Area.—The area of the district has been reduced from 3,576 Square miles to 3,434 square miles owing to the creation of the Bombay suburban District out of the Thana District in 1920.

Famine.—There has been no famine. But in 1918-19 scarcity was felt, the rainfall being insufficient and the crops completely failing. Relief works were opened in April and closed in June. 61,581 units of labourers were engaged on relief-works.

Plague.—The first indigenous case occurred early in December 1896, though imported plague was detected as early as the first week of October of that year. Bandra was the first to suffer; and the disease spread to Bhiwandi, Kurla, Bassein, Bhayandar, Thana, etc., in rapid succession. By degrees the whole district became affected. The following figures show the total mortality from plague since 1911-12:—

Agriculture and Land Revenue.—The term of the settlement which expired in 1911-12 was extended from time to time to the end of the year 1918-19. The Revision Survey Work of the State was completed in 1920-21.

Of the total area of 198,120 acres, 49,031 are under forest and 29,801 are unarable. The extent of the cultivable land in the State is 119,288 acres; while the waste land amounted to 7,589 acres or about 6.03 per cent. of the cultivable land in 1921-22. The number of occupancies is 3,141. 7,589 acres remained fallow and the net area cultivated was 111,699 acres during the year 1921-22. Details are:—

Famine and Plague.—In the year 1918-19 the rainfall at Jawhar was deficient and capricious. The crops were damaged wholesale with the single exception of Tur, Varai and Nagli. The rainfall during other years was on the whole good. The State has so far been free from plague.

General.—There is no military force in the State. The Police number 70 are maintained at an annual cost of Rs. 12,514. There is one jail at Jawhar with a daily average of 15 prisoners, maintained at a cost of Rs. 2,943 per annum. The State has two dispensaries, one at Jawhar and the other at Kudan with a daily average attendance of 20 patients with an annual cost of Rs. 5,427.

Opium is imported from the nearest British Depôt at Nasik. The right of cultivating opium is ceded to the British Government and the State receives 20 per cent. of the pass-fee on opium purchased by it. The Abkari revenue and management was farmed out to British Government in 1880 for an annual amount of Rs. 32,000. The farm was renewed in 1904-05 and its term extended to 31st July 1914. The present lease has been renewed in 1914 for a further period of 10 years ending 31st July 1924 for an annual amount of Rs. 47,400. The Bhang-Ganja revenue and management were ceded to the British Government for Rs. 506-4-0 annually for a term of five years which ended on 31st March 1911. The term was renewed twice for two periods of five years first ending on 31st March 1916 and the second on 31st March 1921. The term has been again renewed for two years ending on 31st March 1923 for an annual amount of Rs. 663. The right of manufacturing and selling salt within the jurisdiction of the State has been permanently extinguished on accepting from the British Government the offer of Rs. 15,000 as compensation.
