tables are based and without whose ready co-operation this publication would not

have been possible.



EXPLANATIONS

- 1. Academic Year—For the sake of uniformity the academic year in these tables is taken to coincide with the financial year, i.e., to extend from April 1st of one year to March 31st of the next.
- 2. Recognised Institutions are those in which the course of study followed is that which is prescribed or recognised by the Department of Public Instruction or, by a University or a Board of Secondary and Intermediate Education constituted by law and which satisfy one or more of these authorities, as the case may be, that they attain to a reasonable standard of efficiency. They are open to inspection and their pupils are ordinarily eligible for admission to public examinations and tests held by the Department or the University or the Board.
- 3. Unrecognised Institutions are those which do not come under the above definition of recognised institutions.
- 4. Enrolment—For definiteness, the enrolment in the institutions on 31st March of the academic year in question is taken.
- 5. Expenditure—In calculating the expenditure from Government, District Board or Municipal Funds entered in Tables III-A and III-B and other expenditure tables, all payments or contributions from fees and other sources, which are credited to such funds, are deducted.
- 6. Other Sources include income from endowments, subscriptions, contributions, etc.
- 7. Local Boards include District, Municipal and Cantonment Boards.
- 8. Engineering Schools include Survey Schools.
- 9. Classes I-XII—In Tables IV-A and IV-B, provision has been made for twelve school classes covering the Primary, Middle and High School sections. The figures for the lowest class in the Primary Section or School whether called Infant Class, Sub-standard A, Preparatory Class or Class I, have been entered against Class I in the tables, and the figures of the succeeding higher classes have been shown against Classes II, III, IV, etc., upto the end of the school course without any break in the sequence of classes. Should the number of classes be less than twelve in a school, the figures of the top class have been shown against Classes XI, X or IX according as the total number of classes is eleven, ton or nine, and so on. Where the number of classes exceeds twelve, the figures of the additional classes are shown after Class XII for each class separately. The figures of the Intermediate Classes of Intermediate Colleges are not shown under "School-Education", but are entered against 1st year and 2nd year Intermediate Classes under "Collegiate Education". As a general rule, the duration of each class is taken to be one scholastic year.
- 10. Certificated Teachers are those who have obtained any form of Teachers' Certificate other than the one granted on the basis of public examination of a Teachers Training Institution.
- 11. Anglo-Indian and European Education—All tables include statistics relating to Anglo-Indian, and European education.
- 12. Examination Results—Refer to those students who were educated during the current year i.e., the year for which the statistics are being given in this publication.
- 13. All statistics refer to Recognised Institutions only, except where side-headings for Unrecognised Institutions are entered.
- 14. As it was found that these cosolidated General Educational Tables will not give a true picture without including Administered Areas of Gwalior, corrected figures for which have not been received so far, those for 1945-46 are incorporated to make the consolidated table relatively nearer the truth though not exact.

EDUCATION IN INDIA, 1946-47

Introduction

The year under report was the last pre-independence year and the atmosphere was, therefore, charged with political tension. During the succeeding year, in which material for this year had to be collected, partition of the country into two independent states took place and the mass-scale shifting of administrative machinery and records did not permit us to collect the data for the whole of the country. This report, therefore, does not contain information in respect of the areas now under Pakistan. The present report therefore relates only to that part of British India which now forms part of the Indian Union. Because of this, it has not been possible to compare in detail the position of education during the year under review with that in the previous one.

The area of India (covered under this report) was 7,13,742 square miles, and the estimated population 245 millions.

INSTITUTIONS & ENROLMENT

There were 1,64,067 institutions, of which 1.57,193 were recognised and 6,874 unrecognised. The total number of students in all the institutions was 1,35,73,704, while 1,32,88,266 and 2,85,438 were separate enrolment figures in recognised and unrecognised institutions respectively. These statistics for the year under report showed an increase of about 5,600 institutions and 9,31,000 students over the previous year, which was assessed after estimating figures for 1945-46 in respect of the area covered by the present report. Generally speaking, this increase was observed in all types of institutions.

EXPENDITURES

The total expenditure on education amounted to Rs. 45,16,88,100. The increase in expenditure, worked on the same assumption as above, was approximately Rs. 7,80,00,000. The indirect expenditure on "Direction & Inspection" during the year amounted to nearly Rs. 1.38 crores. The table appended below gives the amount spent during the year on direct and indirect items and the sources from which the expenditure was met:—

General Education

PRIMARY

During the year under review the total number of Primary Schools under all managements (Government, District & Municipal Boards and Private Bodies) was 1,34,967 (1,20,601 for boys and 14,366 for girls). The number of students on rolls in these was 1,00,47,375 (88,45,558 in boys' schools and 12,01,817 in girls' schools). The expenditure incurred was Rs. 12,80,56,838 on boys' schools and Rs. 2,45,64,549 on girls'. Similarly the cost per student in these schools is worked out to be Rs. 14·5 and Rs. 20·4 as against Rs. 11·3 and Rs. 15·9 respectively in the previous year. The number of pupils per teacher during the year was 31.

SECONDARY

The term 'Secondary' is generally applied to the Middle and the High School classes. Certain amount of non-uniformity in the classification of school classes at this stage in different Provinces, Areas continued as before. During the year under review there were 7,093 and 1,201 Middle Schools for boys and girls respectively, where 9,48,171 and 1,81,113 pupils were on rolls. The expenditure incurred on these schools was Rs. 2,42,44,218 and Rs. 58,22,325 respectively. There were 3,073 High Schools for boys and 586 for girls, where 13,88,630 and 1,82,757 pupils were on rolls respectively. The expenditure on these schools was respectively Rs. 7,43,29,212 and Rs. 1,48,66,683. The following table gives expenditure on Secondary Schools according to its source of income:—

It is interesting to note that of the total expenditure on High Schools nearly 83% was spent on the boys' schools while only about 17% on the girls' schools. The percentages of expenditure on Middle & High Schools from government funds alone work out to $32 \cdot 4$ and $25 \cdot 6$ respectively. The teacher-pupil ratios in Middle & High Schools were 1: 23 and 1: 24 respectively.

COLLEGIATE & UNIVERSITY

During the year under review there were 15 universities in former British India now forming part of the Indian Union (area covered in this report) and 3 universities in former Indian States now in the Indian Union. The Universities of Punjab and Dacca have been excluded as they are situated in areas now in Pakistan even though certain colleges of East Punjab were affiliated to the Punjab University. Saugor University which was started this year has been included,

The number of Arts & Science Colleges (both Degree and Intermediate) was 420. This includes 361 for men and 59 for women. Approximately 21% of these colleges were managed by the government, while the rest (excepting 4 by Local Boards) by private bodies. The students on rolls in the Arts & Science Colleges and University Departments for general education was 1,58,899 (1,51,794 in colleges for men and 7,105 in those for women). The expenditure on all the 15 universities under report was Rs. 1,92,69,301 while that on the Arts & Science Colleges was Rs. 3,44,37,479. An analysis of the statistics shows that the percentages of expenditure on these colleges for men and women from government funds alone were respectively 29.6 and 49.2. The cost per student in Arts & Science Colleges for men and women was Rs. 209.8 and Rs. 354.0 respectively as compared to Rs. 196.1 and Rs. 311.5 during the previous year.

The output of Doctorates was 57 men and 4 women, Masters 2,723 men and 384 women, while that of Graduates (Pass and Hons.) 14,244 men and 2,319 women.

Professional & Special Education

TEACHERS' TRAINING

During the year under report there were 22 Teachers' Training Colleges and 339 Normal and Training Schools for men students and 12 Training Colleges and 190 Normal and Training Schools for women students. The students on rolls'in the colleges for men and women respectively were 2,080 and 413, while those in the schools were 23,789 and 10,265. The expenditure figures for the year on the colleges and schools was Rs. 18.33,873 and Rs. 77,58,738 respectively. A major portion of this expenditure in all cases was met from government funds. From these institutions 11, 122 men teachers and 8,873 women teachers (including Degree, Diploma and Certificate holders) were trained during the year.

Engineering & Technology

There were 14 Engineering and Technological Colleges with 5,864 students (including 6 women students). The notable feature of the year was that 5 Colleges for Engineering & Technology were opened in the 3 Provinces of the country: Bombay 1, Madras 3 and West Bengal 1. The number of Engineering & Technical & Industrial Schools was 491 with 29,015 students. The total expenditure on Engineering Technological, Technical and Industrial Institutions was Rs. 1,24,28,845, of which Rs. 31,50,862 was spent on colleges. Approximately $47 \cdot 2\%$ of this expenditure was met from government funds. The output of Engineering & Technological Graduates during the year was 815 (528 in Engineering and 287 in Technology).

MEDICINE & VETERINARY

During the year under report there were 22 Medical Colleges of which only 3 were for women. The latter were all aided institutions and were one each in the provinces of Madras, East Punjab and Delhi. The table given below shows some details about Medical Colleges and Schools in the country:—

There were 4 Veterinary Colleges (one each in the provinces of West Bengal, Bihar, Bombay and Madras) with 588 scholars on rolls. The total expenditure on these institutions amounted to Rs. 7,82,078.

The output of Degree holders in Medicine was 1,056 men and 131 women, and that in Veterinary Science 16 men.

AGRICULTURE & FORESTRY

The facilities for Agricultural education, as existed during the year in question, are summarised in the table appended below:—

There were no Agricultural Colleges exclusively for women. Of the 14 Agricultural Schools, one was meant for girls alone, and was situated in the province of Bihar. Mention may, however, be made of the fact that 8 women students were reading in the Agricultural Colleges.

The two Colleges for Forestry—The Indian Forest Rangers' College, Dehra Dun and The All-India Research Institute in Forestry, Dehra Dun—continued their existence in U. P. and were administered by the Central Government. The third one, viz., The Indian Forest Rangers College, Coimbatore, which was closed in the year 1939, was re-opened during this year under the administration of Madras Government. The latter college had on its rolls 70 students, while the other two situated in U.P. had 211. The total expenditure on these 3 colleges was Rs. 6,30,702.

Law

Provision for Law studies in most of the Universities as postgraduate courses existed as before. There were 13 colleges with 8.186 students on rolls, and the expenditure incurred amounted to Rs. 6,13,925. The output of Masters and Bachelors in Law was 7 and 2,732 (including 21 women graduates) respectively.

Adult Education

During the year adult literacy centres/classes in the country continued to impart instruction to adults and issued literacy certificates to both men and women. The number of regular Adult Schools was 5,988 with 1,55,864 men and 9,773 women on rolls. The expenditure incurred on these schools was Rs. 9,93,800.

AESTHETIC EDUCATION AND EDUCATION OF THE HANDIGAPPED

There were 14 Art Schools in the country during the year with 1,698 (including 169 girls) students. The expenditure incurred on these schools was Rs. 4,36,742. As regards the education of the handicapped there were 51 schools with 1,881 students on rolls. Madras had two schools for lepers, while Bengal and Bihar had one each for the mentally retarded. The amount expended on these schools was Rs. 3,85,453.

Miscellaneous

WOMEN'S EDUCATION

The education of girls showed some progress during the year, and the following main features may be recorded in this field:—


- (a) The total number of girl students in all types of institutions was 32,67,472 as against about 31,00,300 in 1945-46;
- (b) 17,41,267 girls were studying in institutions for boys as against about 16.38,700 in the last year ; and
- (c) The output of women degree holders (Doctors, Masters, etc.) in all subjects was 3,351 as against 2,770 for the previous year.

ORIENTAL LEARNING

Facilities for Oriental studies were available in colleges as well as in schools like Tols, Pathshalas, Madrassas, Muktabs, Sanskrit and Arabic schools, etc. In the province of Madras degrees were awarded in Oriental Learning and the output of graduates was 28.

EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS

The number of institutions in rural areas during the year was 1,37,980 of which 86% were Primary Schools. The number of students on rolls in these institutions was 96,22,931 of which about 83% were in the Primary Schools. The expenditure incurred on these institutions was Rs. 15,68,74,964.
