RESOLUTION

1. **Constitution.**—The number of district councils and local boards remained unchanged. The number of seats in the Amraoti local board was increased from 13 to 15 and in the Chandur local board reduced from 15 to 13 owing to the transfer of two circles of the latter to the former.

2. **Elections.**—No general elections were held during the year. The general election of the Jubbulpore district council was due in February 1937 but was postponed till April 1938 to enable the reconstitution of the local board circles to be completed on the basis of a wider franchise. In the Sakoli local board of the Bhandara district two casual vacancies were filled under section 10-A of the Local Self-Government Act.

3. **Disposal of business.**—All the district councils except Nagpur, and all but 16 local boards, held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 738 [767] of which 94 [66] proved abortive. Average attendance in district councils rose to 69 [65] and in local boards fell to 51 [54]. In the Nagpur division, some local boards held an unduly large number of meetings, e.g., Hinganghat 14, and Umrer and Warora 10 each. The Arvi local board held only one meeting owing to acute tension between the board and the council. In the Jubbulpore division, the local boards of Banda, Hoshangabad, Harda and Gadarwara, and in the Chhattisgarh division, the local boards in the Bilaspur, Bhandara and Balaghat districts failed to hold the prescribed number of meetings due to apathy of the office-bearers. The need for legislation for automatic disqualification of habitual absentees is again urged in several reports. It is gratifying to note that at least one local body, viz., the Harsud local board, took action under section 17 (2) of the Local Self-Government Act to remove a member for failure to attend any meeting. It is felt that travelling allowance paid to cover out-of-pocket expenses might improve attendance and the Damoh district council has decided to try this method.

4. **General financial results.**—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 32.33 [Rs. 31.38] lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 72.76 [Rs. 73.73] lakhs and the total expenditure, to Rs. 73.35 [Rs. 72.42] lakhs, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 31.74 [Rs. 32.69] lakhs. In the Jubbulpore division income increased in all the district councils except Hoshangabad and Narsinghpur and the expenditure exceeded the income in all except Jubbulpore and Mandla. In the Berar division the main item of income (cess) fell to Rs. 10.67 [Rs. 12.85] lakhs against a normal demand of Rs. 11.32 lakhs. This was due to a fall in the land revenue collections to Rs. 92.70 lakhs (normal Rs. 99.46 lakhs). There will be a permanent decrease in the income from cess in Berar, and specially in West Berar, owing to the reduction of land revenue in the seven taluqs the assessment of which was revised. In Berar the revenue from school rate decreased to Rs. 0.67 [Rs. 1.01] lakhs because of the continuance of the economic depression. The Akola and Yeotmal councils must keep a close watch on their finances if they are to maintain the prescribed minimum balance. The Amraoti council deserves to be complimented for having prepared useful schemes for the utilization of its large balance.

5. **General Departments.**—The income under this head decreased to Rs. 36.15 [Rs. 38.54] lakhs, while the expenditure increased to Rs. 9.51 [Rs. 9.34] lakhs. The decrease in receipts is attributed to short recovery of taxes and cesses by all councils except Mandla and Narsinghpur, and to a fall in receipts under "Civil Works". The Mandla district council did not receive the half share of Rs. 3,000 on account of ferry dues. In Berar, receipts suffered considerably owing to fall in income from cesses.

6. **Cattle-pounds.**—The number of cattle-pounds increased to 1,889 [1,878] and the income to Rs. 5.29 [Rs. 5.18] lakhs while expenditure decreased to Rs. 2.90 [Rs. 2.96] lakhs. The increase in income is due to the opening of new pounds. In Chhattisgarh better supervision was exercised by appointment of cattle-pound inspectors in all the districts. In the Jubbulpore division supervision leaves much to be desired, but Mandla

and Hoshangabad now propose to appoint inspectors. Out of 82 pounds in the Nagpur district 11 are not self-supporting and their closure should be considered.

7. **Education.**—The total expenditure on education, including that on school buildings, amounted to Rs. 30.10 [Rs. 30.61] lakhs of which Rs. 11.55 [Rs. 10.64] lakhs were provided by Government. Fees, contributions from other than provincial revenues, and miscellaneous receipts brought in Rs. .28 [Rs. .19] lakhs, while the remaining amount of Rs. 18.27 [Rs. 19.78] lakhs was met from the surplus of the general purposes grant and other sources. The total number of schools increased from 4,196 to 4,506 and the enrolment also increased from 305,023 to 309,697 while the average attendance increased from 236,253 to 240,667.

It is pleasing to note that increase in the number of schools has been accompanied by a higher enrolment and better average attendance. The Betul district council has opened 56 new schools in the aboriginal tracts and has also adopted an ambitious scheme for the extension of compulsory education, but it remains to be seen how far it will be able to bear the cost. All the district councils in the Jubbulpore division and the Balaghat district council have prepared similar schemes and in Mandla 89 villages have been brought under compulsion. The district council, Amraoti, has prepared a new scheme of cheap type schools under which a school will be opened in every village or group of villages with a population exceeding 500. The results of the experiment will be watched by Government and by other councils with special interest. The same council is also introducing a scheme of supplying wireless sets to the larger villages. The Mandla district council has opened a vidya mandir and is also opening 50 schools for the backward classes. The desire for expansion of education is in evidence all round and the only hindrance to progress is the scarcity of funds. Jubbulpore, Mandla, Damoh and Narsinghpur district councils received grants for village libraries. The number of trained teachers continues to be inadequate and the Raipur and Damoh district councils have reported difficulty in securing such teachers. Increased facilities for training teachers are obviously necessary. Vocational training schools made good progress during the year. The percentage of transfer of teachers fell to 11 [20] in the Drug district which is very satisfactory. In Bhandara it was as high as 34.41. The district councils must realize that they cannot get the best out of their teachers if they shift them about too frequently.

8. **Medical.**—The number of dispensaries decreased to 79 [86] owing to the transfer of six dispensaries in the Amraoti district and one dispensary in the Balaghat district to municipal or notified area committees and the expenditure on medical relief also fell to Rs. 2.10 [Rs. 2.13] lakhs. A few new dispensaries were established. One cheap plan dispensary in Chanda was opened and sanction for two in Nimar, one in Mandla, two in Jubbulpore, two in Raipur and one in Drug has been accorded. Proposals are also under contemplation to open two cheap plan dispensaries in Raipur, two in Bhandara, one in Bilaspur, one in Drug and one in Hoshangabad.

The growing popularity of the indigenous systems of medicine is reflected in the opening of one ayurvedic dispensary each in Chhindwara and Raipur. The Drug district council maintains three regular and three subsidized ayurvedic dispensaries, while Raipur employed four ayurvedic vaidyas on a monthly remuneration of Rs. 25 and a contribution of Rs. 100 per annum. On the recommendation of a committee appointed by it, Government has since decided to establish 83 indigenous dispensaries in the province and to subsidize allopathic and indigenous practitioners settling down in villages. Government trusts that district councils will whole-heartedly co-operate in carrying out these schemes in the course of the current year.

9. Public health.—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation fell slightly to Rs. 1.53 [Rs. 1.56] lakhs and Rs. .18 [Rs. .20] lakh, respectively. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 668,259 [584,444].

There is a welcome rise in the number of vaccinations, but it has not yet reached the peak figure of 1935-36 which must, therefore, continue to be the goal to be attained. The halting progress is ascribed to lack of supervision by the vaccination staff. Government has just sanctioned the transfer of control over vaccination from district councils to the Public Health Department which will employ competent and qualified sub-assistant health officers in place of the assistant superintendents of vaccination. It is hoped that this reform will not only secure an improvement in the standard of vaccination but will also provide an agency for general health and sanitation propaganda in the rural area. Schemes for compulsory vaccination are engaging the attention of all the district councils in the Nagpur division. The Nimar district council has enforced the Vaccination Act in 36 villages and Raipur in 18.

In the Nagpur division additional facilities for water-supply were provided out of the substantial Government grant. Almost all the district councils constructed new wells either from their own funds, or from the Government of India grant, or from both. In the Jubbulpore division, progress was slow and expenditure on water-supply fell to Rs. 14,095 [Rs. 23,506]. In Chhattisgarh, there is still considerable leeway to make up, although the expenditure was slightly higher during the year. Sanitation in villages continues to be as deplorable as ever. Government hopes that with the spread of village panchayats which it has under contemplation and with the expansion of education, an administrative agency and public opinion will be created which will no longer tolerate this unsatisfactory state of affairs.

10. Veterinary and stock breeding.—Veterinary receipts and expenditure amounted to Rs. 3,177 [Rs. 2,898] and Rs. 1,14,751 [Rs. 1,11,286], respectively. The number of veterinary dispensaries rose to 95 [94].

Five outlying dispensaries were opened in Jubbulpore and one each in Raipur and Chhindwara. At present two stud bulls in Seoni, one in Damoh, six in Raipur and two in Bilaspur are maintained at the respective district council's cost. In Jubbulpore cattle-breeding activities were transferred to the

Veterinary Department with 13 controlled and 73 private breeding centres. The results of these breeding schemes have not yet come up to expectations. The year was on the whole healthy except for the somewhat extensive outbreak of diseases in Nagpur. The reports bear ample testimony to the superiority of the goat-virus method to the old serum method.

11. Civil works.—Expenditure on civil works decreased to Rs. 6.96 [Rs. 7.38] lakhs. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance decreased to 1,796 [1,798] miles. The Government grant for transferred works increased to Rs. 7,76,885 [Rs. 7,17,701] and the expenditure to Rs. 7,65,687 [6,96,234].

The independent mining local board, Chhindwara, is constructing a first class road from Eklehra to Damua. The condition of roads, schools and pounds in the Wardha district was unsatisfactory owing to maladministration of the council and a proposal to transfer some of the roads to Government is under consideration. On the maintenance and construction of village roads the Chhindwara district council spent Rs. 3,095, Mandla Rs. 738, Hoshangabad Rs. 582, Nimar Rs. 999 and Balaghat Rs. 551. These figures only emphasise the magnitude of the work ahead and the utter inadequacy of the progress made so far. Government is convinced that improvement of village tracks is essential to ensure better marketing and is at present considering a proposal for a more effective co-ordination of the utilization of the various grants for rural communications.

12. Markets.—The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local Self-Government Act have been applied was 934 [931]. The income from markets was Rs. 3.36 [Rs. 3.40] lakhs.

The general complaint that district councils do not spend enough from their market income for providing amenities in the markets still continues. The Seoni district council is one of the few that have applied a portion of the income to improvement of the markets.

13. Legislation, byelaws and rules.—There was no legislative activity in regard to the Local Self-Government Act during the year. Many district councils either adopted the revised pension fund byelaws or had them published for objections. Some district councils adopted byelaws prescribing standard weights and measures as a step preliminary to the standardization of weights and measures in the public markets.

14. Taxation.—The only new tax sanctioned in the year was that on grain milled and husked by machinery in the Bhandara district. The proposals of the Nagpur, Chhindwara and Saugor district councils for enhancement of terminal tax, had to be rejected by Government. The Hoshangabad district council is the only body which considered the imposition of a special school rate and an extra cess of 3½ per cent while the Nimar district council took steps to increase the market fees. The general trade depression and the unfavourable economic conditions of the agriculturists are no doubt responsible for the absence of schemes of new taxation, but Government hopes that

the district councils fully realise that unless they tap all available sources of revenue, there can be no expansion of their beneficent activities.

15. **Staff.**—Several district councils imposed “emergency” cuts in the salaries of their staff ranging from 5 to 30 per cent. There was also a tendency on the part of the district councils to withhold increments on the ground of economy. Complaints were received from some district councils that they habitually paid their teachers late and that there were cases of employment of the staff in work which does not form part of their legitimate duties. Government has noticed that cuts in salaries and the withholding of increments are resorted to as measures of retrenchment without exploring alternative measures to balance the budget. Security of tenure is an essential condition of loyal and efficient service and, therefore, Government wishes to draw attention to the undesirability of action likely to undermine the confidence and morale of the servants working under them.

16. **Financial irregularities.**—The report of the Examiner of Local Fund Accounts gives a lengthy catalogue of the financial irregularities committed by the district councils and local boards. Cases of tenders not invited, or of lowest tenders not accepted without sufficient reason, of disregard of the tax-payer’s interest, of excess payments, of grants of advances contrary to rules and of non-observance of statutory rules in the maintenance of public works accounts are only too common. The statutory period for the return of audit reports after disposal was extended from three to four months, in the hope of ensuring their punctual submission, but Government regrets to observe that there was no improvement and the audit notes continued to be delayed as before. The Hoshangabad and Narsinghpur district councils submitted their replies to the audit report for 1935-36 so late as the 31st March 1938. The quality of disposal of objections leaves much to be desired and the replies continue to be vague and evasive. The Hoshangabad district council frankly admitted its inability to dispose of the audit objections and has asked for the services of an experienced auditor. It is, however, reassuring that the provision of surcharge in the Local Fund Audit Act has effected considerable improvement in the condition of accounts in these bodies. A speeding up of this process is, however, essential and Government is constrained to repeat that it will not hesitate to make use of this power in all cases of proved disregard of rules involving financial loss to local bodies.

17. **Village Panchayats.**—Twenty-four [20] new panchayats were established and 7 [1] were disestablished owing to continued party factions, abortive elections, or gross maladministration. 952 village courts and benches functioned of which 99 [99] village courts and 123 [116] village benches exercised enhanced powers. Fourteen [13] village courts exercised special powers under section 54 (1) of the Village Panchayat Act. 7,906 [8,764] civil suits and 7,115 [6,987] criminal cases were disposed of. On the whole, these powers were exercised judiciously. It is gratifying to note that the district councils

are taking increasing interest in the working of village panchayats and all except Saugor and Bhandara have now formed sub-committees for the panchayat work.

As usual, the judicial work continued to claim the lion's share of the attention of panchayats to the neglect of administrative functions. This over-emphasis on judicial duties will, it is hoped, be corrected when the new Panchayat Bill, which Government introduced in the last Assembly session, becomes law and imposes certain obligatory administrative duties on panchayats.

18. **General remarks.**—The relations between local boards and district councils were generally harmonious. In Wardha, Hoshangabad and Saugor districts there was a tendency on the part of some local boards to question the authority of the district council. In Wardha, an *ex*-Chairman of a local board, and an *ex*-Chairman of the district council, have been prosecuted for offences under section 409, Indian Penal Code. The reports bear testimony to the cordiality which marked the relations between the district councils and the district officers. The Commissioner, Jubbulpore, specially brings to notice the valuable work done by the district councils of Hoshangabad and Narsinghpur in combating the cholera epidemic in co-operation with Government officers. This was the first year of the working of local bodies under the new constitution. Government has felt the need of improvement in the various branches of Local Self-Government and has recently appointed a committee to examine the position and recommend measures for placing the working of local bodies on a more up-to-date and efficient footing.

19. The thanks of Government and the public are due to those office-bearers and members of district councils and local boards whose good work has been specially commended in the divisional reviews.

RESOLUTION

1. **Constitution.**—The number of district councils and local boards remained unchanged.

2. **Elections.**—During the year general elections were held in the Seoni sub-division, in the Jubbulpore, Bilaspur, Balaghat and Bhandara districts and in all the Berar districts but no district council could be fully constituted. The elections to Mandla, Narsinghpur, Hoshangabad, Drug and Raipur councils were due in the year under review but could not take place owing to a variety of reasons, the main reason being delay in the preparation of electoral rolls. It is remarkable that in the Berar districts and in the districts of Bilaspur and Balaghat the number of uncontested seats was large and the interest evinced by the electorate was not very keen. In the Balaghat district, only 42 per cent of the electorate attended the poll.

3. **Disposal of business.**—All the district councils except two and all the local boards except 17 held the prescribed number of meetings. The total number of meetings held was 750 [738], of which 90 [94] proved abortive. The average percentage of attendance at district council meetings decreased to 65 [69] and that of the local board meetings rose to 52 [51]. The continued absence of some members from local board meetings and the failure to initiate action under section 17 (2) of the Local Self-Government Act against such members are again commented upon by Commissioners. This question is now linked up with the general overhaul of the law regulating local self-government, for which a committee was appointed by Government after the close of the year.

4. **General financial condition.**—The year opened with a balance of Rs. 31.36 [Rs. 32.33] lakhs. The total receipts from all sources amounted to Rs. 71.56 [Rs. 72.76] lakhs and the total expenditure to Rs. 75.84 [Rs. 73.35] lakhs, leaving a closing

balance of Rs. 27.08 [Rs. 31.74] lakhs. The following table shows the net receipts and expenditure in lakhs of rupees in various departments:—

In several district councils, viz., Jubbulpore, Damoh, Narsinghpur, Raipur, Bilaspur, Drug and Balaghat, expenditure exceeded income. In Berar, owing to an indifferent harvest and consequent suspension of land revenue, collections of the district council cess—which is the main source of income—dropped considerably and receipts from other sources also declined owing to the unsatisfactory economic conditions. The Amraoti district council continues to maintain a very satisfactory financial position; the other Berar district councils must take time by the forelock and rehabilitate their financial position by a judicious combination of economies and fresh taxation.

5. **General departments.**—The income under this head decreased to Rs. 33.52 [Rs. 36.15] lakhs, while the expenditure increased to Rs. 10.54 [Rs. 9.51] lakhs. The decrease in income is explained by the subnormal harvests in the Nagpur and Berar Divisions resulting in diminished receipts from cesses and rates.

6. **Cattle-pounds.**—The number of cattle-pounds increased to 1,901 [1,889]. The income decreased to Rs. 4.99 [Rs. 5.29] lakhs and the expenditure to Rs. 2.85 [Rs. 2.99] lakhs. Inspections of cattle-pounds by office-bearers, members and staff are generally inadequate and in some district councils are not made at all. The district councils in the Jubbulpore Division would do well to emulate the example of the Chhattisgarh councils in appointing cattle-pound inspectors.

7. **Education.**—The total expenditure on education, including that on buildings, amounted to Rs. 30.95 [Rs. 30.10] lakhs, of which Rs. 12.10 [11.55] lakhs were provided directly by Government. Fees, contributions other than those from provincial revenues and miscellaneous receipts brought in Rs. .38 [.28] lakhs, while the remaining amount of Rs. 18.47 [Rs. 18.27] lakhs was met from the surplus of the general purposes grant and other sources. The total number of schools increased from 4,506 to 4,761 and the enrolment decreased from 309,697 to 308,423, while the average attendance increased from 240,667 to 241,351.

During the year Wardha, Chhindwara, Damoh and Narsinghpur district councils made efforts to introduce compulsory education but were unsuccessful owing to their inadequate finances. In Sironcha compulsion exists only in name and the independent local board would be well advised to consider the Betul system of securing good attendance through aboriginal propagandists. In Mandla, Government sanctioned 50 Bhumijan schools, out of which 40 have been opened by the district council and 10 have been entrusted to the Mission authorities. Vocational schools continue to be popular and the Nimar and Damoh councils have each introduced agricultural training in one of their schools. The Amraoti council sponsored a cheap type school scheme and has introduced agricultural training in certain vernacular middle schools. Circulating libraries were started in Nagpur, Wardha, Chhindwara and Chanda districts. Government regrets to note that some district councils such as Nagpur and Chanda continue to transfer teachers too frequently although the undesirability of doing so has been impressed upon them time and again. There is still considerable leeway to be made up in providing trained teachers. In many district councils the teaching staff is highly discontented as a result of inadequate salaries, repeated cuts, unjustifiable withholding of increments and unpunctuality in disbursement of salaries.

8. **Medical.**—The number of dispensaries increased to 83 [79] and the expenditure on medical relief increased from Rs. 2.10 to Rs. 2.19 lakhs. There was further extension of medical relief during the year by the opening of two subsidised dispensaries, one each in the Betul and Nagpur districts, by the provision of a travelling dispensary by the independent local board, Chhindwara, and by the establishment of cheap plan dispensaries at Karanjia in Mandla, Lamta in Balaghat, and Biliagarh in Raipur. The Amraoti district council introduced its own system of cheap medical aid in fifteen villages. Since the close of the year, Government has sanctioned several other cheap-plan dispensaries both in the open and in the aboriginal tracts. The schemes of opening ayurvedic and unani dispensaries and of subsidising vaid and hakims to settle in villages also met with a fair measure of success. In spite of financial stringency, Government has decided to continue these schemes, and it is hoped that district councils will not be slow to take full advantage of them. It is pleasing to note that the Drug district council has now increased the number of its ayurvedic dispensaries to four and the Bhandara council has established six more such dispensaries.

9. **Public health.**—The total expenditure on vaccination and sanitation increased slightly from Rs. 1.53 to Rs. 1.59 lakhs and Rs. .18 to .24 lakhs, respectively. The total number of vaccinations performed during the year was 445,358 [668,259]. The marked fall in the number of vaccinations is to be mainly attributed to slack supervision by the vaccination staff. With the replacement of Assistant Superintendents of Vaccination by Sub-Assistant Health Officers of the Public Health Department it is expected that there will be definite improvement in this respect. The wisdom of compulsory vaccination is gradually

being realized by district councils and during the year Jubbulpore and Mandla decided to introduce this measure. After some hesitation the Narsinghpur council, and later still the Hoshangabad council, have also agreed to introduce compulsory vaccination.

Measures for the improvement of water-supply in rural areas were taken by almost all the district councils but lack of funds hampers progress in this as in all other spheres of rural development.

10. Veterinary.—Veterinary receipts and expenditure amounted to Rs. 2,525 [Rs. 3,177] and Rs. 1,14,005 [Rs. 1,14,751], respectively. The number of veterinary dispensaries rose from 95 to 97. Two new dispensaries in the Drug and Yeotmal districts, one subsidised dispensary in the Raipur district and three "outlying dispensaries" in the Bhandara district were established. A veterinary compounders' training class was run at the Jubbulpore dispensary. Only a few councils incurred an expenditure on stock breeding and the results obtained from stud bulls in the Damoh and Bilaspur districts continued to be very unsatisfactory. No epidemics amongst cattle are reported.

11. Civil works.—Expenditure on civil works decreased to Rs. 6.56 [6.96] lakhs. The total length of provincial roads transferred to district councils for maintenance increased to 1,802 [1,796] miles. The Government grant for transferred works fell to Rs. 7,06,554 [Rs. 7,76,885] and the expenditure to Rs. 6,95,345 [Rs. 7,65,687]. It is satisfactory to note that the Wardha council spent large amounts over repair of buildings. Ten miles of the Eklehra-Damua road was completed by the Independent Mining Local Board, Chhindwara. The condition of buildings in the Jubbulpore and Saugor districts is very unsatisfactory. Several district councils have taken advantage of Government's scheme for improvement of rural communications and about half the total allotment of Rs. 1,50,000 was distributed over schemes prepared by them. There is still a large balance from the allotment of rupees one lakh earmarked for rural communications out of the Government of India grant of Rs. 6 lakhs made for rural reconstruction in 1936-37. It is hoped that district councils will prepare schemes and qualify for grants from this allotment in the current year.

12. Markets.—The total number of public markets and of villages to which sections 26 to 34 of the Local Self-Government Act have been applied was 831. The income from markets was Rs. 3.25 [Rs. 3.36] lakhs. In the Berar districts and in Wardha, Raipur and Bilaspur districts there was a considerable fall in receipts from markets.

13. Legislation.—No legislation was undertaken during the year.

14. Taxation.—The only new tax imposed was an additional cess in the Betul district for meeting the extra expenditure on compulsory education. Cesses were not fully recovered in the Chhindwara district, and the Jubbulpore council made no attempt to collect the arrears of the wheel tax amounting to Rs. 15,000.

15. Staff.—As in previous years certain district councils continue to look upon the expenditure on their staff as the most suitable field for effecting economies regardless of the fact that a well-paid and contented staff is the key to success of local self-government. Having regard to the depleted finances of many councils, Government is ready to consider reasonable and *bona fide* proposals towards retrenchment but it must make it plain that such measures as cuts in salaries and withholding of increments otherwise than for inefficiency should come last in the order of retrenchment and must be clearly demonstrated to be unavoidable. The Jubbulpore, Hoshangabad and Nimar councils continued the emergency cut and the Damoh council has not paid arrears of increments from 1929 to 1934. It is satisfactory that the Chanda council partially restored the cut it had previously imposed.

16. Financial irregularities.—The annual audit disclosed the same defects in accounts which have been repeatedly noticed in previous years. The Wardha council showed some improvement in its accounts, but it has still to dispose of several old audit objections. The accounts of the Raipur council were in a deplorable state and the general purposes grant of the Hoshangabad council had to be withheld until the audit objections were disposed of satisfactorily. Government takes this opportunity to repeat its conviction that no improvements in accounts is likely to be permanent unless the office-bearers themselves exercise stricter supervision and closer control.

17. Village Panchayats.—During the year 34 [24] new panchayats were established and 4 [7] were disestablished for reasons of internal dissensions, apathy of the local people and continued neglect of primary administrative functions. 987 village courts and benches functioned, of which 97 [99] courts and 120 [128] benches exercised enhanced powers. 13 [14] village courts exercised special powers under section 54 (1) of the Village Panchayat Act. 7,393 [7,906] civil suits and 6,798 [7,115] criminal cases were disposed of. On the whole civil and criminal powers were exercised with a due sense of responsibility. The duration of cases is still high and the basic principles of deciding cases by panchayat courts, *viz.*, justice, equity and good conscience, still remain to be imbibed by a fairly large number of panchayats.

The percentage of panchayats levying taxes continues to be the same as last year, *i.e.*, 27, but the number of panchayats doing administrative work has risen by 30 to 630 and has reached the figure of 63 per cent. The useful work done by many panchayats in combating epidemics, and especially cholera, by encouraging people to get themselves inoculated and by free distribution of medicines deserves to be mentioned. Eighteen out of 24 district councils have formed sub-committees for panchayat work and 22 district councils have now their own agencies for the audit of panchayat fund accounts and for inspection and propaganda.

18. General remarks.—There was no occasion for the use by Government of its powers of control. The relations between the district councils and Government officials continued to be

cordial. Government desires to record its appreciation of the work of those office-bearers and members of district councils whose names have been mentioned in the Commissioners' reviews.

ORDER.—Ordered that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance and that the report be translated and copies circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district council and local board members.

ORDERED also that the resolution be published in Part I of the *Central Provinces and Berar Gazette*.
