By the revised settlement the total assessment on the Government occupied land in the 5 talukas was raised by Rs. 1,33,221 from Rs. 6,07,118 to Rs. 7,40,339, equal to an increase of 22 per cent. **General.**—In 1903 the State Police numbered 215. The cost of supporting the same was Rs. 20,752 in the same year. The state has only one jail at Bhor. The daily average number of convicts in the jail was 16, and the total cost of the same was Rs. 2,202, in 1902-03. There is a state printing press at Bhor. During the last ten years 49 panthers and 1 hyena have been killed. The state possesses one dispensary with a daily average of 63 patients. The expenditure on the same in 1902-03 was Rs. 2,444.
