative Credit Societies of his taluk. I am also under deep obligation to all members of Committee and Controllers for the work they have done; and most readily give them all the credit for the success. It would be inviduous on my part, were I to name some of them—most probably they would not like it—but I am sure, that I may be permitted to express my gratitude to all Presidents of the Societies, for the work they have done.
- 26. The prescribed accounts covering a period from 1st April 1906 to 30th June 1907 are appended to this report.
