The Consultation & Diary Book of Edward Harrison Esq^r. President and Govern^r. &c^a. Council their proceedings and transactions in the affairs of the R^t. Hon^{ble}. United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies in the Presidency of the Coast of Chormandel &c^a. begun the 3^d. of January 17¹⁴/₁₅.

Edward Harrison Esq^r. President his Acco^t. of the R^t. Hon^{ble} : Comp^{as} : Cash read, ballance remaining pag^s : Sixty seven thous^d. One hundred twenty four, four fanams and five Cash. Cash Acco^t. for Deor. read.

Pasqual Diego &c^t. fishing ffarmers being indebted on the Books 350 pag^s : for that farm are call'd upon for the mony & declaring that they paid One hundred pagodas to John Mason late Secretary according to Custom on that account Anno 1712—Which upon examination the Board finds has not been paid into Cash. fishr. Farmers debt on the Genl. Books demanded, 100 pag^s. of wch. they pretend to have paid the late Secory.

ORDER'D that the Accomptant do examin strictly into this affair & report the truth thereof to the Board. the Accompt. to examin into the affr.

Mess^{rs}. Hastings and Warre deliver in their Report of the Houses & Gardens mention'd in Serrapas Mortgage bond Which are claim'd by other persons, the said Report is enter'd after this Consultation, and upon debating the several Articles thereof it is RESOLV'D as follows. Messrs. Hastings & Warre deliver in their Report of Serrapas Houses & Gardens.

TO THE FIRST ARTICLE.

THAT the House belongs to Serrapa it having been legally sold by order of the Mayors Court and purchas'd by him as appears by the Bill of Sale.

TO THE 2^d. ARTICLE.

THAT if the Original Assignment is produc'd & found to be dated before the Mortgage the House therein mention'd belongs to Narso, otherwise it is Serrapas, & if it is Narsos he is also indebted to the Hon^{ble}. Company on account of the Tobacco farm, wherefore the said House must be sold with the Rest.

— FORT ST. GEORGE, JANUARY 1714-15 —

TO THE THIRD ARTICLE.

THAT the Bill of Sale for the house therein mention'd Remaining in Serrapas hands unindors'd & none of the Witnesses mention'd (except Timmapa) having testified anything to the purpose, only that Ram Chitty did dwell in that house, it is AGREED to belong to Serrapau.

TO THE FOURTH ARTICLE.

THAT one of the Houses & Gardens therein mention'd to stand in Trevlicane value about eighty pagodas does fairly belong to Bompolo & his Mother Modanah.

TO THE FIFTH ARTICLE.

THAT SERRAPAU not having paid for the House therein mention'd when He bought it at publick Sale for which reason the Court of Admiralty judg'd it a void bargain, & the lawfull Owner Veronahs Widow having afterwards satisfied the debt for which the House was order'd to be sold, the title thereof fairly rests in her, & Serrapau has knavishly Mortgag'd what was none of his own.

AGREED that publick Notice be given for selling those Houses & Gardens that appear to be Serrapas at the Sea Gate on the 10th. instant except his dwelling house & one small Garden as mention'd in Consultation of the 18th. Ult^o. & that this Board will secure the title to all Purchasers.

AGREED further that the grounds commonly call'd the Paddy feilds mention'd in Consultation of the 3^d. Ult^o: be let out to the fairest bidder at the same time.

A debate arising whither Serrapa ought not to pay interest for this debt, & the Mortgage bond being examin'd it appears to have been only given for the Principal Sum without any interest mention'd, some part of which has been paid in at times as he was able, though not mention'd as it ought to have been in Consultation, & in further consideration that he is the oldest inhabitant upon the place, that he was the Company head Merchant many years & has very little left to Subsist on

ORDER'D that two thousand Pagodas be advanc'd the Paymaster to defray Charges Garrison.

Mathew Welds case taken into Consideration & fully debated, the heads of the Charge against him are as follow

FIRST.

THAT He stood indebted large sums as Paymaster and Storekeeper which were not discharg'd according to the Orders of the Board.

SECONDLY.

THAT when Paymaster he bought Timber & Plank at low prices, & charg'd them to the Comp^{ys}. Acco^t. at a considerable advance.

THIRDLY.

THAT when Sea Customer he gave M^r. Raworth sevⁿ. Certificates for goods custom paid, which goods were sent up hither with the said Certificates, which appear upon the foil at the Sea Gate, accordingly they were excus'd the Custom here, but it was never paid by M^r. Raworth at Fort St. David.

FOURTHLY.

THAT He is still indebted about three hundred pagodas on account of Timber & Plank paid for with the Comp^{ys}. mony but not forthcoming.

— FORT ST. GEORGE, JANUARY 1714-15 —

TO THE FIRST ARTICLE, it appears by a General Lett^r. from ffort S^t. David dated the 23^d. June 1713 Paragraph N^o. 5 Where they write us the Dep^{ty}. Gov^r : promises, M^r. Mathew Weld shall not be indebted more to the Comp^a. on the ballance of his Acc^o. than what He shall be able to pay in, Again in their General Letter dated the 26th. July following, they inclose us Mathew Welds Acco^t. Curr^t. by which they tell us we may perceive what ballance is due from him which as there stated is pagodas 237 : 28^{ta}. & 1^{ca}. & the Dep^{ty}. Govern^r. acknowledges to have rec^d. the Remainder into Cash being pagodas 1703— :—though he has never given the Hon^{ble} : Company credit for it in his Cash Acco^t.

AGREED that it is the opinion of this Board that no payment to a Govern^r., Dep^{ty}. Govern^r., or Cheif singly is a legal payment to the Company, the establish'd Rule being to pay all sums into Consultation, however the Council having sign'd the Letter Which agrees to the Account Currant wherein the Dep^{ty} : Govern^r. credits Mathew Weld by so much mony received of him, this case is so very particular, that it is AGREED to referr it home to our HON^{BLE}. MASTERS.

TO THE SECOND ARTICLE.

M^r. Weld makes appear that He had a parcel of Timber & Plank by him of his own, out of which all the best were cull'd for the Comp^{as}. use, which was the reason that a higher value was put upon them than what they cost one with another, the remainder being so bad that He has them still upon his hands, however as it is but too likely that great abuses may be introduc'd this way

AGREED that for the future no Timber or Plank, or other Stores be bought in at ffort S^t. David but by the Storekeep^r : Who shall first acquaint the Board with the prices & quality for their approval, & afterwards issue them to the Paymaster as there is occasion to use them.

TO THE THIRD ARTICLE OF SEA CUSTOMS.

M^r. Weld pleads that Certificates were never denied upon the exportation of goods, the EXPORTER having first AGREED to the Customs, & promis'd payment, that he thought himself very Secure in the word & honour of his Govern^r., & could never have imagin'd, but that he would have paid him the mony, & therefore He humbly hopes he shall not be oblig'd to make it good.

AGREED that this Article having something very particular in it, be likewise referr'd home in the next General Letter.

TO THE 4TH : ARTICLE.

M^r. Weld acknowledges the debt and promises speedy payment of the mony.

Upon the whole matter considering the ballance of his old Account pagodas 1910 : 28^{ta} : 1^{ca} : is now made good.

AGREED that his Suspension be taken off upon his making good the payment aforesaid for Timber & Plank wanting & that he do continue in his employ till the Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. further pleasure is known, whither they will accept of his former payment to M^r. Raworth, & excuse him on account of the Sea Customs.

Pursuant to an order of Consultation dated the 3^d. of December, We have survey'd the several Houses & Gardens that were mortgag'd by Checaw Serrapau to the R^T. Hon^{BLE}. Company Some of which are laid claim to by other proprietors, & having heard their several pretentions thereto, We do now lay before your Hon^R. & C^T. the examinations thereon.

1st One House mention'd in the Mortgage to be stand^R. in the Pedda Naigues Petta, & valued at Pag^a. 100. is laid claim to by one Gruapa who alledges the said house was given him by his Mother & Brother w^{ch}. Serrapa denies, & produces a Bill of Sale, by which it appears he bought the said House at Publick Outcry in June 1700, w^{ch}. was then Sold by order of the Mayors Court for satisfaction of a Mortgage that the Church Wardens, & Ministers of this place had thereon.

2^d One House mention'd in the Mortgage to be standing in the Moors Muskeet Street, & valued at 150 pagodas, is laid claim to by one Narso, formerly one of the Tobacco & Beetle ffarmers here, who alledges the said House was given him by Serrapau, & produces the Original Bill of Sale to said Serrapa, as also the copy of a Cadjan Wherein Serrapa acknowledges to have assign'd over unto him by deed of gift the said House dated in August 1703, the Original Cadjan Narso says is in possession of his Conicoply who at present is up in the Country. Serrapa acknowledges to have given the House to Narso but declares it was since the same was mortgaged to the Company, but it appears to us by copy of the aforesaid assignment to be given before the date of the said Mortgage.

3^d One house mention'd in the Mortgage to be standing to the Westward of Narrans and valued at pag^a. 200. Is laid claim to by Quondam Ram Chittee, who produces as Witness Viz^t.

Timmamah, Nairo Veronah, & Verapah, the first of these three declares He was present when Beetle was given to the Complainer by Serrapahs order, & He was wish'd Joy of his House as accustomary on such occasions.

NAIRO VERONAH declares He knows nothing of the matter.

VERAPAH denies to have seen any mony paid for the said House as alledg'd by Ram Chittee.

SERRAPAH produces a Bill of Sale for this House & acknowledges to have permitted the said Ram Chittee, who was formerly his Servant to live therein for several years in consideration only of keeping it in Repair, & paying the Hon^{BLE}. Comp^{AS}. Quit Rents, but denies ever to have sold or given away the said House.

4 Two Houses mention'd in the Mortgage to be standing in Trevlicane & valued at 100 pagodas.

TWO GARDENS mention'd in the Mortgage to be standing in Trevlicane & valued at pag^a. 150.

ONE of the said Houses & one of the Gardens are laid claim to by Bompolo in the behalf of himself & his Mother Modana, & Serrapah acknowledges that He has neither Mortgage or Bill of Sale to produce, but has only a Letter from one Ankona, Bro^R. to the said Bompolo who being indebted to him desires he will take the said House & Garden in part of payment, which was the Reason He Mortgag'd it to the Hon^{BLE}. Company. Narran being ask'd what He knew of this affair, declares the same to belong to the foresaid Modana, which is all except the Charity of her freinds She has to subsist on, & the value of the said House & Garden is about eighty Pagodas.

5 ONE House mention'd in the Mortgage once Veronahs Widows & valued at 700 Pagodas, is laid claim to by the Widow of Bangore Veronah, Serrapah being ask'd what title he had to the said House aledg'd he bought the Same at Outcry, which upon enquiry we found to be true as appears by the Register of the Admiralty Court, but

the said Serrapah not paying for the said house, the sale was declar'd Void, & the Bill of Sale drawn out for that purpose, Ord^d. to be cancell'd. Serrapah insists that the Estate of Veronah is several thousand pagodas indebted to him & was the Reason He did not pay the said money into Court, which is what We have to offer on this occasion & are.

Having often promis'd in our General Lett^s. from Vizagapatam to contrive all ways and means proper to reduce the Charges of that Settlement, & thereby make the Investments in those parts more advantageous for our R^t. Hon^{ble}. Masters I presume to present the following reasons for the non performance of that Acceptable Service before resigning my Cheifship, with respect to the bad Condition of the Factory, the Nature of the Government, & the goods provided there, & to the first can assure your Hon^r. & C^a. that the Factory repairs for these five years past have daily encreas'd under an absolute necessity to prevent its falling down, the Walls being supported with Buttresses, and the lodgings so decay'd that it is not safe living in them, as appears by the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. Servants being oblig'd to dwell in out Houses.

As to the Government after our troubles with Fuckerle Cawn were over, & just before the arrival of Gov^r. Harrison We reasonably hop'd for a less charge in Soldiers & Peons wages but found the succeeding Nabob Habid Cawn so farr from protect^t. & favouring our trade, that we were daily persecuted with unjust and unreasonable demands, so that the pleasing work of returning to Fort St. George some of our Soldiers & discharging peons was stop'd to defend ourselves & our Investment at Ingerum, which was in danger of being ruin'd had not that Rajah Countenanc'd & encourag'd the trade which his good Character & plentiful Country for Cloth Manufactures invited us to, and the Success with good management would have answer'd the undertaking, but the Rajah was oblig'd to have his people in arms against the Nabob, whose rapacious hands were seizing all that fell in his way till the News of a Setled Government at the Moguls Court & fear of being accountable to a Superiour power in those parts, made him in May 1713 prepare for his escape, & appoint for his Deputy or Phousdar one Hodge Hussein whose favour & freindship We had often experienc'd so farr as to venture again upon the Ingerum trade & accordingly sent two of our Merchants with M^r. Faucet to make an Investment of 20000 pag^s. which succeeded from June the 20th. to January the 27th. without any material Impediment, when M^r. Faucet having advanc'd to the Merchants more mony than our orders would justifie & being told in a private letter from this Writer that the consequence might be his ruin, He took no further care of the business but in a revengefull manner, as if I had been his Mortal Enemy made those false & scandalous reports with which you have been already sufficiently troubled, wherefore I beg leave to proceed with my reasons for not making more considerable retrenchments in our Charges at Vizagapatam, especially the Principal Articles of Soldiers & Peons Wages which must be continued till there comes a Nabob with a full power to govern, and keep the Rajahs in such subjection that his Perwannas will be received and obey'd in all their Countrys which favourable juncture has been daily expected since this Moguls Accession to the Throne, but two contending great men at Court have prevented, & by sending & changing their Servants in Government make our Account of Presents extravagant And uncertain, and the discharging Soldiers and Peons impracticable.

The method of making our Charges more tolerable by increasing our Investments has been attempted with a good prospect at Ingerum, & with good management may be continued, as also the bringing Salampores from the Ganjam Country in the manner we contracted with M^r. Symonds before I left Vizagapatam for 1½ pag^s. less in a Corge than M^r. Jennings & C^a. give the Black Merchants who I presume by that preced^t. may be perswaded to accept the same price or less than 14 pag^s. for what provided at Ingerum or near Vizagapatam where the plenty & cheapness of Cotton generally answers that of Rice in the Ganjam Country.

Having in my Journey from Vizagapatam view'd the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. Factorys at Madapollam and Metchlepatam, I think it my duty to let your Hon^r. & C^t. know

their condition & want of repairs. At Madapollam the timbers of the old Factory and all Building materials are much more substantial than those of the New whose foundation is weak, & the upper rooms leaky where the Timbers being green and very slight at first are lyable to be rotten in a few years, & the Bricks having a great deal of sand mix'd with the clay are very much consum'd especially in those Walls which are not plaister'd wth. Chenam Which are most of the Outworks.

The Factory at Metchlepatam seems to be kept in as good order as the Charges allow'd will admit of, and a little of M^r. Nodens care is wanting to those at Madapollam. I am

Senhor Aleixa Pessoa de Andrade having deliver'd in his answer to the Petition of Francisco Laité de Pereira mention'd in Consultation the 12th. instant, & all persons concern'd being Summon'd in order to a fair hearing

The foremention'd Petition was read the second time as also several attestations which the Plaintiff produc'd for proof of What allerdg'd against the Defendant.

The Defendants answer read with several attested papers relating thereto, which papers being translated by Mr. Anthony Barnewalle, the Plaintiff was ask'd if he requir'd the oath of the Translator to which he réply'd that He was satisfied with his word knowing him to be a man of honour.

Mr. Anthony Barnewalle Merchant, Sen^r. Dience Gomes a Portugeese Merch^t. & Sen^r. Constantine an Armenian Merchant all three lately arriv'd from Manilha were fully examin'd to the most material points which the Plaintiff Charges upon the Defendant in his Petition, & the substance of their ans^r. (in which they all agree) is as follows.

THAT to the best of their judgement John de Sampayo the Plaintifs Bro^r. in law appear'd & acted as his Attornie in Manilha, and that Aleixa Pessoa was assisting to him in a freindly manner to endeavour to borrow mony in order to ransom the Ship but it was not to be procur'd.

THAT they never heard of Aleixa Pessaos protesting against any persons that were willing to have bought the Ship & Cargo upon pretence that He intended to redeem her for the Owners.

THAT they never heard of any such proclamation as the Plaintiff asserts to have been publish'd by the government in Manilha to forbid any persons purchasing the Ship or Cargo of the French except those that were concern'd in her before she was taken.

THAT they did always take for granted that Aleixa Pessoa the Defendant did fairly purchase the Ship of the French for his own Account & for Acco^t. of Manoel Pereira Ramos that was half concern'd with him, that they never heard anything of a redemption or ransom, & that the Customs were paid at Manilha for the Cargo by order of the Government, which would not have been in case the Ship had been ransom'd unless by a previous agreement.

And further Senhor Constantine particularly declares that the French did endeavour to evade paying the customs upon pretence of a ransom, but the government being fully convinc'd that it was a real sale, did compel the Comuissary to pay the Customs before they would let the Ship depart the Port, & the Deponent Constantine was his Security for the said Payment.

The foregoing evidence being given in the presence of both parties they had afterwards a full hearing, untill they had nothing further to Offer & being withdrawn, upon summing up the Evidence the board came to the following resolutions.

—FORT ST. GEORGE, MAY 1715—

RESOLV'D that the Plaintiff has not made appear to the Board, that the Defendant was his lawfull Attornie, or that He qualified him with mony or credit to purchase the Ship or Cargo nor has he made good any one of the facts which he asserts in his Petition that are material for proving the Ship & Cargo, to have been redeem'd for Acco^t. of the Owners, on the contrary it appears by original papers duly authenticated, that John de Sampayo the Plaintifs Brother in law, was the principal person employ'd to act in this affair, & the Defendant was only desir'd to assist him, the necessary instructions being entirely confided to John de Sampayo. It appears further by the said papers that John de Sampayo, after having us'd all possible means to redeem the Ship was forc'd to desist for Want of mony, which he signifies under his hand to Aleixa Pessoa the Defendant, desiring him to purchase the said Ship & Cargo for his Own Account that the City of Macao might not lose the benefit of the Customs. It appears further that the Defendant did not offer to purchase the Ship for his own Acco^t. till all hopes of ransoming her for the Owners were at an end, & the french were about parcelling out the Cargo to other people.

Resolutions taken thereupon.

Further the Defendant produces a fair bill of Sale made & past in the presence of the Castellano de Cabita who is the cheif judge of that Port, which bill of Sale is Witness'd by John de Sampayo the Plaintifs Attornie, & no mention therein made of a ransom or of the Plaintiff, or any other of the Owners.

A Bill of Sale Produced by the Defendant.

And Further the Plaintiff himself acknowledges that he has already prosecuted the Defendant on this same account in the City of Macao, where undoubtedly he produc'd all the evidence that He now pretends to want, as well as the same that He has now produc'd here, & where we cannot doubt but He had a fair & favourable hearing, as He and all his family are Natives, & Inhabitants of that City, & Whereas it appears fully to the Board that the Defendant after having been imprison'd at the Suit of the Plaintiff for some days, had a full hearing and the cause was determin'd, after which he was clear'd & had license to depart the Port with the Ship, having publickly Sold the Cargo there for his Own and Partners Acco^t. & paid the Customs of the city as usual, all which the Plaintiff does not deny but weakly alledges the government of that his Native place to be his Enemies.

the Plaintiff acknowledges he prosecuted the Defendant at Macao, & was cast himself.

AGREED that it is the judgement of this Board, that by what Evidence has appear'd to us Sen^r. Aleixa Pessoa de Andrade did fairly purchase the Ship Jesus, Maria, Joseph & Cargo of the French Captors (according to an instrument now produced) for his Acco^t. in Company with Manoel Pereira Ramos, & it does not appear to us that the former Owners have any just pretentions thereto, accordingly we adjudge the purchase to him the Defendant, & that the Plaintiff, be accountable for the charges of this Suit.

Comp^{as}. Cash.

Raworth had some how or other wrong'd him in the payments made to him, & therefore hop'd I would be so kind as to look into the Account, which I accordingly did, when it was demonstrated to me by his own receipts given in the Comp^{as}. Book that He was not charg'd wth. One farthing more than vouch'd by his own hand, whereupon being couvinc'd of the justness thereof, He promis'd at the Councill board to pay the same into Cash, but beg'd We would favour him so farr as to give him a little time.

Now upon looking into the ballances that stood upon the General Books ending April last, I observ'd that this Gentleman was indebted on his Paymasters Acco^t. pag^s. 389: 35: 4, the Warehouse pag^s. 380: 8^{ia}: 3^{ca}, Cornmeter pag^s. 15: 5: 5: & for the Comp^{as}. old boat sold him pag^s. 30, upon promise of payment before the Cash Acco^t. for April should be shut up which as We advis'd your Hon^r. & c^t. was kept open some time that all ballances Might be paid in, & thereby clear'd in the General Books, I gave him time till every person had paid theirs in, but it was the 6th. of June before he tender'd any mony on the aforesaid Sum^s, when He brought to Councill pag^s. 260, and desir'd an order for the payment of his Diet mony being pag^s. 54 as your Hon^r. & c^t. had consented it should be paid, as also for 36 pag^s. due to him when Paymaster for 6 Lascars arrears He paid, but omitted to be charg'd in his Accounts, w^{ch}. Mess^{rs}. Houghton & Berriman by their Report enter'd in the consultation of the 21st. Ditto, declare to be his due, but all this being pag^s. 39: 35: 4 short of his Paymasters Acco^t. He beg'd I would advance the same for him, I accordingly did it, & He is still so much indebted to me, and refused with no little insolence before the Councill to give me a Receipt for it, though I had generously lent it him

Ditto He reads his Warehouse Account for May, the aforesaid ballance still standing out, & then promises again in a short time to discharge it, The 12th. July it was again demanded, when not having it ready after so many admonitions I thought it was highly necessary to proceed according to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. orders, being convinc'd in my self He had made use of the Cash, and well knowing that the affair of M^r. Raworth rose first in a small Sumⁿ, which if discover'd in time might have stop'd his hand as to his Warehouse practices, & that if I did not do my duty according to the 87th. paragraph of our Masters Letter by the Kent, I might make myself answerable for the miscarriage, which M^r. Baker had heard read at the board, wherefore as He has made himself subject thereto; it's his own fault and no unchristian action in me as He terms it.

As to the great service he pretends to have done in the recovery of the Renters debt, I am oblig'd to be something particular in, because that I am sensible the whole Councill & all ffort S^t. David must own it to be gain'd by my own diligence, thus farr he was aiding therein, that He With Mess^{rs}. Woodward & Houghton took from the Conicoplys appointed for that purpose the translation of the Accounts with which they acquainted me constantly as they went on, and something I will allow to these last Gentlemen, because they never attack'd me therein as M^r. To confute his Allegations in his postscript, how can He say that I press'd hard upon him to clear his paymasters debt, when I gave him more than one years time to do it in, or that being unwill^s. to fall under obligations was the motive that induc'd him to pay the greatest part of what charg'd him by Mr. Raworth out of the present Cash of the Warehouse, that ready cash ought to have been pagodas 380 : 8 : 3 : He had no more than pag^s. 260, and at his desire I lent him pag^s. 39 : 35 : 4 : and neither the pag^s. 54 allowed him for his Diet Mony, nor the 36 pag^s. due to him for the Lascars Arrears were in his possession, but there was an order of Councill made for the payment of those Sum^s purposely to enable him to clear his Paymasters ball^{ce}. and How can He say that I call'd for the Warehouse ballance before all Collected, when He owned himself upon the first demand that there was only 5 or 6 pag^s. uncollected, which He declar'd at the Councill board He Would be answerable for.

Whatever Gentlemen he pretends to bring in a parallell Case with him, I know of none He can, and I am sure there has none been equal to him for insolencies, which obliges me to Remind him of those gross ones He offer'd me during my Government, several of which were Made matters of Councill, but upon his Submission in consideration of his ffamily I was so kind to omit entering, each one of which accord^s. to the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. orders was enuff to have created his dismission.

Having thus set forth the state of Mr. Bakers case as it Really is, I shall leave the decision thereof to your Hon^r. & c^t. & am

Having survey'd the Walls of Cuddalore I find the South side to have a foundation of four foot deep and five thick eleven foot from the Surface to the top of the Parapet, which is three foot thick, with a small Curtain of five foot high and ten broad.

To the Westward I find the Wall all the same as to the Southward, only one foot higher with a curtain compleat as farr as the Vizapore Point which is three hundred ninety One fathom.

The Wall continued to the Trevadee Point the same height without any curtain which is in length One hundred & nineteen fathom.

From the Trevadee point towards the Braminy Gate is One hundred & four fathom of Wall, but Seven foot high, and the Same thickness with the former without any Curtain, from Which towards the said Gate is a New foundation of fifty fathom, & an old Wall of fifty more, which is likely to fall if not pull'd down. The Braminy Gate and the small work by it is very weak.

The Chellembum or South West Bastion is not above ten foot high, and the two Bastions nam'd Chellembum and Trevadee to the West Ward not yet finish'd.

With Submission I offer my opinion, That to make the Town defensible against even a Country Enemy, with such a Garrison as We usually have in it, the following work is absolutely necessary.

1st. That part of the Wall from the Braminy Gate to Trivadee Bastion to be finish'd.

2^d. A Bastion to be built where the aforesaid Gate Stands, with each flank large enuff for two Guns to command both sides of the Town.

3^d. The Curtain should be finish'd as farr as the works go, With a foot bank upon it of two foot broad & One $\frac{1}{2}$ high, the loop holes stop'd up, and the Parapet to be four & a half foot higher that the foot bank.

4^{thly}. That the Vizapore & Braminy Gates now close to the Points, be both plac'd near the Middle of the Curtain, for there they are best defended.

5. That the two Bastions nam'd Chellembum and Trevadee, which are now unfinish'd be compleated, and the Chellembum Bastion rais'd, a foot & a half higher.

6^{thly}. That there be a small Terrass over the three gates to cause a communication from one Bastion to the other, or steps to be made at each Gate to mount y^e. Curtain, this compleats the South & West sides of the Town, though but a weak defence against a potent enemy.

Success not meeting with much trouble, except that once in the night rogues came on our Camp, but being repuls'd three times they left us. We arriv'd at Phworedabad the 3^d. instant, where we were met by Padre Stephanus bringing two Seerpaws, which were received with the usual ceremony by John Surman, and Cojee Surhaad. The 4th. We arriv'd at Baorapoola, three Course from the City, sending the Padry before to prepare our reception, that if possible We might visit the King the first day even before We went to the house, which was got for us, accordingly the 7th. in the morning We made our entry with very good order, there being sent a Munsubdar of two thousand Munsub with about 200 horse & peons to meet us, bringing likewise two Elephants & Flags, about the middle of the City We were met by the Syud Sallabut Cawn Babauder, & were by him conducted to the palace, where we waited till about 12 a clock till the King came out, before which time We met with Caundora Behauder, who rec^d. us very civilly, assuring us of his protection & good Services. We prepar'd for Our first present, Viz^t. One thous^d. & One gold Mohurs, the Table Clock set With precious Stones, the Unicorns Horn, the gold Escrutore bought from Zoudy Cawn, the large peice of Ambergreese, the Astoa, & Chelungie Manilha work and the Map of the World, these with the Hon^{ble}. the Govern^{rs}. Letter were presented every one holding Something in his hand as usual John Surman received a Vest and Culgee set with precious Stones & Seeraad a Vest and Cunger set with precious Stones likewise, consid^g. the great pomp & state of the Kings of Indostan, we were very well rec^d. On our arrival at our house We were entertain'd by Syud Sallabut Cawn Sufficient both for us & our people, in the evening He visited us again & Stay'd abo^t. two hours. The great favour Caundora is in wth. the King gives us hopes of Success in this undertaking, He assures us of his protection & says the King has promis'd us very great favours. We have rec^d. ord^{rs}. first to visit Caundora as our Patron, after which We shall be order'd to visit the Grand Vizier, & other Omrahs, We would have avoided this if We could fearing to disoblige the Vizier, but finding it not feazable, rather than disoblige one who has been so serviceable, & by whose means, We expect to obtain our desires, We comply with it.

Will without doubt be very welcome news, We have since visited sev^{ll}. Omrahs, as the Vizier Caundora, & Fackarubcaun, where we were rec^d. wth. all the Respect that could be expected, & gives me some hopes that all will end well, but what gives me the most encouragem^t. (for I am well acquainted these Nobles, as long as they are expecting to get anything are always complaisant) is that the methods we are at present taking, is consistant & with the advice & Council of Zowde Cawn, We visited that Gentleman the 11th. Curr^t. & met wth. the same treatment He has always given to Englishmen, wth. the highest acknowledgem^{ts}. of the favours He has received from them, that as yet He had never been able to retaliate any of them, but hop'd He had now an opportunity of doing Something, he pressingly advis'd us to do nothing without the advice, Counsel & order of Caundora (and the main instrument of our affairs) Syed Sellabut Cawn, that the turn of affairs at the Durbar oblig'd us to it, this which he told us by word of mouth he wrote me when I sent your Hon^{rs}. Lett^r. to him. We are convinc'd He advises like a freind, & are intent on the method, but at the same time very cautious how we any ways disoblige the Vizier, Wee being very sure that Zowdy Cawn was very intimate there, sent & advis'd him when We intended to visit, That He would use his interest for our bett^r. Reception, intending to manage the Durbar by his means, He assur'd us that We might be satisfied as to the important Durbar. The good prospect We have of our affairs makes Coja Surhaad very good humour'd, & at present tractable, in hopes He shall obtain his promis'd Reward, & consider^s. that everything is come^s. to it's crisis, I take particular care that He remains so & as much as possible perswade every one with me to do the like w^{ch}. I fear gains me but little good will, but as passion must now be curb'd, except We expect to be laught at, We must be very circumspect in our actions & Councils.

We have rec^d. Letters from Madrass advising y^t. Sadatulla Cawn had taken the strong Fort of Chingie, & that He was for intrench^s. on the Comp^{ss}. Bounds to rapture. We hope to get orders time enough to go by your August Shipping, God send Success to our affairs. I am

Since our former We visited the Vizier & Fuckrub Cawn W^{ch}. was attended with a great many civilities & promises of assistance in our affairs, likewise We paid our Respects to Zoudee Cawn, whose treatment was equal to the respect He has always shown to Englishmen, assur'd us our affairs Were in a very good state, & that the design We had of carry^g. on our business by means of Caundora was the only advisable way to hope for Success, for althô the Vizier, & Fuckrub Caun, were in the highest posts, & our business in a great measure would inevitably fall into their hands, yet for a Patron or one to have the entire management of the business, none was so fit or could do so much as Caundora. We were well inform'd that He was very intimate with the Vizier, for which reason we particularly desir'd his freindship in the management of that Durbarr, He assur'd us We might rest satisfied on that side, a few days We hope will bring the King to his palace again, when We shall enter upon action, & hope everything will answer the expectations we have conceiv'd from so good a beginning.

The Padre in some of his former Letters to us, while in our way Copys of which We have sent your Hon^r. & c^t. did advise that He had been oblig'd to give a writing under his hand & Seal to the Mudsuddies at Court, for a certain Sum of mony, and goods on our arrival, & finishing the business, We have examin'd into that matter, & are inform'd that 'tis to Caundora Behader & Syud Sallabut Caun Behader for twenty five thousand Rupees, We intend to take up this obligation as invalid & make as good agreements as We can ourselves, the main reason of our doing this, is that the Padry may have no more opportunities of giving notes under his hand for anything relating to our business.

We have frequently complain'd to your Hon^r. & c^t. & wrote of the invalidity of the Letters of credit sent us, & of what ill consequence it might be, in case We should be disappointed of mony when we come to action it being the main spring of our Negotiation, yo^r. Hon^r. & c^t. did advise that you Were seeking a Remedy, by sending fresh Lett^{rs}. Which as yet We have not rec^d. as for those already sent We have met with nothing but denials, Lollbeharry refusing to let us have any mony, but on very unreasonable conditions, the other Joogurpursaud Remains in Agra, We did not enquire for him there expecting to find him in this place, but now perceiving our mistake We have wrote to him but with little hopes of Success. We hope your Hon^r. & c^t. first Letters will Remedy this disappointment.

A Duplicate of your Hon^{rs}. & c^{ts}. dated January the 15th. & Original of the 29th. came to hand June the 29th. 20 Coarce distance from Dilly, We deferr'd giving answer at that time, in hopes to obtain an order on Sadatulla Cawn to attend it, but the Remooval of his Majesty from the City, hinder'd us from commencing any business, so can only give your Hon^r. & c^t. an Acco^t. how things stand at present.

The 2^d. of July when We arriv'd within 12 Coarce of the City, there came two Seerpaws from his Majesty, which were rec^d. with the usual ceremony, when We arriv'd within three Coarce, We prepar'd for our entry desiring if possible for the credit of our negotiation, that We might first pay our obeisance to his Majesty, & then proceed to the house provided for us Which being concerted the 6th., there came a Caun of 2000 Muns, with 200 horse, peons, Elephants & Flags to conduct us to the City, when We arriv'd at the outward gate, We were met by Syed Sallabut Cawn Behauder, who carried us to the Kings palace. We carried with us some Rarities, which We presented Caundora introducing us to the Royal presence, consider^s. the great state, with the Adoration paid to these Eastern Monarchs, We were as well rec^d. as any European has been for these many years. We rec^d. Seerpaws, there be^g. a Culgee set with Jewells given to John Surman, & a Cunger set wth. Jewells likewise to Seerhaad, when We came to our house, We were by the Kings order, entertain'd by Syud Sallabut Cawn with a dinner sufficient for us & all our people, Three days after, the King left the City, und^r. pretence of visiting a sacred place, about Six Coarce from thence, but the true reason (We are of opinion) was to clear himself of a kind of confinement, which he thought He suffer'd whilst in the Fort, afterwards on the petition of his Omrahs to return to the City, the time of the rains being improper for travelling, He show'd himself resolv'd to proceed, either to Lahore or Azmere, neither could all the arguments us'd avert his intended journey. This startled us, consider^s. with how great trouble, and risque We had brought the Present thus farr, & how to carry it on at this time of the Year We were something at a stand, at last We concluded to give the gross of our Present in, notwithstanding the King was abroad, But in delivering some of the fine clocks, they were order'd to be Return'd & kept in good order till He came back to the City, He having now determin'd only to visit a Sacred place, about 40 Coarce from Dilly, after which He would Return, This stop'd our presenting the remaind^r. of our goods, but We concluded that it was necessary to attend his Majesty in this Tour, We now continue in the Camp, leaving M^r. Stephenson & M^r. Philips to take care of what goods Remain in the City, & in case that the King should proceed farther, that they may concert measures to bring the goods after us, We are in this interval preparing petitions to be deliver'd to his Majesty, hoping We shall do Something for our Hon^{ble}. Masters, that has not been yet obtain'd. The patronage and management of this negotiation, is in the hands of the greatest favourite at Court, Caundora, & under him Syud

Sallabut Cawn, withall, We being no ways unmindfull of our old freind Zeowdy Cawn, without whose advice We enter upon nothing, But he being at present in so low a station, is not able to obtain the Kings ear. However We are satisfied, that in whatever lies in his power he does & Will assist us, but particularly in the Viziers Durbar.

Hassein Ally Cawn Behawder Omeer All Omrah is lately gone into the Decan Country, having the entire command of all that part of this Kingdom, Your Hon^r. &c^t. have undoubtedly heard how great He has made himself, even to vie with the commands of his imperial Majesty, as lately appear'd in the disputes between himself & M: Jemlah Whilst at Court, when He oblig'd his Antagonist, contrary to the Kings desires, to Remove from Court to Patna, where by the interest of Omeerall Omrah, & his own mismanagement He is quite ruin'd, Wherefore We humbly Recommend a very good Correspondence with Omeer All Omrah otherwise, what ever We shall be able to do here, will be of very little Service before him.

We have in a very Particular manner observ'd what Your Hon^r. &c^t. have wrote concerning the priviledges, & accordingly have specified them in our Petitions, as for the Towns, We cannot yet advise Yo^r. Hon^r. &c^t. what We are capable of doing, till such time as We find how the Court is dispos'd, however our Endeavours shall not be wanting in the minutest particular, & above all for Divy Island.

Concerning Sadatulla Cawns taking the Fort of Chingie We have examin'd & find, that as soon as the news arriv'd at Court, that Raja Seroop Sing was dead, Orders were sent from hence to his Son, to deliver up that Government to Sadatulla Cawn, He having orders likewise to receive it, which the Rajah not thinking fit to comply with, said Fort was taken from him by force, this Victory in the Kings behalf has very much pleas'd this Court, We are endeavouring to get an order concern^g. y^e. business of Fort St. David, to be sent to your Hon^r. &c^t. by the Ships from Bengall.

We hope his Majesty will not exceed his intended Journey but Return to the City, when We shall advise your Hon^r. &c^t. of whatever occurs. We are
