Report on the Working of Hospitals and Dispensaries in the State during the Calendar Year 1922.

Reviews the—

READ—

The report on the working of Hospitals and Dispensaries in the State for the calendar year 1922 received from the Senior Surgeon in Mysore with his letter No. Pl. 32-7-89, dated the 24th—30th July 1923.

Recorded.

2. There was a delay of three months in the submission of the report. Such delays should be avoided in future.

3. Dr. H. B. Mylvaganam, F. R. C. S. (Eng), was in charge of the Department throughout the year except in the month of May when he went on a month's privilege leave and Mr. B. Mahomed Usman, L. M. & S., acted as the Senior Surgeon from the 6th to the 31st May 1922.

4. The total number of medical institutions working at the close of the year was 195 as against 196 in the previous year. Two new Local Fund Dispensaries were opened at Bedaguli and Arakere in the Mysore District. The Malnad Improvement Dispensary at Attigundi in the Chikmagalur Taluk and the Female Dispensaries at Tirthahalli and Kallurkatte in the Shimoga District, also maintained from the Malnad Improvement Fund were closed, temporarily.

5. The total number of patients treated in the State Public, Local Fund, Municipal and Private Aided Institutions was 1,876,373 against 1,924,946 in the previous year, of whom 21,110 were in-patients. These figures show a decrease of 48,573 in the case of out-patients and an increase of 304 under in-patients. Of the in-patients treated 12,462 were cured, 4,383 relieved, 2,165 discharged otherwise and 1,209 died. The percentage of deaths to total admissions was 5.68 against 5.91 in the previous year. The number of out-patients treated during the year was 1,855,263 against 1,904,140 in 1921. The largest number of out-patients treated was under "Malaria" viz., 317,918, the next largest number being 225,962 under all other diseases of the digestive system.

The number of patients on whom surgical operations were performed was 36,985 against 22,841 in 1921. The number of important surgical operations performed in the Victoria Hospital, Bangalore, and the Krishnarajendra Hospital, Mysore, was 297 and 430 as against 204 and 310 respectively in the previous year. In the Minto Ophthalmic Hospital, Bangalore, the number of operations performed was 1,177 as against 1,258 in the previous year.

The number of cases treated in the Dental Department of the Victoria Hospital was 1,794 against 2,029 in 1921. The Department was placed in charge of a wholetime officer from 23rd November 1922.

6. The number of midwives that were working during the year was 156, the same as in the previous year, and the average number of cases attended to by each midwife was 72 against 65 during last year.

7. *Maternities*.—The total number of out-door patients treated in the Maternity Hospitals at Bangalore, Mysore and Robertsonpet was 12,831, 10,886 and 14,841, the number of in-patients being 1,207, 882, and 841, respectively. The total number of midwifery pupils undergoing training was 72, of whom 34 passed out during the year.

8. *Minto Ophthalmic Hospital, Bangalore*.—The number of in-patients and out-patients treated was 2,109 and 16,629, as against 1,880 and 18,463 respectively in 1921.

9. *Lepor Asylum*.—The number of patients treated in the institution was 90 against 95 in the previous year. Of these 63 were discharged otherwise, 2 died and 25 remained in the Asylum at the close of the year.

Intravenous injections of Sodim Hydro Cardate solution having been found to be ineffectual, Ethyl Esters of Hydrocorpus Wightiana Oil with Creasale and Camphor, Dr Muirs, latest treatment for Leprosy, is now being administered and the results are being watched.

10. *Lunatic Asylum*—The number of lunatics treated in the Asylum during the year was 305 as against 312 in 1921. Of these, 79 were cured, 32 discharged otherwise and 23 died, leaving 171 under treatment at the close of the year. Of the 305 treated, 77 were from the Civil and Military Station, Bangalore. The expenditure of the Asylum was Rs. 60,849 as against Rs. 60,756 in 1921.

11. *Medical Stores*.—The total sum spent on the purchases made by the Stores was Rs. 1,22,811 against Rs. 2,08,099 in 1921. The supplies made to other departments amounted to Rs. 18,136 against Rs. 7,961 in 1921, of which a sum of Rs. 11,188 was adjusted during the year. Steps should be taken to adjust the balance very early.

12. *Epidemic Diseases Hospitals*.—The total number of patients admitted into the Epidemic Diseases Hospitals at Bangalore, Mysore and the Kolar Gold Fields was 1,323; of these, 787 were cured, 167 discharged and 301 died.

13. *Unani Davakhanas and Vaidyasalas*.—The total number of patients treated in the several Ayurvedic and Unani Medical Institutions in the State during the year was 484,718 against 427,938 in the previous year.

14. *General*.—All the Medical Institutions with the exception of 12 were inspected by the District Medical officers concerned. The Senior Surgeon himself inspected 111 Hospitals and Dispensaries. Steps should be taken to have all the institutions inspected at least once a year. The administration of the Department during the year was satisfactory.

**REPORT ON THE WORKING OF HOSPITALS AND DISPENSARIES
IN THE STATE FOR THE YEAR 1922.**

STATEMENT A.

There were 196 institutions working at the close of the year 1921. During the year, under report, two new dispensaries were opened, *viz.*, one at Bedagully, Chamrajnagar Taluk, and the other at Arakere, Seringapatam Taluk, in the Mysore District. The Malnad Improvement Fund Dispensaries at Attigundi in the Kadur District and the Female Dispensaries at Thirthahalli and Kallurkatte in Shimoga District, also maintained from the Malnad Improvement Funds, were closed during the year as a temporary measure, on account of want of qualified hands. Thus there were 195 institutions open on the last day of the year.

STATEMENT B.

The total number of patients treated in the State Public (Class I), Local and Municipal (Class III) and Private aided (Class IV) institutions was 18,76,373 against 19,24,946 in the previous year, showing a decrease of 48,573 or 2.52 per cent.

The number of in-patients treated in institutions of Class I, Class III and Class IV respectively was 15,348, 1,554 and 4,208 making a total of 21,110 against 15,391, 1,584 and 3,831 or a total of 20,806 in 1921.

Of the 21,110 in-patients treated, 12,462 were cured, 4,383 relieved, 2,615 discharged otherwise, and 1,209 died, the percentage of deaths to total admissions being 5.68 against 5.91 in the previous year.

The daily average of in-door patients was 372.18 men, 311.72 women and 105.56 children or a total of 789.46 against 375.78 men, 307.83 women and 89.97 children or a total of 773.58 during the year 1921. The total number of out-patients treated during the year under report was 18,55,263 of whom 4,16,002 were treated in the State Public Institutions, 13,63,509 in the Local Fund Municipal Dispensaries and 75,752 in Aided Institutions under private management, the corresponding figures for the previous year being 19,04,140, 4,27,402, 14,02,539 and 74,199.

The daily average of out-patients was 4,317.42 men, 2,420.03 women and 3,740.69 children or a total of 10,478.14 against 4,523.92 men 2,421.67 women and 3,592.23 children or a total of 10,537.84 in the year 1921.

STATEMENT C—II.

The largest number of out-patients treated, *viz.*, 3,17,918 came, as usual, under "Malaria." Arranged in the order of greatest prevalence, the other diseases were, all other diseases of the digestive system 2,25,962, diseases of the eye 1,82,610, all diseases of the respiratory system except pneumonia and tubercle of the lungs 1,72,336, other diseases of the skin 1,54,699, ulcer 1,02,112, injuries 98,043, pyrexia of uncertain origin 71,460, diseases of the ear 58,506, dyspepsia 63,501, rheumatic fever and rheumatism 48,461, diseases of the nervous system 38,930, diseases of the connective tissue 35,067, dysentery 32,523, and all other general diseases 27,673.

STATEMENT D—I AND II.

The total number of in-door patients treated in the Jail Hospitals and in the Institutions maintained by the Public Works and Military Departments during the year was 1,320 with 23 deaths against 961 and 22 respectively in the previous year.

The total number of out-door patients treated in the Jail Hospitals and in the Institutions maintained by the Public Works and Military Department was 75,905 against 80,368 in 1921. The Railway Dispensaries afforded medical relief to 29,137 patients against 26,766 in the previous year.

The number of operations performed in all these institutions was 1,542 all on out-door patients, 366 out of them having been performed in the Railway Dispensaries, the corresponding figures for the previous year being 1,553 and 267.

STATEMENT E.

The total number of patients treated (in-door and out-door) and the number of operations performed in the Private Non-aided Medical Institutions in the State during the year were, respectively, 47,475 and 3,209 against 41,224 and 2,255 in the year 1921.

STATEMENT F.

Of the 18,76,373 patients treated, 15,288 were Europeans and Eurasians, 13,87,882 Hindus, 3,85,839 Mahomedans and 87,364 belonged to other classes as compared with 13,602 Europeans and Eurasians, 14,45,670 Hindus, 39,987 Mahomedans and 65,817 others in the previous year. Grouped under sexes, 8,21,566 were men, 4,01,148 women and 6,53,659 children against 8,40,445 men, 4,03,693 women and 6,80,508 children in the previous year.

Including the 116 cases that remained at the close of the previous year, the number of surgical cases that were under treatment during the year was 37,101. Of these 35,446 were cured, 1,405 were relieved, 86 were discharged otherwise and 139 died, leaving 25 under treatment at the close of the year. Of the 36,985 operations performed during the year 11,751 were done in the Bangalore District, 6,744 in the Mysore District, 5,487 in the Kolar District (including Kolar Gold Fields), 3,654 in the Shimoga District, 2,628 in the Tumkur District, 2,312 in the Kadur District, 2,487 in the Hassan District and 1,922 in the Chitaldrug District.

STATEMENT H.

The total income of Hospitals and dispensaries from all sources was Rs. 10,09,050 against Rs. 10,09,573 in 1921. Of this, the grant from State Funds was Rs. 7,97,801; the District and Municipal Funds contributed Rs. 1,85,400 and miscellaneous receipts amounted to Rs. 20,449, the last item consisting chiefly of the fees collected from patients liable to pay for treatment in the Institutions in the cities of Bangalore and Mysore.

STATEMENT G.

The total number of patients on whom surgical operations were performed in the State Public and Municipal and Local Fund and Private Aided Medical Institutions was 36,985 against 33,841 in the previous year and the number of operations performed was 37,201 as against 34,279 in the previous year.

MIDWIVES.

The number of Midwives working in the State during the year under report was 156, the same as in the previous year and the number of cases they attended was 11,211 against 10,243 in the previous year, giving an average of 72 cases per Midwife per annum against 65 cases in the year 1921.

Of the 11,211 cases attended, 9,354 were natural, 769 tedious, 211 laborious, 464 complex, and 413 abortions, against 7,960 natural, 1,025 tedious, 196 laborious, 687 complex and 375 abortions in 1921. The number of deaths was 50 against 58 in the previous year. Of the 11,296 children born, 10,204 were born alive, 315 were premature and 777 still-born against 9,064, 332, 933 out of a total of 10,329 in the previous year.

Arranged according to classes, there were born 10 Europeans, 37 Eurasians, 2,625 Mahamedans, 8,279 Hindus and 345 others against two Europeans, 13 Eurasians, 2,647 Mahamedans, 7,351, Hindus and 316 others in 1921. Arranged according to sexes, there were 5,893 male and 5,235 female children, the sex in 168 cases being undetermined owing to early abortion.

There were 85 twins. The subjoined table shows the work done by Midwives in each District.

INDIGENOUS MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS.

The total number of patients treated in the several Ayurvedic and Unani Medical Institutions in the State during the year was 4,84,718 against 4,27,938 in the previous year.

VICTORIA HOSPITAL, BANGALORE.

The number of in-patients treated in this Hospital during the year was 3,637 against 3,441 in 1921 and their daily average was 142.32 against 155.70. The number of deaths was 271 or 7.45 per cent of admissions against 244 or 7.03 per cent, in the previous year. The number of out-patients was 48,992 with a daily average of 333.80 against 41,872 and 278.16 respectively in 1921. Out of the 297 operations 278 or about 97 per cent, were successful, 513 cases were treated and 51 radiographs taken in X-Ray Department against 454 and 40 respectively in the previous year. The number of cases treated in the Dental Department was 1,794, Mr. S. Subba Rao, B. A., M. B. C. M. (Madras) L. R. C. P. (London) M. R. C. S (Eng.) remained in charge of the institution throughout the year.

KRISHNARAJENDRA HOSPITAL, MYSORE.

The number of in-patients treated (including these treated in Ophthalmic Department of the Hospital) was 2,227 against 28·25 in the previous year and their daily average was 152·77 against 159·30. The number of deaths was 137 or 6·10 per cent, of the total admissions against 153 or 5·42 per cent in the previous year; the number of out-patients treated and their daily average were 50,930 and 411·65 respectively, the corresponding figures for the previous year being 56,754 and 44·48. The number of cases treated and that of radiographs taken in the X-Ray Department of the Hospital were 86 and 28 against 96 and 27, respectively in 1921. The Ophthalmic Department of the Institution afforded treatment to 277 in-patients and 6,727 out-patients. The more important operations performed and the names of the surgeon who performed them are given in the following table.—

THE MINTO OPHTHALMIC HOSPITAL, BANGALORE.

The number of in-patients treated in this institution during the year under report was 2,109 against 1,180 in the previous year, showing an increase of 229. Of the number treated 1,127 were cured, 820 were relieved, 69 were discharged otherwise, and 93 failed against 1122, 487, 219 and 52 respectively in 1912. The daily average of in-patients was 87.54 against 88.95. The total number of out-patients and their daily average were 16,629 and 167.12 against 18,463 and 190.04 in the previous year. MATERNITY HOSPITAL, BANGALORE.

The number of in-patients treated during the year was 1,207 of which 930 were labour cases and the rest were cases of various diseases peculiar to women, against 1,237 and 786 respectively in the year previous. The daily average of in-patients was 26.83 against 29.04 in 1921.

The number of deaths was 35 or 2.89 per cent of the admissions against 42 or 3.39 per cent in the year previous. The total number of out-patients treated was 12,831 against 15,376 in 1921, their daily average being 91.57 against 98.71.

There were 19 pupil midwives under training at the beginning of the year and 15 fresh pupils were admitted during the year making a total of 34. Of these, 19 passed out, and 15 remained under training at the close of the year.

VANI VILAS HOSPITAL, MYSORE.

Eight hundred and eighty-two in-door and 10,886 out-door patients received treatment in this institution during the year against 797 and 13,420 respectively in 1921. Of the inpatients treated 652 were labour cases against 694 in 1921. The daily average of in and out-door patients respectively was 27.11 and 87.76 against 30.47 and 113.47 in 1921. There were 20 deaths among the in-patients giving a percentage of 2.27 to the total number of admissions against 31 and 3.17 in the previous year.

The number of deaths was 9 giving a percentage of 1.07 of the total admissions against 17 and 2.17 per cent in 1921. The daily average of in-door and out-door patients was 16.46 and 79.05 against 18.20 and 102.35 respectively in the year previous.

There were 11 pupil Midwives under training at the beginning of the year and 6 fresh pupils were admitted during the year, making a total of 17. Of these 8 passed out, 1 left, 1 absconded and 7 remained under training at the close of the year.

EPIDEMIC DISEASES HOSPITAL K. G. F.

This institution is under the management of the Sanitary Board, Kolar Gold Fields, and it afforded medical aid in 192 cases, of which 169 were cured and 15 died giving a percentage of 7.81 of deaths.

THE LEPER ASYLUM, BANGALORE.

There were 29 inmates (16 males and 13 females) at the beginning of the year under report and 61 (52 males, 7 females and 2 boys) were admitted during the year, thus making a total of 90 (68 males, 20 females and 2 boys) against 95 (77 males and 18 females) during the previous year.

Of the above 63 were discharged otherwise and 2 died leaving 25 (13 males, 11 females and 1 boy) at the close of the year.

The daily average strength of the Asylum during the year was 25.43 against 25.08 in the previous year.

The percentage of total mortality to the number admitted was 2.39 against 11.08 in 1921.

Intravenous injections of Sodium Hydro carpate solution were tried in 25 selected cases and no encouraging results were obtained, (E. C. C. O.) Ethyl Esters of Hydrocarpus Wightiana oil with creasale and camphor Dr. Muirs latest treatment for Leprosy, is now being administered. In only one case an anaesthetic patch of the size of four anna bit reduced itself to the size of a pea. Further progress in this treatment is being watched.

The total cost of up-keep of the Asylum during the year under report amounted to Rs. 7,559-4-5, against 8,067-7-0 in the previous year.

LEPERS OF THE CIVIL AND MILITARY STATION, BANGALORE.

At the beginning of the year, there were 8 (4 males 3 females and 1 boy) and 37 (36 males and 1 female) were admitted during the year, thus making a total of 45 (40 males 4 females and 1 boy). Of the above 45 lepers, 35 were discharged during the year leaving 10 at its close.

The cost of maintenance claimed from the Civil and Military Station authorities during the year was 2,924-6-0, against 1,786-9-7 in the previous year.

The average cost per head per diem was 0-11-2 against 0-12-2 in the preceding year.

MEDICAL STORES, BANGALORE.

Mr. G. S. David, Surgeon, was in charge of the Medical Stores, throughout the year.

Two hundred and six annual indents and 1,102 extra indents were supplied during the year against 170 and 1,027 respectively in the previous year. As there was a large stock of Europe Medicines on hand towards the close of the previous year it was considered not necessary to draw up the Foreign Indent in March, as usual. On account of the receipt of a large number of annual and extra indents, the stock ran out earlier than was expected and forecast was prepared during the second half of the year, and comparative statement of the quotations received from Foreign and Indian Firms was submitted to Government who were pleased to order the acceptance of the tender of the Boots Pure Drug Co., Nottingham, in Government Order No. L. 4357-8 Med. 71-22-2, dated 15th December 1922. Pending the receipt of supplies from England, purchases had to be made from firms in India to meet the demands of institutions and such purchases were subsequently reported to Government and were accorded special sanction. Country medicines were as usual, purchased from the local contractors appointed by Government.

The bills paid during the year amounted to Rs. 1,22,811 against Rs. 2,08,099 in the previous year. Of the bills paid Rs. 1,00,136 represent the value of Europe Medicines and instruments, Rs. 9,158 that of country medicines and Rs. 13,517 of stationery and other articles purchased from the grants under local Fund Dispensaries.

The supplies made on credit to other departments, etc., amounted to Rs. 18,136 against Rs. 7,961 in the previous year and the amount adjusted was Rs. 11,188 against Rs. 9,118. Steps have been taken for the early adjustment of the outstanding bills.

The interest evinced by the Superintendent in closely watching the drug market and taking timely action for replacing drugs which went up in value by equally efficacious but cheaper ones, and otherwise securing to Government a reduction in the

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE LUNATIC ASYLUM, BANGALORE,
FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 1922.

This institution was in direct charge of Mr. G. S. David L. M. & S., till 9th August 1922, on which date he was relieved by Mr. F. Noronha, M. B. C. M., D. Psy. MED., who had returned from England after obtaining the diploma in Psychological Medicine.

STATEMENT I.

Deals with the population of the Asylum and with the disposal thereof during the period under report, with corresponding figures for the previous ten years.

The year opened with 168 inmates under treatment and with 137 admissions (including 2 re-admitted) the total number treated during the year was 305. Of these, 111 were discharged (79 cured, 32 otherwise and 23 died) leaving 171 under treatment at the close of the year. The corresponding figures of the previous year were 176 old cases, 136 admissions (312 total cases) 103 discharged (69 cured, 36 otherwise) 3 escapes and 38 deaths with 168 remaining at the close of the year. The daily average strength was 196.58 against 187.00 in 1921. The percentage of recoveries and deaths to daily average strength was 40.19 and 11.69 against 35.82 and 20.32 in the previous year. Compared with the admissions, the recoveries and deaths amounted to 57.36 per cent and 16.79 per cent, respectively, against 49.26 and 27.94 per cent in the previous year.

Of the 137 admissions the duration of insanity prior to admission was ascertained in 94 cases: of these, 32 were reported to have been insane for less than three months, 31 between three and six months, 15 between six and twelve months and 16 over one year.

Of the 79 recoveries, duration of the disease was known in 45 cases, 25 being within three months, 6 between three and six months, 7 between six and twelve months, and 7 upwards of a year.

STATEMENT—I-A.

Shows the number of cases admitted for observation and their disposal. At the beginning of the year there were 13 remaining and 102 were admitted making a total of 115; of these 75 were certified to be insane and admitted regularly; 12 were removed by Magistrates before being reported, 19 were discharged as sane and 1 died, leaving 8 at the close of the year.

Their daily average strength was 13.41 against 12.98 in the previous year.

Combining I and I-A, there were in all 239 admissions (including 2 re-admissions), 152 discharges and 24 deaths, against 222 (including 2 re-admissions), 125 and 40 respectively, in the previous year and the daily average strength was 209.99 against 199.98 in 1921.

STATEMENT—II

Deals with the statistics of the criminal lunatics. The number that remained at the close of the year was 22 males and during the year under report 4 males were admitted making a total of 26 males. There were 8 discharges and no deaths, against 8 and 5 respectively, in the previous year, leaving 18 males at the close of the year.

Their daily average was 16.43 against 24.33 in the previous year.

Of the 4 admissions all were under trails classified according to following offences:—

- One was charged under Section 380, I. P. C.
- One was charged under Section 448, I. P. C.
- One was charged under Sections 452, and 506, I. P. C.
- One was charged under Section 302, I. P. C.

Of the 18 criminals that remained at the close of the year, 16 were under trials, and 2 convicts.

STATEMENT III.

Shows the sex, residence and religion of those admitted during the year under report.

Of the 137 admissions, 99 or 73.26 per cent were males and 38 or 27.74 per cent, were females. Eighty-seven belonged to the Mysore State, 25 to the Civil and Military Station, Bangalore, 12 to other British Indian Provinces, 4 to other Indian States. The residence of 9 could not be ascertained. Of the 87 Mysoreans, 49 came from Bangalore District, 14 from Mysore, 11 from Kolar, 1 from Shimoga, 5 from Tumkur, 1 from Chitaldrug, 2 from Hassan and 4 from Kadur. The Hindus who numbered 105 or 76.64 per cent formed as usual the majority, Christians formed 22 or 16.06 per cent, while Mahomedans numbered 10 or 7.3 per cent.

STATEMENT IV.

Shows the occupation of the patients admitted during the year.

Of the 137 admissions, 115 had some occupation or other, 16 had no occupation whatever, while in the case of 6, occupation could not be ascertained.

STATEMENT V.

Shows the ages of patients admitted during the year.

As usual the largest number 92 or 67.15 per cent were between twenty and forty years of age, 19 or 13.96 per cent between forty and sixty years of age, 6 or 4.39 per cent over sixty years of age.

STATEMENT VI.

Shows the different types of insanity present in the patients admitted.

Five were of different maniacal forms of insanity; 14 came under delusional insanity, 12 were suffering from dementia, 10 were suffering melancholia, 10 from insanity of haschisch, 9 from insanity due to other causes, 8 from post-febrile insanity, 6 from idiocy, 4 from alcoholic insanity, 1 from mental stupor, 1 from myxoedema, while 3 yet to be diagnosed and 1 from general paralysis of the insane.

Of the 171 that remained at the close of the year, 8 came under Idiocy, 61 under mania of all forms, 14 under melancholia of all forms, 1 under circular insanity, 2 under mental stupor, 25 under delusional insanity, 2 under post febrile insanity, 8 under haschisch, 6 under other causes, 2 under confusional insanity, 36 under demential of all forms, 3 under moral insanity, 1 under alcoholic, 1 under Myxædema and 1 under N. Y. D.

STATEMENT VII.

Shows the Aetiological factors and associated conditions in the patients admitted during the year.

Among the 137 admissions, both predisposing and exciting causes were known in 67 cases, predisposing alone in 34 cases exciting alone in 14 cases, and in 22 cases no cause was known. Among the chief predisposing causes, previous attack contributed 25, congenital mental defect, 14 and moral deficiency 11.

Among the chief exciting causes, ganja smoking 15, alcohol 8 and fever 6.

STATEMENT VIII.

Shows the details of expenditure which came to Rs. 60,849-13-7 against Rs. 60,756-5-2 in the previous year.

STATEMENT IX.

Shows the scale of establishment on the 31st December 1922 which was the same as that of the previous year.

STATEMENT X.

Shows the expenditure and receipts under "Manufacture" and "Gardening." The daily average number of inmates employed on remunerative labour was 12.01 (on weaving 6.06 and on gardening 5.05), out of the daily average strength of 196.58. Such of the others as were able to do light work were employed in helping in the kitchen, laundry and in keeping the premises clean.

The expenditure under "Manufacture" of cloth came to Rs. 1,191-1-5; under gardening Rs. 323-3-8 and in all to Rs. 1,514-5-1. The receipts under the heads are

Rs. 1,357-6-3 and Rs. 451-12-4 respectively, in all Rs. 1,809-2-9, showing a net profit of Rs. 294-13-8 against Rs. 344-1-0 in the previous year.

SANITATION OF THE ASYLUM AND THE HEALTH OF THE INMATES.

The maximum number of lunatics confined on any one night was (140 males and 60 females). The capacity of the cells and enclosures remained the same as in the previous year, *i.e.*, 450 c.ft. per head.

The usual colour and whitewashing and sundry repairs during the year were done by the Public Works Department. The accommodation was enough for the male and female inmates but it was not of the right sort.

The number of inmates treated during the year for physical diseases was 75 giving a daily average of 5.98 against 7.29 in the previous year.

Only four *post mortem* examinations of patients were held during the year, as most of the bodies were handed over to the relatives whose sentiment had to be respected.

Private patients.—At the beginning of the year there were 6 (4 males and 2 females) and 19 (14 males and 5 females) were admitted during the year, making a total of 25 (18 males and 7 females). Of these, 9 (6 males and 3 females) were discharged leaving 16 (12 males and 4 females) at the close of the year. A sum of Rs. 3,934-7-9 was recovered from their relatives and Rs. 2,307-8-5 was remitted to the Treasury, deducting the wages, etc., paid to the respective private servants, a balance of Rs. 102-0-0 was remaining on hand at the close of the year.

THE LUNATICS OF THE CIVIL AND MILITARY STATION, BANGALORE.

At the beginning of the year there were 42 (21 males and 21 females) and 35 (22 males and 13 females) were admitted during the year, making a total of 77 (43 males and 34 females); of these, 26 (16 males and 10 females) were discharged during the year and 3 (2 males and 1 female) died, leaving 48 (25 males and 23 females) at the close of the year.

The cost of their maintenance came to Rs. 12,368-15-6 against Rs. 11,552-15-9 of the previous year.

Inspections.—The official visitors of the Mysore State and those of the Civil and Military Station, Bangalore, visited 12 times during the year. The Senior Surgeon visited the Institution twice.

Periodical treats and entertainments were given as usual on festive days; fruits and sweets were distributed occasionally. Betel leaves, snuff and tobacco were daily distributed among those accustomed to use them and every attempt was made to keep the inmates happy. A football was purchased out of the donation given by a visitor and is used by the juvenile patient every morning. Kannada and English newspapers and pamphlets are distributed every morning to those that are able and willing to read. The Century Club have generously offered a gift of three packets of playing cards every month; for the use of the patients.

Changes in the staff.—Mr. S. M. Powar, II Class Sub-Assistant Surgeon, was posted in the place of Mr. V. Govindarajulu Naidu. Matron Mrs. M. Louis who was on temporary transfer to Kolar Gold Fields, was relieved by Nurse Florina Prasad of the Epidemic Disease Hospital, who worked as Acting Matron from 21st August 1922 to 25th December 1922. The work turned out by the staff was quite satisfactory.

GENERAL REMARKS.

The treatment of insanity has undergone a revolution during the last quarter of a century and every institution for the insane is now conducted on the lines of a first-rate Modern Hospital and what were known as "Lunatic Asylums" in days gone by are now rightly designated "Mental Hospitals." Unless this institution is brought up to date in construction, equipment, and personal, the benefit to the community under the existing conditions may be said to be infinitesimal.
