KANARA

Area.—The area of the district has increased from 3,910 (1881-82) to 3,946 square miles mainly to accord with the measurement of the survey carried out since 1875. Some internal changes took place in the district between 1891 and 1922. The taluka variations are:—

The following are the territorial changes that took place between 1891 and 1922 (the year in which this volume was revised).

An area of 196 square miles was transferred from Sirsi to Yellapur and Siddapur talukas.

An area of 4·9 square miles was transferred from Mundgod petha to Yellapur taluka in 1914.

An area of 20·3 square miles was transferred from Ankola taluka to Sirsi taluka in 1915.

An area of 83·2 square miles was transferred from Supa petha to Haliyal taluka in 1916.

Recent Settlements.—A revision settlement was introduced in the talukas of Ankola, Kumta and Honawar including Bhatkal petha in 1914-15 and took effect from 1915-16. The total cultivable area of the district is 377,629 acres and the assessment on the Government occupied land is Rs. 10,19,381.

The rates now in force and other details of assessments, dates, etc., are given in Table XV.

Important Public Works.—The Southern Maratha Railway, which was opened for traffic in 1886, crosses the northwest angle of the district, two stations, Tinnai Ghat and Castle-Rock, being in the Supa petha. In 1920-21 there were 404 miles, 7 furlongs, 605 feet of metalled road and 775 miles, 521 feet of unmetalled road suitable for fair weather traffic only.
