#### PREFACE.

------

The following extracts from official correspondence will serve to explain the history of the present Revised Catalogue:—

India Office, London, 24th July 1863.

To His Excellency the Right Honourable

The GOVERNOR GENERAL OF INDIA IN COUNCIL.

My Lord,—The accompanying letter\* from the Royal Asiatic Society relates to the importance of rendering accessible to European students the works, in various departments of science and literature, which issue from the press in India, and contains a request that, pending an arrangement for the regular transmission to this country of all works of interest and importance published in India, the titles at least of all such works may be collected.

2. It has been the object of orders sent from time to time to the several governments in India that copies of all works published in India should be sent home for deposit in the Library formerly at the East India House, and now attached to this office. These orders do not seem to be systematically observed, and I have now to request that the attention of the several local governments may be called to the subject, and that steps may be taken for the regular transmission to this country of all works of interest and importance which may issue from the press in India. The collection of the titles of all such works, according to the tabular form proposed by the Asiatic Society, may facilitate this object, and such a collection should be ordered to be forthwith commenced under all the governments in India.

SIR-We, the undersigned Director and Vice-Presidents of the Royal Asiatic Society of Great Britain and Ireland, beg leave to memorialize you, in the name and on behalf of the Council and Members of the Society, in reference to a subject which, since it concerns alike the literary and the commercial interests of the Indian and European dominions of the British empire, appears to us to deserve your special consideration.

It is doubtless well known to you that of late years the Hindús have shown great literary activity, partly by editing numerous texts of their ancient Sanskrit literature, partly by translating English and Sanskrit works into their vernacular dialects, and partly by producing original compositions on subjects of a political, scientific, and religious character. But though these books are very numerous, and in many respects important, and though they have an extensive circulation among the natives of India, only a very inconsiderable portion of them is at present accessible to European scholars; and the knowledge of these few is in most instances due to chance, or to the good will of disinterested persons residing in It is unnecessary for us to dwell on the serious hindrance which has arisen from this circumstance to a proper appreciation of the actual condition of India and its inhabitants, equally from a scientific and from a political point of view, and in some degree, we may add, to a proper administration of the country itself. Frequent attempts have indeed been made by scholars and booksellers in this country to remove this impediment, but they have proved altogether unavailing. It is therefore our conviction that there is here an urgent necessity for the authoritative assistance of Government, and that by this means alone the claims of Oriental studies in England can be adequately satisfied.

This assistance would be, in our opinion, perfectly justified, also, on legal grounds. Five of our great libraries are entitled to a copy of every work published in the British empire. The law conferring

on them this privilege was intended to preclude the ultimate loss of any such book. Hitherto, however, these libraries have been practically deprived of the fruits of this privilege so far as India is concerned, chiefly, as we suppose, because the Hindús are unaware of the obligation imposed on them by law to furnish copies of their publications to the libraries in question.

In view of these facts, we would be permitted to suggest that the Indian authorities be instructed to give their attention to this matter, and at least to collect quarterly the titles of all Native books and pamphlets that issue from the Indian presses.

A catalogue of the publications of past years, as complete as might be found possible, would also possess great value. Moreover, inasmuch as a regular commercial intercourse between the booksellers of India and England would tend to increase the material resources of both countries, and prospectively to exercise a beneficial influence on the education of the natives, we would propose that the Indian authorities be also instructed to furnish the public with certain other items of information touching books published in India, agreeably to the enclosed form.

We do not presume to indicate the mode which may seem most appropriate for making the information thus obtained accessible to the public at large. If, however, the Royal Asiatic Society be considered as a fitting channel for this purpose, we shall be most ready to give publicity to the materials transmitted to us by Government through the medium of our Journal, or in such other manner as may appear to us best calculated to further the accomplishment of what is here proposed.

It will be observed that the Royal Asiatic Society further suggests that a catalogue of the publications of past years, if such can be prepared, will possess great value.

2. I am also desired to draw attention to the directions of the Secretary of State regarding the transmission to the India Office of all works of interest and importance which may issue from the press in India, and I am to request that His Excellency in Council will take such steps as may seem best fitted to carry out the Secretary of State's wishes in this respect.

in reference also to previous correspondence noted in the margin (which contains the same subject brought in a different way before the notice of Government) I have the honour to report as follows:—

2. When the orders of the Right Honourable the Secretary of State, contained in his despatch No. 55 dated 24th July 1863, for the collection

of lists of Native publications, were first referred to this office, I had the honour to recommend, in my letter No. 297 dated 17th

June 1864, that Collectors and Magistrates should be authorized to call upon the owners of printing presses in the several districts for returns of works and periodicals issued by them from the date of the establishment of their respective presses up to the 31st of December 1864, and I proposed to undertake the embodiment of these returns in a general catalogue which should contain the names of all Sanskrit and Vernacular publications in this Presidency up to the close of the year 1864, to be followed afterwards by annual lists of subsequent publications.

- 3. At the end of June 1865 I received an instalment of the returns which had been called for, but on receiving them I found that precise forms had not been furnished to the owners of printing presses, and that the information supplied was extremely defective. I therefore thought it better to collect returns afresh by the agency of the Deputy Educational Inspectors throughout the presidency, to whom I furnished tabulated forms to be filled up.
- 4. This fresh application for returns caused a delay of several months. On being received, the lists were embodied in my office into a general catalogue, which has now been printed, and of which I beg herewith to submit six copies for the use of Government.
- 5. The catalogue submitted, though superior to what could have been compiled from the returns furnished by the political authorities and Magistrates, is still utterly imperfect. The causes of this inperfection are as follows:—(1) the absence, in many cases, of regular records in the printing offices; (2) the carclessness or obstructiveness of printers or publishers, who failed to see that they had an interest in facilitating the returns, and who perhaps suspected the motives of Government in calling for them; (3) the wish in some cases to conceal the names of works of a discreditable character; (4) the want of scholarship in some of the Deputy Educational Inspectors; (5) the newness of the whole thing, none of those concerned having had experience of the means to be adopted in framing a catalogue of the kind required, and all acting under pressure, with a view to carry out the wishes of Government with as little delay as possible.

- 6. By keeping back the returns I had received, and by causing them to be corrected and enlarged, I might doubtless have obtained a far more complete and scholarlike catalogue than the imperfect one now submitted, but on consideration I thought it would be better to have the present catalogue printed as a basis to future operations. I think that the advantage of an immediate public beginning is likely to be greater than that of a list less full of faults and omissions, appearing after some months' more delay. The first list, whenever it appeared, would be certain to be imperfect.
- 7. I now propose, with the permission of Government, to consider the catalogue herewith submitted as a nucleus for collecting information. I propose to send copies of it to all Oriental scholars in the presidency, and to all other persons who are likely to possess the means of assisting us, and to solicit from them additions and corrections and any remarks which they may have to offer. In this way I trust to collect a supplementary catalogue, correcting the mistakes and supplying the omissions of the prese a catalogue of works published up to the end of 1864. When this is complete, I would propose to proceed with the regular collection of annual lists of Native publications in the presidency.
- 8. Among other matters on which I would propose to solicit information is the question what books, either of those mentioned or those omitted in my catalogue, are so far interesting as to be worth purchasing for transmission to England. With the permission of Government, I would propose deferring compliance with the last paragraph of their Resolution No. 698 dated 8th August 1864 until I have veceived the advice of scholars on this subject.
- 9. In the mean while I am inclined to think that the present catalogue, imperfect as it is, may in itself be not wholly useless to the Royal Asiatic Society and other learned bodies or individuals in Europe. Even a perfect catalogue would probably not afford information different in kind from that contained in the list herewith submitted. It will be seen that 898 names of books and periodicals in the Sanskrit, Zend, Maráthí, Gujaráthí, Canarese, Sindhí, Persian, Urdú, and Hindí languages have been collected. These perhaps do

not amount to more than half of the printed Native literature of this presidency; still they constitute a fair representative of it. The names and subjects set down in the accompanying catalogue indicate the taste of the people, and the sort of literary activity which has existed among them. Many remarks might doubtless be made on the subject. I would therefore respectfully suggest that copies of the present catalogue be forwarded to the India Office, with an intimation that supplementary lists are in course of preparation-

- 10. There are two remaining points on which I have to submit my opinion. The first of these regards the agency by which annual lists of publications are in future to be made. On this I beg to express my concurrence with the Revenue Commissioner for the Northern Division, who, in his letter No. 1850 dated 14th June last, recommends that they should henceforth be made by means of the machinery of the Educational Department.
- 11. The second is the question mooted by Mr. Robertson in his letter No. 880 dated 25th February 1865, and also discussed at length by Mr. Talboys Wheeler, as to the desirability of an Act compelling Native printers and publishers to furnish to Government copies of all works that they may bring out. On this 1 beg to express my humble opinion that such an Act is extremely desirable, but that it should contain a clause providing that Government will in all cases pay the full published price of the books thus furnished. I would suggest that two copies of every book published in the presidency should be in this manner taken by Government, of which one should be deposited in the Library of the University of Bombay, and one transmitted to the India Office.

#### Bombay:

Office of the Director of Public Instruction, 20th March 1866.

SIR,—I have the honour to forward to you herewith, and to request your inspection of, a Catalogue of Native Publications in the Bombay Presidency up to the 31st of December 1864, prepared by me under the orders of Government.

- 2. The want of catalogues of the kind has been long felt, not only by Oriental scholars in Europe, but also by many persons generally interested in the welfare and progress of India.
- 3. Considerable difficulties, however, have attended the collection of the present list, among which may be mentioned the imperfect records kept in printing presses; the apathy or obstructiveness of printers when applied to for information, and the want of scholarlike feeling in many of the persons employed to collect returns.
- 4. The present catalogue, then, is felt to be wholly imperfect, but it has been printed in order to serve as a nucleus for additional and more correct information.
- 5. It is hoped that scholars acquainted with different branches of Native literature may be kind enough to look over the list, and to favour this department with such corrections and additions as they may be able to supply, on the receipt of which a supplementary catalogue will be published, which it is hoped may complete the record of Native printed literature in this presidency down to the end of the year 1864.
- 6. I have now the honour to solicit your cooperation in the work. Should you be willing to lend your assistance, I request that you will favour me with a list under the following heads:—
  - I. Corrigenda.
  - II. Addenda.
- 7. Your list of corrigenda should be made in reference to the present catalogue, by quoting in each case the number of the entry

in which any mistake has been made as to name, subject, date, price, &c. &c.

- 8. Your list of addenda should be drawn up under ten columns, according to the system of the present catalogue (with the first column omitted). Your entries should, whenever practicable, be drawn up from the actual titlepages of works. The name should be given in Romanized Vernacular or Sanskrit. The subject should be given as briefly and characteristically as possible. The column of "remarks" should contain an indication of anything worthy of notice, from a literary, political, or moral point of view, in the works entered.
- 9. In addition to the above heads of entry, I would further solicit from you a list of any works (whether entered or omitted in my present catalogue) which may seem to you, for any reason, to be worthy of transmission to England.

My thanks are due to Mr. Nugent for his performance of this troublesome task. Finally, the Revised Catalogue, as compiled by Mr. Nugent, was most carefully corrected in respect of orthography and points of scholarship by Dr. Kielhorn, Superintendent of Sanskrit Studies in the Poona College, whom I have to thank for the great trouble he has taken.

The following remarks on the Sanskrit and Maráthí sections severally of the printed literature contained in this catalogue will be found interesting: they have been respectively contributed by Dr. Kielhorn and by Mahádev Govind Ránáde, Esq., M.A., LL.B., Acting Maráthí Translator to Government in the Educational Department:—

REMARKS ON THE SANSKRIT PORTION OF THE CATALOGUE, BY Dr. Kielhorn.

"The students of Sanskrit who may reasonably expect to find in the 175 numbers of Sanskrit works contained in this catalogue, a fair representation of Sanskrit literature, will, on a careful inspection, be disappointed. Most of the books here enumerated, if books they may be called, have no other claims to general interest than that which they may derive from being practical little manuals teaching the proper mode of performing certain ceremonies, or containing hymns or prayers for worshipping the gods, &c. There are only a few books in the whole collection which really contain something of the better part of the literature of ancient India. Titles like the Bhágavatapurána, the Mahábhárata, Rámáyana, Manu, or the S'akuntalá, are like a few green trees in a barren desert. This is not difficult to understand.

There never has been, at least for the last two thousand years, an Indian public. The study of literature was always confined to the few who considered themselves by divine right the sole bearers of all mental culture. And these few did not study it merely to cultivate and elevate their minds, or to seek in it relaxation from more severe labours, and a source from which to draw new strength and vigour, but they made it their business, just as others made it their business to till the ground, or to battle with the enemy. We do not say this in depreciation of India; on the contrary, we might consider it rather a proof of the contentment and disinterestedness of Indian authors that they wrote without a public in our sense of the word. However, a clear understanding of this singular phenomenon will make us better appreciate and judge Indian literature. A poem like the S'is'upalabadha, or a play like the Prabodhachandrodaya, could never have been meant for general readers. A system of philosophy like that of the Nyáya would be of no use to a man who could not devote at least some years of patient study to it exclusively. The grammatical science, admirable as it appears when once mastered, and far superior to whatever the Greeks fabled about grammar, would be entirely lost upon an ordinary scholar. We doubt even whether comparatively easy poems, as the Meghadúta, could have been really appreciated by a mind not specially trained for understanding them. Author and public everywhere influence each other. In India the author wrote only for readers who would devote perhaps the best part of their lives to the study of his works, and consequently he did not condescend to make himself intelligible to the man of plain common sense. On the other hand, the general public saw the hopelessness of ever mastering the works of its authors, and left the study of them to those who by no other avocation were prevented from devoting their whole lives to them-

If these remarks are true with regard to the literary state of India some thousand or two thousand years ago, they are much more so for India of the present day. The number of native scholars educated on a time-hallowed plan, which is perhaps better fitted than any other plan to hand down from one generation to another the traditional interpretation of difficult works composed in Sanskrit, becomes smaller every year, however European scholars may deplore this fact. Men who have studied the literature of their country thoroughly, and understand it, are becoming ever less numerous. Those few who still exist have perhaps their learning handed down to them from their fathers and forefathers and with it they have also inherited, as a dearly valued heirloom, the manuscripts from which their parents and ancestors drew their wisdom. Printed books are therefore either not wanted at all by these scholars, or the number of copies required is so small that even the most enterprising printer would not venture to print the books. If the better productions of Sanskrit literature were printed, they would not be sold in India, for want of readers. In fact, we are rather surprised than otherwise to find that some printers have been disinterested enough to publish some very extensive works, the sale of which, we are afraid, will never be so large as to cover the mere expenses of paper, printing, &c.

The above may, we believe, explain the fact that among the Sanskrit books contained in this catalogue there are so few really valuable works. We do not mean to stop with this general assertion. We shall, as far as the limits of this short notice may permit, place most of the books classified before the reader, and thus

enable him to test the truth of our statement. Before we do this, however, we feel obliged to make one more observation.

In speaking of the readers which printed Sanskrit books might find in India, we mentioned only those Native scholars who have been educated according to the old system. We did so intentionally. The introduction of a more general study of Sanskrit into schools and colleges is only a very recent event, and was still more so in 1864. We cannot therefore expect to find among the Sanskrit books contained in this catalogue many works intended for the wants of those who have studied Sanskrit in Government institutions. Some beginning seems to have been made in this direction, it is true, but nothing more than small portions of books have come forth as yet.

In proceeding now to give a detailed account of the more important books contained in this catalogue, we have to remind the reader at the outset that we have not been able to get sight of every work. Some books, although only lately published, are either not procurable at all, or only to be obtained with great difficulty. With regard to these, therefore, we have been obliged to rest satisfied with the information given by the publishers themselves, which, we fear, is not always very trustworthy.

There are no Vedic works at all contained in this catalogue; we proceed therefore at once to the Post-Vedic Literature.

#### (A) Epic Poetry.

There is a valuable edition of the whole Mahábhárata (74), together with a short commentary composed by Nílakantha, and called Bháratabhávadípa. Of single episodes of this vast epic poem we have to mention principally several editions of the Bhagaradgitá (11, 45-49), being a dialogue between Krishna and Arjuna on divine subjects. In some editions the Bhagavadgítá is accompanied by four other small works, viz. the Bhishmastararája (18, 47, 48), a prayer or hymn in which Bhíshma praises Krishna; the Vishnusahasranáma (kathana) or the thousand names of Vishnu (47, 48, also

168-172 &c.); the Anusmriti (6, 47, 48), prayers for obtaining final beatitude; and lastly the Gajendramokshana (38, 39, 47, 48), containing the story of a Gandharva having been changed into an elephant, and afterwards liberated and restored to his original state, by Krishna. All these works profess to be taken from the Mahábhárata, but the two last are not contained in the Calcutta edition of the Mahábhárata. Another little work may be mentioned here in connection with the Bhagavadgítá, viz., the Saptas'lokígítá (131), which is said to be an abridgement of the former work.

We have also a very well and correctly printed edition of the whole Rámáyana (113), which is accompanied by a commentary called Tilaka, composed by Ríma, whoever he may be. The text given in this edition differs considerably from the Bengal text, and somewhat less from that of Schlegel's edition of the Rámáyana. There is, besides, a separate edition of the Bálakánda (10), or first book of the Rámáyana. This is perhaps the best place to mention also the Bháratachampú (17), and the Rámáyanachampú (114), two compositions in prose and verse relating to the subjects of the two principal epic poems.

#### (B) Poems on Cosmogony and Mythology.

The Pauranic literature is very well represented in this catalogue, at least so far as titles are concerned. The number of important works, however, is even here not very great.

The most prominent work of this class is without doubt the Bhágavatapurána, dedicated to the glorification of Bhágavat or Vishnu. We have several editions of it (13-16), some of them accompanied by the commentary of S'rídharasvámin. A famous song, in which the god Bhágavat is praised by the herdswomen, is entitled Gopigitá (51). The small tract Jearastotra (56) is stated to be taken from this Purána. There is, besides, an abridgement of the whole Bhágavatapurána, called Chatahs'loki Bhágavata (25), and consisting of six pages, where the original poem, which contains 18,000 s'lokas, must indeed have been marvellously abridged. Another work deserving of mention here is the Bhágavatachúrniká (12), which treats in prose on the subject of the Bhágavatapurána.

The only other Purana of which we have a complete edition, besides the Bhagavata, is the Lingapurana, composed, as the name would suggest, in honour of Siva. The lithographed edition of this work (71) contains, besides the text, a commentary called Sivatoshani by Ganes'a.

No. 44 of the catalogue bears the title Garudapurána, but this is incorrect, the work referred to being merely an extract from the Pretakalpa, or second part of the Garudapurána. It treats of the rewards and punishments awarded to the souls of the departed in the world to come, and of obsequial rites. The text is accompanied by a succinct commentary.

The following works are, like the last, only extracts from Puránas. The most important of them all is the Adhyátmarámáyana (1-2), which forms part of the Brahmándapurána. It chiefly relates the exploits of Ráma, in such a manuer, however, that it considers them always as the deeds of the god Vishnu. This work has been commented on by Rámavarman of S'ringavera. One of the most famous chapters of the Adhyátmarámáyana, called Rámagítá, which savours very much of Vedánta doctrines, has been published separately (110). The Vishnupanjarastotra (167) is also said to be taken from the Brahmándapurána, and we believe that the Dattátreyastotra (28) has to be referred to the same source.

The Krishnajanmakhanda (64) forms the fourth or last section of the Brahmavaivartapurana, and is composed entirely with the view of glorifying Krishna.

As extracts from the Padmapurána we may mention the Maghamá-hátmya (73), treating chiefly of some ablutions to be performed during the month of Magha; the Biivarpanastotra (19); the Rámás vamedha (112), from the Pátálakhanda of the Padmapurána; and perhaps the Ekúdas ímáhátmya (33, 34).

There are several small sectarian works said to form part of that extensive mass of poetical compositions which usually goes by the name of Skandapurána. We find a Chandrastotra (22); Chátur-másyamáhátmya (24), in 32 books; Rámanavamívratamáhátmya

(111); Sanistotra (127-128); Satyanárógana (136,137); Sívaka-vacha (146,147); Vais úkhamáhátmya (160). The Kárttikaná-hátmya (59, 60), which forms part of the Srísanatkumárasamhítá, belongs most likely also to this Purána.

We will notice only a few other small works belonging to this The Haritáliká (53, 54) teaches the mode of worshipping the goddess Parvatí on the third day of the illumined half of the month Bhádrapada, and is accompanied by a tale taken from the Bhavishyottarapurána, in which the origin of the Haritáliká rite is related, and its name explained (verse 47). To the same Purána belong also the Krishnajannashtumi-eratukathá (111), and the S'rávanadvádas' ikathá (111, Fámanajayantikathá). Another work, entitled Saptas'ati (120,100), is an extract from the Markandeyapurana, and celebrates in 16 chapters the provess and achievements of Párvatí. The Purushottamamihátmya (103), which contains 31 books, is taken from the Brihamáradíyapurána, and the Nrisimhachaturdas (cratamáhátmya (111) from the Nrisimhapu rana. Several others of the smaller tracts mentioned in this catalogue might perhaps be enumerated here, but it would be of no advantage to do so.

#### (C) Artificial Poems.

This class contains some very beautiful and justly admired poems. Besides, on several of these compositions the very best commentaries that exist in the whole commentatorial literature of India have been written. It is therefore a matter of great regret that the poetical works of this kind are represented very scantily in this catalogue. In the whole collection there occur the names of only five good classical poems, and not one of these has been published entire. Of the Kumarasambhava only the second book has been printed (65), some twelve years ago, and even this cannot be had now. The same is to be said of the Naishadhlyacharitra, composed by Harsha, and celebrating the love and marriage of Nala and Damayantí, of which the first canto (88) was published in 1845. The case is a little better with the Raghuvams'a (107-109), but even

here the most extensive publication does not contain more than seven cautos out of nineteen. Of the S'is'upálabadha, or, as it is called after its author (if such he was), the Mághakávya, which describes the death of S'is'upála, slain by Krishna, the first two cantos (72) were printed in 1815, but they are out of print now. More recently the first three cantos have again been lithographed (145), together with the commentary of Mallinátha. An edition of Cautos I.—III. of the Kirátárjaníya (61) appears to survive only in name. There is another lithographed edition of the first five songs of this poem (62), accompanied by Mallinátha's commentary.

Two other poems deserve to be mentioned here, though both are rather modern compositions. The one is the Mahimnahstotra (75-79), or, as it is also called, Mahimnahstava, composed by Pushpadauta in honour of S'iva; the other the Gangálahari, by Jagannátha (37). The occasion on which the latter poem was composed is stated in one of the editions before us in the following manner:- 'In 1578 there lived in Delhi, at the court of King Akbar, a Pandit named Jagannáth Ráy. By his learning he obtained the king's favour, and married his daughter. After some days he rued this act, but the Brahmans of Benáres would not receive him into the caste. Therefore he sat down on the borders of the river Ganges, and began to praise its goddess. Then the water rose one step at each verse, and after it had thus riseu fifty-two steps Gangá herself appeared before all, and purified him and his Muhamadan wife.' Nothing of all this appears in the poem itself except the name of the poet (vv. 36 and 47). But it is clear that the poet must have felt himself weighed down with some heavy sin, from which in his opinion none but the all-purifying Gaugá could deliver him. The glory and power of Gangá are sung in the most exalted strain; and the fervour of the poet's prayer, and his childlike confidence in his almighty and allmerciful goddess, are deeply touching. The language of the poem is pure, and, though not free from a certain mannerism, brings forcibly to one's mind the better works of Indian literature. In one of the editions before us the poem is accompanied by the commentary of Sadás'iva the son of Manikabhatta, which, although it

betrays sometimes its author's inability to write correct Sanskrit, is nevertheless of great value for the understanding of the original. It shows also that there exist a good many various readings, though the poem is not three hundred years old.

#### (D) Drama.

The catalogue mentions two editions of Kálidása's well-known play S'akuntulá (123-4), and also an edition of the Vikramorvas'i (164), by the same poet. An edition of the Venisamhara (162), by Bhatta Nárávana, is out of print now. Besides, there is an edition of the philosophical drama Prabodhachandrodaya (101), by Krishnamis'ra. The last work of this kind, the Hanumannutaka (52), or Mahánátaka, deserves a fuller mention, because we have a first edition of it. There exist, as far as we know, two recensions of this work, the one consisting of nine acts, and commented on by Madhusúdana; this was published in Calcutta in 1840: of the other recension, in which this play contains fourteen acts, we owe the editio princeps to Mr. Bápú Hars'et Devlekar, who has indeed done more for Sanskrit literature than any other publisher in this presidency. The subject of the Hanumannátaka is the history of Ráma as it is given in the Rámáyana. The play, however, as it lies before us, is evidently unfinished; its context is often broken, and it contains pieces of different authors and of different times. Some verses are distinctly stated to be composed by the commentator with the view of filling up the gaps in the original composition. There is a tradition contained in the last verse of this play and the commentary thereon, according to which the play was originally written on stones by Hammat-Válmíki heard of the extreme sweetness of its style, and became. afraid his own Rámáyana would not be read if the play continued to exist: he therefore asked Hanumat to throw the latter into the Bea. Hanumat having complied with this request, the play remained concealed in the sea until it was again taken out by King Bhoja (who was, according to the commentator, an incarnation of Hanumat), and by his order put together by Mis'ra Damodara. The text of this play is accompanied by the commentary of Mis'ra

Mohanadása, which is mostly succinct and clear. Mohanadása quotes the usual lexicographical and other authorities in support of his statements, and mentions many various readings, without, however, as far as we have observed, critically deciding between them. We are sorry that the editor has admitted some verses into the text of the play against Mohanadása's distinct statement.

#### (E) Fables.

Of all the collections of fables existing in Sanskrit literature, only one has been printed in this presidency, viz., the *Hitopades a* (55). Whatever the advantages may be which a student working without the assistance of a teacher may derive from the present edition of this work, we very much doubt its fitness for being used as a school book.

#### (F) Grammar.

Of the various grammatical systems for which India is justly renowned, two are represented in this catalogue, the system of Pánini and that of the Sárasvata grammar. To the former belongs the Siddhántakaumudí (143) of Bhattojidíkshita, being a commentary on Panini's grammatical Sútras, which, however, are here given in another order than in the Ashtadhyayi; and an abridgement of the Siddhantakaumudi, entitled the Loghukaumudi (67), by Varadarája. The small tract named Taddhitakalápa (157), the author of which is not named, is a treatise on secondary nominal affixes, observing the order in which these affixes are given in the Siddhántakaumudí, but it is not a portion of the Siddhántakaumudí itself, as stated incorrectly in the catalogue. Rúpávali and Dháturúpávali (119-122) contain paradigms of the Sanskrit declensions and conjugations; as a supplement to them may be mentioned the Samásachakra (125-6), which gives a short account of the Sanskrit compound nouns according to Pánini's system, besides a chapter on the meanings of the cases &c. (and in one of the editions before us, also, to fill up the book as it were, the Maráthí declension of the pronoun to); its author is not named. The Keidantavyúha (63), on verbal derivatives, and the

small work entitled Shadlingani (140), which treats of the Sanskrit declension according to the Siddhantakaumudí, we have not met with.

The lithographed edition of the Sárasvata grammar (132) is not the first edition of this work. In 1829 a much more convenient edition than the present one was printed in Bombay. This, however, is very scarce now, the only copy which perhaps ever reached Europe being in the possession of the Secretary of the Royal Asiatic Society in London.

#### (G) Lexicography.

There are three editions of Amarasimha's Númalingánus úsana (3, 4, 138), if not the oldest, at least the best-known, dictionary existing in Sanskrit literature. In one of these editions (138) the text is accompanied by a commentary chiefly etymological, the author, of which, Hari Pandita the son of Vináyaka, composed it by order of the publisher, Vithal Sakhárám Agnihotrí. A careful comparison of the first fifty pages of this edition with the corresponding part of the Paris edition of the Amarakosha shows that it contains not only slight various readings, but also whole lines that are not to be found in the latter. Sometimes these additional verses are marked by inverted commas, and in this case they are not explained by the commentator.

#### (II) Rhetoric

Two works of this class have been printed, both compositions of the 15th and 16th centuries. One is the *Pratáparudra* (100), composed by Vidyánátha in honour of King Pratáparudra. This is out of print now. The other work, entitled *Knvalayánanda* (66), was composed by Appayadíkshita, as he bimself states, by order of King Vyankata; the text is accompanied in the present edition by a commentary called Alankárachandriká, written by Vidyánátha the son of Rámachandra or Rámabhatta.

#### (I) Philosophy.

Under this head we have to mention only one modern work, a commentary on the Gadádharí, entitled Nyáyaratna (93), by Raghunáth Sástrí.

#### (K) Law ond Ritual.

There is a complete edition of Manu (81) accompanied by the commentary of Kullúkabhatta; two books of Manu have also been printed separately (80). Besides, we have several editions of the Dharmasindhusára (30-32) composed by Kás'ináthopádhyáya. This work consists of three parts, which treat of the division of time, of the festive days to be observed in every month, and finally of the various religious ceremonies which every man ought to perform. To the latter subject especially is devoted the Prayogaratna (102), by Bhatta Nárávana the sen of Bhatta Rámes/vara. The Dánachandriká (26), or, as it is properly called, the Dánasankshepachandriká, by Divákara the son of Mahádeva, treats of the various kinds of religious gifts. Another work which belongs to this class is the Vratarija (173), composed by Visyanátha, or, as he calls himself also, Daivajna-s'arman: it treats of religious observances and vows. The author himself informs us, in the beginning of his work, that he composed it in 1736 in Benáres, after having studied many books on the subject. The Fratodyápanakaumudí (174), by S'ankar Ballal Ghare, of the Chittapavana family, treats of the same subject. Among the smaller tracts which we could get sight of, the As'auchanirnaya (9) must be mentioned here,

#### (L) Astronomy and Astrology.

The comparatively great number of works on astronomy and astrology contained in this catalogue shows that this branch of Indian science is still studied extensively. Most of the printed works of this kind have been composed during the last four hundred years. We content ourselves with merely mentioning the titles of them: Brihajjátaka (21), Muhúrtachintámani (84), Muhúrtaganapati (85), Muhúrtamártánda (86), Nílakanthatíjika (92), Sarvárthachintámani (135), Shatpanchásíká (141-2), Síghrabodha (144), and Tithinirnaya (158).

#### (M) Lists of the Names of Deities, Prayers, Hymns, &c.

The list of the names of a god generally begins with a few introductory remarks in which the blessings are set forth which the worshipper hopes to obtain by the recital of these names, vizhealth, wealth, defeat of his enemies, &c. Some lists are ascribed to Rishis, as Náráyana, Kanvapraskanva, Vyása, &c., as their authors. Now and then the selection of the names of a particular deity is fanciful, e.g., in the Ganapatisahasranámávali, where each of the thousand names of Ganapati begins with the letter g.

The prayers and hymns (Stotra) are often sensible, sometimes even beautiful. They are ascribed to various authors, e.g., the Aparádhakshamápanastotra, the Sivastuti, and the Charpatapanjarika to Siankaráchárya; the Kálikástotra to Kálidása, the Rámaraksha to the Rishi Buddha Kausika. Sometimes they are said to be taken from Puráuas (see above).

Different from these Stotras are the Pújás; whereas the former are prayers or hymns in our sense of the word, the latter always require the performance of some particular religious rite, and tracts like the Anantachaturdas'ipújá or the Upángalalitapújá regularly consist of two parts. First the directions are given according to which the god is to be worshipped, and afterwards some story, generally taken from a Purána, is related in explanation of the origin of the rite, &c. Where we know with certainty from which Purána such a tale has been taken, we have mentioned the particular Pújás already, with the Pauranic literature.

The above is, we trust, an impartial description of the Sanskrit books printed in this presidency, and it is as exhaustive as we could make it. We have only one more remark to offer before concluding this notice.

Many of the books mentioned contain, no doubt, a correct and readable text. However, this in itself is not sufficient. The text of a book may contain no mistakes in the grammar and idiom of the language, it may not be at variance with what we know of the time of the writer and the circumstances under which he lived, it may also be entirely consistent with the character of the writer as known from other sources, and it may, lastly, be composed strictly according to the rules laid down for a particular class of literary

composition; and yet we cannot be satisfied with it so long as we are not told how the text has been constituted, what manuscripts have been compared, whether they all contain the same text, or form groups of manuscripts representing different recensions of the same work; which recension has been chosen, and for what reasons whether the editor has thought it sometimes necessary to reject the readings of his manuscripts, and in which particular case he has done so. We also desire to know whether the quotations from the work which he edits have been collected as far as possible, and compared with the text given by the manuscripts; whether imitations, if there are any, have been compared, &c. An editor may by constant study have become as familiar with his author as that Roman who, Cicero tells us, was able to say "this verse belongs to Plautus, and this not," yet we should always consider him to have sinned against the first laws of the critical art if he did not give us satisfactory answers to the above questions. We are afraid critical accuracy has never been the strong point of Indian scholars, not even of the best of them, and we observe daily with regret how lax the critical conscience, if we may say so, of Indian scholars of the present day proves to be; but we firmly trust that the publishers, some of whom have already done good service to the cause of Sanskrit literature, will take care that in future the works issued from their presses will become more satisfactory in this respect, and we assure them that they will earn the warmest thanks of European scholars by doing so.

#### REMARKS ON THE MARA'THI' PORTION OF THE CATALOGUE.

The total number of Marathi books contained in this catalogue is 661; of these 428 are prose and 233 are verse, that is, nearly one to two—a very large proportion for any but the less cultivated languages of modern times. I have divided the prose books into (1) school books, (2) popular literature, (3) scientific works, and (4) law books: about each of them in their order.

(1) The prose school books number about 98, and may be further subdivided into reading-books, mathematics, history, geography,

and grammar. As all these books are either translations, or compilations prepared to order, they are indicative of nothing beyond them, and may be passed by without special remark. Major Candy's series constitutes by far the best portion of the school reading-books.

(2) The prose popular literature of every cultivated language generally reflects all the real strength and excellence of the national intellect. In order to convey as complete a notion of this department of our published literature as is possible under the circumstances, I have subdivided the total number of works, 221, into no less than eleven heads—history, tales, moral essays, biography, travels, Puranic bakhars, philosophy and religion, political tracts, newspapers and magazines, science and miscellaneous: of each of them in their order.

History.—There are twenty-three books of history, large and small. Of these twenty-three, fourteen relate to India, six to England, there are three books on general history, and one on Egypt. Of the fourteen which relate to India, the translations of Elphinstone's and Murray's histories, and of Grant Duff's Marátha history, are the only ones which possess any literary merit. By the side of these and Bál Gangádhar S'ástrí's compilations, none of the books on English history would appear to possess any standing. The only textbook on general history is a translation of Marshman's Brief Survey of History, and even that, I fear, is now nearly out of print. It will be thus seen that there is not a single original historical work of merit besides the several translations, while the large departments of the history of Greece and Rome and of modern Europe and America are entirely neglected.

Tales.—The next subdivision is that of tales and fictions, with a total of 39 works. Of this number fully sixteen are represented by the multiplied editions of the old and popular stories of the Panchopákhyán, Vetál Panchvis'í, Simhásan Battisí, and S'uka Baháttarí. These four constitute the stock of the most popular stories of fiction in the language; they are to be found in every indigenous school, and constitute their whole library. Besides this

purely indigenous literature there are about fifteen works, which represent the addition to our stock of fictions as the result of English contact. Of these, ten are translations, and five are original efforts on the model of English fictions. Mr. Krishna S'ástrí's translation of the Arabian Nights stories represents by far the best effort of literary prose in the language. Of the original works, Muktámálá and Rájá Madan are the best. Some more recent efforts in this direction have been more successful. One of the most distinctly marked tendencies of the age is towards a multiplication of this class of works.

Moral Essays.—Moral books and essays constitute the third subdivision of popular literature, with a total of about 33 books None of these possess any great merit, except, of course, the old systems of morality respectively styled Vidurníti and Náradaníti. They represent the highest moral and economical notions of the people on these subjects, and serve the place of more systematic works.

Biography.—There are about ten works on biography—Columbus, Captain Cook, Cyrus, Náná Phadnávís, Socrates, and Catherine of Russia: these constitute nearly all the remarkable persons who have been honoured with a record of their lives. I can see no particular principle at the bottom of this varied choice. As people grow more familiar with the really great characters of history it is to be hoped that this department will in course of time receive large additions.

Travels.—As might be naturally expected among a people so averse to foreign travel, this department is exceptionally poor. There are only four works, of which two relate to the pilgrimages: to Gokarn and Benáres. The late lamented Dájí Sáheb Kibe may be said to have set the example of this class of writing when he published an account of his tour through Gujaráth and Maháráshtra.

Puranic Bakhars.—I have thought it fit to provide a separate division for Puranic prose, for the reason that this tendency to write the old myths in prose indicates a step in advance, and belongs to the

advanced age of chronicles. The number of works is about seven, and all relate to the old Purána stories. Contemporaneously with the compilation of these Bakhars there arose another class of chronicles, of a more healthy character, brought into being by the political events of the times—I refer, of course, to the historical Bakhars, of which there are several, in the manuscript form, well worth being separately published.

Superstition.—The next subdivision, Superstition, may be passed over without remark here. By far the larger portion of these works are in verse, and I shall take them together when I come to speak of that portion of verse literature.

Philosophy and Religion .- I have thought it proper to class philosophy with religion, for, as at present circumstanced, the Hindús are not sufficiently liberalised to perceive any distinction between The number of books under this head is about twenty, and in my opinion this number is much below the mark. interest some to know the variety of the elements which make up this portion of our literature. Philosophy is as yet only a handmaid to Religion, and occupies a subordinate place. This class of works may be subdivided into the purely missionary works, the purely orthodox works, and, lastly, the works in favour with reformed India, which occupy an intermediate place. The principles of the Hindú religion, the pleasures of the self-enjoying soul, and the Vedokta Dharm Prakás', represent the best portion of orthodox thought stated so as to be generally acceptable to all parties. The commentary on the Purusha Súkta, thoughts upon caste, the Paramaliams doctrines, the remarriage of widows, the principles of Brahmanism, and Dr. Haug's translation of a portion of the Vedas, constitute by far the best of the more recent efforts in this time on the part of reformed India. Of course the philosophy, such as it is, is very poor by the side of the Sanskrit or English works on the subject. The philosophy most in vogue is that of the later Vedántism, and the Gitá, with its diffuse commentary the Dayanes'vari, constitutes three-fourths of the substance of all that passes as philosophy with those who take up these studies in

their old age. The fact is there is no taste in the popular mind for the problems discussed in European works on philosophy, while in the case of old Sanskrit works people who take up these studies generally find it infinitely easier to consult the original itself than any modification or adaptation of it into intelligible Maráthí. With regard to reform literature, there is at present a strong tendency towards an increase of this class of works, as was fully shown at the time of the recent agitation of the remarriage question. More than five works of a very earnest character published at the time showed the deep interest with which the whole question was regarded by the people; only one of these publications finds its place in the catalogue.

Science.—The next subdivision is that of popular science. Although nearly all the works professing to treat of scientific subjects are remarkable for their want of system, I have thought it proper to provide a separate heading for a class of works which are intended more to excite curiosity than to convey truth or system. Of the eleven works under this head, five are dialogues on astronomy, and the rest are popular descriptions of animals, plants, railways, &c.

Political Tracts.—The next subdivision relates to politics. There are only five works in the catalogue of a political turn. Of these, three relate to the defunct body of the Bombay Association, being petitions to Parliament on Indian subjects: of the other two books under this head, one relates to the Inám commission, which is said to be Gairinsáph, or Injustice, and the other relates to the law of prices, advocating the entire freedom of trade, and intended to persuade people that it would not be in any way to their advantage if Government interfered to fix a nirakh scale of prices. Of late years these occasional pamphlets have been on the increase, and are indicative of a new spirit, which in its own time will be our highest privilege under British rule.

Newspapers and Magazines.—I have provided a separate heading for newspapers and magazines. The catalogue makes mention of ten newspapers and seven magazines in all. While there has been a steady improvement in the quality of the newspapers, and the difference between the best specimens of the papers published in our days compared with those which were published ten years ago is so great as to make no comparison possible, the magazines have greatly fallen off; the Trimásik, the old Dnyánprasárak, and the Vichárlaharí had more brilliancy, more earnestness about them than the usual stuff with which the magazines are filled in these days.

The last is the Miscellaneous head, which contains about fifty-five books, calling for no special remark.

(3) To proceed now to the third grand division of science. The total number of works contained under this head is about sixty-eight. As a whole this department is singularly behindhand, for the truths of science, opposed as they are to the traditions of the Puránas have not as yet made their way into the popular mind, and there is no demand for these works outside the school walls. Owing to the difculty of expressing technical terms and scientific ideas, no serious attempt has been made to publish a series of manuals on the different sciences for the use of the higher classes in the schools. There is not a single textbook, good or bad, on the natural sciences, and the same remark holds good of geology, optics, heat, magnetism, and others without number. Out of a total of sixty-eight there are ten works on higher mathematics, three on astronomy, three on scientific music and singing, four on physics, and three on chemistry; while mechanics, electricity, photography, logic, are each content with a single text, possessed of no great merit either for fullness or accuracy. The only sciences which muster more strength are political economy and medicine; there are six works on political economy, most of them being translations of English texts.

The works on medicine are about twenty-two in number, embracing translations of the native Sanskrit authors, as also of the more popular English texts. Bápdeva, Mádhava, Trimbak, Lolumbraj, Mánikbhat, have all been translated, and the Nighantu Prakás' also has been rendered into Maráthí, so as to be available for general use. The English texts translated are about six in number. Of

these, three were translated, so far back as 1829, by Dr. McLennan, on materia medica, nosology, and anatomy. Since the institution of the vernacular class in the Grant College the Native teachers there have published texts on medicine, anatomy, and chemistry. The old Sanskrit texts on Sárír, and the works of the Muhamadan doctors, are still untranslated, and the want of textbooks on physiology and the more advanced subjects of medicine is still felt in this department of study.

There is another subject on which the language possesses a large stock of very valuable works—I refer to the dictionaries. It has been the singular good fortune of the people of this country that their language early attracted the attention of such distinguished scholars as Captain Molesworth and Major Candy, who reduced it to form and order with a perseverance equalled only by the success of the effort. Besides their great works, the S'astris, under their auspices, published a very valuable dictionary, which, together with the more recently published Haus-Kos' and others, has proved of great help to the student.

(4) The fourth great division of prose literature is that of law, with a total of forty-one works, of which about twenty-eight are Acts, and the rest are law books. Among the law works the most valuable are the translations of the Mitákshará and the Vyavahára-mayúkha published by order of Government. The rest of the law literature is entirely of modern growth, and as yet possesses no great work of merit. Within the last two years, however, very valuable contributions in the shape of texts on evidence and contracts have been published by the new class of vakeels. The weekly publication in the Native newspapers of cases decided is also a most promising feature connected with the times.

I have thus passed under review the entire collection of prose literature, in all its different branches, pointing out the special merits, wants, and the tendencies of each, so far as can be ascertained at present.

To proceed now to the verse portion of the Maráthí literature. The total number of books is 223. While the prose literature is for

the most part the work of our own days, the verse literature of the language admits of two divisions, the old and the new; the old being the entire collection of Puranic, devotional, philosophic, superstitious, and moral writings of the poets who lived before the establishment of the British rule, making a total of 197 works; school poetry, histories, translations, selections, these make up the entire contribution of our own times, numbering about 36 works in all: about each of them in their order.

Puranic poetry forms by far the largest aggregate total of poetical works, being no less than 99 books, or fully one-half of the entire collection. I have had the curiosity to analyse this large total, and was not surprised to find that the largest contributor in point of quantity, and first in the order of poetical merit, is Moropant. S'ridhar Váman Paṇḍit, Tukárám, Muktes'var, follow in the order in which the names are mentioned here. The Mahábhárat and its episodes are the most popular subjects with the poets. Moropant has travelled over the whole of the Mahábhárat story, and his Rámáyaṇas, with their fantastic principles of arrangement, are a curiosity in literature. Krishna is the favorite god with this class of poets, the frolics of the god in his infancy, and his less excusable deeds among the women of Gokal, form the subject of all the lyric and impassioned poetry in the language.

Devotional poetry occupies the second place in point of number and merit. There are about 65 works in all, of which five books, perhaps the best of their kind, relate to the biography of the saints and the Sádhu poets. Tukárám's Mánas Pújá and Moropant's Kekávalí are perhaps the best specimens of their respective writings. The god most in favour with this class of poets is, it need hardly be remarked, Vithobá of Pandharpúr. In fact, the theory that salvation can only be worked out, not by works, nor by merits, nor again by knowledge, but by humble devotion and constant prayer, is the peculiar tenet of this class of writings; and with the decay of old learning, and of the more valuable spirit of independent thought, it has succeeded in securing for itself a popularity wholly unauthorised by any merits of its own.

There are about ten works of philosophy, but, as I have previously remarked, they all teach one set of doctrines, those of the Bhagavadgítá. In fact, all the works under this head are either translations, paraphrases, or commentaries on the Gítá, of which the Dnyánes'varí takes the first rank. The Dásabodh of Rámdás, Váman Pandit's essays on detached subjects, and Eknáth's great work, make up the whole of our present possessions in this department of literature.

There is much more variety in the next class, of superstitious works, which number about fourteen. Incantations against the bites of serpents, palmistry, the science of prognostics, the good or bad omens attendant upon the touch of the lizard, the sacred influences of the planet Saturn, these and many more make up a large collection of the recognised pabulum which the popular mind feeds on with inexpressible delight. They indicate a state of mind which, however one may deprecate it, on account of the consequences, deserves to be studied in all seriousness of heart, for the light it lets in upon the present state of popular thought.

The last subdivision of this portion of our old literature relates to the class of moral works. Vidurníti and Náradaníti belong in the original to this class of works. Our chief moral teacher is Rámdás; his address to the mind is perhaps the most solemn teaching on the subject. The more recent efforts in this line possess no great merit.

The second great division of verse literature, which I have classed under the generic term of new poetry, is made up for the most part of translations from Sanskrit works and selections from the old poets. There is not a single original work of any merit which can be named by the side of the higher specimens of the old poetry.

The translations from the Sanskrit works, about twelve in number, are however, the richest treasure of the language in its present state of cultivation. Nearly all the best Sanskrit Náṭaks have been already translated. This has been the work of the last ten years, and it is to be hoped that the chief of these translators will supplement their good work by translating all the epic Kávyas and the

other standard prose and verse works of the parent language. The stream of Sanskrit lore must be diverted into our channel, its choicest productions compelled to do service in these days by enriching the language with their excellence of thought and art.

Besides these translations, much good has resulted from the publication of selections from the mass of ancient poetry, in the different editions of Navanít and the Sarvasangraha. In course of time entire collections of the writings of Tukárám, Moropant, Muktes'var, S'rídhar, and Váman Pandit will, it is hoped, be published, and when completed it will be the highest claim of this age to be remembered in all future time.

I have thus travelled over the entire ground sketched by me at the outset, taking stock of all our actual possessions in prose and verse-After all, it should always be borne in mind that forty years ago there was not a single printed book in the language. The Native Education Society was organised about 1829, and the first serial works for the schools were published under their auspices. Forty years is but a short span in the life of a nation's literature, which takes many centuries to grow to maturity. The evidence of growth is satisfactory, but the interval is too short to admit of anything but a collective impression of the whole in one view. It is not possible to mark out the distinctive tendency of each decade. Besides, the comparison of dates in the eighth column, which are not so much the dates of the first publication of those works as of such recent editions of the same as were accessible, makes it perfectly impossible to come to any satisfactory conclusions on this head. Certain it is that within the last ten years greater work has been done than was accomplished during the thirty years immediately preceding. All our best Sanskrit translations, all the higher original efforts in the direction of novels and dramas, and other works of art, all serious efforts to publish entire collections of the old poets, all our best reading series and our best newspapers, all these have been the work of the last ten years; and the press is daily finding increased employment for its varied activity.

It is true the entire picture thus presented to the view is far from satisfactory if one looks at it absolutely. The stage of advance which the language has at present reached is to be hailed more for the promise it holds out for the future than for any accomplished success of the past. It is only when we look at the short interval of scarce forty years that we feel surprised at the amount of work that has already been done, especially when the comparative poverty of the sister languages of the presidency is taken into account.

I hope I shall not be accused of unduly depreciating the progress that has been achieved, but there can be no mistake that to any one who looks at it from a stranger's standpoint our existing literature will appear for the most part either superstitious or childish. Many centuries of carnest effort are needed before this reproach can be washed away. The present, however, is full of promise, and there is every likelihood that before long the Maráthí language will be in a position to take the first rank among the cultivated languages of modern India.
