SEASON AND CROP REPORT OF THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY FOR 1919-20.

I.—CHARACTER OF THE SEASON.

Table I (page i) compares the rainfall of the year with the average fall of rain at each representative station in the Presidency and in Sind. In the Presidency the *kharif* rains were generally in excess of the normal in the Deccan and at two stations in Gujarat and one each in the Karnatak and Konkan; elsewhere somewhat below the standard. *Rabi* rains were above the normal except at two stations in the Karnatak and three in the Deccan. Hot weather rains were over the normal in Gujarat and Karnatak (except Bijapur); elsewhere under it. Except at one station in the Karnatak (Bijapur) the rainy period was generally over the normal and at more than half the stations markedly so. In Sind the total rain of the year was about normal at two stations, over it at two, and in defect at three.

2. The following remarks will show in detail the nature of the season in each Division of the Presidency.

Deccan.—There were ante-monsoon showers almost everywhere which were very useful for preparatory tillage. Regular monsoon opened early in June and *kharif* sowings were eagerly started everywhere on an extended scale owing to famine conditions of the previous year. In the eastern parts of Poona, Ahmednagar and Sholapur, however, a break in the middle of the month postponed their completion till the first week of July. Further rains were generally sufficient in the north and west and all crops including cotton on the whole fared satisfactorily. But in the eastern tracts the long spell of dry weather in July-August stunted their growth and in places they showed distress. Copious rain fell in September. It injured to some extent cotton and other crops ready for harvest, but was very helpful in reviving withering crops where they had not hopelessly gone and in pushing on *rabi* sowings. October rain was sufficient in the north, but in the east it was again deficient and cloudy weather, rain and frost in subsequent months brought on rust on wheat in many places and reduced outturn. *Tur* grew luxuriantly but was much damaged by caterpillars and gram and other pulses were also injured by insect attacks. The season on the whole was below normal in the east but fairly good elsewhere.

Karnatak.—The ante-monsoon showers were heavy and facilitated preliminary field operations. As in the Deccan *kharif* sowings were eagerly started on a larger scale under favourable early rains. But the rains in July and August were insufficient in the east and crops in light soils in particular suffered and the sowing of cotton was retarded. September rains improved the withering crops to some extent, but in places it was very heavy and further delayed the sowing of cotton. Late rains in October and November helped *rabi* sowings but were harmful to cotton. Later on *rabi jowar* and wheat were damaged by grass-hoppers and the latter by rust and cotton suffered from *wilt* in many places and bolls dropped owing to cloudy weather. Their yield was thus far from satisfactory. In the west (*mallad*) the early rains were unusually heavy and continuous and delayed the drilling of paddy in many places. July and August rains were sufficient but the crop suffered from the heavy rains of the later months and *kharif jowar* from sugary disease. *Tur* and other pulses also did not fare well. On the whole the season was below normal.

Konkan.—Here there were practically no ante-monsoon rains anywhere and the drilling of rice in the up-*ghat* talukas of Kanara had to be done later. The monsoon commenced early in June all over but being light and partial in the latter part of the month the sowing of sprouted rice in Ratnagiri was delayed. Light rain in July was trying to upland rice but good showers at the end of the month relieved the situation and transplantation was done under favourable conditions everywhere. A break at the end of August again caused anxiety but copious rains in the latter half of September and in October improved prospects throughout the division and all crops yielded well. There was some rain in November in the south which helped *rabi* crops and supplied water for

irrigation. The season on the whole was most favourable, the like of which, it is said, had not been experienced during the last twenty years.

Gujarat.—The monsoon commenced rather late but the subsequent rains were generally sufficient and well distributed and the crops progressed well except in Kaira, where seedlings of *bajri* and other crops were greatly damaged by caterpillars in August and had to be resown. The appearance of cloudy weather followed by rain in November, however, changed the aspect of the season altogether damaging standing *kharif* crops as well as those lying cut in the fields. The *jowar* crop lodged and sprouted in the ear in Surat and the advanced cotton crop in Broach was affected by boll-worm. The sowing of *rabi* crops was delayed. The latter promised well in the beginning but were in turn seriously damaged in many places by unusually heavy rains in January and frost in February. The late cotton crop in Broach and elsewhere already affected by the boll-worm got wet and the lint was discoloured. The season for *kharif* as well as *rabi* crops was thus far from satisfactory.

Sind.—The inundation of the Indus on which the cultivation in the Province mainly depends was very good. The river had attained a good level by the end of June and *kharif* sowings were started on an extensive scale at the normal time. The inundation canals continued to flow till almost the end of September and favoured the growth of early crops. Large areas were also flooded for *bosi* (dry) cultivation in northern Sind. The cold weather supply, however, was short and the irrigated wheat on the Jamrao suffered to some extent. The rainfall varied from 3 to 9 inches and though not heavy proved injurious to cotton and caused shedding of bolls and flowers in places. The local as well as the American crop was attacked by boll-worm and the latter by red leaf disease also. Severe frost accompanied by cold in February also did some damage to the standing *rabi* crops but its duration was short. The season on the whole was good for *kharif* but only fair for later crops.

II.—AREA CULTIVATED AND UNCULTIVATED.

(TABLE II, pages ii—v.)

3. The total number of villages in the Presidency (22,984½) dropped by one. Two villages in Broach which had been amalgamated into one in 1918 and remained to be so reported last year were shown as one this year. Some seventeen alienated villages in Thana and one in Ratnagiri and one unsurveyed village in Nasik lapsed to Government and seven alienated villages in Satara were surveyed and transferred from the class of "unavailable" to "available" statistics. The total reported area of the Presidency showed a net gain of 7,461 acres owing to survey operations in Ahmedabad (883 acres) and Satara (1,672 acres) and to the addition of the area of one *uddhad* village in Kaira (4,770 acres) which remained to be included last year. Variations in other districts are small and mostly due to corrections in survey records.

4. In Sind the total number of villages remained stationary; but there was a net addition of 27,051 acres to the total reported area of the division. Accretions from the river came to about 9,700 acres in Karachi, 2,800 acres in Sukkur and 4,200 acres in the Upper Sind Frontier District and survey operations and corrections in previous records added about 3,700 acres in Karachi, Larkana and Upper Sind Frontier. Nawabshah shows an unexplained increase of 6,533 acres and the transfer of some forest lands from certain *dehs* in Sukkur to the Kashmor taluka of the Upper Sind Frontier District adds 16,175 acres to the latter with a corresponding reduction in the former.

5. Excluding the area of 189,600 acres of 6½ forest villages in East Khandesh which has again been relegated to "unavailable statistics" the net area for which statistics were regularly collected and reported in the Presidency advanced by 11,300 acres with a corresponding diminution in the non-reported area owing mainly to the transfer to the former of the area of the seven newly surveyed villages in the Satara District mentioned above. Estimates for the probable cropping in the areas for which statistics were not forthcoming were as usual received from all districts except Ratnagiri for which they had to be added in this office. The area in Sind rose by 27,000 acres for the reasons explained above.

6. *Cultivated, i.e., occupied area.*—Appendix A (page 11) shows the cultivated and uncultivated areas as compared with those in the previous year. In the Presidency proper the gross area cropped showed a net rise of 462 lakhs acres or by about 20 per cent. over the area of the previous year. Early favourable rains following a year of famine were made use of everywhere for sowing food and fodder crops on an extended scale, particularly in districts where cultivation had receded most in the previous year. In Sind also the gross cropped area rose by more than 50 per cent. over the previous year owing to timely and steady inundation of the river. But in no case except Satara and Broach and Thana to a small extent did the area show any advance over the figures recorded in 1917-18. Compared with this year the gross area was behind hand by 1·5 per cent. in the Presidency and 8·8 per cent. in Sind. The area cropped more than once rose by 71 per cent. in the Presidency owing to plentiful late rains, the districts of the Panch Mahals and Surat in Gujarat, Poona, Ahmednagar and Nasik in the Deccan and Belgaum and Dharwar in the Karnatak mainly contributing to the extended cultivation of second crops. In Sind, Larkana, Sukkur and Upper Sind Frontier Districts showed similar results giving a net increase of 53·6 per cent. In consequence of the extension under the cropped area the area under fallows receded from 107·4 to 65·4 lakhs acres or by 39 per cent. in the Presidency and from 64·2 to 52·3 lakhs acres or by 18·6 per cent. in Sind. The assessed cropped area rose by 32,300 acres in the Presidency. This includes 12,760 acres of *bhatha* land newly given out for cultivation in Ahmedabad. The districts of Kaira, Panch Mahals, Satara, East Khandesh, Dharwar and Thana have contributed most of the rest. In Sind the assessed area shows a net increase of 99,100 acres (of this 95,000 acres in Thar Parkar alone) owing to favourable season. The unassessed cropped area shows an increase of 10,000 acres in Gujarat, 7,000 acres in the Deccan and 1,500 acres in the Karnatak. In Sind the unassessed area rose by 71,000 acres owing principally to increases in Karachi, Upper Sind Frontier and Nawabshah Districts.

7. *Uncultivated, i.e., unoccupied area.*—Variations under this head correspond generally with those under the occupied area which have been noticed above. About 68,000 acres of forest lands were given out for temporary cultivation mainly in Poona (22,900 acres), Thana (20,800 acres mostly wood lands), Sholapur (9,900 acres), Ahmednagar (6,700 acres) and West Khandesh (5,600 acres) and about 40,700 acres of culturable waste (including the *bhatha* lands in Ahmedabad mentioned above) and miscellaneous unoccupied lands were similarly dealt with in the Presidency.

III.—CROPPED AREA OF THE YEAR.

(TABLE III, pages vi—xv.)

8. The main features of the season and of the harvest of the year have been described elsewhere in the Report. Appendix B (page 11) shows the effect of the season under report on the area sown as compared with the average and with the area cultivated in the preceding year with the principal crops. In the Presidency proper the area under food crops showed an increase of 25 per cent. over the previous year and 3·8 per cent. over the normal. In Sind the respective percentages were 53·7 and 16·6. *Bajri*, *kharif jowar* and other miscellaneous cereals and pulses were grown to a considerably larger extent than usual everywhere owing to plentiful early rains in the Presidency and early inundation in Sind in order to replenish the stocks of food-grains and fodder which had been seriously depleted almost everywhere owing to the drought of the previous year. The season for the cultivation of wheat, gram and other *rabi* crops was also favourable but the area under them was somewhat limited owing to the pre-occupation of lands usually reserved for such crops by the *kharif* crops. The area under non-food crops was 8·3 per cent. over the previous year and 33 per cent. over the normal in the Presidency and 35·8 and 8·4 per cent., respectively, in Sind. Under the incentive of high prices the area under cotton continued to show steady advance during the year in spite of the urgent necessity for growing food and fodder crops. The cultivation of oil-seeds was extended but the area under them was still far short of the normal both in the Presidency and in Sind.

9. The subjoined table compares as usual the areas under cereals and pulses in the Presidency proper in the *kharif* and *rabi* seasons of the year with those of the preceding two years. For reasons explained above the area under *kharif* crops advanced by 21 *lakhs* acres over that of 1917-18 but that under *rabi* receded by 19 *lakhs* acres thus showing a net gain of two *lakhs* acres over the total acreage under food-grain crops of that year.

Jowari and Bajri.—The table in the margin exhibits the extent of the

the cultivation of these staple crops in the different divisions. Affected by the famine conditions that prevailed in the preceding year the cultivators were keen to take advantage of the early rains to sow wherever possible crops that would mature early and afford food for human beings as well as

fodder for cattle. *Bajri* and *kharif jowar* were accordingly sown with the first fall of rain and the area under them was extended by about 56 and 33 per cent., respectively, over the previous year. Poona (+356,000 acres), Ahmednagar (+305,000 acres), Satara and Bijapur (+220,000 acres each), Sholapur (+199,000 acres), Nasik (+178,000 acres) and Ahmedabad (+127,000 acres) mainly contributed to the increased acreage under *bajri* and Bijapur (+188,000 acres), Poona (+143,000 acres), Satara (+133,000 acres), Belgaum (+94,000 acres), and Dharwar (+83,000 acres) that under *kharif jowar*. The area under *rabi jowar* showed a small decline (—124,000 acres) owing to the extended cultivation under the early variety. In Sind good rain in the desert portion of Thar Parkar and other hilly tracts where *bajri* is extensively grown and favourable inundation elsewhere favoured the cultivation of both these cereals and the area under them rose by 133 and 57 per cent., respectively, over the previous year.

Wheat.—The cultivation of this crop (area 1,981,000 acres) advanced by 642,000 acres in the Presidency and 230,000 acres in Sind or by 83 and 69 per cent., respectively, over the abnormally low area of the previous year. Late rains were favourable but owing to the pre-occupation of lands usually sown with *rabi* crops by *kharif* crops the area in the Presidency was about 6.1 *lakhs* acres short of the crop of 1917-18 and about 2 *lakhs* acres in defect of the normal. Nasik, Ahmednagar, West Khandesh and Poona in the Deccan, Ahmedabad, and Broach in Gujarat and Dharwar and Bijapur in the Karnatak mainly contributed to the increase over the previous year. In Sind the steady inundation and good rain-fall of the year afforded sufficient moisture and the cultivation of wheat was extended mainly in Sukkur, Larkana and Upper Sind Frontier and Thar Parkar Districts. But as in the Presidency the total area was still about 110,000 acres short of the acreage of 1917-18.

Other Cereals and Pulses.—Among these the area under Rice (3,044,000 acres) rose by 331,000 acres over last year owing to resumption of its cultivation mainly in North Gujarat and Lower Sind. In Dharwar absence of timely rain and in Thar Parkar dearth of seed reduced the area to some extent. The area under *ragi* (593,000 acres) improved by 69,000 acres over the previous year owing to its extended cultivation in North Gujarat and Dharwar. Helped

by the plentiful moisture afforded by late rains gram (area 669,000 acres) was sown to a larger extent than in the previous year everywhere by 76 per cent. in the Presidency and 108 per cent. in Sind, the extension being particularly marked in Broach, Poona, Ahmednagar, Ahmedabad and in North Deccan and Upper Sind. But for reasons given against wheat the total area under it was still about 27 per cent. short of the acreage in 1917-18. Miscellaneous Cereals and Pulses (area 3,687,000 acres), which are mostly raised in the *kharif* season, showed an increase of 24 per cent. in the Presidency and 68 per cent. in Sind, owing generally to favourable season for the sowing of these crops.

Oil-seeds.—(Area 942,000 acres) were more extensively grown than in the previous year but the area under them was still short of the normal by 39 per cent. in the Presidency and 37 per cent. in Sind—a result due to greater attention being paid during the year to the cultivation of food grains and other more paying crops. The table in the margin shows the variations under the

principal oil-seeds as compared with the previous year. In the Presidency Sesamum was sown to a larger extent in the Deccan (+51,000 acres), Gujarat (+28,000 acres) and Karnatak (+17,000 acres) and Linseed in Nasik, Ahmednagar, Khandesh and Bijapur. Rapeseed (which includes *Jambho-Eruca sativa* and is cultivated mainly in Sind) was more largely sown in Larkana, Upper Sind Frontier, Sukkur and Nawabshah Districts. The area under Groundnuts was about stationary, the decline in its cultivation in Nasik, Sholapur, Satara and Karnatak due to dearth of seed and deficiency of water supply in the beginning being made up by its expansion in Poona, Khandesh, Ahmednagar and new areas in North Gujarat.

Cotton.—The total area under this crop amounted to 4,337 thousand acres or about 1·2 and 36·2 per cent. over the previous year and the average in the Presidency and 0·9 and 73·3 per cent., respectively, in Sind. Notwithstanding the greater need for food and fodder crops the cultivation of this crop showed a considerable expansion in the Deccan and Gujarat under the stimulus of high prices fetched by the crop in the previous season. In the Karnatak, however, preference was given to *jowar* and other food crops owing to deficiency of sowing rains for cotton. In Sind the extension in area shown last year was maintained.

Other Crops.—Among other crops Sugarcane in the Presidency showed a fall of 73 per cent. in area below the previous year owing mainly to deficiency of water supply in wells and canals at the time of planting, but also in part due to dearth of seed owing to the fact that the crop of the previous season was fed to cattle in many places during the prevalence of drought. The area under Tobacco (106,000 acres) more than doubled under the stimulus of high prices fetched in the previous season. Safflower, which is now included under Dyes showed an increase of 112,000 acres in area owing to extended cultivation of *jowar*, wheat and other crops with which it is usually sown. The fodder crops showed an increase of 206,000 acres, mainly in Panch Mahals, Nasik, Satara, Belgaum and Ratnagiri and the area under fruits and vegetables rose from 438 to 619 thousand acres owing to extended cultivation in almost all districts.

11. Appendix C (page 12) shows as usual the distribution in each district of the Presidency and of Sind of the principal food and non-food crops in percentages of the gross area cropped.

IV.—IRRIGATED AREA.

(TABLE IV, pages xvi-xix.)

12. During the year the area irrigated in the Presidency proper amounted to 1,032 thousand acres showing a decline of 4·5 per cent. below the area of the previous year. Irrigation was resorted to, to a greater extent in South Deccan

and in Belgaum and Dharwar Districts of the Karnatak, but elsewhere it was availed of to a smaller degree owing to plentiful late rains of the year. In Sind the irrigated area advanced by 626 thousand acres or by about 25 per cent. over the previous year owing mainly to the plentiful and steady supply of water in Government canals. The increase was general but more marked in Upper than in Lower Sind. About 3·8 per cent. of the net cropped area in the Presidency was helped by irrigation while in the case of Sind the ratio amounted to 79·1 per cent.

13. Appendix D (page 13) exhibits the variations under the several heads of irrigation and of crops irrigated as compared with similar statistics for the previous year.

14. In the Presidency proper owing to ample supply of water irrigation from Government canals (area 222,000 acres) was extended mainly in Ahmedabad and Kaira in North Gujarat and in Nasik, Poona and Sholapur in the Deccan and from private canals (51,000 acres) in Poona and Satara. Tank water (area 109,000 acres) was for the same reason largely utilized mainly in Ahmedabad and Dharwar Districts and to some extent also in Nasik and Poona. Irrigation from wells receded from 752,000 to 619,000 acres (—17 per cent.) almost everywhere except in South Deccan due to water from other less expensive modes of supply being available. The area irrigated from other sources (31,000 acres) showed a small extension in South Konkan, but elsewhere it was generally curtailed resulting in a net decline of 10,000 acres or 24 per cent. In Sind Government canals supplied water to about 2,963,000 acres of land which formed 93·8 per cent. of the total irrigated area in the division. Of the remainder 50,000 acres or 1·6 per cent. were helped from wells, and 133,000 acres or 4·2 per cent. from other sources.

15. As regards the crops grown the area under irrigated rice rose from 116 to 173 thousand acres mainly in Ahmedabad and Kaira in North Gujarat (+40,000 acres) and Dharwar (+16,000) in the Karnatak. Irrigation was taken for wheat mainly in Nasik, Poona, Sholapur and Satara (+31,000 acres) but it was availed of to a less extent in North Gujarat and in Khandesh, Ahmednagar and Bijapur (—36,500 acres). Barley and maize were specially grown for their fodder in Gujarat and Deccan in the previous year as there was considerable demand for it. But during the year under report as plenty of fodder was available from other sources the area watered for these crops was curtailed by 9 and 37 thousand acres respectively. For the same reason the area under irrigated *jowar* (mainly *sundhia* in Gujarat and *hundi* in the Deccan) fell by 61,000 acres in North Gujarat and 10,000 acres in Satara, Sholapur, however, had owing to deficiency of late rains to irrigate 16,000 acres of it more than in the previous year. *Bajri* did not require irrigation assistance during the year in North Gujarat, but about 88,000 acres of it had to be helped with it principally in Ahmednagar, Poona, Sholapur and Satara owing to shortage of late rains. Other cereals and pulses (including gram) were for the same reason more extensively irrigated in the Deccan and Karnatak. The cultivation of sugarcane receded everywhere owing to shortage of water supply at the planting season. Other crops call for no special remarks. The variations in Sind have already been explained above under crops.

V.—OUTTURN OF CROPS.

16. Table V (page xxi) shows the estimated yield of the principal *kharif* and *rabi* crops in parts of 100 which is taken as normal. As observed elsewhere the monsoon commenced favourably everywhere in the Presidency, but the long break in the middle of the season was trying in the eastern parts of the Deccan and Karnatak. Later rains relieved the situation somewhat but they were excessive in places and more or less damaged the standing *kharif* crops as well as those lying in the fields particularly in Gujarat and East Deccan. *Rabi* crops were generally benefited by these late rains but cloudy weather rain and cold and frost in subsequent months reduced their outturn in parts of Gujarat, Deccan and Karnatak. *Tur*, gram and other pulses were in many places damaged by caterpillars and insect attacks. The reported yield

estimates show that full normal yield or somewhat above it was secured for *khari* crops in the Konkan and parts of Gujarat, Khandesh and West Deccan generally but elsewhere it was about 10 to 25 per cent. or more under it. *Rabi* crops were about normal in Khandesh but 10 to 25 per cent. below it elsewhere. In Sind the yield of both *khari* and *rabi* crops varied between one-half to three-fourths of the normal. The figures must be taken as giving only a general indication of the facts.

17. Table VI (pages xxii-xxxi) compares the acreage under food-grain crops (cereals and pulses) in each district of the Presidency and of Sind and its approximate outturn in tons with similar statistics for the two preceding years. The following table sums up the result for each division :—

18. Compared with the figures of 1917-18 the area under foodgrain crops in Gujarat, Deccan and Konkan showed an aggregate deficit of 400 thousand acres which was more than covered by their extended cultivation in the Karnatak (600 thousand acres) giving a net increase of 1.25 per cent. The reported outturn however was higher in every case except a small deficit in the Deccan and the net gain amounted to 10.7 per cent. over the yield returned in 1917-18. Sind shows a deficit of 5.4 per cent. in area but an increase of 19.2 per cent. in the total outturn as compared with the statistics of 1917-18.

VI.—PRICES, TRADE AND STOCK.

19. The appended Table VII (page xxxiii) shows the prices of the principal staples and of fodder ruling at harvest time at each district headquarter station in the Presidency and in Sind.

20. Excepting *tur*, gram, *gul* and tobacco which were even dearer than in the previous year the prices of all articles of food and fodder generally ruled easier though they were still considerably higher than in 1917-18 which itself was a year of high prices. This must be attributed to short stocks of food stuffs in India and in the world generally.

Jowari and Bajri.—The prices of both these staples ruled cheaper than in the previous year by $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 *seers* per rupee in Gujarat and Deccan and by $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 *seers* in the Karnatak and in Sind. Compared with the prices that prevailed in 1917-18 they showed a rise of about 38 to 40 per cent. except in the case of *bajri* in Gujarat and Deccan where it amounted to 25 to 30 per cent.

Rice.—In Sind the price of this staple was about stationary but in the Presidency it was easier by $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 *seer* per rupee below the previous year. Compared with 1917-18 it was dearer by 22 per cent. in Gujarat and 25 to 30 per cent. elsewhere in the Presidency and 35 per cent. in Sind.

Wheat and Gram.—Wheat was cheaper than in the previous year by about $\frac{3}{4}$ *seer* per rupee in Gujarat and Deccan, $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ *seer* in the Karnatak and 1 *seer* in Sind. It was, however, dearer than in 1917-18 by 25 to 30 per cent. in Gujarat and Deccan, 45 to 50 per cent. in the Karnatak and by about 10 to 15 per cent. in Sind. Gram was sold even dearer by about 6 to 10 per cent. in the Presidency and 27 per cent. in Sind than in the previous year and was about 40 to 50 per cent. dearer than in 1917-18.

Gul.—Owing partly to the short crop of the year and partly in sympathy with the rise in the price of imported sugar the price of this article ruled phenomenally high at between $2\frac{1}{4}$ to $2\frac{1}{2}$ *seers* per rupee throughout the Presidency and about $3\frac{1}{2}$ *seers* in Sind.

Tobacco.—The price of this article also ruled very high owing to the short crop of the previous year and greater demand for export and local use. The price varied between 1.08 to 1.35 *seers* per rupee in the Presidency and 2.95 *seers* in Sind.

Cotton.—Under the stimulus of high prices and favourable rains at the sowing time in Gujarat and Deccan and a good inundation in Sind the area under cotton in the Presidency including Native States (exclusive of Baroda for which statistics are now received by the Director of Statistics direct) during the year amounted to 6,176 thousand acres, or about 5.5 per cent. over the previous year. It was, however, still short of the average of the five years ending 1917-18 by about six *lakhs* acres or 8.8 per cent. This was due in part to deficient rains in the Karnatak and to greater attention having to be paid to the growth of food grain and fodder crops, the want of which was felt particularly in Kathiawar. Owing however to better season the total estimated outturn came to about 1,635,000 bales against an average of 1,439,000 bales showing an increase of 13.6 per cent. Of this about 491,200 bales represented the produce of the long stapled varieties of Broach, Kumta and Dharwar and the rest belonged to the short stapled varieties of Khandesh, North Gujarat and Sind. The prices which mainly follow the trend of American cotton showed a slight fall below the previous year for Broach and Dharwar but in the case of Khandesh they receded by 31 per cent. owing to smaller demand during the latter part of the year. The usual statement is given below :—

Fodder.—The price of dry grass in the Deccan and Konkan and of *jowari kadbi* in the Deccan nearly came down to the level of 1917-18, but elsewhere in the Presidency as well as in Sind it was generally much higher for both than in 1917-18, though cheaper than in the previous year except for *kadbi* in the Karnatak which was sold dearer than in the previous year.

VII.—AGRICULTURAL STOCK.

21. The quinquennial census of agricultural stock was held this year simultaneously in all parts of the Presidency and in Sind in January last under the orders of the Government of India (Cir. letter No. 421-12-21, dated 9th March 1916, R. and A. Dept., C. V. A., communicated with Bombay G. O. No. 6368, dated 26th June 1916, R. D.) and the result of it is given at length in Table VIII (pages xxxiv-xxxix) and Appendix E (page 13) summarises the total strength under each main head as compared with the last census held in 1915-16 and that in 1895-96 the year before the first of the series of recent famines began to show their devastating effect upon the number of live-stock of the country. Being taken within six months of the close of the famine of 1918-19, the result indicates clearly the losses due to famine.

Cattle.—The total number of cattle is now returned at 81.84 *lakhs* in the Presidency showing a net loss of 10.22 *lakhs* or 11.1 per cent. on the figures of 1915-16. In Sind the total number 18.18 *lakhs* declined by 3.71 *lakhs*

or 16·6 per cent. below the figures of the same year. Since 1901 the figures of cattle had steadily increased and in 1915-16 the numbers were the highest ever returned. As regards numbers we are now back to where we were 10 years ago. The loss of a million cattle is less than in the partial famine of 1897 and much less than in the general famine of 1899-1900. However the loss is serious enough, but considering the wide spread nature of the fodder famine and the difficulty of railway transport it is remarkable that the losses were so far minimised by the fodder operations.

Of the total losses half come under the heading "Young Stock". A large number of cows died, but comparatively few she-buffaloes and plough cattle least of all. From the figures it would seem probable that, speaking generally, the cattle which died were the least valuable, but the losses of young stock are serious and of course the condition of the surviving cattle was not what it was before the famine. Poona, Ahmednagar and Nasik suffered very severely and in a less degree West Khandesh and Panch Mahals. In a country where there is no standard of efficiency either amongst the plough or the milch cattle, little real information can be obtained from a mere recital of figures. It is quality that counts not mere quantity.

Horses and Ponies.—Showed in the Presidency a small net increase of 2,000 head over the number returned in 1915-16, but some of the best Deccan breeding tracts suffered severely.

Sheep and Goats.—The former declined in the Presidency by 2·62 lakhs below the numbers returned, in 1915-16. In the case of goats the decrease amounted to 8·85 lakhs. In Sind there was a gain of 50 thousand under sheep but a loss of 73 thousand under goats as compared with the returns of 1915-16. The figures returned show a general decline under goats in every district of the Presidency and of Sind (except Sukkur, Hyderabad and Thar Parkar) but the number under sheep showed some increase in Poona, West Khandesh and Kaira Districts and in the Konkan except Kanara in the Presidency and in all districts of Sind except Hyderabad and Upper Sind Frontier.

VIII AND IX.—CONDITION OF THE AGRICULTURAL POPULATION.

22. It was anticipated that owing to losses in cattle and lack of seed many cultivators would find it difficult to sow their fields in 1919; and the fact that a full average area was sown shows that these apprehensions were unfounded. The people showed great staying powers during and after the famine, but the widespread crop failure must have told severely on their resources.
