## SEASON AND CROP REPORT OF THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY FOR 1927-1928.

### CHAPTER I—CHARACTER OF THE SEASON.

1. **General.**—The agricultural season of 1927-28 may, on the whole, be described as fairly good. It was, however, characterised by certain outstanding features, some of which were favourable and some detrimental to the healthy development of the crops, in different parts of the Bombay Presidency proper. Discussing the facts of the season as consecutive links in a chain, it can be said that the Season had an auspicious beginning and the good anti-monsoon showers, received in many parts in the south of the Presidency, facilitated preparatory tillage in those areas. The rains in June gave sufficient moisture to commence *kharif* sowings in most parts of the Presidency except in North Gujarat and the eastern parts of the Deccan and Karnatak, where they were only light. In July, however, unprecedentedly heavy rains in North Gujarat and Kathiawar produced floods which caused considerable damage to stock and property, and in some cases, whole fields of young crops, especially in the low-lying areas, were destroyed. At the same time, a serious deficiency of rain in the south-east of the Presidency checked further *kharif* sowings, and the crops that had been already sown and had germinated were withering. Except in the two tracts mentioned and also South Gujarat, where rain was badly needed for rice, conditions were generally satisfactory, almost every where in the Presidency. From the beginning of August to the middle of September the rainfall was much below the average. This reacted differently in different tracts according to the nature of the preceding rain. Thus, in North Gujarat, it proved a definite boon, as it enabled the cultivators to resow the flooded areas with suitable crops; in the south-east of the Presidency, it was the cause of further deterioration in the withering *kharif* crops, while in the rest of the Presidency, the crops were simply surviving on the strength of previous moisture, and they badly required immediate good rains. A rather serious attack of grass-hoppers was also experienced in the Deccan and Karnatak, from Nasik down to Dharwar, which further aggravated the situation. Very luckily, the anxiously awaited rain came during the last week of September and this continued in the first half of October. It indeed proved to be the turning point in the fortunes of the Season, especially in the Deccan and Karnatak, where it not only revived the withering crops, but it also checked the grass-hopper attack, which had assumed a serious aspect in places. A fairly heavy and wide spread rain was received in November which, though it spoiled the ripe *kharif* crops, rather seriously in places, proved on the whole very opportune and beneficial to the young *rabi* crops. Rains in February and March were injurious to the *rabi* crops ready for harvest or lying cut in the threshing yards, especially in the Karnatak, where cotton was spoiled to a considerable extent.

In Sind, the unfavourable inundation of the river, almost throughout the season, excessive July rains, locusts, and frost in January had very prejudicial effects on the development of both the *kharif* and *rabi* crops, so that their yield, in most places, was very much below the normal.

Details regarding the season in its various aspects are contained in the following section.

**2. Distribution of Rainfall.**—Statement I (pages 32-33) compares the rainfall during the year under report with the average fall of rain at each representative station in the Bombay Presidency and Sind. The average rainfall figures for each station are, as during the last year, those supplied by the Indian Meteorological Department, based on the rainfall statistics available up to and including the year 1920.

**Kharif Rains.**—In Gujarat, the *kharif* rains were more than double the average in the north, but were slightly below it in the south. In the Deccan, these rains were above the normal at Nasik, Satara and the hilly Deccan tracts, just approached the average at Ahmednagar and fell below it at the remaining places. In the Karnatak, they were somewhat short of the standard at Belgaum and Bijapur, but were above the average at the other places. In the Konkan, the rains were slightly below the usual amount throughout the Division. In Sind, the distribution was very uneven. They were more than double the average at Hyderabad and as much as seven times of it at Mirpurkhas (Thar Parkar). They were, however, below the normal at Karachi, Nawabshah and Larkana, while Sukkur and Jacobabad (Upper Sind Frontier) had even less than half an inch of these rains against an average of about two and two and a half inches respectively.

**Rabi Rains.**—*Rabi* rains were much above the normal everywhere in Gujarat, except at Broach, where they were only just above it. In the Deccan, they were generally above the average at all stations except at Poona and Satara, where they were only slightly below it. In the Karnatak, these rains were below the standard everywhere, while in the Konkan, they were considerably above the average throughout the Division, especially at Thana and Ratnagiri, where they were excessive amounting to nearly four times the normal. In Sind they were below the average everywhere.

**Hot Weather Rains.**—These presented no features of special importance during the season under review.

**3. Nature of the Season in different Divisions.**—The following remarks will show in detail the nature of the Season in each Division of the Bombay Presidency, including Sind.

**Konkan.**—The regular monsoon broke out early in June, except at Ratnagiri where it started a week late, and gave sufficient and well distributed rains for the sowing of rice seed. The rains in July were adequate and enabled the completion of *kharif* sowings and the commencement of rice transplantation. From the beginning of August to the middle of September, however, the rainfall was generally deficient and the standing crops maintained themselves on the strength of previous

moisture, and immediate rain was very badly required to relieve them. Good rains at the end of September proved very beneficial and improved the prospects of the crops almost everywhere. The rainfall in October, though useful in many places, delayed harvesting of crops and was somewhat injurious to ripe rice. Unusual rains accompanied by a heavy cyclone, about the middle of November, were very harmful to the harvested crops lying cut on the threshing yards, and this spoiled the quality of grain. The season was, on the whole, favourable in this Division. As regards crop diseases, the season was generally free from them except "*Koleroga*" on betelnut, in places in the up-*ghat* talukas of the Kanara district.

**Gujarat.**—The anti-monsoon showers were practically absent in this Division. The rains commenced in the second week of June, but sowings were started in South Gujarat a week later and completed under the adequate rains in July. In North Gujarat, the rains were scanty in June; but good rains, early in July, gave a general start for the sowings. Things went on smoothly till the last week of July, when unprecedentedly heavy rains, in the areas north of Broach, caused heavy floods, which damaged life and property very seriously and washed away completely whole fields in low lying areas. From the beginning of August to the middle of September, the rainfall was very deficient almost throughout the Division. This deficiency proved very beneficial to the over-saturated fields in the north, and it gave the cultivators an opportunity to resow suitable crops in the flooded areas, though it was harmful in the south, especially in the rice tract of Surat, where the crop began to show signs of withering. Rainfall in October was rather excessive in the Panch Mahals where ripe maize and other *kharif* crops were spoiled; elsewhere, it was generally up to the requirements of the crops which progressed well. November rains, being excessive in South Gujarat, did some harm to the *kharif* crops, ready for harvest or already harvested in places, but were very beneficial to the *rabi* and resown crops in the flooded areas in the north. Rains in December further helped the resown crops. The absence of dew and the presence of cloudy weather in February told prejudicially on the quality of cotton. Due, it is said, to too wet a condition of the soil, mango trees in North Gujarat did not flower, while the blossoms of those in South Gujarat withered under the scorching heat of April. The season was, on the whole, fairly good for Surat and part of Broach district, but was definitely much below the normal in North Gujarat, in most of the flooded areas, where the *kharif* crops were seriously damaged, and *rabi* crops gave only poor yields, thus necessitating liberal grants of suspensions and remissions. As regards crop diseases, wheat suffered from rust in Ahmedabad and Panch Mahals districts, where its outturn was considerably reduced. There was also some trouble from caterpillars in parts of the Panch Mahals, and a mild attack of *Aphis* on cotton in places.

**Deccan.**—The monsoon broke with full vigour, in the first week of June, and the sowings of *kharif* crops were started almost everywhere. Rains in July were generally sufficient in the West and the North Deccan,

where sowings were completed and the crops progressed well. In the East Deccan, however, rains were deficient and more rain was badly needed for the completion of the retarded sowings. From the beginning of August to the middle of September, the rainfall was much below the normal, with the result that while the crops in the North and West Deccan maintained themselves on the strength of previous moisture, those in the East Deccan showed signs of withering. Fortunately, ample and wide spread rains were received by the end of September and early in October which not only revived the condition of the withering crops, but also checked the grass-hopper attack, which was getting serious in places, and pushed on the *rabi* sowings. In places, however, the rains were rather heavy and continuous and spoiled *bajri* and other *kharif* crops. Fairly heavy rains by the middle of November damaged *kharif* crops ready for the sickle or already harvested and spoiled the quality of the Khandesh cotton, though they proved most beneficial to the young *rabi* crops for their further development. Late rains in February and March told adversely on the harvested *rabi* crops in places, especially in East Khandesh, Sholapur and Satara districts. The season, on the whole, was fairly good for both the *kharif* and *rabi* crops in most of the Deccan, except in East Khandesh and Sholapur districts where it was only fair for the *kharif* crops. As regards fungus diseases and insect pests, rust affected the wheat crop on the canal areas, while an attack of wingless grass-hoppers did much damage to *jowar* and *bajri* crops in Nasik and Satara districts.

**Karnatak.**—The special features of the season in this Division were (1) the two unusually long droughts, one in August and the other in October, (2) a very serious attack of grass-hoppers on *jowar* and *bajri* crops and (3) the unwelcome late rains in February which spoiled the harvest of *rabi* crops. Good anti-monsoon showers in May facilitated the preliminary field operations. Under the favourable rains of June and July the sowings were done satisfactorily and the season opened with bright prospects. The long break from the beginning of August to the middle of September, however, gave an unfavourable turn to the situation. The young crops, especially in the eastern parts of the Division began to wither, while at other places they were simply holding their own on the strength of previous moisture, and immediate rains were very badly required everywhere to save the crops from total destruction. There was also a rather severe attack of grass-hoppers which made the position still worse. Very luckily, the most anxiously awaited rains came in the very nick of time. The widespread and copious rains were received by the middle of September and they gave new life to the crops that had survived the long drought, checked the grass-hopper trouble, and proved an excellent preparation for the *rabi* sowings. Rainfall in October was again very defective, with the result that the *rabi* sowings were retarded and the standing crops suffered very badly. Fairly heavy and general rains were received by the middle of November. These rains were rather continuous and heavy in places and spoiled the *kharif* crops ready for harvest, though on the whole, they were very beneficial to the *rabi* crops for their further development. The crops

progressed satisfactorily under favourable weather conditions during the succeeding two months. But the most untimely rains in February and again in April proved injurious to the harvested *rabi* crops in many places, where they discoloured grain and fodder and spoiled the quality of cotton, thus reducing its market value. The season, on the whole, was only fair, almost everywhere, necessitating grants of suspensions and remissions to a varying extent in all the three districts. As regards crop diseases and insect pests, grass-hoppers played great havoc, damaging *jowar* and *bajri* crops and reducing their yield to a considerable extent. The attack of wilt on Kumpta cotton was rather marked during the year under review, while the Dharwar-American variety suffered from an attack of red leaf-blight to some extent.

**Sind.**—The main feature of the season in this Province is the inundation of the Indus, on which agriculture in Sind chiefly depends. This caused great anxiety at the outset. For, not only was the river very late in rising (about the middle of July), but the inundation period was very short and was further characterised by the river keeping abnormally low throughout when, by the end of August, it abruptly fell far too much below the level necessary for keeping the canals flowing. This state of affairs brought about considerable reduction in the area of *kharif* crops, and gave a distinct set-back to cotton cultivation. There were again unparalleled heavy rains in Lower Sind, during the last week of July, which caused the washing out of crops and the destruction of live-stock and property in many places. Cultivators, however, took advantage of the moisture left in the soil, by these excessive rains, by growing *jambho* oil seed. This crop grew well and would have given a good yield, had it not been hit by severe frost. On account of the premature and rapid fall in the river level by the end of August, a general deficiency of water supply was felt throughout, and this curtailed the area under *rabi* sowings also to a great extent, almost everywhere. A very severe frost in January further deteriorated the standing *rabi* crops. As for crop-diseases and pests, locusts swarmed over practically all parts of the Province, as in the previous year, and caused much damage to the crops. Rice is said to have suffered a good deal from rust and smut diseases in all the rice-growing tracts, except the Nara Valley, to such an extent that its yield is reported to have fallen much below the normal. Rats also caused a good deal of damage to this crop. Taking all these things together, it may be said that the season under review was generally very satisfactory, as the outturn of both the *kharif* and *rabi* crops fell much below the normal.

## CHAPTER II—AREA CULTIVATED AND UNCULTIVATED.

(Statement II, pages 34-39).

4. **Number of Villages.**—The total number of villages, in the Bombay Presidency proper, decreased by twenty-one, from 22,921½ in 1926-27 to 22,900½ during the year under report. The main decrease of nineteen villages, in Bankapur taluka of the Dharwar district, was owing to



correction in the previous records, while the reduction of two villages in Ranebennur taluka of the same district was due to their amalgamation with the adjoining villages in the same taluka.

Twenty-seven villages in the Belgaum district and three villages in the Bijapur district were transferred from the class of 'unavailable statistics' to that of 'available statistics' owing to the survey measurements in the former and to correct classification in the latter district.

In Sind, the total number of villages remained the same as last year, only three *dehs* (villages) in the Larkana district being transferred from the class of 'unavailable statistics' to that of 'available statistics' due to correction in previous records.

### Total Area and Reporting and Non-reporting Area in the Bombay Presidency proper.

5. **Total Area.**—The total area showed a curtailment of 12,000 acres in the Bombay Presidency proper, the whole of the decrease occurring in the Belgaum district (—12,000 acres) owing to correct survey measurement of some *inam* villages in that district.

6. **Reporting Area.**—The total area, for which statistics are regularly collected and reported in the Bombay Presidency proper, showed a net decline of 23,000 acres. The most noticeable decrease occurred in the East Khandesh district (—76,000 acres) due to the area of 17½ forest villages being correctly classified in the survey records. Against this, there was an increase in Belgaum (+30,000 acres), Bijapur (+7,000 acres), Dharwar (+6,000 acres), Satara (+5,000 acres) and Thana (+4,000 acres) districts, as a result of more survey measurements.

7. **Non-reporting Area.**—The decrease of 23,000 acres in the "reporting area" has already been noted under that head above. This decrease means a corresponding increase under the present head—"non-reporting area." Against this increase of 23,000 acres, there was a decline of 42,000 acres, mostly in the Belgaum district, due to correct survey measurements, the net result being an increase of 11,000 acres in all, for the Presidency proper as a whole.

### Total Area and Reporting and Non-reporting Area in Sind.

8. **Total Area.**—The total area showed a slight increase of 5,000 acres in the Province, the increase being shared by Nawabshah (+3,000 acres) and Sukkur (+2,000 acres) districts owing to the formation of new *kacha* lands by the action of the river.

9. **Reporting Area.**—The reporting area showed an increase of 16,000 acres. This increase was contributed by the Larkana district (+11,000 acres) due to *bigoti* measurements, and by Nawabshah (+3,000 acres) and Sukkur (+2,000 acres) districts owing to survey operations and *kacha* lands left by the river.

10. **Non-reporting Area.**—The variations under this head generally correspond with those under the "reporting area" which have been noticed above.

**11. Estimates for Non-reporting Area.**—Estimates of the probable cropping of the areas for which statistics were not forthcoming were, as usual, received from all the District Officers.

**12. Cultivated (i.e., occupied) and Uncultivated Area.**—Details regarding this, as compared with the last year, are shown in Appendix A (page 25).

**13. Gross Cropped Area.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, the gross cropped area expanded by 794,000 acres. The most noticeable increase occurred in the Deccan, except the East Khandesh district, (+495,000 acres) due to the favourable rains which encouraged extensive cultivation in most parts of the Division, and in the Karnatak (+172,000 acres) due to generally sufficient rains, late in the season, which gave an impetus to *rabi* sowings on a very large scale. Gujarat, except the Ahmedabad district, (+88,000 acres) and Konkan (+39,000 acres) also contributed to this increase. In the Ahmedabad district, however, there was a slight decrease (−14,000 acres) due to excessive rains and floods during the last week of July.

**14. Twice Cropped Area.**—This showed an extension of 250,000 acres in the Bombay Presidency proper, the increase being shared by all the Divisions except the Konkan. It was specially marked in the Deccan, where the double cropped area advanced by 160,000 acres due to the abundant rains of the season which left ample moisture in the soil for a second crop to be taken on the same land. The same cause brought about an extension, though to a much less extent, in Gujarat (+68,000 acres) and in the Karnatak (+38,000 acres).

**15. Net Cropped Area.**—This advanced by 544,000 acres in the Bombay Presidency proper. The causes which led to the increase in the Deccan (+335,000 acres), Karnatak (+134,000 acres), Konkan (+55,000 acres) and Gujarat (+20,000 acres) are the same as already noted under "gross cropped area" above.

In Sind, the gross cropped area, and the net cropped area decreased by 70,000 acres and 96,000 acres respectively due to the late and low inundation of the year, but the area cropped more than once showed an increase of 26,000 acres, mostly in Thar Parkar (+15,000 acres) and Hyderabad (+9,000 acres) districts on account of excessive rains in July.

**16. Assessed and Un-assessed Area.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, the assessed area curtailed by 2,000 acres, while the unassessed area expanded by 40,000 acres, chiefly in the Deccan and Karnatak. In Sind, both the assessed and un-assessed areas advanced by 20,000 acres and 16,000 acres respectively.

**17. Temporary Cultivation in Forest Lands and Culturable Waste.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, about 93,000 acres of Forest lands were given out for temporary cultivation mainly in West Khandesh (35,000 acres), Poona (23,000 acres), Sholapur (20,000 acres), Thana (10,000 acres), Ahmednagar (4,000 acres) and Belgaum (1,000 acres) districts; while about 59,000 acres of Culturable Waste mainly in West

Khandesh (33,000 acres), Nasik (6,000 acres), Thana (5,000 acres), Broach and Belgaum (4,000 acres each), Ahmednagar (2,000 acres), and Ahmedabad, Surat, Poona, Kolaba and Kanara (1,000 acres each) districts were similarly dealt with.

In Sind, the area under Forest showed a slight advancement of 4,000 acres, but that under Culturable Waste dropped by 31,000 acres, the decrease being chiefly noticed in Karachi and Hyderabad districts.

### CHAPTER III—CROPPED AREA.

(Statement III, pages 40-61.)

**18. Variations in Cropped Area.**—The main features of the season and of the harvest have been described elsewhere in the Report. Appendix B (pages 26-27) shows the effect of the season under report on the area sown as compared with the average and with the preceding year's area under the principal crops.

**19. Food Crops.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, the area under food-crops advanced by 204,000 acres or 1·0 per cent. over the previous year and by 494,000 acres or 2·5 per cent. as compared with the average. Among the *kharif* crops, *bajri* showed a decline of 23,000 acres below the previous year, partly through the fear of grass-hopper attack in the Deccan and partly owing to excessive July rains in North Gujarat; while rice showed an expansion of 42,000 acres due to favourable sowing rains. Among the *rabi* crops, *jowar* showed a set back of 187,000 acres due to unsuitability of rains for this crop, while wheat and gram showed an advancement of 147,000 acres and 112,000 acres respectively over the previous year, owing to the favourable late rains of the season in most parts of the Presidency. The area under sugarcane remained almost stationary.

**20. Non-food Crops.**—The area under non-food crops expanded by 5,90,000 acres or 7·0 per cent. over the previous year and by 1,593,000 acres or 21·4 per cent. as compared with the average. The most noticeable increase was under cotton (+347,000 acres) and groundnut (+138,000 acres) due to the popularity of these crops, as they find a ready market and fetch good prices, and also to some extent under sesame (+69,000 acres) due to seasonable rains at the time of sowing.

The net result of these variations in the food and non-food crops, as noted above, was an increase of 794,000 acres or 2·8 per cent. over the total cropped area of the previous year and of 2,087,000 acres or 7·8 per cent. as compared with the average.

**21. Cropped Area in Sind.**—In Sind, with the exception of rice and *bajri*, which advanced by 102,000 acres and 12,000 acres respectively over the previous year, the area under almost all the crops, both food and non-food, showed a general set back of 70,000 acres below the previous year due to deficient water supply, on account of late and low inundation and premature and rapid fall of the river.

22. **Kharif and Rabi Seasons.**—The following table compares, as usual, the *kharif* and *rabi* seasons of the year, in the Bombay Presidency proper, with those of the preceding two years:—

It will be seen from the above table that the *kharif* area, during the year under report, showed an advancement of 212,000 acres over that of the last year, but as much as 2,112,000 acres when compared with the area of 1925-26. The *rabi* area, on the other hand, exhibited a considerable decline of 362,000 acres below the area of 1925-26, though it showed a slight extension of 38,000 acres over that of 1926-27. The net result of these variations was that the total area under cereals and pulses extended by 250,000 and 1,750,000 acres respectively, when compared with the previous year and 1925-26.

23. **Variations under Principal Crops.**—The detailed remarks below explain the variations under the principal crops.

**Jowar and Bajri.**—The sub-joined table compares the extent of cultivation of these staple grains in the different Divisions of the Bombay Presidency:—

It will be seen from the above table that the area under *jowar* (chiefly *rabi*) showed a considerable set back of 211,000 acres and 679,000 acres respectively below the previous year and the normal in the Bombay Presidency. The decrease was shared by all the Divisions, as less area was devoted to this crop, partly through the fear of grass-hopper attack in the Deccan and Karnatak, and partly due to the general unfavourable character of rains for the crop. The area under *bajri* fell short by 11,000 acres as compared with the previous year, though it advanced by 457,000 acres over the normal. It showed a slight improvement in the Deccan and Karnatak, but a marked decline in North Gujarat due to the excessive rains and floods in July.

In Sind, the area under *jowar* showed a decrease below the previous year, owing to the late and low inundation of the year, but a slight increase when compared with the normal, while that under *bajri* showed a slight increase as compared with both the previous year and the normal.

**Rice.**—The area under rice, in the Bombay Presidency proper, increased by 42,000 acres or by 2·1 per cent. over the previous year, the chief increase being shared by North Gujarat (+ 23,000 acres) and the Deccan (+ 19,000 acres), due to the favourable rains at the time of sowing. There was also a slight increase in the Karnatak (+ 5,000 acres), against which there was a similar decrease in the Konkan (— 4,000 acres), where more area was put under *vagi* in the Ratnagiri District.

In Sind, the area under the crop expanded by 102,000 acres or 9·8 per cent. as compared with the previous year, the increase being contributed by Larkana (+ 54,000 acres), Upper Sind Frontier (+ 32,000 acres) and Sukkur (+ 19,000 acres) districts under the incentive of high prices fetched by the grain, as compared with other food grains.

**Wheat.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, the area under wheat extended by 147,000 acres or 11·0 per cent. over the previous year. The most marked increase occurred in the Deccan (+ 154,000 acres), where the ample September rains encouraged cultivation under the crop on an extensive scale. There was also some increase in Gujarat (+ 32,000 acres) against which, there was a similar decrease in the Karnatak (— 29,000 acres) partly due to deficient moisture and partly to rotation.

In Sind, the area under the crop declined by 74,000 acres or by 15·8 per cent. below the previous year owing to the premature fall in the river, most of the decrease being shared by Sukkur (— 30,000 acres), Upper Sind Frontier (— 25,000 acres) and Larkana (— 20,000 acres) districts.

**Oilseeds.**—The area under oilseeds, in the Bombay Presidency proper, expanded by 214,000 acres or 18·4 per cent. over the previous year, and by 561,000 acres or 63·6 per cent. when compared with the average.

In Sind, on the other hand, the area under oilseeds curtailed by 24,000 acres or 7·1 per cent. below the previous year and by 45,000 acres or 12·6 per cent. as compared with the average,

The following table and the succeeding remarks explain the variations under the principal oilseeds as compared with the previous year :—

**Groundnut.**—The crop is becoming more and more popular with the cultivators every year due to the good prices and the ready sale it obtains in the market and consequently, the area under it is advancing recently, almost by leaps and bounds. So far as the year under report is concerned, the area under the crop showed a substantial increase in the Deccan (+ 94,000 acres) and the Karnatak (+ 42,000 acres). The increased cultivation under groundnut is, in fact, one of the most striking agricultural changes in recent years.

**Sesame.**—The area under sesame, which is principally a *kharif* crop, advanced by 69,000 acres over the previous year, the increase being shared by all the Divisions of the Presidency proper, except the Konkan, where it remained stationary, due to suitable rains at the time of sowing.

**Linseed.**—The area under this crop showed a slight decline of 4,000 acres below the preceding year in the Bombay Presidency proper, mostly in the south-east due to the deficiency of rains in this area.

**Rape and Mustard.**—These oilseeds also showed a small increase of 4,000 acres in the Bombay Presidency proper, chiefly in the Karnatak, where the ample moisture, left in the soil by the good September rains, encouraged more cultivation under these oilseeds.

**Castor-seed.**—The area under this oilseed expanded by 26,000 acres mostly in North Gujarat, where it was found more convenient to grow this crop on a larger scale this year, after the floods.

**Oilseeds in Sind.**—As regards oilseeds in Sind, the only important oilseeds in the Province are rape-seed and mustard (which are by far the most important) and sesame; the area under other oilseeds such as linseed, groundnut, castor-seed, cocoanut, etc., being quite negligible in the Province. The area under rapeseed and mustard curtailed by 55,000 acres below the previous year, the decrease being marked in the Upper Sind Frontier District, due to the unfavourable inundation of the river, while that under sesame showed a very slight increase of 4,000 acres in the Province.

**Cotton.**—The cultivation of cotton showed an extension of 347,000 acres or 8·1 per cent. over the previous year and of as much as 751,000 acres or 19·5 per cent. when compared with the average, as more area was brought under the cultivation of this crop on account of high prices fetched by cotton in recent years and also owing to the favourable rains at the time of sowing in most parts of the Presidency. The increase in area was general, but was most noticeable in the Deccan (+ 205,000 acres); Karnatak (+ 73,000 acres) and Gujarat (+ 70,000 acres) also equally contributed to this increase.

In Sind, on the other hand, there was a decline of 61,000 acres, mostly in the Thar Parkar (—32,000 acres) and Nawabshah (—21,000 acres) districts, as a result of the unfavourable inundation of the river.

**Sugarcane.**—The area under this crop remained almost stationary in the Bombay Presidency proper, being 65,000 acres during the year under review against 66,000 acres during the previous year; while in Sind it was just the same (3,000 acres) as during the previous year.

**Tobacco.**—The area under the crop increased by 15,000 acres or 14·8 per cent. over the previous year in the Bombay Presidency proper, most of the increase occurring in Kaira (+ 11,000 acres) and Satara (+ 2,000 acres) districts, due to the late rains of the season being favourable for the cultivation of this crop.

In Sind, the area under tobacco remained almost the same (8,000 acres), as last year.

**Fruits and Vegetables.**—These showed a set back of 41,000 acres in the Bombay Presidency proper, the decline being shared by Belgaum (—17,000 acres), Sholapur (—15,000 acres) and East Khandesh (—11,000 acres) districts. In Sind, however, there was some advancement of 9,000 acres, all the districts of the Province contributing to the increase.

24. Appendix C (pages 28-29) shows as usual the distribution, in each district of the Presidency proper and in Sind, of the principal food and non-food crops in percentages of the gross area cropped.

#### CHAPTER IV—IRRIGATED AREA.

(Statement IV, pages 62-71.)

25. **Variations in Irrigated Area and Crops.**—Appendix D (page 30) exhibits variations under the several heads of irrigation and crops irrigated as compared with similar details of the previous year.

26. **Area Irrigated.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, the area irrigated showed a decline of 58,000 acres or 5·7 per cent. below the previous year, having declined from 1,023,000 acres in the last year to 965,000 acres during the year under report. Almost the whole of the decline occurred in the Deccan (— 55,000 acres) where, owing to the favourable character of the season, less necessity was felt to resort to irrigation sources.

In Sind also, the irrigated area contracted by 130,000 acres or 4·2 per cent. from 3,113,000 acres during the previous year to 2,983,000 acres

during the year under review, as a result of the unfavourable inundation of the river.

### 27. Area Irrigated from Different Sources of Irrigation in the Bombay Presidency Proper.—

**Government Canals.**—The area under Government Canals fell by 85,000 acres or 28·8 per cent. The decrease was distributed in almost all the districts of the Deccan, where owing to favourable rains, the cultivators did not much feel the necessity of resorting to this source of irrigation.

**Private Canals.**—Irrigation from private canals advanced by 29,000 acres or 52·7 per cent. over the previous year, almost the whole of the increase being contributed by Nasik (+ 17,000 acres), Ahmednagar (+ 6,000 acres) and Satara (+ 5,000 acres) districts, where there was a corresponding decrease under the area irrigated by Government Canals.

**Wells.**—Well irrigation extended by 15,000 acres or 3·0 per cent. over the previous year. The increase was shared by all the Divisions of the Presidency proper, except the Konkan, where, owing to the ample rains of the season, no necessity was felt of helping the crops with irrigation.

**Tanks.**—The area irrigated from tanks declined by 35,000 acres or by 25·0 per cent., from 140,000 acres in the previous year to 105,000 acres during the year under report. Almost the whole of this decrease was noticeable in the Dharwar district (— 32,000 acres), where more area was irrigated by other sources of irrigation.

**Other Sources.**—Irrigation from “Other Sources” expanded by 18,000 acres or by 51·4 per cent., mostly in the Dharwar district (+ 20,000 acres), where a corresponding decline is marked under the area irrigated by tanks. Variations in other districts are generally small and call for no special remarks.

### 28. Area Irrigated from Different Sources of Irrigation in Sind.—

**Government Canals.**—In Sind, which is mainly dependent for cultivation on irrigation, the area irrigated by Government canals showed a set back of 121,000 acres or 4·1 per cent. below the previous year due to the unfavourable nature of the inundation. The districts which chiefly contributed to this decrease were Thar and Parkar (— 67,000 acres), Upper Sind Frontier (— 65,000 acres) and Nawabshah (— 16,000 acres). Against this decline, there was some advancement in Larkana (+ 9,000 acres), Hyderabad (+ 7,000 acres), Karachi (+ 6,000 acres) and Sukkur (+ 4,000 acres) districts.

**Private Canals.**—There is hardly any cultivation, worth the name, under private canals in Sind, except perhaps in the district of Sukkur. In this district, the area rose from 8,000 acres during the previous year to 11,000 acres during the year under report.



**Wells.**—Irrigation by wells showed an advancement of 12,000 acres or 27·9 per cent., and this increase was shared by almost all the districts in the Province, as the inundation being very poor, a greater necessity to help the crops with well irrigation, wherever available, was felt.

**Tanks.**—The area irrigated by tanks is quite insignificant in Sind,—the total area in the Province hardly exceeding two thousand acres, and that too confined to the Larkana district only.

**Other Sources.**—Irrigation from “Other Sources” fell by 26,000 acres or 25·0 per cent., the decrease being chiefly marked in Hyderabad (— 11,000 acres), Upper Sind Frontier (— 10,000 acres) and Larkana (— 4,000 acres) districts.

29. The ratio of the irrigated area to the net cropped area was 3·4 per cent. in the Bombay Presidency and 71·4 per cent. in Sind.

### 30. Crops Irrigated (Bombay Presidency Proper).—

**Jowar.**—The area under irrigated *jowar* fell by 21,000 acres or 9·4 per cent. in the Bombay Presidency proper, mostly in the Sholapur district (— 25,000 acres) where, owing to the sufficient late rains, no necessity was felt of helping the crops with irrigation to the usual extent.

**Bajri.**—Irrigated *bajri* declined by 15,000 acres or 23·4 per cent., the decrease occurring chiefly in Ahmednagar (— 9,000 acres) and Poona (— 6,000 acres) districts where, owing to the favourable nature of the rains, there was no necessity to help the crop with an artificial water supply.

**Rice.**—The area under irrigated rice showed a slight decline of 3,000 acres in the Bombay Presidency proper. There were, however, large variations in some parts. In the Karnatak, the area decreased by 15,000 acres; against which, there was an expansion in Gujarat (+ 7,000 acres) and the Deccan (+ 4,000 acres) where, owing to the indifferent rains in places, the crop had to be helped with irrigation.

**Wheat.**—Irrigated wheat extended by 32,000 acres or 22·2 per cent., the increase being contributed by almost all the districts in the Deccan and the Karnatak, and by the Ahmedabad and Panch Mahals districts in Gujarat, where more use of the irrigation facilities had to be made on account of deficient moisture in places.

**Cotton.**—The area under irrigated cotton showed a decline of 6,000 acres or 20·0 per cent., the decrease being equally shared by Ahmedabad (— 2,000 acres), Sholapur (— 2,000 acres) and Satara (— 2,000) districts where, owing to suitable rains, the crop had sufficient moisture to fall back upon and did not require any artificial water supply.

**Sugarcane.**—The area under sugarcane remained almost the same as that of the previous year.

31. Crops Irrigated in Sind.—In Sind, the area under irrigated rice expanded by 103,000 acres or 9·9 per cent., under the incentive of high

prices fetched by the grain as compared with other food grains. On the other hand, the area under wheat, jowari and cotton declined by 37, 45 and 59 thousand acres respectively below the last year owing to the unfavourable character of the inundation. The area under sugarcane remained just the same as during the preceding year.

**32. Number of Wells for Irrigation.**—The quinquennial enumeration of the number of irrigation wells in the Bombay Presidency proper, fell due in 1927-28, and it was accordingly taken during the year under report. The details regarding it are given in Statement IV-A (pages 72-73) and are summarised in Appendix D (ii) (page 30).

The number of masonry wells for irrigation shows an increase of 11,360 (the figure being 188,108 during the year under report as against 176,748 in 1922-23) or 6·4 per cent. during the last five years. The increase is general in all the Divisions of the Presidency proper, but most marked in the Deccan (+ 7,087). Gujarat (+ 2,361), Karnatak (+ 1,286), and Konkan (+ 626) also contributed to this increase. In the Deccan, the noticeable increase in the East Khandesh district (+ 3,437) can be attributed to the correct classification of masonry wells, which were wrongly shown under "non-masonry" wells in the last census return (i.e., in 1922-23). In the remaining districts of the Deccan, the rise was due partly to the conversion of "non-masonry" wells to "masonry" wells and partly to new wells having been built. In Gujarat, Ahmedabad (+ 1,590) and Kaira (+ 432) districts were chiefly responsible for the increase owing to the construction of new wells. In the Karnatak, the increase is noticeable in the Belgaum district (+ 1,199), due to the digging of new wells as a precautionary measure against a deficiency in the water supply; while in the Konkan, the rise in the number of wells is only apparent—more information being available on this occasion from *khoti* (unsurveyed) villages.

## CHAPTER V—OUTTURN OF CROPS

(Statements V and V-A, pages 74-75 and 76-90.)

**33. Yield of Principal Crops.**—Statement V (pages 74-75) shows the estimated yield of the principal *kharif* and *rabi* crops, taking 100 as representing the normal. It is prepared from the district estimates which are returned in annas, with twelve annas as representing a normal crop. The figures are, therefore, only approximate. The character of the season has already been described elsewhere.

### 34. Outturn of Crops in the Bombay Presidency Proper in parts of the normal.—

#### A—Kharif Crops—

**Jowar.**—Except in Ahmednagar and Poona districts, where it had reached the normal, and the Satara district, where it was a little below the normal, the outturn of *kharif jowar* ranged between two-thirds to four-fifths of the normal in all the districts. In the Ahmedabad district, however, it gave a very poor outturn—even less than half the normal, due to excessive rains and floods.

**Bajri.**—The outturn of *bajri* was generally good in the Deccan, where it ranged between three-fourths to four-fifths of the normal in all the districts, while in the Nasik district it reached almost the normal. In Gujarat and the Karnatak, it varied from one-half to two-thirds of the normal in all the districts except in the Satara district, where it came to about four-fifths of the normal and in the Kaira district, where it was definitely poor—giving only one-third of the normal.

**Rice.**—Rice returned an yield above normal in Kolaba, Ratnagiri and Satara districts, a full normal in Ahmednagar and Bombay suburban districts and about four-fifths of the normal in the Panch Mahals, Nasik and Thana districts. In the rest of the districts, it varied from two-thirds to four-fifths of the normal, except in Broach and Dharwar districts, where the outturn fell to a little more than half the normal.

**Cotton.**—The yield of cotton varied from two-thirds to three-fourths of the normal in all the districts in Gujarat. In the Deccan, it ranged between three-fifths to three-fourths of the normal except in East Khandesh and Satara districts, where it came to about four-fifths of the normal; while in the Karnatak, the outturn of the crop ranged between two-thirds to three-fourths of the normal.

**Sesame.**—In Gujarat, the oil-seed yielded from one-half to two-thirds of the normal in all the districts except in the Kaira district, where it was almost a failure due to heavy rains and floods and returned only one-fourth of the normal. In the Deccan, it was better, ranging between two-thirds to four-fifths of the normal in all the districts and reaching almost the normal in the Satara district. In the Karnatak, the outturn varied from three-fifths to two-thirds of the normal, while in the Konkan, it came to about four-fifths of the normal in all the districts except in the Kanara district where it fell to about two-thirds of the normal and in the Kolaba district, where it rose almost to the normal.

#### **B—Rabi Crops—**

**Jowar (Rabi).**—The yield of *rabi jowar* in Gujarat came to about four-fifths of the normal in Kaira and Panch Mahals districts, about two-thirds of the normal in Broach and Surat districts and only half the normal in the Ahmedabad district. In the Deccan, it reached the full normal in West Khandesh, Sholapur, and Satara districts, a little below normal in the Nasik district and about four-fifths of the normal in Ahmednagar and Poona districts. In the Karnatak, the outturn varied from three-fifths of the normal to almost a full normal.

**Wheat.**—In Gujarat, the yield of wheat ranged from two-thirds to three-fourths of the normal throughout the Division, except in the Broach district, where it fell to only half the normal. In the Deccan, it came to about four-fifths of the normal in all the districts except in the Nasik district, where it reached almost the normal and in the Satara district, where it even exceeded the normal. In the Karnatak, it ranged between two-thirds and three-fourths of the normal.

**Gram.**—Gram returned from two-thirds to four-fifths of the normal in Gujarat. In the Deccan, the crop gave a full normal yield in the West Khandesh district, a little below the normal in Nasik and Satara districts and from three-fourths to four-fifths of the normal in the rest of the Division. In the Karnatak, the outturn ranged between two-thirds to three-fifths of the normal, while in the Konkan, it varied from two-thirds to three-fourths of the normal.

**Tobacco.**—The yield of tobacco ranged between three-fourths to four-fifths of the normal in all the districts of Gujarat except in the Surat district, where it fell to two-thirds of the normal. It came to about four-fifths of the normal in the North Deccan and ranged from three-fourths to almost a normal in the rest of the Division except in the Satara district, where it even exceeded the normal. In the Karnatak, the outturn of the crop varied widely—reaching almost a normal in the Belgaum district, about two-thirds of the normal in the Bijapur district and only half the normal in the Dharwar district. In the Konkan, it came to about four-fifths of the normal in the Kolaba district.

**Linseed.**—This oil-seed returned from four-fifths to a full normal yield in the North Deccan and between three-fifths to three-fourths of a normal in the rest of the Division. In the Karnatak, it varied from one-half to two-thirds of the normal. The crop is not grown to any appreciable extent in other districts of the Presidency.

**Rape and Mustard.**—The outturn of these oilseeds ranged between three-fifths to three-fourths of the normal in the Gujarat except in the Broach district where it gave a very poor yield—only two-fifths of the normal. In the Deccan, it varied from three-fifths to four-fifths of the normal, while in the Karnatak, it came to about two-thirds of the normal in Belgaum and Bijapur districts and fell to only half the normal in the Dharwar district.

### 35. Outturn of Crops in Sind in parts of the normal—

#### A—Kharif Crops—

**Jowar.**—In Sind, the outturn of *kharif jowar* came to half the normal in Hyderabad, Thar Parkar and Larkana districts and about two-fifths of the normal in the Sukkur district, while it ranged between three-fifths and two-thirds of the normal in the rest of the Province.

**Bajri.**—*Bajri* returned half the normal in Hyderabad, Thar Parkar and Larkana districts, while the yield of the crop ranged between two-fifths and three-fifths of the normal in the remaining districts.

**Rice.**—Rice was very poor in the Sukkur district, where it yielded only one-third of the normal. In Hyderabad and Thar Parkar districts, it reached half the normal, while in the rest of the Province it varied from two-fifths to two-thirds of the normal.

**Cotton.**—In the three cotton growing districts of the Province, which occupy more than ninety-nine per cent. of the total area under the crop,

*viz.*, Hyderabad, Nawabshah and Thar Parkar districts, the yield of cotton came to only half the normal in the first two districts and about two-thirds of the normal in the last (*i.e.*, Thar Parkar). In the remaining districts, the crop gave an outturn varying from one-half to three-fifths of the normal.

### **B—Rabi Crops—**

**Wheat.**—Wheat was generally poor in the Karachi district, where it yielded only two-fifths of the normal. In the other districts of the Province, the outturn of the crop ranged between one-half and three-fifths of the normal.

**Gram.**—Gram returned only one-third of the normal in Thar Parkar and Sukkur districts, while its yield varied from one-half to two-fifths of the normal in the remaining districts.

**Tobacco.**—Except in Thar Parkar and Larkana districts, where it was only two-fifths of the normal and in the Hyderabad district where it came to half the normal, the outturn of the crop rose to about two-thirds of the normal in the rest of the Province.

**Rape and Mustard.**—The oilseeds returned a little above half the normal in the Thar Parkar district and about two-fifths of the normal in the Larkana district, while their yield came to half the normal elsewhere in the Province.

**36. Outturn of Sugarcane in the Bombay Presidency including Sind.**—In Gujarat, sugarcane gave almost a normal yield in the Kaira district, while in other districts, it ranged between three-fourths and four-fifths of the normal. In the Deccan, the crop returned a full normal yield in West Khandesh, Ahmednagar and Poona districts, and even exceeded it in the Satara district, while it was somewhat below the normal in the rest of the Division. In the Karnatak, the outturn varied between three-fifths to four-fifths of the normal, while in the Konkan, it came to about four-fifths of the normal in Thana and Ratnagiri districts and almost reached the normal in the remaining districts.

In Sind, sugarcane yielded about three-fourths of the normal in the Upper Sind Frontier district and about two-thirds of the normal in Karachi and Sukkur districts, while the outturn of the crop ranged between three-fifths to two-thirds of the normal in the remaining districts of the Province except in the Thar Parkar district, where it fell to about two-fifths of the normal.

### **37. Outturn in Tons of Food-grain Crops—**

Statement V-A (pages 76-90) compares the acreage under food-grain crops (cereals and pulses) in the various Divisions of the Bombay Presidency and their approximate outturn in tons, during the year under

report, with similar statistics for the two preceding years. The following table sums up the result :—

It will be noticed that while the area under food-grains in the Bombay Presidency proper expanded by 1·3 per cent., the outturn increased by as much as 13·2 per cent. as compared with the previous year, thus depicting the general favourable character of the season during the year under report.

In Sind, on the other hand, as a result of the late rise and early fall of the river, the area under food-grains curtailed by 0·7 per cent., while the outturn decreased by as much as 10·3 per cent. below the previous year. This exhibits the unsatisfactory condition of the season over a large part of the Province during the year under review. As compared with 1925-26, however, it will be noticed that there is an increase both in the area and outturn of food-grains in the Province.

#### CHAPTER VI—PRICES, TRADE AND STOCK.

**38. Prices of Principal Articles.**—Statement VI (pages 92-93) shows in detail the retail prices of the principal staples and of fodder ruling at harvest time at each district headquarter station in the Bombay Presidency and in Sind. The detailed remarks below explain the variations in the prices of the principal articles.

**Jowar.**—In the Bombay Presidency proper, *jowar* was sold cheaper by one and one-half to two and a quarter seers per rupee at Ahmedabad, Satara, Godhra (Panch Mahals) and Poona, and by one-half seer to one and a quarter seers per rupee at Ahmednagar. Broach, Jalgaon (East Khandesh) and Sholapur, while it was dearer by one and a half seers per rupee at Dharwar and by one-half to about a seer per rupee at Kanara, Kaira and Belgaum. At the other head-quarter stations the

price of the article showed small variations ranging from a quarter to one-third of a seer per rupee.

In Sind the price of *jowar* ruled easier by one and a half seers per rupee at Jacobabad (Upper Sind Frontier) and by one-third to three-fifths of a seer per rupee at Sukkur, Karachi and Nawabshah, while it remained stationary at other places in the Province.

**Bajri.**—*Bajri* ruled easier by more than three seers per rupee at Sholapur and by one-half seer to two seers per rupee at the remaining head-quarter stations in the Presidency proper except at Kaira and Belgaum where it was dearer by one and four-fifths seers to two-thirds seer per rupee respectively.

In Sind, the price of the article was cheaper by more than a seer per rupee at Karachi and Sukkur and by one-half and three-fourths of a seer per rupee at Hyderabad and Larkana respectively. At the other stations in the Province, the price of *Bajri* showed but very slight variations.

**Rice.**—Rice ruled easier by a quarter to two-thirds of a seer per rupee at Dharwar, Satara, Godhra (Panch Mahals), Ahmedabad, Kaira and Ratnagiri, while its price was higher by a quarter to two-fifths of a seer per rupee at Broach in Gujarat, at Ahmednagar and Poona in the Deccan, and at Belgaum in the Karnatak. At other places, the price of the article showed only very small variations.

In Sind, rice was sold cheaper by one-half seer and a quarter of a seer per rupee respectively at Mirpurkhas (Thar Parkar) and Larkana, while the price of the article remained the same as last year at all the other places in the Province.

**Wheat.**—Wheat was cheaper by two and a quarter seers per rupee at Nasik, by one and one-half to one and three-fourths seers per rupee at Satara, Broach, Bijapur, Dharwar, Ahmednagar and Kaira, and by one-half to one and one-third seers per rupee at the remaining district head-quarter stations in the Presidency proper.

In Sind also, the price of wheat ruled easier by one and one-third of a seer per rupee at Larkana and by one-third to a little more than a seer per rupee at all the other places in the Province.

**Gram.**—Gram was cheaper by a little less than three seers per rupee at Kaira and Satara, by one and a half to two and one-third seers per rupee at Godhra (Panch Mahals), Broach, Ahmednagar, Ahmedabad, Nasik and Dharwar, and by a quarter of a seer to one and a quarter seers per rupee at the remaining places in the Presidency proper. On the contrary, it was dearer by two-thirds of a seer at Thana and by one-half seer at Ratnagiri.

In Sind the price of the article ruled easier by a seer to one and three-fifths seers at Sukkur, Hyderabad and Mirpurkhas (Thar Parkar), and by half a seer to a little less than a seer at the remaining stations in the Province.

**Turdal.**—*Turdal* ruled easier by one and four-fifths seers per rupee at Satara, and by a quarter seer to one seer at Kaira, Godhra (Panch Mahals)

and Broach in Gujarat, at Ahmednagar and Poona in the Deccan, at Belgaum in the Karnatak and at Alibag (Kolaba) in the Konkan. On the other hand, its price was dearer by one-third to four-fifths of a seer per rupee at Thana, Dhulia (West Khandesh), Sholapur, Kanara and Jalgaon (East Khandesh). It was stationary at Bijapur, while, at other places, it showed only small variations.

In Sind, where *mugdal* is generally used in place of *turdal* the price of the article (*mugdal*) was higher by one-third to three-fifths of a seer per rupee at all the stations in the Province, except at Nawabshah and Sukkur where it remained stationary.

**Gul or Raw Sugar.**—The price of the article ruled easier by one-third to one seer per rupee at all the stations in Gujarat except at Kaira, at Dhulia (West Khandesh), Sholapur and Satara in the Deccan, and at Alibag (Kolaba) and Ratnagiri in the Konkan; while it was higher by a quarter of a seer per rupee at Bijapur. At all other stations in the Presidency proper, the price either remained stationary or differed but little from that in the preceding year.

In Sind, the price of the article was cheaper by one and one-third and one and one-half seers per rupee respectively at Jacobabad (Upper Sind Frontier) and at Hyderabad and by one-half to four-fifths of a seer per rupee at the remaining places in the Province.

**Tobacco.**—Tobacco ruled easier by half a seer per rupee at Dhulia (West Khandesh), by two-fifths seer per rupee at Thana and by a quarter seer per rupee at Kaira, Belgaum and Bijapur. On the other hand it ruled higher by a seer per rupee at Ahmednagar and by one-third seer per rupee at Jalgaon (East Khandesh). At all other places in the Presidency proper, its price was either stationary or showed but very slight variations.

In Sind, the price of tobacco was nearly the same as last year almost every where except Nawabshah, where it was easier by a seer per rupee.

**Cotton.**—Under the incentive of high prices fetched by the crop during recent years and owing to the suitability of rains at sowing time in most places, the area under cotton extended nearly everywhere in the Presidency and the total area under the crop in the Bombay Presidency including Sind, Western India Agency and other Indian States stood at 7,763 thousand acres, thus showing a rise of 849 thousand acres or 12·3 per cent. over the previous year. The outturn also increased from 1,289 thousand bales during the last year to 1,800 thousand bales during the year under report thus showing a rise of 511 thousand bales or 39·6 per cent. over the preceding year. Of this total outturn (1,800,000 bales), 422 thousand bales or 23·4 per cent. represented the yield of long-stapled Broach, Dharwar and Kumpta varieties, while the remaining 1,378 thousand bales or 76·6 per cent. belonged to the short-stapled varieties of Khandesh, Gujarat and Sind. As compared with the previous year, the outturn of the long-stapled cotton rose by 24·8 per cent. and that of the short-stapled cotton by 44·9 per cent.



The following table compares the prices of cotton during the year under report, with those of the previous year, and the average of the preceding five years : —

It will be seen from the above table that the price of Broach variety increased over the previous year, though it was still below the average. The prices of the other two varieties, namely Khandesh and Dharwar fell, both as compared with the last year and with the average. This fall may be attributed to the quality of cotton being prejudicially affected by the untimely late rains in many places.

**Fodder.**—Generally speaking, it may be said that there was no scarcity of fodder during the year under report. This was partly due to the ample stocks of fodder of the previous year being available and partly to the general favourable rains of the season which enabled the sowings of the principal fodder crops to be done on an extended scale and these gave a sufficient supply of fodder to the cattle of the Presidency. For the same reason, the supply of dry grass also was not below the mark. In consequence, the prices of both *Jowari Kadbi* and dry grass did not show any appreciable rise in many parts of the Presidency. The actual variations in the prices of these two articles are noted below.

**Jowari Kadbi.**—This was cheaper at Broach and Surat in Gujarat, and at Poona and Satara in the Deccan. At other places in the Presidency, the price of the article ruled somewhat higher than the previous year.

**Dry Grass.**—This was also cheaper at Broach and Surat in Gujarat and at Dhulia (West Khandesh), Poona and Satara in the Deccan, while it ruled somewhat dearer at Belgaum. Everywhere else in the Presidency, the price remained either stationary or showed but very small variations.

In Sind, *Jowari Kadbi* was cheaper at Nawabshah and Larkana. Dry Grass was also cheaper at Karachi and Nawabshah, but ruled higher at Jacobabad (Upper Sind Frontier). At all other places in the Province, the prices of these two articles either remained stationary or showed only slight variations.

**CHAPTER VII—AGRICULTURAL STOCK.**

39. Information under this head is collected only once in five years. The result of the last enumeration has been published in the Season and Crop Report for the year 1924-25.

**CHAPTERS VIII AND IX—CONDITION OF THE AGRICULTURAL POPULATION.**

40. Generally speaking, the agricultural season of 1927-28 was, so far as the actual produce of the land is concerned, some what inferior to its predecessor. It was marked by adverse factors such as (1) the unprecedentedly heavy rains in North Gujarat, which caused heavy floods requiring resowing operations *en masse*, (2) a general deficiency of rains in the south-east of the Presidency and (3) a bad attack of grass-hoppers from Nasik down to Dharwar, affecting the yield of *jowar* and *bajri* crops. These caused considerable anxiety in the earlier part of the season, but the situation appreciably improved from September onwards under the favourable rain and weather conditions, though untimely rains, in places, spoiled both the *Kharif* and *Rabi* harvests to some extent. The result was that the outturn of crops was normal in the Konkan and most of the Deccan, fairly good in South Gujarat and the Karnatak, but was definitely below the average in North Gujarat. In Sind, the unfavourable inundation of the river throughout the period and excessive July rains curtailed both the *Kharif* and *Rabi* sowings, while the general deficiency of water-supply, locust attacks, rice diseases and severe frost in January, adversely affected both the *Kharif* and *Rabi* crops, so that their yield in most cases, was much below the normal. The net result was that there was no actual scarcity of food and fodder. The condition of cattle was also generally satisfactory. For, although rinderpest and foot and mouth disease appeared, as usual, in some districts no where did they assume such a serious aspect as to interfere with agricultural operations.

41. Prices of agricultural products were either stationary or exhibited a downward tendency. Wages, on the other hand, were the same as last year or showed a rise in places, while scarcity of labour was felt in many parts, especially in Gujarat, where all sorts of labour—agricultural and otherwise—was in great demand owing to the destruction of houses by the great flood, and the general disorganization which it brought in its train. The net result was that for the labouring classes, earning increased cash wages, conditions during the year under review, continued very satisfactory. For, while wages continued high, price showed, if anything, a downward tendency. This meant an increase in the purchasing power of the agricultural labourers and they could better afford to live in a state of reasonable ease and comfort. The self dependent small farmer with an economic holding, chiefly using his own labour in producing food for himself and family did not suffer seriously, though the general depression in the prices of agricultural produce coupled with indifferent harvests in places affected him to a certain extent. But the

big cultivator chiefly employing hired labour was very hard hit almost everywhere due to the increased cost of cultivation and the low prices of agricultural products, especially was this true of the Deccan Canal Irrigator owing to the slump in the *gul* market.
