RESOLUTION.

1. The administration of the Jail department during the year 1929 does not present any striking features but steady progress was made toward developing the policy of recent years, which is aimed at the more scientific and humane treatment of the criminal, and the application of reforming influences to those who are amenable to reform. To this end there has been increasing specialisation in the treatment of prisoners. Habitual criminals, who as far as can be seen at present are irreclaimable, are strictly segregated from the ordinary prisoners who form the bulk of the jail population, and particular care is taken in dealing with youthful and adolescent offenders to keep them separate from adults, and do all that is possible to reform them. The results achieved in the Narsinghpur jail, which is reserved for young offenders, are reported to be highly satisfactory, and it is expected that still better results will be obtained when the Borstal Act, which has recently come into force, has worked for some time. The question of issuing executive instructions to District Magistrates to see that in future all cases involving offenders below the age of 21 years are tried by Magistrates invested with first class powers is under examination. As the Inspector-General points out, it is desirable that as few youthful offenders as possible should be sent to jail at all, and there are several provisions in the law intended for the achievement of this object. In some cases however a sentence of imprisonment is inevitable, and then the sentence should be sufficient to justify the young offender being sent to

Narsinghpur, where he can properly be dealt with. Legislative provision has also been made for dealing with young children, and the Act will be brought into force as soon as the necessary rules have been framed.

2. The Governor in Council commends to the attention of District Magistrates the remarks of the Inspector-General about short sentences of imprisonment. Section 388, Criminal Procedure Code, at present authorises magistrates who impose sentences of fine only, and of imprisonment in default of payment of fine, to order, when the fine is not paid at once, that the fine shall be payable either in full within thirty days of the date of the order, or in two or three instalments, of which the first shall be payable within thirty days of the order, and the other or others at an interval or at intervals of not more than thirty days, and to suspend the execution of the sentence of imprisonment and release the offender, on the execution by him of a bond for his appearance on the date or dates on which payment of the fine or the instalments thereof, as the case may be, is to be made. The Inspector-General might profitably examine whether full use is being made of these powers, and might bring to the notice of the District Magistrate concerned any case in which it appears to him that a particular magistrate might have avoided committing to jail an offender sentenced to fine only. It will also be of interest if the Inspector-General can arrange in future years to furnish separately figures giving the number of persons admitted to jails to serve sentences not exceeding three months, who have received substantive sentences of imprisonment, and of persons who are admitted to serve sentences of imprisonment in default of payment of fines, where the substantive sentences consist of fines only. The view of the Inspector-General that it is undesirable to familiarise first offenders with prison life is one which every penologist must share, and which every magistrate should keep constantly before him in framing his sentences.

3. A leading feature of the year according to the report has been the completion of the reorganization of the jail industries, but from the body of the report it is not easy to discover the nature or effect of this reorganization. The financial aspect of jail industries

can be illustrated from the report. On the average a prisoner by his work earns roughly 25 per cent of his total cost to the community. In the Central Jails of Nagpur and Jubbulpore his earnings amount to just over 50 per cent of the public money spent on him. Further it would appear from Statement XII-A that through the employment of jail labour Government has saved an average of roughly Rs. 10-1-6 per prisoner. These and similar piecemeal items of information that can be culled from the report, suggest that it is desirable that the reorganization referred to should be clearly set out for the information of the public.

4. The Discharged Prisoners Aid Society has continued to do good work, and also very considerable services have been rendered to our jail population by ladies and gentlemen who have visited jails and tried to awaken interest and hope among prisoners, and generally to help them to those qualities of character and mind that are likely to prepare them to re-enter free life as useful citizens. The Governor in Council notes with appreciation the names of those who have liberally given of their time to this form of public service, and trusts that their numbers will increase. The object of such work is not to give the prisoner an easy time, but to make his sojourn in prison bracing instead of deadening, to keep alive and encourage qualities that hold together social life, and, above all, to increase as far as possible the chance that a sojourn in jail will be really remedial in its effect.

5. The Governor in Council has noted the names of the officers commended by the Inspector-General for good work, and thanks Lt.-Col. Powell for another year of careful administration of his department.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this resolution be submitted to the Government of India in the Home Department and that a copy be forwarded to the Inspector-General of Prisons for information and guidance; also that it be published in the *Central Provinces Gazette*.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the report on the administration of the jails in the Central Provinces and Berar for the year ending the 31st December 1929.

2. Lieut.-Colonel W. J. Powell, I.M.S., held charge of the department throughout the year.

3. The number of jails and the accommodation remained unaltered during the year.

4. The reorganization of jail industries was completed since the last report. Some of the articles manufactured in our jails were sent to the arts exhibition held in Nagpur last December. These jail exhibits secured 5 certificates of merit. With the exception of the Nagpur Jail, the main activities of other jails are concentrated on

supplying materials for use in the tent factory at the Jubulpore Jail. Apart from this, stone-breaking is the chief minor industry for short-termers.

5. The working of the old and infirm jail at Betul has been most satisfactory. The health of these old and feeble prisoners has been remarkably good, and in addition the cottage industries which have been organized have been most profitable financially. On occasions other prisoners have been sent to Betul for a change of air after acute disease and their health has benefited. It was pleasing to see in the admirable report published at the beginning of the year by the United Provinces Jail Committee that jails of this type were recommended for that province. There is no doubt that special treatment in healthy surroundings for old and infirm prisoners is a necessity.

6. The Adolescent Jail at Narsinghpur has been working satisfactorily. Rules under the Borstal Act are now ready for publication and funds for the required staff at the Borstal Institution have now been voted by the Legislative Council. The Children's Act is still in abeyance, while rules are being thought out. Here, however, though a Senior Certified School is in existence in the present Reformatory School, a Junior Certified School has to be built. Private charitable institutions cannot entirely take the place of a Government institution.

7. The Fourth Conference of Inspectors-General of Prisons was held at Lucknow during the first week of December. At the last two conferences the chief subject on the agenda was the treatment of long-term prisoners in lieu of transportation. A progressive stage system was worked out whereby those sentenced to long-terms would gradually enjoy more and more privileges if their conduct was good, and would earn increasing amounts of remission. No orders have yet been issued on the subject. The suggestion of the 1925 Conference to cut down the number of returns in the annual report has borne fruit and the length of this report is accordingly reduced.

CHAPTER I.—JUDICIAL.

8. General Summary.—The following table gives a brief summary of the various classes of prisoners dealt

with during the year. The figures for 1928 are also shown for purposes of comparison :—

The year opened with a population of 4,407 prisoners of all classes against 4,412 in 1928 and closed with a population of 4,169 or 238 less than the figure of the preceding year.

The number of undertrials admitted during the year was 5,207 against 5,115 of last year.

The number of civil prisoners also increased from 423 to 544. Economic conditions resulting from the continued failure of crops in parts of the province does not appear to be the sole cause for this increase. The number of these prisoners is steadily increasing, and, as suggested last year, the question of increasing the accommodation for such prisoners will have to be borne in mind.

While there was a decrease of 102 in the admission of convicts, the daily average fell from 4,441.98 to 4,314.55.

The number discharged from all causes was 14,461 against 14,157 in 1928.

9. The number of convicts at the beginning of the year was 3,899 against 3,863 in 1928. STATEMENT No. I. Number and disposal of convicts. Direct admissions decreased from 5,059 to 4,957 in the year under report. Had it not been for the sweeper strike in Nagpur, which resulted in the conviction of 103 sweepers under the Municipal Act, the admissions would have been still less.

The number of prisoners received on transfer from other provinces increased from 61 to 72 in 1929, including 6 prisoners returned from the Andamans on account of ill-health.

Eighty-eight prisoners volunteered and were transferred to the Andamans for service.

Of 4,875 prisoners discharged, 828 were released on appeal, 1,202 were released on expiry of sentence, 2,668 were released under remission rules, and 177 were released by order of Government. The large number of releases by order of Government is chiefly due to the release of sweepers in the Nagpur Jail who were convicted under the Municipal Act.

Criminal lunatics.—Nine criminal lunatics were transferred during the year to the Mental Hospital at Nagpur.

Executions.—The number of prisoners executed was 32 against 37 in 1928.

There was a marked increase in the number of deaths as compared with the previous year, viz., from 36 to 55, in the year under report.

At the close of the year 3,466 males and 165 females remained in custody as compared with 3,689 males and 210 females in 1928. The daily average number of convicts decreased from 3,924.76 in 1928 to 3,796.83 in the year under review.

Advisory Boards were held twice in the year at Nagpur, Raipur, Akola and Narsinghpur Jails and once each in Jubbulpore and Amraoti.

Of the 289 prisoners placed before the board, 55 were recommended to the Local Government of whom 44 were actually released.

10. The following table shows the distribution of convicts admitted direct from courts according to religion as compared with the previous year :—

The number of youthful offenders admitted during the year increased from 29 in 1928 to 36 in the year under report.

Of these, 12 were sent to the Reformatory School, Jubbulpore, and the remainder served their sentence in jails or were released on furnishing security.

11. Narsinghpur Adolescent Jail.—The year opened with 185 boys as compared with 122 in the year previous. The admission numbered 317 against 322 in 1928. 307 boys were discharged during the year as follows :—

Seventy were transferred to other jails, 28 were released on appeal, 82 were released on expiry of sentence, 121 were released on remission system, and 3 were released on the recommendation of the Advisory Board.

Two died, one boy escaped and was still at large at the end of the year. This jail has, as usual, played its part admirably, efficiently and with great success towards the

reclamation of the adolescent convict. As long as there is no suitable arrangement for special supervision and adequate aid on release, reversion to crime is more or less inevitable, specially in the case of these young delinquents.

12. The following figures furnish particulars for the past two years in regard to the term of sentence of those admitted to jail :—

The number of prisoners sentenced to a term not exceeding one month was the same as last year, *i.e.*, 227, and it is noticed that there has been a gradual increase of such sentences during the past seven years, starting with 144 in 1923. With the exception of sentences between three and six months and those above ten years all other term sentences show a gradual decrease.

The futility of awarding short sentences is now getting recognized by the magistracy, but it is evident that there is still a tendency to ignore, if not justify short sentences in lieu of small fines and in cases under the Excise Act. A great many persons sentenced with a small fine will not come to jail if sufficient time is given to them to arrange to pay the fine and if they are compelled to have this time. The first impulse on hearing the sentence of a small fine

is to refuse to pay it if possible. The grant of a few days to cool down and to make arrangements would in my opinion help a good deal in realizing the fines. Several offenders under the Excise Act get short sentences, because they are "Casual" offenders, but I have found that many of them are casuals only on paper. Their offence, like some other kinds of offences, is generally not the first that they committed, but the first that was detected. Short sentences would be avoided, if there is an agreement on this point.

The Deputy Commissioner, Narsinghpur, has again pointed out the large number of boys in Narsinghpur Jail who have received short sentences. Casual offenders below 21 years of age from all over the province are up till now confined in that jail. Honorary and stipendary Magistrates with only 2nd or 3rd class powers are in the habit of dealing leniently with these boys out of mistaken kindness, and when it is remembered that the maximum sentence they can award is by no means a long one, the position becomes serious. Some District Magistrates have now deputed selected Magistrates with 1st class powers to try all cases of boys under 21 in their district and this has resulted in adequate sentences being awarded in such cases.

Enumeration of the evils of short sentences cannot be repeated too often. It is an open secret that the dread and shame of imprisonment disappear with familiarity with prison life. Threatening a first offender with imprisonment is much more deterrent than the actual award of a short sentence. If the sojourn in jail is only brief, the prisoner leaves the jail gate with less fear of breaking the law than before. He derives no benefit beyond improvement in health as a result of a regulated life and medical attention. This, however, is obviously not the object of punishment.

13. There was a decrease in the number of reconvicted prisoners from 1,012 in 1928 to the year under report. The ratio per cent to the total number of convicts admitted was 18 against 20 in 1928. There was again a decrease in the number imprisoned for the first time in default of furnishing security under section 110 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, *viz.*, from 96 to 73, in the year under report. It is perhaps too early to express an opinion, but I believe that modern methods introduced into our jails during recent years aiming at the individualization of prisoners are bearing fruit.

The number of youthful offenders under 15 years of age rose from 29 in the last year to 36 in 1929, these figures showing a steady increase during the past six years. Of the 36 convicted this year, nine had been previously convicted.

14. Recognition of habituals.—The following table shows the recognition of habitual offenders :—

The ratio per cent of habitual criminals to the total number of convicts imprisoned was 19 against 21 in the year previous.

15. The total number of escapes during the year was five against three in 1928. These occurred at Bilaspur, Hoshangabad, Bhandara, Narsinghpur and Raipur. Three of them have since been captured. There was an unique experience of one prisoner who, while under transfer from Akola to Yeotmal, escaped from police custody, returned to Akola and surrendered himself voluntarily to the Superintendent of the Akola Jail.

16. There has been again a fall in the total number of jail offences during the year under review, being 3,749 against 4,086 in 1928, which in itself speaks for better discipline.

It is noteworthy to mention that there was a decrease in the offences dealt with by criminal courts; the number dropped from seven to three in the year under report.

Corporal punishment was inflicted on four prisoners during the year against seven in the year previous and in all cases the punishments were deserved.

CHAPTER II.—FINANCIAL.

17. The total expenditure in guarding and maintaining the prisoners during the year was Rs. 7,07,363 against Rs. 7,09,516 in the previous year, being a decrease of Rs. 2,153. The average cost per head has, however, increased from Rs. 159-11-8 to Rs. 163-15-2 on account of a slight decrease in the number of prisoners. The causes for the variations under different heads are explained below :—

STATEMENT NO. IX.
Expenditure in guarding and maintaining prisoners.

Establishment charges.—The total expenditure increased by Rs. 15,835 and the average per head per prisoner increased by Rs. 5-15-5. This was due to (1) payment of increments to the staff, (2) payment of full average salary to a greater number of senior officials going on leave, (3) entertainment of more temporary warders for guarding prisoners sentenced to death, and (4) consequent increase in the warder staff.

Dieting charges.—The total expenditure under this head decreased from Rs. 1,95,014 to Rs. 1,81,190 or by Rs. 13,824 during the year : the average cost per head fell from Rs. 44-3-10 to Rs. 42-6-11. The decrease is due to the purchase of grain at a cheaper rate than the preceding year.

Hospital charges.—These have increased from Rs. 19,697 in 1928 to Rs. 29,310 or by Rs. 9,613. The average has also increased from Rs. 4-6-11 to Rs. 6-12-8. This increase is due to the settlement in 1929 of bills incurred in 1928.

Clothing and bedding.—The total amount spent under this head was Rs. 47,944 against Rs. 61,933 in the previous year. The decrease is due to the purchase of a small stock of cotton and woollen clothing and also to a reduction in the price of prison clothing.

Sanitation charges.—The decrease in expenditure under this head is due to the municipal bill for water consumption in the Jubbulpore and Nagpur Jails not being paid up to the end of the calendar year.

Charges for moving prisoners.—This head shows an increase of Rs. 2,733 over the figures of the previous year which is attributable to the following reasons :—

- (1) Large number of prisoners released.
- (2) Transfer of several volunteers to the Andamans.
- (3) Adjustment of previous year's bills being made during the year under report.
- (4) Increased number of transfers.

Other miscellaneous services and supplies.—The total expenditure under this head shows an increase of Rs. 5,032. This increase is due to the installation of electric lighting during the course of the year in the Jubbulpore Central Jail and also to a large amount of gratuity paid to long-term volunteer prisoners transferred to the Andamans, the supply of water-proofs to warders and to the adjustment of the bills for supplying grass in 1928.

Travelling allowances.—The total expenditure under this head shows a decrease of Rs. 2,664. The decrease is due to fewer transfers of jail staff and warders during the year under report.

Contingencies.—The expenditure under this head was Rs. 7,257 or an increase of Rs. 1,960 against the last year's figure. The increase was due to the payment of telephone

charges for 1928 in the current year ; and also to the purchase of a cycle and a typewriter in the Nagpur and Hoshangabad Jails, respectively.

Extraordinary charges, etc.—This head shows an increase of Rs. 1,385 over the figures of the previous year. The increase is due to (1) payment of the bill for ammunition purchased in 1928 along with that purchased in 1929, (2) replacement of various articles of dead-stock, (3) purchase of two buffaloes by the Bilaspur Jail, (4) purchase of a pair of bullocks by the Saugor Jail and purchase of a large stock of ammunition owing to the increase of 50 warders for guarding undertrial and civil prisoners.

18. The daily average number of convicts sentenced to labour fell from 3,905 in 1928 to 3,796 in 1929. The average number of sick, convalescent and infirm and the number not employed for various other reasons were 185 and 139 and the balance therefore available for work was 3,472 against 3,606 in the previous year. The number not sentenced to labour was 23 against 24 in the previous year. The following figure shows the employment provided for prisoners during 1928 and 1929 :—

The increase in the number of prison officers is due to the classification and separation of different classes of habitual prisoners. The separation entailed the employment of more officers to supervise the increased number of gangs. The number of these officers did not however exceed the sanctioned strength of 10 per cent.

An average of 370 prisoners were daily employed in preparing articles for daily use and consumption in the jail. No credit is taken in jail accounts for prisoners thus employed.

In the jail factories 1,594 prisoners were employed as compared with 1,751 in the previous year. A brief account of the special industries carried on in the important jails is given below as usual.

19. Nagpur Central Jail Press.—In printing there was a drop of six million forms. This was due to a heavy surplus stock of forms being discovered in the various offices in the province by the Inspector who was on special duty in this connection during the year. Consequently, very few indents were received in the year under report. The stock of surplus forms is being distributed to those who are in need of forms. This was the second year since the appointment of the Inspector of Forms was created and the economy effected as a result of his inspections of several offices has more than justified the appointment of an Inspector.

Three hundred and twenty-four kinds of new forms were added to the schedules, while 311 kinds of forms were revised during the year. File-boards with flaps and tape and bundis which have been brought on the schedule are now prepared in the press. The cost of the preparation of the file-boards alone amounted to Rs. 12,000.

The cash earnings have decreased from Rs. 57,225 in 1928 to Rs. 32,880 in 1929, that is, by Rs. 24,345. The decrease is mainly due to the method adopted during the year of calculating the cost of forms as recommended by the Examiner of Press Accounts in his letter No. 924, dated the 9th/12th January 1929, addressed to Local Government. Profit is now charged on a percentage based on convict labour instead of according to older methods which have been found faulty. If the charges had been calculated as in 1928 the decrease would only have been Rs. 1,845. It must be pointed out that the Jail Press does not receive any payment for forms supplied to provincial departments. Cash earnings are on account of forms supplied to central departments and local bodies.

Six million forms have been printed less during the year for reasons stated above. This will also account for

a decrease in the cash earnings. A comparative statement is given below :—

Rubber stamps.—Rubber stamps worth Rs. 1,058 were sold during the year. The quality of the stamps manufactured has been satisfactory.

Quinine.—The demand considerably increased during this year especially for the supply of 4-grains quinine tablets and quinine powder in bulk. 413 indents were received and complied with. Though the Local Government have sanctioned the supply of quinine and cinchona preparations to subsidised medical practitioners no indent has so far been received from any of them.

20. *Jubbulpore Central Jail.*—The outturn of nearly all articles has increased. The following articles were

sold during the year and articles worth Rs. 57,000 were in hand at the end of the year :—

The difference is due to a lesser number of indents received. Prices of nearly all jail-made articles have been reduced on account of the requests received from Government departments and the result of this reduction amounts to a loss of Rs. 12½ per cent. The last column in the table given above shows the price calculated according to 1928 rates of articles sold this year, indicating a loss of Rs. 23,000 in profits on account of reduction in prices alone referred to above.

21. Raipur District Jail.—There was a good demand for cloth for liveries and the weaving section was fully occupied. Four more looms of the improved type were installed for cloth weaving. The demand for aloe mats and salitas was more than could be met. Durrie-making, chick-making, newar-weaving and to a smaller extent furniture-making were the other important industries of the year.

Statement No. XII relating to cash earning has been abolished.

22. Taking into consideration the value of manufactured goods, raw material, etc., at the beginning and end of the year, the gross profit during the year amounted to Rs. 1,81,763 against Rs. 2,44,052 in 1928, i.e., a decrease of Rs. 62,289. The decrease is attributable to the following reasons :—

(1) Reduction in prices of manufactured articles in the Jubbulpore and Nagpur Jails.

- (2) Large stock of peons' livery cloth which was disposed of at the close of the year for which payment is awaited by the Nagpur Central Jail.
- (3) Smaller sale of gitti and manufactured articles at the Amraoti Jail. Owing to the scarcity of water at Amraoti the paper factory could not comply with the demand of jail-made paper and boards.

The saving effected to Government by the employment of prison labour amounted to Rs. 43,743 as compared with Rs. 40,762 in the preceding year.

23. This statement has been re-introduced after some years and no comparison can be made. The total cost of maintenance of prisoners amounted to Rs. 7,07,363 or Rs. 163-15-0 per head and the amount of cash earned by prisoners was Rs. 1,83,114 or Rs. 42-7-0 per head. Thus the net cost to Government amounted to Rs. 5,24,249 or Rs. 121-8-0 per prisoner.

CHAPTER III.—VITAL.

24. The following is the statement showing the admissions into hospital, daily average sick, total mortality and ratio of deaths per mille for the last two years :—

Of 929 admissions into hospital, 828 were convicts, 96 undertrials and 5 civil against a total 956 in the previous year. But the daily average sick increased from 39.01 to 40.83.

The total number of deaths during the year was 58 against 39 in the previous year. The ratio of deaths per mille increased by 4.66, the figure being 13.44 against 8.78 in 1928.

There was no mortality in the jails of Chanda, Damoh, Mandla and Khandwa.

Jubbulpore Central Jail.—The number of prisoners admitted into hospital was 152 against 149 in 1928. There were 37 admissions as dysentery patients with 3 deaths as compared to 14 admissions and no deaths in the previous year.

Nagpur Central Jail.—There were 9 deaths out of 130 admissions into hospital against 5 deaths out of 63 admissions in the previous year.

Raipur District Jail.—The number of admissions into hospital decreased from 242 in 1928 to 167 in 1929. The number of deaths had also decreased from 6 in 1928 to 3 in the year under report. The daily average number of sick was 8.15 against 8.30 in the previous year.

Akola District Jail.—The number of admissions into hospital increased from 65 in 1928 to 85 in the year under report, the deaths being 3 in 1929 as compared to 2 in the previous year.

Amraoti District Jail.—The admissions into hospital was 50 this year against 60 admissions in the previous year. The mortality also reduced from 4 to 2 this year.

Chhindwara District Jail.—Of the 46 admissions into hospital from all causes, 9 were admitted for pulmonary tuberculosis. The mortality due to pulmonary tuberculosis was 6 against 2 deaths in the previous year.

Narsinghpur Adolescent Jail.—The number of admissions to hospital was 21 against 20 in the previous year, and the number of deaths was 2 against 3 in the year previous.

25. The diseases demanding special attention are cholera, dysentery, malaria, tuberculosis, diarrhœa and pneumonia. The following particulars show the number of admissions and deaths to convicts from the above diseases :—

Cholera.—The deaths due to cholera were 2 out of 3 admissions to hospital—one at Nagpur and one at Yeotmal. Last year there were no cases at all.

Dysentery.—Out of 169 admissions, there were 8 deaths this year as compared to 103 admissions and 2 deaths in the previous year.

Malaria.—The number of admissions into hospital dropped from 136 in the last year to 80 this year, the

number of deaths remained the same as in the previous year, *viz.*, 2.

Tuberculosis.—There was a slight increase in the admissions due to this disease being 34 against 23 in the previous year. The number of deaths also increased from 6 in the last year to 10 this year.

Pneumonia.—Cases increased from 28 last year to 36 this year and 10 proved fatal this year against 8 last year.

Diarrhœa.—There was a remarkable increase in admissions to hospital from 35 in the last year to 63 this year. But it is noteworthy that there is no proportionate increase in deaths, the deaths being 3 this year against 2 last year. I find that there was also a general increase of bowel complaints in the province outside the jails apart from epidemics of cholera.

26. Of the 55 convicts whose deaths occurred during the year, 25 had been in jail for a period not exceeding 6 months, 4 for a period exceeding 6 months and not exceeding one year. From this it will be seen that more than half of the mortality was in the newly admitted prisoners. A great many of the newly admitted prisoners in districts where scarcity prevailed were in very poor health.

27. The number of undertrials in jail on the 1st January 1929 awaiting trial was 446 as compared with 522 in the preceding year. The number received during the year was 5,207 against 5,115 in 1928. Of the total number of 5,653 undertrials dealt with during the year, 2,878 were acquitted, 2,181 were convicted, 132 were transferred and 2 died, leaving 460 at the end of the year. The daily average number was 473.51 against 483.19 in 1928.

28. *Statement A.*—This statement shows the nature and amount of accommodation for each class of prisoner in the jails at the close of the year. The total accommodation available was for 6,749, the same as that of the previous year. There was temporary overcrowding in undertrial wards at Bhandara, Saugor and Wardha Jails which was relieved by accommodating the excess number in the empty barracks intended for convicts. Overcrowd-

ing also took place in the convict wards of the Akola, Bilaspur and Yeotmal Jails, but was only temporary.

29. *Statement B.*—This table shows the physical condition of the prisoners from all jails during this year as compared with the previous year :—

30. *Statement C.*—This statement refers to the working of the remission rules. The total number of convicts released under the remission rules was 2,668 as compared with 2,742 in the previous year. The maximum gratuity earned was Rs. 25-4-0 against Rs. 29-12-0 in the preceding year. The average gratuity was Re. 0-6-10 against Re. 0-8-1.

31. *Discharged Prisoners' Aid Society.*—Some progress has been made during the year. The branch at Jubbulpore has been rejuvenated. As in the previous year, a grant of Rs. 3,000 was made by Government to assist the work of the Society. Subscriptions from the public have fallen off, but the Society has now accumulated a sufficient balance to start building a Home in Nagpur where ex-prisoners can be housed while they are seeking work. It is proposed to provide work at this home such as bookbinding and the running of a small agricultural plot. The house rented in Nagpur city for the past few years is not entirely suitable.

32. A pleasing feature in the working of the department during the last two years is the increasing number of voluntary workers who are visiting jails and helping the prisoners towards a better outlook on life. In the large female wings at Nagpur and Jubbulpore a number of ladies are regularly visiting the jails and instructing the women.

In Nagpur this work is particularly well organized. A ladies' sub-committee has been formed and a grant sanctioned from its funds by the Discharged Prisoners' Aid Society. The work at the jail is organized under three

heads by Mrs. McFadyen, the Honorary Secretary. One lady instructs in reading and writing, another in sewing and a third writes letters for the women, finds out how their children and relatives are faring and generally keeps them in touch with their homes while they are in jail. Mrs. Gordon has undertaken this important work during the year, and her departure will be sorely felt by the women. Mrs. Shott of the Wesleyan Mission visits the female prisoners at Jubbulpore once a week and teaches them the three "R"s and sewing. Unexpected progress has been made by the females as a result of Mrs. Shott's teaching. Six women out of a class of 10 can now read and write Hindi fairly well and about 10,000 articles of prison clothing were either sewn or finished by the female prisoners.

There can be no doubt that such human sympathy in these unfortunates is of the greatest benefit to the women themselves and to the country at large.

On the male side the professors of the Spence Training College in Jubbulpore are regularly visiting the jail and in addition to lecturing to the prisoners are actively engaged in improving the condition of the younger prisoners by participation in games which have been started in their enclosure; their annual sports were held last November and the keenness and skill displayed by the convicts was very encouraging.

Three extra mural hockey grounds are now in daily use at the Juvenile Jail at Narsinghpur and one is ready at Jubbulpore.

It is not to be inferred from the above that the lot of the prisoners is being made too easy in jail. There has been no curtailment of the hours of work, and strict discipline has been maintained. Moral and other lectures, physical exercise and games, education and libraries are made available for leisure hours which in the past were not sufficiently utilized for reformation of prisoners.

My thanks are due to all the ladies and gentlemen who have rendered valuable service as voluntary workers and have helped in these reformatory measures.

33. Education.—Unfortunately, the provision for school masters had to be cut out of the budget in 1929 on account of scarcity. It is hoped that they will soon be appointed. In spite of the absence of trained teachers,

the jail schools have flourished under the supervision of the jailor staff with the help of educated convicts. There is an increasing demand for admission to the classes and a large number of prisoners who came into jail illiterate, have been released able to read and write, or their time in jail has been ameliorated and their outlook on life improved by working in the schools. Active co-operation of the jail staff in this work, in addition to their heavy ordinary duties, is beyond praise.

34. Religious preachers.—As usual, religious and moral instructions continued to be given in nearly all jails. The Chairman of the Jail Board, Seoni, in his note, dated the 18th November 1929, on the Seoni Jail says :

“We proceeded round the jail and found all in good order. One member remarked that the convicts are better housed than we are ourselves, and in regard to the only complaint that was made (*viz.*, regarding the visits of the Moulvi), I observe that the arrangements for spiritual ministrations to convicts are far better than those for free men.”

35. Visitors.—The Hon'ble the Home Member visited the Yeotmal Jail during the year. Quarterly Board meetings were held regularly at every jail. In addition frequent visits were paid by Sessions Judges, District Magistrates and non-official visitors.

36. Inspections.—All the jails in the province were visited by the Inspector-General of Prisons during the year.

37. Notice of officers.—As usual, all grades of the jail staffs worked with zeal and energy with almost no exception. Colonel Powell desires the special mention of the following officers :—
