P R E F A C E

Reduction in regional imbalances of educational development is a major objective of the National policy on Education. To promote this programme, it is necessary to collect statistics of educational development in the different regions of the country periodically and to publish them for information and use by all concerned.

The Ministry of Education publishes annually statistics of educational development in the different States of the Indian Union. But as imbalances of educational development between one district and another are far more pronounced than those between one State and another, it was decided to collect and publish statistics of educational development in the districts also every five years. Accordingly, such statistics were collected and published, for the first time, for the year 1960-61.

The study is now being repeated for the year 1965-66 and it is proposed to bring out a separate volume on the district educational statistics of every State. It will contain statistics for the year 1965-66 along with comparative data for the year 1960-61. To make inter district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per capita expenditure on education, etc., will also be included.

In this programme of bringing out 16 volumes for all the States of the Union (except Nagaland) this volume is the fourth and is devoted to the educational statistics of districts in Gujarat State. It has been based on the data collected from the State Department of Education.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the co-operation and help received from the Director of Public Instruction, Maharashtra, and other educational authorities in the State and the staff of the Statistics and Information Division which has prepared this Report.

I - INTRODUCTORY

The Ministry of Education and Youth Services publishes the statistics of education in India annually in their publications 'Education in India, Vol. I and Vol. II'. These publications give the statistics at the national and State levels, but do not provide district-wise statistics.

2. To fill up this gap, the National Council of Educational Research and Training brought out a volume entitled 'Educational Statistics - District-wise' giving the bench mark of educational data of various kinds for all districts for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparison possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentages of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education were also given. These comparative statements show a wide range of variation between the districts in every respect.

3. It has now been decided to have a similar review of educational development in the districts for the year 1965-66. Such periodic reviews are necessary for several reasons. For instance, they will help to judge the effectiveness of the measures taken to correct regional imbalances at the district level. Secondly, such collection and publication of data on different aspects of education at the district level will help the preparation of educational development plans for all districts so that they can be adopted, as recommended by the Education Commission as the principal unit for administration, planning and development of school education.

4. This review will be divided into sixteen volumes - one volume being devoted to the educational statistics of the districts in every State (except Nagaland). The present volume, which is the fourth in the series, gives the data for each of the districts of Gujarat on number of educational institutions, pupils, teachers, expenditure, etc., at all levels of education. It also gives the rates of growth in different sectors from 1960-61 to 1965-66 and some important indices of educational development.

II - SUMMARY

5. The district-wise statistics of Gujarat State for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66, given in the following pages, give an idea about the disparities in educational development among the 18 districts of the State.

PRIMARY SCHOOL CLASSES:

6. A synoptic view of the relative position of the 18 districts, as far as provision of schooling facilities at primary stage are concerned, is given below in Table 1. This table gives enrolment ratio in classes I-V for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 and the ranking of the districts according to their position with respect to enrolment ratio.**

As a matter of fact for 17 districts only which existed in 1960-61. In 1965-66 though the number of districts rose to 18 by bifurcation of Surat into Surat and Bulsar but population figures of only composite Surat district as it existed in 1960-61 are available.

7. Between 1960-61 and 1965-66 i.e. within a period of 5 years, the enrolment ratio increased from 73.0 to 82.4 at the State level. But the growth in individual districts varied. As a matter of fact, the enrolment ratio slightly decreased in case of Banaskantha whereas there was phenomenal increase in case of Dangs from 51.5 to 95.5 which moved it from 15th position in 1960-61 to 3rd position in 1965-66. In 1960-61, in 10 of the 17 districts the enrolment ratio was less than the State average. In 1965-66 also, the number of such districts remained the same with only difference that Dangs which was below the State average in 1960-61 became above the State average in 1965-66 and in its place Sabarkantha came down from its above the State average position in 1960-61 to below the State average position in 1965-66. The lowest enrolment ratio in 1965-66 was in Banaskantha (44.2) followed by Junagadh (62.0), Kutch (65.1), Panchmahals (67.1) much below the State average of 82.4. Primary education is the base upon which the super-structure of education is built and, therefore, the extent to which this is expended, it will have its impact on other stages of education.

MIDDLE SCHOOL CLASSES:

8. Table 2 gives the enrolment ratios of various districts for classes VI-VIII for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 and the ranking thereof.

9. During the 5 years period under consideration, the enrolment ratio at middle school stage (classes VI-VIII) increased from 26.3 to 34.9 at the State level. But the district-wise growth had been some what uneven. As a matter of fact in Sabarkantha enrolment ratio decreased from 22.2 to 20.2. In both 1960-61 and 1965-66, of the 17 districts, only 6 had the enrolment ratio above the State average. These districts in 1960-61 were Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Kaira, Mehsana and Surat. In 1965-66, Bhavnagar which was below the State average in 1960-61 moved above the State average in 1965-66 and contrary to it Broach which was above the State average in 1960-61 went below the State average in 1965-66. In all other districts the enrolment ratio was less than the State average. The lowest enrolment ratio in 1960-61 was in case of Dangs and was 6.8 as against 26.3 of the State. In 1965-66, the lowest enrolment ratio was in the case of Banaskantha and was 11.3 as against the State average of 34.9.

HIGH SCHOOL STAGE:

10. Table 3 gives enrolment ratio in classes IX-XI for the various districts of Gujarat for the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 alongwith their ranking.

11. During the period 1960-61 to 1965-66, the enrolment ratio at the State level increased from 13.0 to 20.1. As in the case of previous stages, the increase in the enrolment ratio varied from district to district. However, there is no much change in the ranking of the different districts during this period. In 1960-61, only 6 of 17 districts had enrolment ratio at high school stage above the State average. This number remained the same in 1965-66 also with one change that Mehsana was replaced by Broach. These districts in 1965-66 were Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Kaira, Rajkot and Surat. All other districts had enrolment ratio less than the State average and Dangs had the lowest enrolment ratio of 2.2 in 1960-61 and 4.2 in 1965-66 as against the State average of 13.0 and 20.1 respectively.

ALL SCHOOL CLASSES:

12. The complete enrolment ratio for classes I-XI district-wise is given in Table 4 along with the ranking of the districts according to their position.

13. Taking school stage as a whole, the enrolment ratio was 46.6 in 1960-61 and 55.0 in 1965-66 at the State level. In 1960-61 there were only 6 districts whose enrolment ratio was higher than the State average. This number increased to 7 in 1965-66. These districts were Ahmedabad, Mehsana, Kaira, Surat, Broach, Baroda and Dangs. In both the years 1960-61 and 1965-66, the highest enrolment was in Ahmedabad and the lowest in Banaskantha. One could see that taking the school stage as a whole, the districts of Banaskantha, Junagadh, Kutch, Panchmahals, Surendranagar and Jamnagar were behind the other districts in enrolment ratio.

HIGHER EDUCATION:

14. Table 5 gives the enrolment ratio in higher education classes in various districts of Gujarat during the years 1960-61 and 1965-66 alongwith their ranking.

15. During the period under review, the enrolment ratio at higher education stage increased from 2.1 to 3.9 at the State level. Though the increase varied from district to district, there was not much variation in ranking of the districts for the years 1960-61 and except 1965-66, except that there were no students in higher education in the districts of Amreli and Banaskantha in 1960-61. While such a provision was there in these two districts in 1965-66. In 1965-66, only in the districts of Ahmedabad, Baroda, Kaira and Rajkot the enrolment ratio was higher than that of the State average. In rest of the districts it was less than that of the State average.

III - AREA AND POPULATION

16. Gujarat State as at present, consists of 18 districts. In 1961 there were only 17 districts in the State. The Surat district of 1961 was bifurcated into two districts, viz. Surat and Bulsar. The total area of the State is 72,245 sq. miles. The area of the different districts varied from 17,060 sq. miles of Kutch to 689 sq. miles of Dangs. The area of Banaskantha, Bhavnagar, Junagadh, Mehsana, Rajkot undivided Surat and Surendranagar varied between 4,000 to 5,000 sq. miles; Ahmedabad, Jamnagar and Panchmahals varied between 3,000 to 4,000; Baroda, Broach, Kaira and Sabarkantha varied between 2,000 and 3,000 and of Amreli it was less than 2,000 sq. miles.


17. The total population of the State in 1961 was 206.33 lakhs consisting of 106.34 lakh males and 99.99 lakh females. By 1966 the population of the State is estimated to have increased to 256.64 lakhs of which 121.95 lakh were males and 114.69 lakh females. The population of the different districts in 1966 varied very much. In Ahmedabad, undivided Surat and Kaira the total population was 20 to 30 lakhs each whereas in Banaskantha, Baroda, Bhavnagar, Broach, Junagadh, Mehsana, Panchmahals, Rajkot and Sabarkantha the population varied between 10 to 20 lakhs each. However, in Amreli, Jamnagar and Kutch the total population was 7 to 10 lakhs. In Dangs, however, the total population was only 0.8 lakhs.

18. The overall density of population per sq. mile for the State as a whole increased from 286 in 1961 to 328 in 1966. The density of population also varied very much among the districts. The density was the highest in 1966 in Kaira (865) followed by Ahmedabad (732), Baroda (592) and

undivided Surat (579). In 7 of the other districts the density varied from 300 to 500 and in three districts from 200 to 300. In Surendranagar the density was 190, in Dangs 119 and in Kutch only 47 per sq. mile.

19. Of the total population in the State in 1966 the population in the age-group 6-11 was 32.4 lakhs, consisting of 16.7 lakh males and 15.7 lakh females. The children in this age-group formed 13.7% of the total population of the State.

20. The population in the age-group 11-14 in 1966 in Gujarat was 17.1 lakhs consisting of 8.8 lakh males and 8.3 lakh females. This formed 7.2% of the total population of the State.

21. Similarly, the total population of the State in the age-group 14-17 in 1966 was 15.5 lakhs consisting of nearly 8 lakh males and 7.5 lakh females. The population in this age-group formed 6.5% of the total population in the State.

22. In the age-group 17-23 the total population in the State was 26.5 lakhs consisting of 13.8 lakh boys and 12.7^{lakh} girls. The total population in this age-group formed 11.2% of the total population of the State.

23. Thus of the total population of the State, 91.4 lakhs consisting of 47.2 lakh boys and 44.2 lakh girls was in the age-group 6-23. The population in the age-group 6-23 in the State formed 38.6% of the total population. Among the males they formed 38.7% and among the girls they formed 38.5%.

IV - LITERACY

24. According to 1961 census the general literacy rate that is the number of literates per thousand of corresponding population was 305. This rate for males was 411 and for females 191 only. Among the districts the literacy rate for the total population was highest in Ahmedabad (419). In 6 of the 17 districts this varied from 300 to 400; in 7 districts from 200 to 300 and in the remaining 3 districts, namely, Banaskantha, Panchmahals and Dangs it was less than 200, the lowest being in Dangs (93). Among the males, the literacy rate per thousand of population was the highest again in Ahmedabad (527). In 6 of the districts it varied from 400 to 500; in 7 districts from 300 to 400, in 2 districts from 200 to 300 and in one district, namely, Dangs less than 200 (143). In the case of females in 7 districts including Ahmedabad the literacy rate per thousand of population was between 200 to 300; and in 3 districts, namely, Panchmahals, Banaskantha and Dangs it was less than 100.

V - TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, ENROLMENT TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE

INSTITUTIONS:

25. The total number of educational institutions in Gujarat in 1960-61 was 26575 which increased to 27,253 by 1965-66. The total number of institutions in the State has increased at an annual growth rate of less than one per cent. The number of institutions have increased only in Ahmedabad, Baroda, Bhavnagar, Dangs, Kaira, and Sabarkantha. In the other districts there was slight decrease in total number of institutions. The increase in the total number of institutions was the highest during the period in Mehsana.

ENROLMENT:

26. The total enrolment in all recognised educational institutions in the State in 1960-61 was 28.67 lakhs. Of this 19.27 lakhs were boys and 9.40 lakhs girls. By 1965-66 the total enrolment in all recognised institutions in the State increased to 38.43 lakhs of which 25.06 lakhs were boys and 13.37 lakhs girls. The increase in enrolment is observed in all the districts. At the State level the cumulative annual rate of growth was 5.8%. Among the districts the increase in enrolment among the boys as well as girls was the highest in Bhavnagar and Dangs. The Table gives the percentage increase in the enrolment of boys and girls in the different districts along with sex ratio of enrolment in 1965-66.

27. The sex ratio i.e. number of girls enrolled for every 100 boys at the State level was 49 in 1960-61 which increased to 53 by 1965-66.

28. As a percentage of population the total enrolment in educational institutions was 13.9 in 1960-61 and 16.2 in 1965-66 at the State level. The highest percentage enrolment in 1965-66 was in Ahmedabad (31.3), followed by Mehsana (19.1), Kaira (18.7) and Bhavanagar (18.3). In Banaskantha the percentage enrolment to the total was only 7.5.

TEACHERS:

29. The total number of teachers in educational institutions in Gujarat increased from nearly 84,000 to 1,14,000 during the period. This shows the rate of increase of 6.0% per annum. Among the total number of teachers 23.4% were women in 1960-61 and the corresponding percentage in 1965-66 was 26.1. In 1965-66 the percentage of women teachers was more than 30 in Ahmedabad, Bhavanagar, Jamnagar, Kutch and Rajkot. The lowest percentage of women teachers was in Banaskantha (11.0) followed by Sabarkantha (15.6). In 1960-61 for every 1,000 population the number of teachers was 4.1 and by 1965-66 this number increased to 4.8. In 1965-66 the number of teachers per thousand

population was the highest in Ahmedabad (6.7), followed by Bhavnagar (6.0) and was the lowest in Banaskantha (2.5).

EXPENDITURE:

30. The total direct expenditure on all recognised institutions in Gujarat was Rs.1,463.4 lakhs in 1960-61. By 1965-66 the total direct expenditure more than doubled to Rs.2,995.5 lakhs. The annual cumulative rate of growth of direct expenditure during the period was 13.7%. The direct expenditure has shown substantial increase in all the districts. However, taking 1960-61 as base, the highest increase in the total direct expenditure was in Dangs followed by Baroda and Ahmedabad. The increase in the expenditure during the period was the lowest in Surendranagar followed by Bhavnagar and Amreli.

31. The direct expenditure per head of population was Rs.7.1 in the State in 1960-61. By 1965-66 the direct expenditure per capita increased to Rs.12.7. Among the districts in 1965-66, the per capita expenditure on education was the highest in Ahmedabad (Rs.25.9) followed by Baroda (Rs.22.5) and Kaira (Rs.17.3). On the other side of the scale, the per capita expenditure was only Rs.4.4 in Banaskantha and Rs.5.8 in Kutch. Of the 18 districts, the per capita expenditure was less than Rs.10/- in 7 districts in 1965-66.

32. Of the direct expenditure on education at the State level in 1965-66, 58.8% was from Government funds, 20.8% from fees, 7.3% from Local Board funds and 13.1% from other sources. The percentage contribution from Government funds varied from 31.0% in Amreli districts to 99.7% in Dangs. The contribution from fee income varied from nil in Dangs to 33.6% in Baroda.

VI - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

33. The number of pre-primary schools in Gujarat increased from 348 in 1960-61 to 627 in 1965-66. In 1960-61 there was no pre-primary school in the districts of Dangs and Jamnagar, whereas by 1965-66 24 pre-primary schools were opened in Jamnagar but still Dangs remained without a pre-primary school. In the other districts the number of pre-primary schools varied very much from less than 10 in Banaskantha to 98 in Mehsana.

ENROLMENT:

34. The total enrolment in pre-primary schools including attached classes increased from 25,547 in 1960-61 to 47,287 in 1965-66. The enrolment in pre-primary classes was less than 1,000 in Banaskantha, Baroach, Sabarkantha and Bular districts in 1965-66; 1,000 to 2,000 in Amali, Kutch, Panchmahals, Surat and Surendranagar; and 2,000 to 3,000 in Bhavnagar and Jamnagar; 3,000 to 5,000 in Junagadh, Baroda and Ahmedabad and 5,000 to 7,000 in the other 3 districts. The sex ratio in students of pre-primary schools at the State level was 80 girls for every 100 boys in 1960-61 which increased to 84 girls per 100 boys by 1965-66.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

35. Of the total enrolment, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes was 2,198 at the State level. In many districts the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in pre-primary schools was negligible.

TEACHERS:

36. The number of teachers in pre-primary schools increased from 694 to 1,195 during the period. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66 all excepting 196 were women. Of the total number of teachers 60.8% were trained in 1960-61, whereas by 1965-66 the percentage of trained teachers decreased to 55.7. This decrease in the percentage of trained teachers is mainly due to the decrease in the percentage of trained teachers in Ahmedabad, Junagadh, Kutch and Mehsana. The pupil teacher ratio at the State level was 40 students per teacher and it varied from less than 30 in Surat and Bulsar to more than 50 in Mehsana and Amreli.

EXPENDITURE:

37. The total direct expenditure on pre-primary schools increased from Rs.11.47 lakhs in 1960-61 to Rs.23.64 lakhs in 1965-66. The direct expenditure was the highest in Kaira district followed by Ahmedabad and Jamnagar in 1965-66. The direct expenditure per pupil in the pre-primary schools was Rs.50 at State level in 1965-66. The expenditure per pupil varied from Rs.75 in Jamnagar to Rs.29 in Kutch and Mehsana.

VII - PRIMARY EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

38. The number of primary schools in Gujarat slightly decreased from 12,031 to 11,191 during the period 1960-61 to 1965-66. This decrease in the number of primary schools is mainly due to up-grading of primary schools to middle and high schools and is observed in the districts of Amreli, Banaskantha, Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kaira, Kutch, Mehsana, Panchmahals, Rajkot, Surat and Surendranagar. The number of primary schools show an increase only in Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Dangs and Sabarkantha.

39. On an average there was a primary school for every 6.0 sq. miles in 1960-61 and every 6.5 sq. miles in 1965-66. In 10 districts the average area served by a primary school in 1965-66 was less than 5 sq. miles and in 5 districts it was more than 10 sq. miles and in the remaining districts it was between 5 - 10 sq. miles per school.

40. The population served by a primary school increased from 1,715 in 1960-61 to 2,115 in 1965-66. The average population served by a primary school in a district was less than 1,500 in 5 districts and more than 3,000 in 4 districts. In Dang the average population per primary school was only 325, whereas in Mansana it was 4,560. Details are given in Statement VI.

ENROLMENT:

41. The total enrolment in primary schools in Gujarat in 1965-66 was 8.6 lakhs. In classes I-V the enrolment at the State level which stood at 20.6 lakhs in 1960-61 increased to 25.6 lakh by 1965-66. This shows a growth rate of 5.1% per annum. The growth rate of enrolment in these classes was 4.8% in the case of boys and 5.6% in the case of girls. Among the districts also there was substantial increase in the enrolment of classes I-V during this period. However, the increase in the enrolment of both boys and girls was the highest in Dang district.

42. The sex ratio of enrolment in 1960-61 at the State level was 56 girls for every 100 boys and in 1965-66 it was 58 girls for every 100 boys. The table on next page gives the enrolment in 1965-66 in classes I-V as a percentage of enrolment in 1960-61 and the sex ratio of enrolment in 1965-66.

in the Age-group 5-11 (boys) 1955-66.



43. The percentage enrolment in classes I-V to the total population in the age-group 6-11 i.e. enrolment ratio gives an index of facilities created for primary stage education. This enrolment ratio was 73.0 at State level taking both boys and girls together in 1960-61 which increased to 82.4 by 1965-66. In the case of boys this enrolment ratio increased from 91.2 to

101.3 during the period while in case of girls the increase was only from 53.7 to 62.2 during the period. In 1965-66 the enrolment ratio of boys in classes I-V was more than 100 or around 100 in 11 districts out of 18 districts. The enrolment ratio was the lowest in Banaskantha (68.0) and the highest in Dangs (119.3). In the case of girls in none of the districts the enrolment ratio exceeded 86.0 which was in Ahmedabad. On the other hand in Banaskantha the enrolment ratio was only 18.8. Taking both boys and girls together, the enrolment ratio in classes I-V was 100 or more in Ahmedabad and Mehsana. In Banaskantha the enrolment ratio was the lowest and was only 44.2. The details are given in Statement VII-A.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

44. Of the total enrolment in classes I-V, 4.21 lakhs belonged to the S.C. & S.T. communities. Of this number 2.91 lakhs were boys and 1.30 lakhs girls. The percentage of S.C. & S.T. students to the total enrolment in classes I-V was 15.8 at the State level. Among the boys the percentage of S.C. & S.T. students was 17.3 and among the girls 13.3. There is large variation among the districts in the percentage of S.C. & S.T. students to the total enrolment in classes I-V. This is mainly due to the variation in the percentage of S.C. & S.T. population to the total population and also due to the variation in the educational development in the different districts. Among the boys the percentage of S.C. & S.T. to the total enrolment in classes I-V varied from less than 10 in Amreli, Banaskantha, Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kaira, Kutch, Rajkot and Surendranagar to 45.3 in Surat. In Dangs however 82.0% of the students belonged to S.C. & S.T. In case of girls the percentage of S.C. & S.T. to the total enrolment was more than 10% only in Banaskantha, Baroda, Broach, Dangs, Panchmahals, Sabarkantha and Surat, the highest being in Dangs (73.3). Taking both

boys and girls together the percentage of S.C. & S.T. to the total enrolment was more than 10% only in 7 districts, the highest percentage being in Dangs. The details are given in Statement VII-B. The Statement VII-B also gives in columns 11-13 the extent of coverage. The extent of coverage is defined as

$$\frac{\text{Percentage of S.C. \& S.T. students to corresponding total enrolment}}{\text{Percentage of S.C. \& S.T. population to total population}} \times 100$$

This shows that the enrolment of S.C. & S.T. in classes I-V is similar to the enrolment of all students in comparison to the respective total population. At the State level the extent of coverage taking both boys and girls together was 79.0. In the case of boys the extent of coverage was 87.8 and in the case of girls 65.5. In the case of boys, the extent of coverage was more than 100 in Ahmedabad, Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Kaira, Mehsana, Rajkot and Sabarkantha and was the lowest in Banaskantha (43.9). In case of girls, the extent of coverage of S.C. & S.T. was more than 100 only in Bhavnagar. The extent of coverage was the lowest in Baroda 38.8. Taking both the boys and girls together the extent of coverage of S.C. & S.T. was more than 100 in Ahmedabad, Bhavnagar, Kaira and Mehsana and was lowest in Baroda 52.6.

TEACHERS:

45. The total number of teachers in primary schools in Gujarat increased from 18,977 to 19,545 during the period 1960-61 to 1965-66. This increase comes to an annual rate of growth of 0.6%. The corresponding rate of growth of enrolment in primary schools during this period was 5.1% per annum. Taking 1960-61 position as base, the number of teachers in primary schools showed an increase only in Ahmedabad, Amreli, Baroda, Bhavnagar, Broach, Jamnagar, Mehsana and Sabarkantha.

Sabarkantha. In the other districts there was some decrease. In Junagadh district the decrease in 1965-66 as compared to 1960-61 was more than 50%.

46. The percentage of women teachers among the teachers in primary schools, was 19% in 1960-61 which increased slightly to 20% by 1965-66. Among the districts, in 1965-66, the percentage of women teachers was 44.1% in Ahmedabad, 34.4% in Bhavnagar, 23.2% in Surendranagar and 22.3 in Kutch. In all other districts the percentage of women teachers was less than 20. In Banaskantha Panchmahals and Sabarkantha the women teachers formed less than 10% of the total number of teachers in primary schools.

47. The percentage of trained teachers among the teachers in the primary schools was 38.8 in 1960-61. It increased to 47.2 by 1965-66. Among the male teachers the percentage of trained teachers increased from 36.4 to 44.0 during the period and in the case of women teachers from 48.8 to 66.0. In 1965-66, taking all the teachers together, more than 50% of the teachers were trained only in Ahmedabad, Bhavnagar, Surat and Surendranagar. In Banaskantha and Kutch the percentage of trained teachers was around 25% only.

EXPENDITURE:

48. The total direct expenditure on primary schools increased from 263.64 lakhs to Rs. 337.11 lakhs during the period under consideration. This shows a cumulative annual rate of growth of 4.9%. The direct expenditure on primary schools increased in all the districts excepting Amreli, Banaskantha, Junagadh, Kutch, Mehsana and Rajkot. In these districts there was a decrease in the direct expenditure on primary schools. The increase in the direct expenditure was highest in Dangs district. The per capita expenditure on primary schools in the State was only Rs.1.3

in 1960-61 which increased slightly to Rs.1.4 by 1965-66. Among the districts, the per capita expenditure on primary schools in 1965-66 varied from Rs.9.7 in Dangs less than Rs.1 in Amreli, Banaskantha, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kutch, Mehsana and Rajkot districts. In Banaskantha the per capita expenditure on primary schools was only Rs.0.3.

49. The total direct expenditure on primary schools formed 18.0% of the total direct expenditure on education in the State in 1960-61. By 1965-66 this percentage decreased to 11.4 at the State level. Among the districts in Dangs 67.8% of the total expenditure on education was on primary schools. In Panchmahals and Surendranagar districts the direct expenditure on primary schools formed nearly 21% and in Amreli and Broach nearly 15.5%. In Banaskantha, Baroda, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kaira, Mehsana, Rajkot and Bular districts the expenditure on primary schools formed less than 10% of the total expenditure on education in these districts.

50. The expenditure per student in primary schools in 1965-66 was Rs.39.4 at the State level. This varied from Rs.20 or less in Rajkot, Mehsana, Bhavnagar and Banaskantha to Rs.75.3 in Ahmedabad and Rs.95.9 in Dangs. The cost per student has a direct relation with the pupil-teacher ratio. The pupil-teacher ratio was the highest in those districts where the cost per student was lowest. At the State level the pupil-teacher ratio was 44 in 1965-66. Among the districts it varies from less than 30 in Dangs, Jamnagar and Junagadh to 74 in Mehsana. The Table on next page summarises the position.

VIII - MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

51. The number of middle schools increased from 6,487 to 9,051 in the State during the period under consideration. This shows an increase of 40% over the 1960-61 position. Among the districts there has been considerable increase in the number of middle schools in all. The percentage increase in the number of middle schools during the period was the highest in Kutch followed by Dangs and the lowest in Broach district.


52. In 1960-61 a middle school served on an average an area of 11.1 sq. miles. By 1965-66 the average area served by a middle school at the State level decreased to 8.0 sq. miles. In 1965-66 in Kutch there was a middle school on the average for every 50 sq. miles whereas in Dangs there was a middle school for every 19 sq. miles and in Surendranagar for every 12 sq. miles. In 7 of the 18 districts the average area served by a middle school was less than 5 sq. miles.

53. On an average at the State level there was a middle school for every 3,200 population in 1960-61. By 1965-66 the average population served by a middle school at the State level decreased to 2,600. Among the districts the average population served by a middle school varied from 3,000 to 3,400 in Ahmedabad, Banaskantha and Surendranagar districts to less than 2,000 in Sabarkantha. In all other districts the average population served by a middle school was between 2,000 to 3,000. The details are given in Statement X.

ENROLMENT:

54. The total enrolment in middle schools in Gujarat was 21.15 lakhs in 1965-66. The enrolment in these schools was highest in Kaira district and was the lowest in Dangs district.

55. The enrolment in the middle stage classes i.e. classes VI-VIII in 1960-61 at the State level was 3.87 lakhs, which increased to 5.97 lakhs by 1965-66. This shows a growth rate of 8.5 per cent per annum. The growth rate of enrolment in these classes during the period for boys was 7.6% per annum and for girls 10.8% per annum. Taking 1960-61 as base, the percentage increase in enrolment during the period in these classes in the different districts was the highest in Bhavnagar and the lowest in Sabarkantha.


56. The sex ratio of enrolment i.e. the number of girls for every 100 boys enrolled was 39 at the State level in 1960-61. This increased to 46 by 1965-66. In the different districts, the sex ratio in 1965-66 varied from 72 in Surat district to 14 in Banaskantha district. The Table below gives the enrolment in 1965-66 as a percentage of enrolment in 1960-61 along with the sex ratio in the different districts.

57. The percentage enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the population in age-group 11-14 other words the enrolment ratio gives the index of the facilities created for middle stage education. At the State level the enrolment ratio for boys and girls together increased from 34.9 during the period. In the case of boys the enrolment ratio increased from 36.6 to 41.2 and in the case of girls from 15.2 to 22.7. Among the districts, in the case of boys the ratio in 1965-66 varied from 69.3 in Mehsana and 66.4 in Ahmedabad to less than 10 in Banaskantha and Dangs. In the case of girls the enrolment ratio varied from 44.2 in Ahmedabad to less than 10 in Banaskantha, Dangs and Sabarkantha districts. Taking both boys and girls together, the ratio varied from 55.8 in Ahmedabad to less than 20 in Banaskantha, Dangs and Amreli districts.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

58. Of the total enrolment in classes VI-VIII in Gujarat in 1965-66, 70,701 were students belonging to the S.C. & S.T. communities. Of this number 51,396 were boys and 19,305 were girls. The sex ratio of enrolment of S.C. & S.T. comes to 38 girls for every 100 boys. The total enrolment of S.C. & S.T. students in these classes varied from more than 11,000 in Ahmedabad to less than 1,000 in Amreli, Jamnagar and Kutch.

59. The percentage of S.C. & S.T. students to the total enrolment in classes VI-VIII was 11.8 at the State level taking both boys and girls together. In the case of boys the corresponding percentage was 12.6 and in the case of girls 10.2. Among the districts, the percentage enrolment of S.C. & S.T. boys to the corresponding total enrolment varied from 82.0 in Dangs, followed by 25.9 in Surat to less than 5% in Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh and Kutch districts. In the case of girls the percentage enrolment of S.C. & S.T. was the highest in Dangs (83.3), followed by Banaskantha 41.8. In Junagadh and Kaira the percentage enrolment of these students was less than 5%. Taking both boys and girls together, the percentage enrolment of these students in classes VI-VIII to the total enrolment varied from 82.3 in Dangs, followed by nearly 20% in Broach, Panchmahals and Surat to less than 5% in Bhavnagar, Jamnagar and Junagadh.

60. The extent of coverage of S.C. & S.T. students was only 59% at the State level taking both boys and girls together. The extent of coverage was 64% in case of boys and 50.2% in case of girls. Among the districts, the extent of coverage in the case of boys was more than 100 in Ahmedabad, Amreli, Kaira, Rajkot and Surendranagar. On the other hand in Broach, Kutch, Sabarkantha and Surat the extent of coverage was less than 50. In the case of girls the extent

of coverage was more than 100 in Amreli, Banaskantha, Bhavnagar, Rajkot, Sabarkantha and Surendranagar and less than 50 in Baroda, Broach, Kutch and Surat. Taking both boys and girls together, the extent of coverage was more than 100 in Ahmedabad, Amreli, Banaskantha, Rajkot and Surendranagar and it was less than 50 in Broach, Kutch and Surat.

TEACHERS:

61. Total number of teachers in middle schools in Gujarat in 1960-61 was 38,981 consisting of 27,203 men and 11,778 women. By 1965-66 the number of teachers in middle schools in Gujarat State increased to 58,371 of which 40,370 were men and 18,001 were women. The increase in the number of teachers during the period was observed in all the districts except Dangs. Taking 1960-61 as base, the increase in the number of teachers was the highest in Kutch followed by Ahmedabad and Junagadh and was the lowest in Baroda and Surendranagar. In Dangs district, however, there was a decrease in the number of teachers in middle schools.

62. At the State level, women teachers formed 30.2% of the total number of teachers in middle schools in 1960-61, which slightly increased to 30.8% by 1965-66. In the latter year, the percentage of women teachers was the highest in Surat district (39.8) followed by Surendranagar (38.5). In Banaskantha and Sabarkantha districts the percentage of women teachers was even less than 20.

63. The percentage of trained teachers taking all the teachers together, increased from 54.9 in 1960-61 to 75.8 in 1965-66. In the case of men teachers the percentage of trained teachers increased from 56.5 to 80.2 and in the case of women teachers from 51.6 to 66.0 at the State level. Among the districts, in 1965-66, the percentage of trained men teachers was more than 75% in 14 districts. This was the least in Kutch (45.2). Among women teachers similarly, in 5 districts

IX - HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOLS

INSTITUTIONS:

67. The number of high/higher secondary schools in Gujarat increased from 1,056 to 1,590 during the period under review. This shows an increase of 51% over 1960-61 position. Among the districts the percentage increase in high/higher secondary schools was the highest in Surendranagar followed by Jamnagar and Sabarkantha and was the lowest in Kutch and Amreli. In the case of Dangs the number remained the same (1.).

68. On an average there was a high school for every 68.4 sq. miles at the State level in 1960-61. This decreased to 45.4 sq. miles by 1965-66. In the latter year, the average area served by a high/higher secondary school was 689 sq. miles in Dangs, 501.8 sq. miles in Kutch and 109.1 in Banaskantha and 95.4 in Surendranagar. In the other districts, the area served by a school varied from 12.7 sq. miles in Kaira to 68.0 sq. miles Jamnagar.



69. Similarly, on an average the population served by a high/higher secondary school decreased from 22,409 in 1960-61 to 14,883 in 1965-66 at the State level. Among the districts, in 1965-66, the population served by a school of this type varied from 82,000 in Dangs followed by 30,865 in Banaskantha, nearly 24,000 in Kutch and Amreli and about 20,500 in Junagadh to between 11,000 - 12,000 in Ahmedabad, Kaira and Mehsana.

ENROLMENT:

70. The total enrolment in high/higher secondary schools in Gujarat was 6.03 lakhs in 1965-66. Of this, the enrolment in classes IX-XI was 3.11 lakhs (2.22 lakhs boys and 0.89 lakhs girls) only. The enrolment in classes IX-XI increased from 1.73 (1.31 lakh boys and

0.42 lakh girls) in 1960-61 at cumulative rate of 11.4% per annum. The corresponding growth for boys and girls was 10.2% and 14.4% respectively. The enrolment in these classes increased in all the districts. The increase taking 1960-61 as base, varied from 36% in Surendranagar to 10% in Sabarkantha taking both boys and girls together. In case of boys and girls separately the highest increase was observed in Sabarkantha while the lowest increase in case of boys was observed in Surendranagar that in case of girls was observed in Panchghals.

71. The sex ratio, viz. number of girls for every 100 boys, in classes IX-XI in 1960-61 at State level was 32. By 1965-66 it increased to 40. Among the districts, the sex ratio varied from 11 in 1960-61 to 47 in 1965-66. The details are given in Table below:-

72. The percentage enrolment in classes IX-XI to population the age-group 14-17 i.e. the enrolment ratio increased from 13.0 to 20.1 during the period under consideration at the State level. In case of boys, the enrolment ratio increased from 19.0 to 27.8 whereas in case of girls it increased from 6.5 to 11.9. Among the districts in 1965-66. The enrolment ratio taking boys and girls together was the highest in Ahmedabad (35.9) followed by Baroda (26.6) and was the least in Dangs (4.2). In other districts, it was more than 20 in Baroach, Kaira, Rajkot and Surat; between 10 - 20 in Amreli, Bhavanagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kutch, Mehsana, Panchmahals, Sabarkantha and Surenhranagar and less than 10 in Banaskantha. In case of boys, the enrolment ratio was the highest in Ahmedabad (44.3) and the least in Dangs (6.0). In case of girls it varied between 27.0 in Ahmedabad and 1.1 in Banaskantha. The district-wise details are given in Statement XVI.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

73. Of the total enrolment in classes IX-XI in 1965-66, 23,532 students (19,994 boys and 3,538 girls) belonged to S.C. & S.T. communities. The enrolment of S.C. & S.T. students in these classes varied much from district to district depending on the percentage of the S.C. & S.T. population in these districts and their educational standard.

The percentage of enrolment of S.C. & S.T. students to total enrolment in these classes was 7.6 at the State level. In case of boys separately this percentage was 9.0 and that in case of girls was 4.0. Among the districts taking both boys and girls together, this percentage varied from 0.3 in Amreli to 66.5 in Dangs.

74. The extent of coverage of S.C. & S.T. students in these classes was 38.0% at the State level. Among boys the extent of coverage was 45.7% and that in girls 19.7%. There was wide variation in the extent of coverage among different districts. The extent of coverage taking both boys and girls varied from 2.9% in Kutch to 82.2% in Bhavnagar. In case of boys, the extent of coverage varied from 2.9% in Amreli to 109.1% in Bhavnagar and that in case of girls from 1.5% in Kutch to 42.2% in Mehsana. The district-wise details of the extent of coverage are given below:-

TEACHERS:

75. The total number of teachers in high/higher secondary schools in Gujarat was 14,043 in 1960-61 which increased to 22,188 in 1965-66 with an annual growth rate of 9%. The percentage increased was the highest in Surendranagar and the lowest in Dangs.

76. The women teachers formed 15.8% of the total teachers in high/higher secondary schools at the State level in 1960-61. By 1965-66, this percentage increased to 20.1. In different districts the percentage of women teachers varied between 6.9 in Banaskantha to 31.6 in Ahmedabad in 1965-66.

77. The percentage of trained teachers in high/higher secondary schools in the State increased from 59.6 in 1960-61 to 70.6 in 1965-66. In case of men teachers only, the percentage of trained teachers increased from 60.1 to 70.7 and that in case of women teachers increased from 57.1 to 70.2 during the period under consideration. Among the districts, the percentage of trained teachers varied from 44.6 in Sabarkantha to 79.7 in Ahmedabad. The district-wise details are given in Statement XVIII.

EXPENDITURE:

78. The total direct expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in the State more than doubled from Rs.3.99 crores in 1960-61 to Rs.8.10 crores in 1965-66. The increase during the period was at a cumulative rate of 13.6% per annum. The increase in expenditure was the highest in Sabarkantha (188%) and the lowest in Surendranagar (54%).

79. The per capita expenditure on high/higher secondary schools was only Rs.1.9 at the State level in 1960-61. By 1965-66 it increased to Rs.3.4. Among districts in 1965-66, it varied from Rs.0.6 in Dangs to Rs.7.2 in Ahmedabad. The per capita expenditure was between Rs.1 to Rs.2 in Amreli, Banaskantha, Junagadh, Kutch, Panchmahals and Surendranagar. It was between Rs.2 to Rs.3 in Bhavnagar, Jamnagar and Sabarkantha, between Rs.3 to Rs.4 in Broach, Mehsana, Rajkot and Surat and between Rs.4 to Rs.5 in Baroda and Kaira.

80. The direct expenditure on high/higher secondary schools formed 27.3% of the total direct expenditure on education ⁱⁿ State during both the years 1960-61 and 1965-66. Among the districts in 1965-66, this percentage expenditure varied from 19.1 in Baroda to 38.7 in Mehsana except in case of Dangs where this percentage was 4.6.

77. The average cost per student in high/higher secondary schools in 1965-66 was Rs.134.30 at the State level. Among the districts it varied from Rs.36.3 in Bhavnagar to Rs.191.6 in Sabarkantha.

82. The pupil teacher ratio in high/higher secondary schools, at the State level was 27 in 1965-66. The variation among districts in pupil-teacher ratio was from 30 in Baroda to 19 in Sabarkantha only in case of Bhavnagar, it was 38. The Table below gives district-wise details of direct expenditure and related variables.

TEACHERS' TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

INSTITUTIONS:

83. In 1960-61, there were 64 teachers' training schools and 8 colleges in Gujarat. There were at least 2 training schools in every district except Dangs district which did not had any teacher training institution even in 1965-66- The colleges for teachers training existed in the districts of Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Junagadh and Kaira only. By 1965-66, the number of teachers training schools increased to 91 and that of colleges to 14. There were at least 2 schools in every district except Dangs while the districts of Bhavnagar and Kaira had 8 schools each and Ahmedabad topped with 14 schools. There were at least one teachers' training college in every district except Amreli, Banaskantha, Dangs, Kutch, Mehsana, Panchmahals, Sabarkantha, Bulsar and Surendranagar.

ENROLMENT:

84. The total enrolment in teachers' training institutions was 8,864 in 1960-61 which increased to 13,424 in 1965-66. Of the total enrolment in 1960-61, 8,019 were studying courses

of school standard and 845 in those of collegiate standard. The corresponding enrolment figures for school and college standard for 1965-66 were 11,981 and 1,443 respectively. Among the districts the maximum enrolment in teachers' training institutions was in Ahmedabad (1,626) followed by Baroda (1,487) and Kaira (1,336). On the other hand, enrolment in these institutions in Kutch was 205 only. The details are given in Statement XX.

VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

85. The number of vocational and technical education schools (excluding teachers' training) in the State increased from 205 in 1960-61 to 314 in 1965-66. There were at least 4 vocational and technical schools in each district in 1965-66 except Dangs which did not had any. The number varied from 4 each in Amreli and Banaskantha to 28 in Rajkot, 37 in Baroda and 55 in Ahmedabad.

ENROLMENT:

86. The total enrolment in vocational and technical classes of school standard increased from 16,661 (12,494 boys and 4,167 girls) in 1960-61 to 25,292 (17,121 boys and 8,171 girls) in 1965-66. The highest enrolment in 1965-66 was in Ahmedabad district (4,232), followed by Rajkot (3,395), Bhavnagar (2,966) and Kaira (2,509). The lowest enrolment was in Amreli (134) followed by Banaskantha (220), Sabarkantha (400) and Panchmahals (458). Of course, Dangs did not provide instructions in vocational and technical courses.

EXPENDITURE:

87. The total direct expenditure on vocational and technical schools (excluding teachers' training schools) decreased from Rs.44.47 lakhs in 1960-61 to Rs.34.20 lakhs in 1965-66 at the

TEACHERS' TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

INSTITUTIONS:

83. In 1960-61, there were 64 teachers' training schools and 8 colleges in Gujarat. There were at least 2 training schools in every district except Dangs district which did not had any teacher training institution even in 1965-66. The colleges for teachers training existed in the districts of Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Junagadh and Kaira only. By 1965-66, the number of teachers training schools increased to 91 and that of colleges to 14. There were at least 2 schools in every district except Dangs while the districts of Bhavnagar and Kaira had 8 schools each and Ahmedabad topped with 14 schools. There were at least one teachers' training college in every district except Amreli, Banaskantha, Dangs, Kutch, Mehsana, Panchmahals, Sabarkantha, Bulsar and Surendranagar.

ENROLMENT:

84. The total enrolment in teachers' training institutions was 8,864 in 1960-61 which increased to 13,424 in 1965-66. Of the total enrolment in 1960-61, 8,019 were studying courses

of school standard and 845 in those of collegiate standard. The corresponding enrolment figures for school and college standard for 1965-66 were 11,931 and 1,443 respectively. Among the districts the maximum enrolment in teachers' training institutions was in Ahmedabad (1,626) followed by Baroda (1,437) and Kaira (1,336). On the other hand, enrolment in these institutions in Kutch was 205 only. The details are given in Statement XX.

VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

85. The number of vocational and technical education schools (excluding teachers' training) in the State increased from 205 in 1960-61 to 314 in 1965-66. There were at least 4 vocational and technical schools in each district in 1965-66 except Dangs which did not had any. The number varied from 4 each in Amreli and Banaskantha to 28 in Rajkot, 37 in Baroda and 55 in Ahmedabad.

ENROLMENT:

86. The total enrolment in vocational and technical classes of school standard increased from 16,661 (12,494 boys and 4,167 girls) in 1960-61 to 25,292 (17,121 boys and 8,171 girls) in 1965-66. The highest enrolment in 1965-66 was in Ahmedabad district (4,232), followed by Rajkot (3,395), Bhavnagar (2,966) and Kaira (2,509). The lowest enrolment was in Amreli (134) followed by Banaskantha (220), Sabarkantha (400) and Panchmahals (458). Of course, Dangs did not provide instructions in vocational and technical courses.

EXPENDITURE:

87. The total direct expenditure on vocational and technical schools (excluding teachers' training schools) decreased from Rs.44.47 lakhs in 1960-61 to Rs.34.20 lakhs in 1965-66 at the

State level. The decrease was mainly observed in the districts of Amreli, Baroda, Bhavnagar, Broach, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Kutch, Mehsana, Panchmahals and Surat. The highest expenditure on these institutions was by Rajkot (Rs.6,71,238) and the lowest by Amreli (Rs.55,772).

District-wise details are given in Statement XXI.

HIGHER EDUCATION

INSTITUTIONS:

88. The total number of institutions of higher education including universities more than doubled during the period 1960-61 and 1965-66. Of the 228 institutions for higher education in 1965-66, 101 were Arts and Science colleges, 16 Medical colleges, 43 Engineering colleges, 14 Colleges for Teachers' Training, 40 Colleges for Other Professional and Special education, one Board of Secondary education and 4 Universities. In 1960-61, the districts of Amreli, Banaskantha and Dangs had not a single institution of higher education. By 1965-66, all the districts except Dangs had an Arts and Science college. The maximum number of Arts and Science colleges were located in Ahmedabad district (21) followed by Kaira (15), Baroda (12) and Mehsana (11). The districts of Amreli and Banaskantha had one Arts and Science college each. In 1965-66, there were four Medical colleges in Ahmedabad, three in Baroda, two each in Jamnagar and Surat and one each in Bhavnagar, Junagadh, Kaira, Mehsana and Rajkot. There was an Engineering college of post-graduate or under-graduate standard, in every district except Dangs in 1965-66. There was no Teachers' Training college in 9 of the 18 districts while Ahmedabad had 4 and Junagadh and Kaira 2 each such colleges. There were 4 universities

located in Ahmedabad, Baroda and Kaira districts. In 1965-66, the number of institutions for higher education was the highest in Ahmedabad (53), followed by Baroda and Kaira (30 each) and the lowest in Banaskantha (2) and Amreli (3). However, Dangs did not had any institution of higher education.

ENROLMENT:

89. The total enrolment in institutions of higher education increased from 83 thousands in 1960-61 to 1.03 lakhs in 1965-66. In the latter year, of the total enrolment about 163 thousands were studying in Arts and Science colleges, 15 thousands in Engineering colleges, 4 thousands in Medical colleges, two thousands in Teachers' Training colleges and 17 thousands in other colleges for Professional and Special education. Besides, 1,302 were studying in university teaching departments and 286 in research institutions.

90. By courses of studies and standards, 23,550 (22.8%) were studying in Pre-University Intermediate classes; 18,968 (18.3%) in B.A. (Pass & Hons.) classes; 13,586 (13.2%) in B.Sc. (Pass & Hons.) classes; 4,563 (4.4%) in M.A./M.Sc.; 1,443 (1.4%) in Teachers' Training classes and 41,316 (39.9%) in classes of Other Professional and Special education courses. The enrolment among the districts in different courses stages of education varied much depending on the facilities available in those districts. In all stages of education, the highest enrolment was in Ahmedabad (32,403) followed by Kaira (14,871) and Baroda (14,108). The lowest enrolment was in Banaskantha (292), Amreli (770) and Kutch (843). In other districts, it varied from 1,800 to 7,000.

91. The sex ratio of enrolment in higher education at the State level was 22 girls for every 100 boys in 1960-61 and it increased to 25 in 1965-66. Table below summarises the enrolment in 1965-66 as percentage of enrolment in 1960-61 alongwith the sex-ratio in 1965-66 district-wise.

92. The enrolment ratio i.e. enrolment in higher education classes as percentage of population 17-23, at the State level increased from 2.1 in 1960-61 to 3.9 in 1965-66. In case of boys the increase was from 3.3 to 6.0 while that in case of girls was from 0.8 to 1.6. Among the districts, the enrolment ratio in 1965-66 varied from 0.2 in Banaskantha to 10.6 in Ahmedabad. In other districts, it was 0.9 in Ameli and Panchmahals; varied between 1 to 2 in Broach, Junagadh, Kutch, Sabarkantha and Surendranagar; between 2 to 3 in Jamnagar and Mehsana; between 3 to 4 in Bhavanagar and Surt and was 4.2 in Rajkot, 5.7 in Kaira and 7.4 in Baroda. In case of boys separately the enrolment ratio varied from 0.4 in Banaskantha to 15.2 in Ahmedabad and that in case of girls from almost negligible in Banaskantha to 5.1 in Ahmedabad. Statement XXIV gives the district-wise details.

ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTES AND SCHEDULED TRIBES:

93. Of the total enrolment of 1,03,426 in classes of higher education in 1965-66, 3,226 belonged to S.C. & S.T. communities forming 3.1%. In case of boys this percentage was 3.7 and that in case of girls 0.8. Among the districts the percentage of S.C. & S.T. students to total enrolment, taking both boys and girls together, varied from 0.7 in Surendranagar to 17.1 in Banaskantha.

94. The extent of coverage of S.C. & S.T. students in higher education was 19.6% at the State level taking both boys and girls together. In case of boys the extent of coverage was 21.4% and that in case of girls 6.0%. Amongst districts it varied from 9% in Baroda to 59.8% in Mehsana. However, in Banaskantha with small enrolment in higher education the extent of coverage was more than 100 per cent. Statement XXV gives district-wise details.

TEACHERS:

95. The total number of teachers in institutions of higher education in 1960-61 was 2,960 consisting of 2,699 men and 266 women. It increased to 6,639 (6,036 men and 603 women) by 1965-66. The increase is observed in all the districts and if the State level it was 124%. The maximum increase in percentage was in Panchmahals and the minimum in Baroda. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66, 3,563 (53.7%) were in colleges for Arts and Science colleges, 2,850 (42.9%) in colleges for Professional education and 226 (3.4%) in Universities and Research Institutions. The pupil teacher ratio in Arts and Science colleges at the State level was 18. It varied from 24 in Bulsar to 13 in Kutch.

EXPENDITURE:

96. The total direct expenditure on higher educational institutions increased from Rs.252 lakhs in 1960-61 to Rs.814.78 lakhs in 1965-66. The increase was 323% at the State level and substantial in all the districts.

97. Of the total expenditure in 1965-66, 29.9% was on Arts and Science colleges; 8.0% on Medical colleges; 13.4% on Engineering colleges; 1.7% on Teachers' Training colleges; 7.5% on Other Professional colleges and the 39.5% on Universities, Boards of education and Research Institutions.

The average expenditure (direct) per student per annum in 1965-66 was Rs.335.6 in Arts and Science colleges; Rs.704.5 in Engineering colleges; Rs.1,476.5 in Medical colleges and Rs.836.7 in Teachers' Training colleges.
