

## FOREWORD.

Quite a number of changes have taken place in the various rules and byelaws of this Municipality since the last edition was published in October 1935. Correction slips had to be pasted on almost every page, which made the book very inconvenient to Besides, the absence of a stray slip was sure to lead to handle. an incorrect interpretation of a rule, perhaps to the detriment of the Municipality. The election rules, the rules relating to the conduct of business at Municipal meetings, the rules relating to Executive Committees, the byelaws relating to Dangerous and Offensive trades etc. have been thoroughly overhauled, during the last 7 years. Rules such as rules regulating the conduct and discipline of Municipal servants, advances to contractors, working of Municipal Record Office, stamp fees and byelaws for the construction and maintenance of water closets etc. are altogether new. They were sanctioned by Government from time to time and had to be incorporated in the old edition. A number of changes have taken place in the rules and byelaws relating to octroi which is the main source of income of this Municipality The old Octroi Schedule has been completely revised and brought into force with effect from 1.2-1944.

The present edition is brought out only with a view to supply the long felt want of an up-to-date copy of the Municipal rules and byelaws. Most of the old rules and byelaws framed under the provisions of the District Municipal Act still unfortunately find a place in the edition. But it could not be helped.

Most of them are unsuited to the present conditions and steps will have to be taken to delete them with Government sanction. In fact, it is necessary to overhaul the whole set of rules and byelaws. This work will be taken in hand as soon as possible but it is a very laborious task and will take some years before the whole statutory process is gone through and Government sanction obtained. We could not defer publication of the muchneeded edition till this ideal set of rules and byelaws was ready. Better is the enemy of good, they say, and we decided to do this good work of bringing out an up-to-date edition of the present rules and byelaws and let the better edition take its own time The rules and byelaws have been presented in a different order from the one followed in the last edition, and we hope, the new arrangement will be appreciated.

#### APPENDIX B.

#### (Vide Rule 8D)

### Labelling of Articles of Food containing Preservatives.

1. The articles of food containing preservatives to which the rules as to labelling set out in this Schedule apply are sausages, sausage-ment, coffee extract, pickles and sauces, and (where the proportion of benzoic acid exceeds 600 parts per million) grape juice and wine.

2. (1) Where any of the said articles of food contains preservatives it shall bear a label on which is printed the following declaration :--

## (a) CONTAIN (S). PRESERVATIVE.

(2) The declaration shall be completed by inserting at (a) the word "This" or "These" followed by the name of the food as used in paragraph 1 of this Appendix.

(3) In the case of grape juice or wine to which these rules apply there shall be added to the declaration the words "and is not intended for use as a beverage."

3. The prescribed declaration shall be printed in dark block type upon a light coloured ground within a surrounding line and no other matter shall be printed within such surrounding line. The type used shall be not less than one-eighth of an inch in height, or in the case of grape juice or wine to which these rules apply, one-sixteenth of an inch in height.

4. The label shall be securely affixed to the article or be part of or securely affixed to the wrapper or container, and in any case shall be so placed as to be clearly visible. If the article bears a label containing the name, trade mark, or design representing the brand of the article or the name and address of the manufacturer or dealer the prescribed declaration shall be printed as part of such label.

5. No comment on or explanation of the prescribed declaration (other than any direction as to use in the case of a preservative) shall be placed on the label or on the wrapper or container.

ing on the wholesale business of sale or supply of ghee being the room or shop or place measuring square feet, being part of the premises No- subject to the restrictions and conditions following, that is to say:—

1. (a) The licence shall not keep ghee or permit to be kept, outside the said premises or on the public road or street.

(b) This licence is valid only for the premises above specifed, that is for the number of rooms, godowns, or space mentioned herein, and if the licensee at any time during the period of this licence desires to use any additional room or godown or space within the said premises for keeping ghee, he must obtain previous sanction from the Local Authority for doing so.

(c) If the licensee vacates or gives up the possession of the said premises during the period of this licence, he shall forth with inform in writing the Licensing Officer that he is about to do so.

2. The licensee shall cause the premises to be thoroughly cleansed and lime washed at least twice a year during the months of January and July.

3. The licensee shall not use or permit to be used any portion of the premises for dwelling or cooking purposes.

4. (a) No oil, margarine, vegetable product, paraffin, fat, vasa or charbi or other substance capable of being used for the adulteration of ghee shall be kept on the premises.

† Is preferable to the financial year. -

(b) No essences or colouring matter likely to give resemblance to ghee shall be kept on the premises.

(c) The premises shall not form part of or communicate otherwise than by a public street with any other premises upon which is kept any of substances that are named in condition No. 4(a).

(d) The licensee and his servents shall at the request of any Inspector duly authorised by the Local Authority under the said Act, who tenders the price for the quantity required as a sample for analysis sell to the Inspector the said quantity of any ghee, butter or substance mentioned in clause 4 (a) that may be on the premises to, a part of which this licence relates and shall when called upon to do so take a sample from any package the Inspector may select whether the package be sealed or open.

5. The licensee shall keep and maintain a statement as required by section 17D of the said Act in the form prescribed in rule 12 and shall keep it at all times open for inspection of the officer authorised.

6. The licensee shall at all times adopt and cause to be maintained in good order and efficient action, upon the said premises all such appliances or means as the Local Authority may from time to time require for the purpose of minimising danger to life and property or preventing, abating or minimising any nuisance, annoyance or inconvenience to the neighbourhood or to the public from the use to which the premises are put.

7. The licensee shall provide on the premises and maintain in good repair and use a metal sanitary dust bin of approved pattern and size for the deposit of all trade refuse and sweepings and make proper arrangements for the disposal of its contents daily.

S. The licensee shall, at all times during the continuance of this licence, be responsible for the fulfilment and observance of all the foregoing conditions and in case of any infringement of or negligence or failure on the part of the licensee will be liable to prosecution and to suspension or revocation of this licence.

9. This licence will also be liable to suspension or revocation if the premises are so kept or the trade or any operation connected with it is so carried on as to be, in the opinion of the Local Authority, a source of nuisance or danger to life, health or property.

## Licence for using permises for carring on the manufacture or preparation for the purpose of trade of Ghee,

PURSUNT to the provisions of section 17 A of the Bombay Prevention of Adulteration Act, 1925, Mr.\_\_\_\_\_\_is hereby licensed for the period of one year, namely from  $\ddagger \frac{194}{1 \text{ st April}}$ to 31st April 194 to use a place for the manufacturing, packing to . 194 pressing, cleaning, melting or preparing ghee by any process whatever upon\_\_\_\_\_being part of the permises No. measuring in area square feet, subject to the restrictions and conditions following:-

1. No portion of the said permises and no room situate over that partion of the said permises shall be used for human habitation at night.

2. All butter brought to the permises for being manufactured into ghee shall until actually required for such manufacture be stored in a room separate from the room or rooms in which the processes of manafacturing, packing, pressing, cleaning or preparation are carried on. Such separate storage room shall be airy and well ventilated, and shall be entirely disconnected from any drain and no privy water closet shall be allowed to ventilate into it.

- 3. The floor of such separate storage room must be paved with impervious material to the satisfaction of the Local Authority.

No butter must be stored in passages, back yards or 4. spaces under stair-cases or close to a privy or water closet.

5. All stored butter must be kept in properly covered metal or glass or glazed ware receptacles.

I is preferable to the financial year.

6. The processes of melting must be carried out in a properly constructed fire-place provided with a suitable flue.

7. The ladles used for skimming the refuse matter from the surface of the melted butter must at all times be kept in a clean state and must not be placed on the floor but on a suitable shelf or table provided for the purpose in close proximity to the fire-place and such shelf table must be maintained in a clean condition.

8. The conditions which apply to the storage of butter shall also apply to the storage of prepared ghee which may be kept in the separate storage room aforesaid.

9. All coal, coke or firewood or liquid fuel to be used in the process of melting butter shall be kept in suitable receptacles and not loose.

10. This licence is valid only for the premises for which it has been granted, that is, for the number of rooms, godowns or space or quantity mentioned herein, and if the licensee at any time during the period of this licence desires to use a larger space within the said premises he must obtain previous sanction from the Local Authority for doing so.

11. (a) No oil, margarine, vegetable product, paraffin, fat, vasa or charbi or other substance capable of being used for the adulteration of ghee shall be kept on the premises.

(b) No essences or colouring matters likely to give re semblance to ghee shall be kept on the premises.

(c) The premises shall not form part of or communicate otherwise than by a public street with any other premises upon which is kept any of the articles or substances that are named in condition No. 11 (a).

(d) The licensee and his servants shall on the request of any Inspector duly authorised by the Local Authority under the said Act, who tenders the price for the quantity required as a sample for analysis, sell to the Inspector the said quantity of any ghee, butter or any substance mentioned in condition No. 11 (a) that may be on the premises to a part of which this licence ralates and shall when called upon to do so take a sample from any package the Inspector may select, whether the package be sealed or open.

12. The licensee shall keep and maintain a statement as required by section 17 D of the said Act in the form prescribed in Rule 12 and shall keep it at all times open for inspection of the officer authorised. 13. The licensee shall at all times adopt and sause to be maintained in good order and efficient action, upon the said premises all such appliances or means as the Local Authority may from time to time require for the purpose of minimising danger to life or property or for preventing, abating, or minimising any nuisance, annoyance or inconvenience of the neighbourhood or to the public from the use to which the premises are put.

14. The trade shall not be carried on either before 6 A. M. (S. T.) or after 8 P. M. (S. T.)

15. The licencee shall provide on the primises and main tain in good repair and use a metal sanitary dust bin of approved pattern and size for the deposit of all trade refuse and sweepings and make proper arrangements for the disposal of its contents daily.

16. The licensee shall, at all times during the continuance of this license, be reponsible for the fulfilment and observance of all the foregoing conditions, and in case of any infringement of or neglect or failure on the part of the licensee will be liable to prosecution and to suspension or revocation of this licence

17. This licence will also be liable to suspension or revocation if the premises are so kept or the trade or any operation connected with it is so carried on as to be, in the opinion of the Local Authority, a source of nuisance or danger to life, health or property.

18. The licensee shall cause this licence to be affixed to some conspicuous part of the premises to which it relates.

19. The fee chargeable for this licence is Rs. 10 only.

20. If the licensee vacates or gives up possession of the said premises during the period of this licence, he shall forthwith inform in writing the Authorised Officer that he is about to do so.

21. This licence is non-transferable either as regards the person to whom or the premises in respect of which it is granted.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 17 A of the Bombay Prevention of Adulteration Act, 1925, Mr. is hereby licensed for the period of one year from § 194 to 194 to 31st March 194 to use a place for carrying on the wholesale business of sale or purchase or supply of butter the room or shop or place measuring square feet, being part of the premises No.

subject to the restrictions and conditions following, that is to say:-

1. (a) No oil, margarine, vegetable product, paraffin, fat, vasa or charbi or other substance capable of being used for the adulteration of butter shall be kept on the premises.

(b) No essences or colouring matters likely to give resemblance to butter shall be kept on the premises

(c) The premises shall not form part of or communicate otherwise than by a public street or road with any other premises upon which is kept any of the articles or substances that are named in condition No. 1 (a).

(d) The licensee and his servants shall at the request of any Inspector duly authorised by the Local Authority under the said Act, who tenders the price for the quantity required as a sample for analysis, sell to the Inspector the said quantity of any butter, or substance mentioned in condition No 1 (a) that may be on the premises to a part of which this licence relates and shall when called upon to do so, take a sample from any package the Inspector may select, whether the package be sealed or open.

2. The licensee shall not keep, handle or sell any butter under any condition which renders the said butter liable to contamination.

3. All stored butter must be kept in properly covered metal or glass or glazed ware receptacles.

4. No butter shall be stored in passages, back yards or spaces under stair-cases or close to any privy or water-closet.

5. The licence is valid only for the said premises and if the licensee at any time during the period of this licence desires to use any additional room or shop or any additional space within the said premises for keeping butter, he must obtain previous sanction of the Local Authority for doing so.

6. The licensee shall keep and maintain a statement as required by section 17 D of the said Act in the form prescribed in Rule 12 and shall keep at all times open for inspection of the officer authorised.

7. The licensee shall provide on the premises and maintain in good repair and use a metal sanitary dust bin of approved pattern and size for the deposit of all trade refuse and sweepings and make proper arrangements for the disposal of its contents daily.

8. The licensee shall at times during the continuance of this licence, be responsible for the fulfilment and observance of all the foregoing conditions, and in case of any infringement of or neglect or failure on the part of the licensee will be liable to prosecution and to suspension or revocation of this licence

9. This licence will also be liable to suspension or revocation if the premises are so kept or the trade or any operations connected with it is so carried on as to be, in the opinion of the Local Authority, a source of nuisance or danger to life, health or property.

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 17 A of the Bombay Prevention of Adulteration Act, 1925, Mr.

is hereby licensed for the period of one year, from  $\frac{5 194 to 194}{15t April 194 to 31st March 194}$  to use a place for carrying on the wholesale business of sale or purchase or supply of margarine the room or shop or place measuring square feet, being part of the premises No. subject to the restrictions and conditions following that is to say:—

1. (a) No oil, vegetable product, paraffin, fat, vasa or charbi or other substance capable of being used for the adulteration of margarine shall be kept on the premises.

(b) Margarine kept on the premises shall be conspicuously labelled or durably marked as provided for in the rules under the Act.

(c) The premises shall not form part of or communicate otherwise than by a public street with any other premises upon which is kept any of the articles or substances that are named in condition No. 1 (a).

(d) If the licensee vacates or gives up the possession of the said premises during the period of this licence, he shall forthwith inform in writing the Licensing Officer that he is about to do so.

2. #### G. R., G. D. No. S. 91 (64) dated 21-11-1942.

#### By-Laws

1. Granting of license on payment of fees.—The owner or manager of every hotel, restaurant, tea-shop or eating house, etc. shall obtain an annual license from the municipality which shall be granted subject to the conditions stated in these by-laws on payment (strictly in advance) of such fees as may be prescribed by the Municipality by rules under section 58 (j) read with section 90 of the Act.

Livense may be refused—Provided that with the previous approval of the Standing Committee (or Sanitary Committee as the case may be) the Chief Officer shall have the discretion to refuse a license at any site, which, on account of over-congestion or insanitary surroundings, is unfit for such class of trade or business.

Provided also that the Chief Officer shall have power to refuse to grant or to renew a license to an applicant who is in arrears of hotel tax. 2. License is revocable if the business turns out to be a nuisance. A license issued under by-law 1 shall also be liable to suspension or revocation, if the premises are so kept, or the trade, or any operation connected with it, is so carried on as to be, in the opinion of the Chief Officer, a source of nuisance, or danger to life, health or property.

3. Renewal of license—Except in the case of hotels, restaurants, tea shops, etc. which are to be closed after the expiry of the period of the license so granted it shall be renewed at the beginning of every official year on payment of the renewal fee of rupee one.

4. When to apply for a license—Every owner or manager of every existing hotel, eating house, etc., shall within one month after the date from which these by-laws by a public notification declared to have come into force, apply to the Chief Officer for a license.

5. Fine on failure to obtain or renew a license—Failure to apply for a license as required by these by-laws or to renew it at the beginning of every official year shall be punishable with a fine extending to Rs. 25/-

6. License is for specified premises.—A license issued under by-law 1 is vaild only for the premises specified in the license, and if the licensee desires to carry on such trade or any operation connected therewith, in an additional room, shop, or space he shall apply for a fresh license, which if granted, be subject to the payment of an extra fee of Re. 1/-

7. Change of premises to be reported.—Every person to whom a license is issued under by-law 1, and who vacates or gives up possession of the premises during the period of the license, shall forthwith inform the Chief Cflicer of the same.

S. License not transferable.—A license, issued under by-law 1 is, without the written permission of the Chief Officer, not transferable, either as regards the person to whom or the premises for which it is granted.

9. License to be hung up.—Every person to whom a license is granted under by-law 1, shall cause such license to be affixed in some conspicuous part of the licensed premises.

10. Liability of the licensee for servants' neglect or misconduct.—Every person to whom a license is granted under bylaw 1 shall, at all times during the continuance of the license, be responsible for the due fulfilment and observance, of all the

conditions of the license and in case of infringement of or neglect or failure on the part of the licensee or of any other person employed, or having any interest in the business, to fulfil or observe any of the said conditions, the licensee shall be liable to prosecution and be punished with fine which my extend to Rs. 25 (twenty five) and to suspension or revocation of the license

11 None of these by-laws shall be applicable to shops dealing in Soda, Lemon or other aerated waters which do not provide sitting accommodation for consumption of such drinks.

#### Rule

The Chief Officer shall issue annual licenses for hotels or renew them on payment of a fee of rupees two per license which shall be in addition to the hotel tax levied by the Municipalty. The fees shall be paid in advance at the municipal office and no claim for remission or refund shall be allowed on the ground that no use was made of the privilege covered by the license. The license shall be issued subject to the by-laws made in this behalf.

Rules regarding the Distraint and Sale of Moveable property of the Defaulter.

1. Notice of sale to be affixed :—A copy of the proclamation and notice of sale shall be affixed on the notice board of the Municipality and on the outer door or some conspicuous part of the place from which the property was seized and distrained at least 7 days prior to the date on which the auction sale is to be held.

2. The officer is authorized to conclude the sale or postpone it at his discretion.

3. The party who is declared to be the purchaser shall be required to pay the whole purchase money on the spot to the officer conducting the sale; in default, the property shall forthwith again be put up for auction and sale.

4. The property will be handed over to the declared purchaser immediately on payment of purchase money and on obtaining his receipt.

Rules for the Attachment and Sale of Immoveable property.

1. Proclamation of sale :--When any immoveable property has been attached under sub-section (4) of section 105 of the Act, the Chief officer shall cause a Porclamation of the intended sale of such property to be made in Marathi specifying the time and place of the sale together with any other particulars that may be deemed necessary. Such proclamation shall be made in the manner prescribed in sub-clause (ii) of clause (d) of sub-section (4) of section 105 of the Act and if the Chief Officer so directs, shall sloo be published in a local newspaper.

2. Sales by whom to be held :--Sales shall be held by the Vasuli Superintendent or the Chief Officer.

3. Sale to be stayed if payment made before the time of sale :--If at any time before the time fixed for sale the defaulter or any other person on his behalf pays into the Municipal Office or to the Officer appointed to conduct the sale, the dues of the Municipality for the recovery of which the property is proposed to be sold together with all costs incidental to the notice, warrant attachment and detention of the property and the publication of the proclamtion, the sale shall be stayed.

4. Postponement of sale to enable defaulter to raise money by mortgage, lease etc.—If before the sale has been made the defaulter satisfies the Chief Officer that there is reason to believe that the amount due to the Mnnicipality can be raised by the mortgage lease or private sale of the property attached or some other part thereof, or of any other immoveable property of the defaulter, the Chief Officer may, on the application made by the, defaulter, postpone the sale of the attached property on such terms and for such period as he thinks proper, to enable the defaulter to raise the money.

5. Postponement for any other reason—The Chief Officer may also from time to time postpone the sale for any other sufficient reason which he shall record in writing. 6. Sale to be by public auction :---The sale shall be by public auction to be held by an officer authorised in that behalf by the Chief Officer.

7. Municipal servants prohibited from bidding :- No Municipal servant shall directly or indirectly bid for, acquire or attempt to acquire any interest in the property proclaimed for sale.

8. Time for sale:—No sale shall take place on a Sunday or any other recognised holiday, nor until after the expiration of at least 30 days from the latest date on which a copy of the proclamation shall have been affixed under rule No 1.

9. Co-sharer's bid preferred:—When the property put up for sale is a share of undivided immoveable property and two or more persons of whom one is the co-sharer bids the same sum for it, the bid shall be deemed to be the bid of the co-sharer.

10. Purchaser to deposit 25 per cent of the bid :—At all such sales the person who is declared to be the purchaser shall be required to deposit immediately 25 per cent of the amount of the bid and in default of such deposit, the property shall forthwith be again put up for sale.

11. When the full amount is to be paid:—The full amount of the purchase money shall be paid by the purchaser before sunset on the seventh day from that on which the sale of immoveable property took place or if the said seventh day be a Sunday or other recognised holiday, before the sunset of the first working day after such seventh day.

12. Defaulting purchaser forfeits deposit:-If the purchaser makes default in paying the full amount of the purchase money within the prescribed period, his deposit shall, after the expenses of the sale have been defrayed therefrom, be forfeited to the Municipality and the property shall be resold. The defaulting purchaser shall forfeit all claims to the property or to any part of the amount realised on resale.

13. When fresh proclamation necessary in cases of postponel sales and resales:—Every postponed sale of immoveable property and every resale of it on the purchaser's default in payment of the full amount of the purchase money shall, except when such resale takes place within 14 days from the date of the first sale, be made after the issue of a fresh proclamation in the manner prescribed for original sales.

14. Liability of defaulting purchaser for loss on sale :---If the proceeds of the sale which is eventually held be less than the price paid by the defaulting purchaser, the difference together with all costs, the expenses incurred on such resale, shall be

recoverable by the Municipality from such defaulter as arrears of Municipal taxes.

15. Setting aside the sale :- The Chief Officer may set aside the sale-

(1) On an application made within 30 days from the date of the sale by a person interested in the property sold, to have the sale set aside on the ground of some material irregularity or mistake or fraud in the publication or conduct of the sale, or on the ground that the defaulter had no saleable interest in the said property, or

(2) Of his own accord for reasons to be recorded by him in writing, whether or not an application has been made to him under (1) above;

Provided that no sale shall be set aside on the ground of irregularity or mistake, unless it is proved to the satisfaction of the Chief Officer that the applicant has sustained substantial injury by reason thereof.

16. On setting aside sale purchase money shall be refunded:-When a sale is set aside, the deposit or purchase money, as the case may be, shall be refunded to the purchaser.

17. Confirmation of sale:—If the Chief Officer sees no valid ground for setting aside the sale, he shall make an order confirming the sale on the expiration of 30 days from the date of sale or as soon thereafter as the inquiry necessitated by an application of the nature referred to in rule No. 15 is completed.

18. Purchaser to be entered in the Municipal records as owner and granted a certificate:—When the sale of immoveable property is confirmed by the Chief Officer, the name of the purchaser shall be entered in the Municipal records as the owner in lieu of the defaulter, and he shall be granted a certificate declaring him to be the purchaser of the property in question. Such purchaser shall be entitled to the possession of the property.

19. Disposal of proceeds:—When a sale has been confirmed, the proceeds of the sale shall be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (2) and (3) of section 106 of the Act.

20. Forms of proclamation and certificate :-- The proclamation and certificate referred to in rules 1 and 18 respectively shall be in such forms as may from time to time be approved by the Standing Committee.
