



## REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF CIVIL JUSTICE IN THE PRESIDENCY OF BOMBAY DURING THE YEAR 1934.

1. This Report and the Statements appended to it relate to the Presidency proper and not to Sind.

2. *Judicial Staff (Statement No. 1).*—The Judicial staff employed in the Presidency on 31st December 1934 and available for civil cases consisted of 10 permanent High Court Judges and 1 temporary Additional Judge, 17 District Judges, 11 Assistant Judges (including 4 Assistant Judges under training), a Chief Judge and 5 Judges of the Presidency Small Cause Court, 2 Provincial Small Cause Court Judges, 22 First Class Subordinate Judges and 91 Second Class Subordinate Judges. In addition, the Registrars of the Small Cause Courts of Poona and Ahmedabad exercised the powers of a Small Cause Court Judge. There were also 3 Inamdars and Jagirdars exercising the powers of a Subordinate Judge under Regulation XIII of 1830 and 91 Village Munsiffs appointed under the Deccan Agriculturists' Relief Act, XVII of 1879.

### THE CHIEF JUSTICE.

The Honourable Sir John W. F. Beaumont, Knight, presided over the High Court from 1st January to 17th June 1934 and from 20th July to 31st December 1934. His Lordship was on leave from 18th June to 19th July 1934. During the interval the Honourable Mr. Justice S. J. Murphy, I.C.S., officiated as Chief Justice.

### PUISNE JUDGES.

The Honourable Mr. Justice K. C. Sen, I.C.S., acted as a Puisne Judge from 13th July to 21st October 1934.

## HIGH COURT.

### I. ORIGINAL JURISDICTION.

3. *Original Suits for disposal (Statement No. 3).*—The number of civil suits pending on the Original Side of the High Court at the end of the year 1933 was 2,593 including 54 suits received by transfer from the Bombay Court of Small Causes. The number instituted during the year 1934 was 1,896 including 12 suits received by transfer from the Bombay Court of Small Causes and 171 restored during the year. The above totals 2,598, 1,896 and 171 make an aggregate of 4,665 for disposal in 1934 as against 5,051 in 1933.

4. *Original Suits disposed of (Statement No. 5).*—The number of suits decided was 2,326 including 23 suits received by transfer from the Bombay Court of Small Causes. The number left undisposed of at the end of the year was 2,339 including 43 suits received by transfer from the Bombay Court of Small Causes. This number is 259 less than the corresponding number at the end of the previous year. Of these 2,339 suits, 1,406 were ready for trial and in arrear, a decrease of 525 suits over the figure of the previous year. There were 1,306 suits whose hearing had been pending for over one year. This is a decrease of 349 suits on the figures of the previous year.

The average duration of suits disposed of during the year under report was as shown in the table given below :—

6. *Suits instituted and disposed of under the Testamentary and Intestate Jurisdiction.*—The number of suits pending at the end of the year 1933 was 4. The number instituted during the year 1934 was 19. Of these, 11 were decided and 12 remained pending at the close of the year. Of the suits decided—

2 were compromised, the average duration being 151 days ;  
 and

9 were decided after full trial, the average duration being 214 days.

There was 1 suit pending over one year at the close of the year.

7. *Suits instituted and disposed of under the Admiralty and Vice-Admiralty Jurisdiction.*—Three suits were pending at the close of the year 1933. One was instituted during the year under report. One was disposed of during the year, without trial, the duration being 80 days and of the 3 suits which remained pending, 2 were pending over one year at the close of the year.

8. *Suits instituted and disposed of under the Parsi Chief Matrimonial Jurisdiction.*—There were 5 suits pending at the end of the year 1933 and the number instituted during 1934

was 5. Of these, 7 were decided and 3 remained pending at the close of the year 1934. There was no suit pending over one year at the close of the year.

Of the suits decided—

2 were compromised, the average duration being 30 days ;

and

5 were decided *ex-parte*, the average duration being 70 days.

9. *Insolvency Petitions*.—The number of petitions pending at the end of the year 1933 was 1,963 and the number instituted during the year 1934 was 730 making a total of 2,693 for disposal in 1934. Of these, 806 were decided and 1,887 remained pending at the close of the year 1934. There were 1,200 petitions pending over one year at the close of the year.

Of the petitions decided—

763 were decided *ex-parte*, the average duration being 827 days ;

and

38 were decided after full trial, the average duration being 586 days.

10. *Appeals to the Privy Council*.—Five appeals were pending from the previous year and 2 were admitted during the year, making a total of 7 for disposal in the year 1934.

Of these 7 appeals—

1 was decided by the Privy Council who confirmed the order of the Appeal Court ;

1 was abandoned by the Appellant, before the transcript of the Record was transmitted to England ;

3 were pending before the Privy Council in England (including 2 despatched during the year) ;

2 were pending in the Bombay High Court.

11. *References to take Accounts, etc.*—The number of references to take accounts, to make inquiries as to estates to be administered or partitioned, as to debts and incumbrances, as to allowances to be made for maintenance, on questions of title, on questions affecting minors in proposed terms of settlement, to settle conveyances and in like matters, pending at the commencement of the year 1934 was 133 and 191 references were filed in 1934 in the Office of the Commissioner for taking accounts, making a total of 324 for disposal. The number of references disposed of by him during the year 1934 was 186, leaving 133 pending at the close of the year.

In addition to the above, during the year the Commissioner took and passed accounts of 224 Receivers and 21 Liquidators and passed 22 accounts for depositing moneys on behalf of minors with the Accountant General filed under High Court Rule 439. He settled besides 14 warrants for sale of immoveable properties attached filed under High Court Rule 501 and 7 conveyances,

12. *Petitions for Probate and Letters of Administration, etc.*—During the year 522 petitions for Probate and Letters of Administration, 45 Pauper petitions for leave to sue or defend *in forma pauperis*, 43 petitions under the Indian Companies Act, 19 petitions under the Indian Trust Act and 116 petitions under the Guardian and Wards, Lunacy and Arbitration Acts, etc., making a total of 745 were filed for disposal.

13. *Awards under the Indian Arbitration Act, 1899.*—The number of awards filed during the year was 74.

14. *Applications for Execution of Decrees (Statement No. 13).*—The number of applications pending at the commencement of the year was 1,057 and the number of applications filed during the year was 1,624 making a total of 2,681 for disposal. Of these, 326 were disposed of by transfer to other Courts, in 197 satisfaction was obtained in full, in 169 satisfaction was obtained in part and 1,002 were wholly infructuous making a total of 1,694 applications disposed of, and 987 applications remained pending at the close of the year.

The number of Decrees (Decrees or Orders) disposed of during the year in which immoveable property was sold was 46.

The number of Decrees received from other Courts for execution during the year was 92.

## II. APPELLATE JURISDICTION.

*Appeals from High Court Decrees under Section 15 of the Letters Patent.*

(Statement No. 7).—Twenty-eight appeals from decrees on the Original Side of the High Court were filed during the year and 20 were pending at the beginning of the year. Of the total 48, 30 were decided and 18 remained pending at the close of the year. The

number of appeals disposed of was less by 5 than in 1933. These 30 appeals were decided as under :—

- 9 Dismissed or not prosecuted.
- 15 Decrees of the Courts of First Instance confirmed.
- 2 Decrees of the Courts of First Instance modified.
- 3 Decrees of the Courts of First Instance reversed.
- 1 Case was remanded to the Court of First Instance.

There were 2 appeals pending over a year at the end of the year.

The average duration of the appeals which were dismissed or not prosecuted was 196 days and that of appeals which were confirmed, modified, reversed or remanded was 218 days.

19. (*Statement No. 8*).—Twenty-seven Appeals from Orders on the Original Side of the High Court were filed during the year and 12 were pending at the beginning of the year. Of the total 39, 25 were decided and 14 remained pending at the close of the year. The number of such appeals disposed of was less by 16 than in 1933. The results of these appeals were as follows :—

- 10 Orders of the Courts of First Instance confirmed.

There was one appeal pending over a year at the end of the year.

The average duration of the appeals which were dismissed or not prosecuted was 208 days and that of the appeals which were confirmed or reversed was 114 days.

20. (*Statement No. 7*).—On the Appellate Side 22 Letters Patent Appeals from High Court Decrees were filed during the year and 31 were pending at the beginning of the year. Of the total 53, 25 were decided and 28 (including 14 over a year old) remained pending at the close of the year. The number of appeals disposed of was less by 6 than in 1933.

The results of these appeals were as under :—

(Statements Nos. 7 and 8).—The statement in the margin shows the numbers of First and Second Appeals

from Decrees and Appeals from Orders of the Provincial Courts of Original and Appellate Jurisdiction which came up before the High Court and were decided during the year. The institutions of First Appeals were greater by 39 than in 1933 and those of Second Appeals and Appeals from Orders less by 57 and 5 respectively than in 1933.

22. *Appeals disposed of (Statements Nos. 7 and 8).*—The disposals of First and Second Appeals show respectively a decrease of 116 and 9 over the figures of the previous year; while those of Appeals from Orders show an increase of 16.

23. *Appeals pending (Statements Nos. 7 and 8).*—At the close of the year 1,353 First Appeals, 1,809 Second Appeals and 50 Appeals from Orders were pending. The aggregate total of pending appeals is more by 90 than in 1933.

25. *Results of Appeals (Statements Nos. 7 and 8).*—Out of the 268 appeals from Original Decrees decided, 58 were dismissed or not prosecuted. Out of the remaining 210, the decrees of the lower Courts were confirmed in 131, modified in 30, reversed in 47 and 2 appeals were remanded. Of the 823 appeals from Appellate Decrees decided, 356 were dismissed or not prosecuted. Of the remaining 467, the decrees of the lower Courts were confirmed in 335, modified in 24, reversed in 101 and the remaining 7 appeals were remanded.

(*Statement No. 8.*)—Of the 91 appeals from Orders decided, 35 were dismissed or not prosecuted. Of the remaining 56, the orders of the lower Courts were affirmed in 35, modified in 3, reversed in 15 and the remaining 3 appeals were remanded.

During the year under report 8 appeals under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, were filed and 1 was pending at the beginning of the year. Of these 9 appeals, 3 were dismissed or not prosecuted and 6 remained pending at the close of the year.

No Reference under the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, was filed during the year under report.

Under the powers given to the Registrar and the Deputy Registrar of the High Court, 503 applications under the Civil Procedure Code (Act V of 1908) were disposed of by them.

26. *Appeals to the Privy Council.*—At the opening of the year 6 applications for leave to appeal were pending orders. 51 new applications were filed during the year. Of these 57 applications, 7 were rejected, in 2 rule was made absolute, 1 was withdrawn and the remaining 47 remained pending at the close of the year. During the year the records of four appeals were sent to the Privy Council.

27. *Results of Appeals to the Privy Council.*—During the year 4 appeals were decided by the Privy Council. In one case the decision of the High Court was modified, in two it was confirmed and in one it was reversed. Seven appeals were pending before the Privy Council at the end of the year.

## CIVIL COURTS SUBORDINATE TO THE HIGH COURT.

## APPELLATE JURISDICTION.

29. *Appeals instituted (Statement No. 7).*—4,204 appeals were instituted in 1934 showing a decrease of 119 as compared with the previous year. The number of appeals instituted was greater in 8 districts and smaller in 10 districts. There was noticeable increase in Sholapur (54). In the remaining 7 districts the variations were less than 50. The decrease on the other hand was noticeable in Nasik (79). The remaining 9 districts show decreases below 50.

30. *Appeals disposed of (Statements Nos. 7 and 14).*—3,931 appeals were disposed of during the year including 179 by First Class Subordinate Judges exercising Appellate powers. The figure of total disposals shows a decrease of 438 as compared with that of the previous year. The figure of disposals by First Class Subordinate Judges exercising appellate powers shows an increase of 54 over the corresponding figure of the previous year. There was an increase in the disposals in 9 districts, the greatest being in Broach and Panch Mahals (140), followed by Kanara (52). In the remaining 7 districts the increase was below 50. On the other hand there was a decrease in the disposals in 9 districts, the greatest being in Sholapur (204), followed by Kaira (145), Poona (136), East Khandesh (100), Satara (79) and Ahmedabad (76). The remaining 3 districts show decreases below 50.

31. *Appeals pending (Statements Nos. 7 and 14).*—There were 4,437 appeals pending at the close of the year, the number being greater by 280 than at the end of 1933.

(*Statements Nos. 7 and 14.*)—The number of appeals pending for more than a year rose from 1,019 to 1,208.

32. *Results of Appeals (Statement No. 7).*—The results of decisions of appeals in the lower Courts during the year were as follows:—

In 736 cases or 18·7 per cent. of the whole the appeals were either summarily dismissed or not prosecuted, in 1,848 or 47 per cent. the judgments of the lower Courts were affirmed, in 504 or 12·8 per cent. they were modified, in 624 or 15·9 per cent. they were reversed and in 214 or 5·4 per cent. the appeals were remanded. The remaining 5 appeals were disposed of by transfer.

33. The average duration of the appeals in the lower appellate Courts, which were dismissed or not prosecuted was 124 days while that of appeals which were confirmed, modified, reversed or remanded was 389 days.

34. *Miscellaneous Appeals (Statement No. 8).*—599 miscellaneous appeals were instituted during the year and 208 were pending at the beginning of the year. Of the total 807,527 were disposed of

during the year and 280 remained pending at its close. The number of pending appeals was greater by 72 than in the previous year.

35. The average duration of miscellaneous appeals in the lower appellate Courts which were dismissed or not prosecuted was 81 days while that in appeals which were confirmed, modified, reversed or remanded was 163 days.

## CIVIL COURTS IN THE MUFUSSIL SUBORDINATE TO THE HIGH COURT.

### ORIGINAL JURISDICTION.

36. *Change in jurisdiction.*—With effect from 4th June 1934, the Subordinate Courts of Kumta and Sirsi in the Kanara district which were linked by Government Notification, Home Department, No. 3707/2-VI dated 12th November 1931, were dislinked and the Subordinate Judges of Kumta and Sirsi held their Courts at Kumta and Sirsi respectively. (*Vide* Government Notification, Home Department, No. 3707/2-VI, dated 22nd May 1934.)

37. *Original suits instituted (Statement No. 3).*—The number of suits instituted in 1934 was 1,59,521, a decrease of 14,017 over the figure of the previous year.

The decrease occurred in money suits as also in title and other suits, being one per cent. in either case. The number of money suits was 1,33,448 as against 1,47,208 in 1933 and that of title and other suits 26,073 as against 26,330 in 1933.

(*Statement No. 4.*)—The total value of suits instituted in 1934 amounted to Rs. 4,68,75,615 there being a decrease of Rs. 63,48,354 over the total for 1933.

38. *Local distribution (Statement No. 3).*—The number of suits instituted in 1934 showed an increase of 1,257 in the Poona district and a decrease in all the remaining 17 districts. There was an appreciable decrease in 8 districts, being 3,386 in East Khandesh followed by 2,601 in Nasik, 2,059 in West Khandesh, 1,119 in Dharwar, 1,053 in Kaira, 1,052 in Sholapur, 1,005 in Broach and Panch Mahals and 836 in Ahmednagar. The decrease in the other 8 districts was below 500.

(*Statement No. 3.*)—The largest number of suits instituted during the year was in East Khandesh (16,444). Institutions exceeded 10,000 in Poona, West Khandesh, Kaira, Nasik and Ahmedabad and ranged from 5,000 to 10,000 in Thana, Sholapur, Satara, Dharwar, Broach and Panch Mahals, Ahmednagar, Belgaum, Ratnagiri, Bijapur and Surat. Kanara showed 3,339 suits as instituted while the lowest figure 3,236 came to the share of Kolaba.

39. *Number of suits disposed of (Statement No. 5).*—In addition to 1,59,521 suits instituted during the year and 74,377 suits pending from the previous year, 2,779 suits were revived or received on remand or by transfer, making a total of 2,33,677 for disposal.

The number of suits disposed of during the year was 1,65,492 a decrease of 9,525 over the figure of the previous year.

Of the total number of suits decided during the year, viz., 1,65,492, Paid Sub-Divisional Tribunals (that is Courts of Subordinate Judges) disposed of 1,39,816 suits, Small Cause Courts 12,175, District Courts 486, Village Munsiffs' Courts 12,974 while the remaining 41 suits were disposed of by Unpaid Tribunals (that is Inamdars and Jagirdars).

40. *Results of suits decided (Statement No. 5).*—Out of the suits disposed of during the year, 18,444 or 11·1 per cent. were disposed of without trial, 36,312 or 21·9 per cent. were disposed of *ex-parte*, 15,889 or 9·6 per cent. on admission of claims, 40,895 or 24·7 per cent. by compromise, 52,798 or 31·9 per cent. after full trial, 760 or ·5 per cent. on reference to arbitration and 394 or ·2 per cent. by transfer. Of the 52,798 decided after full trial 47,815 or 90·5 per cent. resulted in favour of the plaintiffs and 4,983 or 9·4 per cent. in favour of the defendants.

41. *Suits disposed of by Inamdars and Jagirdars (Statement No. 5).*—The Unpaid Tribunals disposed of 41 Original suits; in 1933 the figure was 57.

42. *Suits disposed of by Subordinate Judges (Statement No. 5).*—The number of original suits disposed of by the Subordinate Judges was 1,39,816 a decrease of 8,587 over the figure of the previous year. The decrease is chiefly in the number of cases decided under the Small Cause Court procedure which decreased by 7,745. The number of suits decided under the ordinary procedure was 69,593 and under the Small Cause Court procedure 70,223.

43. *Suits disposed of by Small Cause Courts (Statement No. 5).*—The Provincial Small Cause Courts disposed of 12,175 suits, an increase of 208 on the total of the previous year's disposals.

44. *Suits disposed of by District and Assistant Judges (Statement No. 5).*—The District Courts disposed of 486 original suits, a decrease of 104 over the figures of the previous year.

45. *Suits disposed of by Village Munsiffs (Statement No. 5).*—The Village Munsiffs disposed of 12,974 suits showing a decrease of 1,026 as compared with the figures of the previous year.

46. *Pending suits (Statement No. 5).*—The number of suits pending at the close of the year was 71,185 as against 74,377 in the previous year.

(*Statements Nos. 5 and 1A*).—Of the pending cases, 8,841 had been pending for more than a year; this shows an increase of 763 on the figure of the previous year. Of the suits pending over a year, 9 were in the Courts of Inamdars and Jagirdars, 204 in the Courts of the Village Munsiffs, 8,555 in the Courts of the Subordinate Judges, 26 in the Small Cause Courts and 47 in the District Courts, the figures showing as compared with those of the previous year a decrease of 2, 55 and 21 respectively in the Courts of the Inamdars and Jagirdars, Village Munsiffs' Courts and Small Cause Courts and an increase of 827 and 14 respectively in the Courts of Subordinate Judges and the District Courts.

The number of suits pending over a year was the largest in Ahmedabad (1,409) followed by Satara (985), Poona (906), Dharwar (833), Belgaum (857), Surat (554), Ahmednagar (518), Nasik (514), East Khandesh (494), Kaira (485), Sholapur (403), Thana (264) and Broach and Panch Mahals (223). The figures for the remaining districts are less than 200.

47. The average duration in days of suits decided in the Courts of the Inamdars and Jagirdars, Village Munsiffs, Subordinate Judges, in the Provincial Small Cause Courts and in the District Courts is as shown in the tabular statement given below :—

48. *Execution Proceedings (Statement No. 13).*—There were 1,02,123 applications for execution pending from the previous year and 1,77,397 new applications were filed during the year. Out of the total number of applications before the Courts 1,73,197 were disposed of during the year and 1,06,323 remained pending at its close. The disposals of the applications were as under :—

- 189 cases disposed of by transfer ;
- 26,741 cases disposed of wherein realisation was complete ;
- 51,542 cases disposed of wherein realisation was partial ; and
- 94,725 cases disposed of as wholly infructuous.

1,73,197

The total amount realised in Courts other than the Small Cause Courts was Rs. 99,66,417-14-1½.

Debtors were imprisoned in 498 cases, moveable property sold in 1,005 and immoveable property in 6,836.

49. *Miscellaneous cases (Statement No. 6).*—The number of institutions and disposals of miscellaneous cases rose from 13,339 to 13,833 and from 13,126 to 13,439 respectively. The number of miscellaneous cases pending at the close of the year also rose from 7,246 to 7,701. Of the 13,439 miscellaneous cases disposed of 2,722 were disposed of without trial, 2,112 were disposed of *ex-parte*, 1,147 on admission of claims, 330 by compromise, 7,086 after full trial, 16 on reference to arbitration and 26 by transfer. Of the 7,086 cases decided after full trial, 4,678 of 66 per cent. resulted in favour of the plaintiffs.

50. The average duration in days of miscellaneous cases decided in the Courts of Inamdars and Jagirdars, Village Munsiffs, Subordinate Judges, in the Provincial Small Cause Courts and in the District Courts is as shown in the tabular statement given below :—

### III. BOMBAY SMALL CAUSE COURT.

51. (*Statements Nos. 3 and 4.*)—The figures of suits instituted, disposed of and pending at the close of the year 1934 in the Presidency Small Cause Court were 34,939, 33,789 and 6,822 respectively. The figures of institutions and disposals show a decrease of 97 and 1,523 respectively when compared with the figures of the previous year, while the figures of suits pending at the close of the year show an increase of 1,200 over those of the previous year.

(*Statement No. 4.*)—There was an increase in the institutions of suits not exceeding Rs. 10, exceeding Rs. 10 but not exceeding Rs. 50 and exceeding Rs. 50 but not exceeding Rs. 100, while there was a decrease in institutions of suits exceeding Rs. 100 but not exceeding Rs. 500, exceeding Rs. 500 but not exceeding Rs. 1,000



and also in the case of suits above Rs. 1,000 but not exceeding Rs. 2,000. The total value of litigation showed a decrease for the year under report. The figure was Rs. 62,27,541-13-5 as against Rs. 67,46,735-10-0 in the preceding year.

52. *Mode of Disposal (Statement No. 5).*—Of the 33,789 suits disposed of, 583 were decided without trial, 10,739 were decided *ex-parte*, 14,112 on admission of claims, 6,528 by compromise, 1,745 after full trial and 82 on reference to arbitration.

53. The average duration of suits disposed of without trial was 32, of those decided *ex-parte* 38, of those decided on admission of claim 43, of those decided by compromise 45, of those decided after full trial 73 and of those decided on reference to arbitration 68.

54. *Execution of Decrees (Statement No. 13).*—Of the 29,397 applications for the execution of decrees that were before the Courts during the year (including 4,405 pending from the previous year) 24,247 were disposed of and 5,150 remained pending at the close of the year. Of the last figure 2,955 were more than three months old. Of the applications disposed of 10,685 resulted in whole or partial satisfaction of the decrees granted, 12,821 were returned as wholly infructuous and 741 were transferred to other Courts.

The total amount realised was Rs. 11,93,963-0-7 as compared with Rs. 13,14,755-2-11 in the previous year.

55. *Coercive process (Statement No. 13).*—In order to enforce the execution of decrees, imprisonment was ordered in 419 cases and sale of moveables in 709. Both these figures show a decrease of 116 and 97 over the figures of the previous year.

56. *Applications to the Full Court (Statement No. 14).*—There were 361 applications for disposal before the Full Court during the year of which 333 were disposed of and 28 remained pending at the close of the year.

#### GENERAL.

57. As compared with the figures for 1933 the number of suits instituted in, and disposed of, by the Subordinate Judges' Courts decreased by 7,774 and 8,587 respectively; the number of regular suits disposed of was less by 842 and that under Small Cause Court jurisdiction was less by 7,745. With the number of revived suits and those pending at the end of the last year, the total number of suits pending shows a decrease from 66,477 to 61,877 and the number of suits pending over a year shows an increase from 7,728 to 8,555.

The number of appeals disposed of by the District Courts decreased by 438. The First Class Subordinate Judges exercising appellate powers disposed of 179 appeals as against 125 in 1933. The total number of appeals pending in the District Courts increased from 4,157 to 4,437.

The figures of suits instituted and disposed of on the Original Side showed a decrease of 139 and 272 respectively as compared with the figures of the previous year. The number of suits pending decreased from 4,573 to 4,244.

On the Appellate Side of the High Court, the total number of institutions and disposals of appeals showed a decrease of 19 and 119 respectively as compared with the figures of the previous year. The total arrears of appeals rose from 3,154 to 3,246.

58. *Inspection*.—During the year under report the District Judges inspected the following Courts of Subordinate Judges: Sangamner and Kopergaon in the Ahmednagar District, Chikodi and Gokak in the Belgaum District, Bagalkot and Muddebihal in the Bijapur District, Godhra and Dohad in the Broach and Panch Mahals District, Haveri and Gadag in the Dharwar District, Kapadvanj in the Kaira District, Shirpur in the West Khandesh District, Nasik and Malegaon in the Nasik District, Junnar and Vadgaon in the Poona District, Dapoli in the Ratnagiri District, Satara, Wai, Koregaon and Vita in the Satara District, Barsi in the Sholapur District, Bulsar in the Surat District and Thana, Kalyan and Murbad in the Thana District.

59. *Judicial Conference*.—No judicial conference was held during the year under report.

60. *Receipts and Charges of the High Court*.—For the year 1934, the total receipts as shown in paragraphs 15 and 28 were Rs. 18,96,590-7-11 on the Original Side and Rs. 1,96,584-9-4 on the Appellate Side making an aggregate of Rs. 20,93,175-1-3. The total charges as shown in the same paragraphs were Rs. 9,37,568-3-0 on the Original Side and Rs. 4,25,080-1-2 on the Appellate Side making an aggregate of Rs. 13,62,648-4-2. The difference between these two aggregates shows an excess of receipts over expenditure of Rs. 7,30,526-13-1. This excess includes the Probate and Administration Duty (the cost of collecting which is borne by the High Court). In the expenditure no sum is charged for rent or upkeep of the High Court buildings and other matters which would have to be brought into account in ascertaining a net profit. On the other hand no allowance is made for criminal work which occupies much judicial time and brings in no revenue and which is naturally not productive of any revenue.

**REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE  
IN THE PRESIDENCY OF BOMBAY DURING THE  
YEAR 1934.**

1. *Judicial Staff (Statement No. I).*—The Judicial staff employed in the Presidency on 31st December 1934 and available for criminal cases consisted of 10 permanent and 1 temporary High Court Judges, 17 Sessions Judges, 6 Additional Sessions Judges, 1 Assistant Sessions Judge, 19 District Magistrates, 6 Presidency Magistrates, 377 other First Class Magistrates, 404 Second Class Magistrates, 246 Third Class Magistrates, 157 Sanitary Committees and Sanitary Boards under Bombay Act I of 1889 and 259 Village Panchayats under Bombay Act IX of 1920—(Now Bombay Act VI of 1933).

In addition to the above, there were 18,967 Police Patils in the Presidency exercising powers under section 14 of the Village Police Act VIII of 1867, of whom 440 were invested with powers under section 15 of that Act.

There were also 61 Benches of Magistrates inclusive of 6 in the City of Bombay constituted from 528 Honorary Magistrates.

2. *Offences reported (Statement No. II).*—There were 263,601 criminal offences reported during the year, an increase of 23165 over the figures of 1933. There was an increase in the number of offences reported in the City of Bombay and the districts of Ahmedabad, Thana, Bijapur, Dharwar, Kanara, Ahmednagar, Belgaum, Bombay Suburban, East Khandesh and West Khandesh, while there was a decrease in the remaining districts. The increase was most noticeable in the City of Bombay, being 19,781 followed by 2,590 in Ahmedabad, 1,090 in Thana, 990 in Bijapur and 737 in Dharwar; the remaining 6 districts show increases below 500. On the other hand there was a marked decrease in Poona being 938, followed by 669 in Kolaba and 666 in Surat; in the remaining 6 districts the variations were below 500. Of the total number of offences reported, 48,253 were under the Indian Penal Code and 215,348 under Special and Local Laws.

3. *Complaints dismissed (section 203, Criminal Procedure Code) and complainants fined (section 250, Criminal Procedure Code) (Statement No. II).*—The number of complaints dismissed under section 203 was 4,840 and the number of complainants fined under section 250 was 172.

4. *Cases found to be true.*—Of the total number of cases under inquiry 256,624 were found to be true. The number of cases brought to trial excluding those withdrawn and including those pending from the previous year was 258,248. The number of cases found to be true and the number of cases brought to trial show an increase of 23,319 and 22,298 respectively on the figures of 1933.

5. *Murders reported as true.*—Out of 835 cases affecting human life brought to trial during the year, 251 were murders of which 141 ended in conviction. The corresponding figures for 1933 were 961, 243 and 149. The 251 murders may be classified as under:—

## ORIGINAL JURISDICTION.

### I. PRESIDENCY MAGISTRATES' COURTS.

6. *Cases in the Presidency Magistrates' Courts (Statement No. 11).*—The number of cases brought to trial during the year in the Courts of the Presidency Magistrates was 25,005 and in those of the Honorary Presidency Magistrates 104,690 making a total of 129,695. This number is greater by 20,289 than that in 1933, when the corresponding figures were 19,938 and 89,468 making a total of 109,406. The number of cases under Special and Local laws was 121,379 or 20,551 more than that in 1933 and the number of cases under the Indian Penal Code was 8,316 or 262 less than that in 1933. There was a very marked increase under the former head in offences under the City of Bombay Municipal Act which rose from 6,340 to 19,941. The number of offences under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act rose from 20,395 to 23,780, under the City of Bombay Police Act from 60,610 to 63,513, under the Indian Railways Act from 1,146 to 1,858, under the Prevention of Gambling Act from 1,687 to 1,917 and under the Indian Lepers Act from 1 to 211. Under none of the Special and Local laws was the decrease in offences appreciable. As regards offences under the Indian Penal Code, there was an enormous increase in offences of Criminal Intimidation and Annoyance which rose from 453 to 856. Offences of Theft also showed a considerable increase: from 1,531 to 2,833. On the other hand there was a big decrease in offences of Hurt which fell from 1,935 to 1,298. Offences of Criminal Trespass fell from 417 to 141, of using Criminal Force and Assault from 1,375 to 1,110 and of Criminal Breach of Trust from 798 to 637.

(*Statements Nos. 2 and 9*).—During the year 128,678 regular and 100 miscellaneous cases were disposed of and 1,017 regular cases were pending at the close of the year.

7. *Results of Trials (Statement No. 9).*—The aggregate number of persons under trial before the Presidency Magistrates was 136,936. Of the persons tried, 12,697 were acquitted or discharged, 117,093 were convicted, 148 were committed to the High Court, 25 were transferred to other Provinces, 10 were handed over to the

Military Authorities and 6,973 remained under trial at the close of the year. Of the persons tried for offences under the Indian Penal Code, 3,801 were convicted and 7,793 were acquitted. The results of trials before each of the three classes of Magistrates during the year are shown below :—

8. *Punishments (Statement No. 12).*—Of the persons convicted, 14,227 were punished with imprisonment, 100,811 with fine, 35 with whipping. 907 convicted persons were released after admonition and 1,103 were released on probation of good conduct under section 562, Criminal Procedure Code. 211 persons were sent to the Leper Asylum at Matunga.

The sentences of imprisonment passed were for the following terms :—

The fines imposed aggregated to Rs. 4,59,096-14-0. The total amount realised was Rs. 3,57,588-11-9, of which Rs. 35,423-12-11 were paid as compensation to complainants.

## II. MAGISTRATES, VILLAGE OFFICERS AND SANITARY COMMITTEES AND SANITARY BOARDS.

9. *Results of Trials (Statement No. 9).*—The aggregate number of persons under trial before these Tribunals was 188,643. Of these the cases of 1,011 were committed to the Sessions or referred to higher authorities and of the remaining 187,632 the cases of 171,733 were finally disposed of by the various Tribunals. Of the total 171,733, 102,155 or 59.5 per cent. were convicted and 68,874 or 40.1 per cent. were acquitted or discharged, 182 persons died, 428 escaped during trial and 94 were transferred.

The total number of persons awaiting trial before these Tribunals at the close of the year was 15,899 as compared with 15,047 in 1933.

Of the sentences of imprisonment imposed, 2,319 were for terms not exceeding 15 days, 7,599 for terms not exceeding 6 months, 1,673 for terms not exceeding 2 years and 34 for terms above 2 years.

Sentences of whipping were passed on 253 persons; in 1933 the figure was 182.

The amounts of fines imposed and realised during the year were Rs. 8,72,402-2-10 and Rs. 7,24,478-6-5 respectively. A total sum of Rs. 22,467-12-6 was paid as compensation to complainants.

In addition to the above, 172 complainants were ordered to pay compensation to accused persons under section 250 of the Criminal Procedure Code as against 216 last year.

### III. COURTS OF SESSION.

11. *Results of Trials (Statement No. 9).*—There were 2,041 persons or 264 less than in 1933 under trial. The cases of 1,812 persons were decided while those of 229 remained pending at the close of the year. Of the 1,812 persons tried, 957 or 52·8 per cent. were convicted, 811 or 44·8 per cent. were acquitted or discharged, the cases of 42 persons were referred to the High Court under sections 307 and 374 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1 person died and 1 escaped during trial.

12. *Punishments (Statement No. 12).*—The following sentences and orders were passed by the Courts of Session :—

The total realisation amounted to Rs. 17,789-0-1½ as compared with Rs. 16,515-13-6 in 1933 and the total amount of fine paid as compensation was Rs. 2,405 as against Rs. 390 in 1933.

## APPELLATE JURISDICTION.

## Appellate Courts Subordinate to the High Court.

## I. APPEALS.

13. (*Statement No. 2*).—The number of appeals decided during the year was 3,022 as against 2,739 in the preceding year—an increase of 284.

14. *Magistrates' Courts (Statement No. 10)*.—The number of persons whose appeals were decided by Courts of Magistrates was 2,473. Of these the appeals of 523 were summarily dismissed and sentences on 1,082 were confirmed after admission making a total of 1,405 wholly unsuccessful appellants or 56·8 per cent. Of the remainder 334 or 13·5 per cent. obtained a modification of the sentences passed on them and 633 or 25·6 per cent. an annulment. The cases of 100 appellants were otherwise disposed of and 1 person died pending decision of the appeal. As compared with 1933, the results were less favourable to the appellants.

15. *Sessions Courts (Statement No. 10)*.—During the year the number of persons whose appeals were decided by Courts of Session was 2,477. The appeals of 805 persons (or 32·5 per cent.) were summarily dismissed; 743 appellants whose appeals were admitted were altogether unsuccessful, 366 obtained an alteration of sentences, 537 were acquitted and the cases of 26 appellants were otherwise disposed of. The proportions of persons whose appeals were wholly unsuccessful, successful in obtaining a modification of the original orders and completely successful were 30, 14·8 and 21·6 per cent. respectively. Of those concerned in admitted appeals only, the proportions were 44·4, 21·9 and 32·1 per cent. respectively. If admitted appeals are only considered, these results were on the whole less favourable to the appellants than in the previous year, the percentage of successful appellants during the year being 54 as against 58·8 in 1933.

## II. SUPERINTENDENCE, REFERENCE AND REVISION.

16. *Magistrates' Courts (Statement No. 10)*.—The cases of 262 accused persons who applied for revision or against whom applications were made by complainants came before the District Magistrates for revision. The number was less by 176 than in 1933. The applications of 217 applicants were rejected and those of 45 were otherwise disposed of.

17. *Sessions Courts (Statement No. 10)*.—Including the cases of accused persons who themselves applied for revision of the orders passed on them in the Courts of Magistrates and of those against



whom such applications were made by complainants, the cases of 1,335 persons were decided on revision by Courts of Session during the year. The number was greater by 58 than in 1933. Applications of 1,108 were rejected and those of 227 were otherwise disposed of.

## HIGH COURT.

### I. ORIGINAL JURISDICTION (HIGH COURT SESSIONS).

18. *Commitments to the High Court (Statement No. 9).*—One hundred and fourteen cases in all were brought to trial at the High Court Sessions during the year including 7 cases pending at the end of 1933. Of these, 108 cases were decided and 6 remained pending at the end of the year. These 108 cases occupied in all 165 days. This may be compared with 145 cases occupying 163 days in 1933.

Altogether 165 persons were tried of whom 121 were convicted and 44 were acquitted.

19. *Punishments (Statement No. 12).*—The following sentences were passed :—

The fines imposed during the year amounted to Rs. 4,800 and fines realised during the year amounted to Rs. 300.

### II. APPELLATE JURISDICTION.

20. *(Statement No. 10).*—Ninety-one appeals were pending before the High Court at the beginning of the year from sentences or orders of Criminal Courts. During the year 597 appeals were preferred and 647 decided, leaving 41 pending at its close. The numbers of appeals preferred and decided during the year are less

by 143 and 98 respectively than those of the preceding year and the number of appeals pending at the close of the year is less by 50 than that of the preceding year. Of the appeals preferred against sentences, 473 were from Courts of Session, 116 from Courts of Presidency Magistrates and the remaining 9 were preferred by the local Government against orders of acquittal.

21. *Results of appeals.*—Five hundred and twenty-four appeals against sentences passed by Courts of Session were decided. The sentences were upheld in 445 cases, reversed in 32, modified in 45 and 1 case was remanded for re-trial.

One-hundred and twelve appeals against sentences passed by Presidency Magistrates were decided. The sentences were upheld in 98 cases, reversed in 8, modified in 4 and 2 cases were remanded for re-trial.

Eleven appeals by the Local Government against the orders of acquittal involving 26 accused were disposed of by the High Court during the year. In 5 appeals involving 10 accused, the High Court set aside the orders of acquittal in respect of 9 persons and convicted them and upheld the order of acquittal in the case of 1 accused. The High Court dismissed summarily 2 appeals involving 10 accused and in 1 appeal involving 3 accused the High Court upheld the order of acquittal and dismissed the appeal. In 1 appeal involving 1 accused the High Court set aside the order of acquittal and sent back the case for trial on merits and in 2 appeals involving 2 accused the High Court allowed the appeals to be withdrawn.

The results of appeals as affecting individual appellants were as follows:—

The appeals of 442 persons were summarily dismissed under section 421 of the Code of Criminal Procedure. In admitted appeals, the sentences of 176 appellants were confirmed, those of 97 altered, those of 55 reversed and 5 persons were remanded for re-trial.

In appeals against acquittal orders the appeals against 10 persons were summarily dismissed; orders were confirmed in the case of 4 persons and reversed in the case of 9 persons, the case of 1 person was referred back to the lower Court and the cases against 2 persons were allowed to be withdrawn.

### III. SUPERINTENDENCE, REFERENCE AND REVISION.

22. *References under section 307, Code of Criminal Procedure.*—Two references were pending in the High Court at the beginning of the year and 9 were submitted to it during the year. Of these, 10 were decided and 1 remained pending at the close of the year. Out of the 10 decided cases involving 14 accused, the High Court convicted 10 and acquitted the remaining 4. The verdict of the jury was accepted in 3 cases and set aside in 7.

23. *References under section 374, Code of Criminal Procedure.*—Thirty-eight references under this section were submitted to the High Court during the year for the confirmation of death sentences and five were pending at the opening. Thirty-nine cases involving 49 accused were decided during the year. The sentence of death was confirmed in the case of 32 persons and commuted to that of transportation for life in the case of 8. The remaining 9 persons were acquitted.

During the year under report, 38 persons were executed in the Presidency.

24. *Revision.*—During the year 1934 two hundred and seventy-eight cases were reported for the orders of the High Court by Sessions Judges and District Magistrates under section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure and 19 were pending at the opening of the year. Of these, 277 were decided during the year and 20 remained pending at its close. The number reported was greater by 136 than in 1933. In 49 cases the orders sent up for revision were not interfered with, in 16 cases sentences were enhanced, in 45 sentences were reduced or altered and in 151 reversed; in 6 cases the proceedings were quashed, in 9, new trials were ordered and the remaining 1 case was otherwise disposed of.

Orders were passed under section 435 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in 375 cases, an increase of 61 on the figures of the previous year. Of these, 361 came before the High Court and 14 were taken up by the High Court on review of Criminal Returns or otherwise of its own motion. Of the 361 applications for issue of rule, 223 were rejected and 4 were allowed to be withdrawn. Of the 134 rules issued, 58 were finally discharged, 68 were made absolute in their entirety and in 8 the orders complained of were modified.

In 4 out of 14 cases taken up by the High Court *suo motu*, the orders passed by the lower Courts were not disturbed; in 4 the sentences were enhanced, in 4 they were reduced and in the remaining 2 they were set aside.

25. *Applications for transfer.*—Eighty-three applications under section 526 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for transfer of cases from one Court or district to another were received during the year, and 5 were pending at the beginning of the year. Of these, 86 were decided during the year and 2 remained pending at its close. 54 were summarily rejected, 3 were allowed to be withdrawn and in 10 transfers were granted without the issue of a rule. In the remaining 19 applications in which rules were issued, transfers were granted in 9 and refused in 10.

26. *Miscellaneous applications.*—Ten applications for bail, 7 for maintenance, 3 for compensation, 3 for disposal of property, 5 for stay of proceedings, 8 for sanction, 3 for *Habeas Corpus*, 3 for security and 14 for miscellaneous purposes were disposed of by the High Court during the year.
