Area.—The area of the district has been reduced from 5,879 square miles (1910-11) to 5,877 square miles owing to the transfer of a village Wadi Salher to the Baroda State.

No change in areas in the remaining 7 talukas.

The transfer of two villages from Chandor to Nandgaon and one from Niphad to Sinnar talukas accounts for the decrease of 15 and 4 miles respectively in the areas of Chandor and Niphad talukas and for the corresponding increase in that of Nandgaon and Sinnar talukas.

Important Public Works.—In 1899-1900 a railway was opened from Manmad on the G. I. P. Railway running to Hyderabad (Deccan). It only traverses a few miles of the Nandgaon Taluka and the north of the Yeola Taluka. Along the five miles of road between Nasik City and Nasik Station a small tramway constructed in 1891 maintains communication. Trams have been driven by petrol motor since 1917.

Tongas and motors are also available. There is a Government High School. The length of Provincial and Local Board roads is as under :—

Plague.—The district was affected to a small extent between 1914-15 to 1917-18. Since then it has almost disappeared.

In 1918 there was a very severe epidemic of influenza throughout the district, which took a toll of 85,279 lives.

The Acetone factory at Nasik Road has now been transferred to the Government Central Distillery.

Recent Surveys.—The revision and the second revision surveys of which the rates were introduced between 1899* and 1921 showed an increase of 57,394 acres in the total culturable area in the 12 talukas of the district. The total culturable area of the district ascertained at the revision and second revision surveys was 2,147,555 acres and assessment Rs. 17,75,884. By the revised settlement the total assessment on Government occupied land in the 12 talukas was raised by Rs. 3,74,406 from Rs. 14,01,478 to Rs. 17,75,884 an increase of 26 per cent.

Area and Population.—Surgana, which was transferred from Khandesh to Nasik in 1890, has an area of 360 square miles. It contains 61 villages with 3,165 occupied houses and the population shown below :—

Density of the population in 1921 was 41 persons per square mile. The population consists chiefly of Konkani Kunbis and Kolis. The principal caste in the state is the Kunbi (6,095).

Land Revenue and Agriculture.—Out of 61 villages in the State, 45 are Khalsa and 15 alienated. The State forest is one of the chief sources of revenue. The forest revenue amounted to Rs. 10,766 in the year 1921-22. The rainfall for ten years ending 1920-21 was ;—

General.—The state contains one primary school maintained at an annual cost of Rs. 386 in 1920-21, the number of boys on the roll being 24.

There is one dispensary in charge of a Sub-Assistant Surgeon appointed by the State. The State enjoyed freedom from plague.

Liquor is sold more cheaply in the State than in British territory, and so an arrangement has been made with the Deshmukh that no liquor should be sold within 3 miles of the border of British territories. The State imports opium from the Huzur Treasury, Nasik, and salt from Surat district.
