

SURAT

Area.—The area of the district has been reduced from 1,669 square miles to 1,651 square miles to accord with the measurement of the Survey carried out in 1897-1904.

Recent Surveys.—The Revision Survey, of which the rates were introduced between 1897-1904, showed an increase in the total culturable area of 33,670 acres. By the revised settlement the total assessment on the Government occupied land was raised by Rs. 88,019 from Rs. 21,67,609 to Rs. 22,55,628, equal to an increase of 4 per cent. Important Public Works.—A new railway connecting the district with the Rajpipla territory at Ankleshwar was constructed by the State of Rajpipla, and completely opened to traffic in 1899. In 1910-1911 there were 70 miles of metallised road and 186 miles of road suitable for fair weather traffic only. The new roads and works importance constructed since 1875 are as follows:—

A New Railway Line has been constructed from Broach to Jambusar by the B. B. and C. I. Railway and opened to traffic in 1914.

Factories.—There are five cotton mills situated at Broach with (1911) an average of 2,541 hands employed daily, 79,928 spindles and 1,039 looms. The paid-up capital of these mills is Rs. 20,75,815.

Famine.—In 1899-1900 the rains failed, and the district was affected throughout by severe famine. The outturn of crops for the year was estimated at 49 per cent. Relief works were opened in September 1899, and were continued till September 1902, the daily average number being 3,826. In 1899-1900, the highest number relieved was 123,247, and in receipt of gratuitous relief, 72,473. The death-rate *per mille* was 134.91. The total deaths from all causes on relief works were 8,181, of which 3,924 were attributed to diarrhoea and 1,802 to cholera. The percentage proportion among the relief workers in the district was 40 males, 45 females and 15 children. In 1900-1901 the area affected was 267 square miles, and the population 43,000, or 15 per cent. of the total. The highest number in receipt of relief was 5,716 in December 1900, and gratuitously relieved 4,013. The death-rate for the year was 64.76 *per mille* in the district. In 1901-1902 the area affected was 706 square miles, and the population 86,000 or 29 per cent. of the total. The total daily average attendance on relief works, which was reduced to 10 in October 1901, again rose to 3,253 in May 1902. The number in receipt of gratuitous relief was a little over 400. The death-rate was 60.45 *per mille*. Since 1901-1902 the district has remained unaffected. (For further details see Table No. XIII.)

Plague.—The first indigenous case of plague occurred in Ankleshwar town in April 1898, and to the end of July only 4 more sporadic cases were registered. It assumed epidemic form in the following August and caused 200 deaths. It then spread to some thirteen villages near Ankleshwar, and reached Broach town in September. The total mortality up to the end of March 1914 in the district amounted to over 11,000 or 4 per cent. of the total population :—
