REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF MINORS' ESTATES.

PROVINCE OF BOMBAY.

Northern Division.

(1) NUMBER OF ESTATES UNDER MANAGEMENT.

Northern Division.—At the beginning of the year, there were two estates (one large and one small) under management. No new estate was taken under or released from management during the year under report. The year thus closed with two estates (one large and one small) under management.

Central Division.—In the last year's administration report information about the Bhaya and the Wani Deshpande estates was incorporated as the former was under management practically for the whole year 1937-38. The Bhaya estate was handed over to the ward on July 9th, 1938 and only one estate therefore remained for management during the year under report. No new estate was taken during the year 1938-39.

Southern Division.—At the commencement of the year there were ten estates—one large in Bijapur, four small in Dharwar and five small in Belgaum. One of the small estates in Belgaum was restored to its ward on his attaining majority. No new estates were taken up for management during the year under report. The year thus closed with nine estates.

(2) INCOME.

Northern Division.— The total income of the estates amounted during the year to Rs. 21,038 as against Rs. 17,549 last year. The increase was mainly due to the encashment of cash certificates of Rs. 9,700 which became due on 12th September 1938.

Central Division.—The gross income of the estate amounted to Rs. 1,336 as against Rs. 1,413 of the previous year. The decrease is chiefly due to less income from tamarind fruits and lack of demand for cultivation of some of the land of the estate.

Southern Division.—The total gross income of the estates during the year amounted to Rs. 48,471 as against Rs. 39,146 in the preceding year. The increase is due to large receipts realised from the matured postal cash certificates in Dharwar.

Notwithstanding the release of one estate in Belgaum there has been an increase of about Rs. 600 which is attributable to the recovery of the decretal amount due to the Saptsagar Estate.

In Bijapur there has been a decrease of about Rs. 3,600. This is due to the fact that there were large realisations from matured securities during the previous year.

Dharwar recorded an increase of about Rs. 12,300 on account of matured postal cash certificates.

(3) EXPENDITURE.

Northern Division.—The total gross expenditure of the estates under management amounted to Rs. 34,007 as against Rs. 12,349 last year. The increase is chiefly due to (1) an advance of Rs. 10,000 from the Thori-Thambha estate to the Gamph estate, (2) the purchase of a house for Rs. 3,000 by the Thori-Thambha estate and (3) the purchase of five year postal cash certificates of the face value of Rs. 10,000 by the Thori Thambha estate for Rs. 8,813.

Central Division.—The gross expenditure amounted to Rs. 1,058 as against Rs. 1,922 in the previous year. The decrease is due to there being no substantial payment made to the creditors of the estate as there was no sufficient balance at the credit of the estate.

Southern Division.—The total gross expenditure of the estates during the year amounted to Rs. 59,964 as against Rs. 31,339 in the previous year. The increase is attributable to large investments in Government securities in the Dharwar district.

In Belgaum there was a decrease of Rs. 341 on account of the restoration of one estate.

Bijapur recorded an increase of Rs. 1,324 which is due to the increased expenditure on medical charges of the minor, legal proceedings and payment of municipal taxes.

In Dharwar there was an increase of Rs. 30,642 which is mainly due to the investment of funds in Government securities.

(4) COLLECTION OF ESTATES' DUES.

Northern Division.—Out of the total demand of Rs. 7,670 (inclusive of Rs. 171 on account of arrears), Rs. 7,559, were collected, leaving a balance of Rs. 111 (Rs. 4 on account of the year

under report and Rs. 107 on account of previous years). The arrears relate to the Thori Thambha estate.

Central Division.—The total demand on account of rents including the arrears was Rs. 1,092. Out of this Rs. 1,069 were collected leaving a balance of Rs. 23 uncollected at the end of the year. For the recovery of Rs. 23 out of past arrears a darkhast was filed against the debtor but it was recorded for want of bidders. A fresh attempt is however being made to recover the arrears.

Southern Division.—The total demand for recovery (including the arrears of Rs. 7,430) amounted to Rs. 14,821 as against Rs. 16,041 in the previous year. A sum of Rs. 7,688 inclusive of an over-collection of Rs. 5 was recovered during the year and Rs. 801 were written off. There was thus a balance of Rs. 6,337 outstanding for collection in the districts as shown below :—

Out of the arrears of Rs. 3,072 in Belgaum, execution proceedings in assistance suits are pending for the recovery of Rs. 2,807 and Rs. 265 are involved in statutory suspensions.

The arrears in Bijapur are also very heavy and demand speedy action. Steps for their recovery are in progress and coercive measures are being adopted wherever necessary.

The progress of collection in Dharwar appears to be satisfactory. Out of the total demand of Rs. 2,402 only Rs. 552 is in arrears. Steps to recover the arrears are in progress.

(5) GOVERNMENT REVENUE, CESSES AND RATES.

Northern Division.—All Government dues ordered to be recovered, were paid in full.

Central Division.—All Government dues were paid in full by the estate.

Southern Division.—All Government dues and cesses, etc., for the year have been paid in full by all the estates.

(6) COST OF MANAGEMENT.

Northern Division.—The total cost of management amounted to Rs. 870 or 4.1 per cent. of the gross income as against Rs. 1,152 or 6.6 per cent. for the previous year.

Central Division.—No amount was recovered during the year on account of cost of management as the estate funds were not adequate to meet them.

Southern Division.—The total cost of management for the year amounted to Rs. 2,464 or 5.08 per cent. of the gross income (Rs. 48,471) as against Rs. 3,903 or 10.0 per cent. in the preceding year. Large payments of audit fees and supervision charges in the previous year and large realisations from matured securities in the year under report in the Dharwar district account for the decrease. The percentage of cost in this district fell from 12.4 to 3.8.

In Belgaum there was a small decrease on account of the restoration of one estate and curtailment in the establishment.

The small increase of Rs. 3 in Bijapur calls for no remarks.

(7) ADVANCES TO CULTIVATORS.

Northern Division.—No advances were made to cultivators out of the funds of any managed estate.

Central Division.—No advances were made to cultivators out of the estate funds.

Southern Division.—No advances were made to cultivators out of the funds of any estate.

(8) SPECIAL SCHEMES FOR MANAGEMENT.

Northern Division.—Both the estates were managed departmentally and no special scheme was necessary for their management.

Central Division.—No special scheme for management was framed or undertaken.

Scuthern Division.-No special scheme for the management of the estates was framed or undertaken in any district.

(9) MAINTENANCE AND EDUCATION OF MINORS.

Northern Division.—The total gross expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 5,219 as against Rs. 5,845 last year. The decrease is mainly due to the release of the Timbi estate from management.

There are four minors (all males). Two of them study in English High Schools and the other two, having given up studies, reside with their grand-mother whom they belp in her domestic affairs. Central Division.—A monthly allowance of Rs. 35 is sanctioned to the family but it could not be paid in full as the balance at the credit of the estate did not permit payment. The wards are in very straitened circumstances. The elder ward has passed the Matriculation Examination and is in search of Government service.

Southern Division.—Due provision was made for the maintenance and education of the minors and their dependants. The total expenditure on this account amounted to Rs. 5,298 as against Rs. 4,300 in the preceding year. The increase is mainly due to larger expenditure on the lodging and boarding of the Beleri ward in the mental hospital, Dharwar.

In Belgaum there was a decrease of Rs. 465 which is due to the release of one estate.

The small decrease of Rs. 74 in Bijapur calls for no remarks.

There are in all 11 minors—all male. Of these 7 are receiving education as detailed below :—

4 in English schools. 3 in Primary schools. 7

Three of the wards in Belgaum are above the school going age and one from Dharwar is mentally unsound.

(10) REPAYMENT OF DEBTS AND EXISTING LIABILITIES.

Northern Division.—Both the estates are free from debt and statement III is, therefore, blank.

Central Division.—The total amount of debt payable by the estate at the beginning of the year was Rs. 6,929. No additional debt was incurred this year. Out of the total liabilities of Rs. 6,929, Rs. 200 were paid in satisfaction of principal and Rs. 200 in satisfaction of interest, leaving a balance of Rs. 6,729, at the close of the year.

Southern Division.—Out of the 9 estates in the division only two in Belgaum are indebted and the rest are free from liabilities. The total liabilities of the two indebted estates amounted to Rs. 21,081 at the beginning of the year. No fresh debts were incurred during the year under report. Claims to the extent of Rs. 200 were paid up from the current income, and the liabilities were reduced to Rs. 20,881 at the close of the year.

(11) LITIGATION.

Northern Division.—At the beginning of the year, there was one undecided suit pertaining to the Timbi estate which has been released from management. The year closed with one civil suit for obtaining possession of a house rented to a tenant. This was filed by one of the two estates in the Ahmedabad district.

Central Division.—The two creditors, Messrs. Uttamchand Gafipat and Punamchand Motiram have obtained decrees against the ward and his uncle, Mr. Madhavrao. Mr. Madhavrao is not in a position to pay his share of the debt. The creditors have filed Darkhasts, but the Government Pleader has been asked to oppose them in order to avoid summary recovery. Another creditor Mr. Vallabhadas Shet of Yeola has been paid Rs. 200 during the year.

Southern Division.—There was only one suit pending at the commencement of the year in the Dharwar district. One new suit was instituted in that district. An appeal was filed in the High Court on behalf of the Nidgundi estate in the Bijapur district during the year under review. One suit was decided in Dharwar in favour of the estate. There were thus one suit from Dharwar and one appeal from Bijapur pending at the close of the year.

(12) GENERAL REMARKS.

Northern Division.—The administration of the estates through the local officers continued to be satisfactory.

Central Division.—The estate was a serious embarrassment to the Collector. With a view to get rid of this estate, Government were moved to authorise the Collector to apply to the District Judge to discharge him as guardian of the estate under section 40(2) of the Gurdian and Wards Act. Government have accorded the requisite sanction and the District Judge has accordingly been requested to discharge the Collector of the guardianship. The decision of the District Judge is awaited.

Southern Division.—The administration of estates through the local officers continued to be satisfactory.
