RESOLUTION.

The reports of the Commissioners on the working of the Local Self-Government Act in the Central Provinces and the Rural Boards Law in Berar were due on the 15th September, but none of them were received in time. The Berar report was more than three months late owing to the fact that the statistical information contained in the district reports was inaccurate and further references had to be made to the district board offices to reconcile discrepancies and supply omissions.

2. *Constitution.*—There was no change in the number of councils or boards or in the sanctioned number of members. According to the recently declared policy, officials are being relieved of their offices under local bodies wherever non-officials can be secured to replace them. The official Chairman of the Seoni district council gave place during the year to a non-official; and the question of replacing the official Secretary of the district council in Damoh and the official Chairmen of the local boards in the Saugor and Damoh districts, by non-officials is under consideration.

3. *Meetings, attendance and elections.*—All district councils and boards held the prescribed number of meetings, but six local boards failed to do so. The average non-official attendance was below 50 per cent in the case of eleven district councils, and in a great majority of local boards. The highest percentage reached was 66 in the case of the Malkapur local board. These figures are not very encouraging, but it is to be hoped that with the introduction of the new Local Self-Government Act, the members will rise to the greater responsibilities devolving on them. The fall in the average attendance of officials in some district councils and local boards is attributed partly to the absence of the official members on tour in connection with famine and scarcity measures and partly to the increased work which the elections for the Reformed Councils and the arrangements for the Census entailed. All the Zamindari boards failed to hold the prescribed number of meetings, and the Northern Zamindari board in Drug did not meet even once. The general elections of some of the district councils and local boards fell due during the year but were postponed owing to the approaching introduction of the new Local Self-Government Act.

4. *General Financial Results.*—Excluding debt heads, the receipts showed a decrease of Rs. 5,48,784, while the expenditure increased by Rs. 7,55,399. The decrease in income occurred in all divisions. Suspensions of land revenue on account of the general failure of crops involved suspension of cesses also, while indirectly also the famine conditions of the year affected the financial position of local bodies unfavourably. The increase in expenditure was mainly due to the increase in the salaries of the clerical and menial staff,—in some cases with retrospective effect—and to the payment of special allowances. There was

a falling off in the receipts under bazar dues owing partly to the bad season and trade depression, and partly to the establishment of private markets by non-co-operators with the object of adversely affecting the financial position of District Councils. Contributions from Government amounted to Rs. 26 lakhs or 51 per cent of the total income of the councils and boards. Of this sum about Rs. 15½ lakhs were allotted for education and Rs. 10½ lakhs for civil works (excluding school buildings). Of the latter, nearly Rs. 7 lakhs was spent on communications and works transferred by Government to district councils for maintenance. The outstanding feature of the year was the very large decrease (Rs. 12 lakhs) in the closing balances of the councils and boards. The tendency for many years past has been for these balances to increase and although in a famine year abnormal liabilities are incurred by local bodies in connection with relief works, the figures indicate that in many district councils a position has been reached in which the normal annual revenue is not sufficient to meet the normal annual expenditure. In the present state of the provincial finances it would be idle for local bodies to expect increased assistance from Government and it is essential, therefore, that before these large balances disappear, each district council should carefully survey the position and so readjust its sources of revenue or reduce its expenditure as to bring about an equilibrium in its finances.

5. *Education.*—The total expenditure on education excluding that on buildings and repairs, which is included in Public Works, rose from Rs. 13 lakhs in the Central Provinces and Rs. 7 lakhs in Berar to Rs. 13½ and Rs. 7½ lakhs respectively. Government contribution amounted to Rs. 11½ lakhs in the Central Provinces and Rs. 3½ lakhs in Berar as against Rs. 11 lakhs and Rs. 2½ lakhs respectively in the previous year. The principal special grants made by Government for education were Rs. 5,85,000 for the maintenance of new primary schools and Rs. 60,000 for pension contributions and for raising the pay of school masters. The number of schools shows no great advance; there was an increase of 29 and 9 in the number of primary and middle schools in Berar, and in the Central Provinces there was a small decrease of 6 and increase of 2, respectively. The percentage of recurring expenditure to the total income remained stationary in the Central Provinces at 39 per cent, while that in Berar decreased from 43 to 42 per cent.

The liberal contributions made from provincial revenues have enabled the councils to effect considerable improvement in the pay of school teachers although the revised scheme recently sanctioned could not be brought fully into force for want of funds. The figures of attendance during the year are distinctly encouraging. It might have been expected that in a year of agricultural distress there would have been a large falling off in attendance while it would not have been surprising if the wave of non-cooperation which swept over the province, also adversely affected the returns. Most districts, however, report a very small diminution in the number of children attending school, while in Berar the number of boys on the rolls has increased from 67,028 in the previous year to 72,432 in the year under review and the average attendance from 72.1 per cent to 83.9 per cent.

The question of the extension of education is mainly a question of funds. It is improbable that the Provincial Government will be able to enhance its educational grants to any great extent in the near future. Section 50 of the new Local Self-Government Act, however, empowers district councils to impose a special school rate and they have thus the power of providing increased educational facilities. In this respect the Amraoti district board have taken the lead by resolving to increase the education cess from 6 to 12 pies in the rupee.

6. *Medical and Sanitary Works.*—District funds subsidised 179 dispensaries against 172 in the previous year. The amount of contributions for maintenance, and for buildings and repairs, increased by Rs. 7,000 and Rs. 6,000, respectively.

There was an increase of about 6 per cent in expenditure under the head "Medical." No change occurred in the number of dispensaries in Berar but in the Central Provinces the number was increased by 7. The financial position of most of the dispensaries is far from satisfactory and some of them

are verging on bankruptcy. The system under which the management is vested in Dispensary committees appears in many respects to have broken down. It is arguable that institutions of this sort ministering to local needs should be under the control of local bodies and supported by them and the question is at present engaging the attention of the local government (Ministry of Public Health). The financial position, already weak, has been aggravated by the failure of the ticket system for the supply of medicine, and it is doubtful whether in the future these institutions will be able to continue to supply medicine free on any large scale. No progress has yet been made with the cheap dispensaries to be tried in Berar but it is hoped that some of these will be constructed in the near future. The opening of two Ayurvedic dispensaries by private agency at Karanja and Murtizapur in the Akola district is an interesting feature and their future will be watched with interest in view of the frequently expressed desire for such dispensaries. Any real advance in the establishment of Ayurvedic dispensaries is, however, dependent on the establishment of an Ayurvedic school of medicine and the regularisation of the qualifications of Ayurvedic practitioners. These questions will be considered by government when the Committee appointed in Madras for the consideration of this subject issues its report.

The expenditure on conservancy was Rs. 18,000, against Rs. 19,000, in the previous year, and most of this was incurred in Berar. A special grant of Rs. 50,000 was as usual sanctioned for the improvement of water-supply in rural areas, but owing to the financial position, the amount actually allotted for the purpose was Rs. 38,500; the expenditure incurred was Rs. 65,177, the excess over the amount actually allotted having been met from the balances of previous year's grant and from the district council contribution. In all Rs. 1,41,302 were spent on the construction and repairs of wells against Rs. 76,000 in the preceding year. A large portion of this was spent in Berar where in consequence of the water-scarcity the expenditure was more than trebled.

7. *Civil Works*.—The expenditure on civil works increased from Rs. 20,83,000 to Rs. 27,03,000. This figure includes Rs. 3½ lakhs expended on school buildings as well as the Government contribution of Rs. 7 lakhs for the maintenance of roads and buildings transferred from the Public Works Department to district councils. In the case of six district councils the proportion of lapses to total allotments was more than 20 per cent, the causes being the insufficiency of the Public Works staff of the councils and the difficulty of finding efficient contractors for the execution of works. The expenditure on communications was 50 per cent of the total expenditure on civil works against 48 per cent in the previous year. The Divisional Local Fund Engineers' Scheme was again reported not to have worked well in most divisions and orders abolishing the scheme have been issued since the close of the year.

The Jubbulpore and Saugor district councils have largely exceeded their allotments. This is due to the fact that, besides working out the year's programme, the councils have been able to complete a number of unfinished works which had been pending completion for the last two or three years and to pay off final bills on that account. Many district councils have failed to utilise their allotments in full. As the Commissioner, Chhattisgarh division, remarks, good progress cannot be secured until the instructions contained in Rule 13 of the District Fund Account Rules in regard to the timely selection of works and preparation of plans and estimates and their execution are followed.

8. *Cattle Pounds*.—The number of pounds rose from 1,584 to 1,634. The income, however, decreased by 7 per cent while the expenditure increased by 25 per cent. The receipts on account of feeding charges of cattle impounded were Rs. 1,82,000 and the expenditure Rs. 1,87,000. Of the latter sum Rs. 86,000 was devoted to the feeding of cattle, while the balance (Rs. 1,01,000) represents the cost of pound servants, and feeding appliances, etc. Last year the corresponding figures were Rs. 67,000 and Rs. 84,000. The increase in the total expenditure from Rs. 3,76,000 to Rs. 4,69,000 is due to the grant of increased rate of pay and allowances to the staff, the creation of new posts and the rise in the cost of fodder. The receipts nearly balance expenditure over the

province as a whole. In the Nerbudda division, however, recoveries on account of feeding charges fall considerably below expenditure on food stuffs and pound servants, and the district councils concerned should enquire into the matter. It is reported from Jubbulpore that non-co-operators made efforts, but unsuccessfully, to establish rival private cattle pounds.

9. *Veterinary*.—All charges on account of veterinary dispensaries, except the pay of Veterinary Assistants, are met from district funds. They amounted to Rs. 76,000 as against Rs. 65,000 in the previous year. The revision of the pay of the establishment is responsible for the increased expenditure. The dispensaries continued to do useful work and are reported to be generally popular. In the Chhattisgarh division where a serious outbreak of rinderpest occurred, a very large number of inoculations was effected. In Berar on the other hand the number of cases treated declined by 33 per cent; this is reported to be due partly to the shortage of water and fodder resulting in owners sending their cattle away to distant places where water was obtainable and partly to the comparative absence of serious cattle disease.

10. *General*.—Rules under the new Central Provinces Local Self-Government Act have been framed and have been published for objections. The Act will be brought into force as soon as the details regarding the constitution of the various councils and boards have been settled. The Government (Ministry of Local Self-Government) hopes that with the introduction of the new Act, local bodies will wield their vastly increased powers to the lasting good of the people.

11. *Notice of Services*.—The relations between district officers and the councils or boards continued to be satisfactory. The thanks of the Government will be conveyed separately to those gentlemen whose good work has been brought to notice in the reports.

ORDER.—Ordered that a copy of this Resolution be submitted to the Government of India in the Department of Education and Health; that copies be forwarded to the Commissioners and Deputy Commissioners for information and guidance; and that it be translated and circulated (through Deputy Commissioners) for the information and guidance of all district council and local board members.

ORDERED, also, that the Resolution be published in the Supplement to the *Central Provinces Gazette*.
