K A I R A

Area.—The area of the District is raised by 12 square miles after the survey carried out in 1894—1896, i.e., from 1,596 square miles to 1,608, 3 miles owing to the transfer of the village of Baroda from Dholka Taluka in Ahmedabad District to Matar Taluka of Kaira District under Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5745—22 and the rest owing to survey corrections. The taluka variations are :—

Recent Surveys.—The Revision Survey, of which the rates were introduced between 1894—95, showed a decrease in the total cultivable area of 835 acres. By the Revised Settlement the total assessment on the Government occupied land was raised by Rs. 2,30,286—from Rs. 13,42,847 to Rs. 15,73,133—an increase of 17 per cent. The second revision settlement which was introduced in Matar and Mehmedabad Talukas in 1918-19 showed a decrease in the total cultivable area of 434 acres. By the second revision settlement in these Talukas, the total assessment on the occupied land was reduced by Rs. 2,03,942, from Rs. 8,72,037 to Rs. 6,68,095—a decrease of 23.4 per cent. The Talukawar figures are :—

Important Public Works.—In 1891 a branch line was opened from Anand to Petlad in Baroda Territory and thence to Cambay Town, thus bringing the district into close connection with the sea. The Cambay Darbar has extended the Cambay Tarapur Railway further from the town for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles towards the Bunder. The Cambay Railway line was commenced in 1899 and completed in 1901. Funds for this line were provided by the Baroda and the Cambay States. A new Railway branch on the metre gauge system, commenced in 1911, has lately been opened for traffic from Nadiad to Kapadvanj. Funds for this line were provided by the Guzerat Railways Co., Ltd.

In 1921-22, after the provincialization of some local board roads in 1920, there were 23 miles of metalled road under the control of the District Local Board and 168 in the hands of the Provincial Administration. The new roads and works of importance constructed since 1875 are as follows :—

Factories.—There are two cotton spinning and weaving mills situated at Nadiad with an average of 1,736 hands (1923) employed daily. There are 37,320 spindles and 682 looms in the mills.

Famine.—There was scarcity in 1911-12 and 1918-19 in the District. But experience in these famines shows that since the great famine of 1900 the sustaining power of the ryots has increased and realizing that every third or fourth year is likely to be a bad year, the people have learnt to lay by something in good seasons for the bad. These conclusions find support in the fact that no famine works were required in 1911-12, and in 1918-19, the maximum number of workers was only 2,129 during the month of May. The maximum number of persons who received gratuitous relief was 11,963, i.e., 1-6 per cent. of the population in 1911-12 (in the month of June) and 13,130, i.e., 1-8 per cent. in 1918-19 (in the month of May).

Plague.—The Kaira District escaped indigenous plague up to the end of September 1898, although not less than 105 imported cases occurred prior to that date. Umreth was the first to succumb. The disease was confined at first to the Golas. It subsequently spread to a number of villages, as far as Dakor. Anand was next slightly affected. Thasra taluka subsequently suffered more severely than Anand. In 1906-07 the district suffered very severely, especially in Nadiad, Borsad and

Anand Talukas. The total mortality from plague to the end of 1910-11 was 72,245 or 10 per cent. of the population of the district. The following statement shows the total mortality from plague since 1896-97 :—

Important Public Works.—Road from Godhra to Pali was a fair weather one and during the last famine in 1911-12 earth work in 12 miles was done and the project for metalling it is under consideration. The Shivrampur Light Railway has been turned into a narrow gauge line by the Gujarat Railway Company and extended from Bamankuva to Pani in Chota Udepur State. The same Railway Company has constructed the Railway from Godhra to Lunawada a distance of 25 miles of which 14 miles run in the Panch Mahals District and the remaining in the Lunawada State limits.
