The President represents to the board that Ducknaroy, who is Prime Minister to the Nabob Sadatulla Cawn, & Tyre Cawn the Nabobs Generall came to St. Thomas last Saturday wth. a body of four hundred horse and one thousand foot, in order to perform a religious ceremony of washing in the Sea at ye, time of the Suns Eclipses the next day, and that he had sent the Compe. black Servants and Merchants [to] welcome him into this part of the Country, and to sound the inclinations of Ducknaroy whether he was inclined to accept an Invitation to see the Fort, That [he] had recd. . a very civil answer from Ducknaroy & Tyre Cawn wth. Assurances of their freindship, and an intimation that they were inclined to give him a Visit.

Ducknaroy & Tyre Cawn men of gt. authority in the execution Nabob's affairs. Ducknaroy & Tyre Cawn [to be] ad-mitted into ye. White Presidt. receives ym. at yo. foot of yo. Stairs in yo. Inner Fort. Secry. & Capt. Enllerton sent to St. Thoma to invite Ducknaroy & Tyre Cawn.

These two persons having the greatest innuence both in the direction and Execution of the Nabobs Affairs, it is thought convenient to receive them in such a manner, as may establish the good understanding between us and [the Nabob] on making the peace and that presents be made them [that may be] most acceptable to them to the Amount of One thousand Pagodas, that [they be adm]itted into the white town wth. twenty Pallanquins, One Hundred horse and [two] Hundred foot, that the President receive them at the foot of the stairs in the inner Fort, and lead Ducknaroy into the Consultation room, that fifty one Guns be fired by the fort, and then taken up by the ships, that on his departure out of the White Town, the same Number of Guns be again fired, and taken up by the ships also, that the Secretary and Capt. Fullerton be sent to St. Thoma to invite them to come into Town too morrow morning.

A PROTEST in the Name of the General of the Netherland East India Company exhibited by Anthony Rouw President at Barroose, and by his direction deliver'd to, & against Cap<sup>r</sup>. Washington Commander of the ship Marlerough (belong<sup>s</sup>. to the English) together with the Supra Cargo, & the rest of y<sup>e</sup>. Officers.

After it came to our knowledge that you the said Cap<sup>t</sup>. Washerton [sic] w<sup>th</sup>. Yo<sup>r</sup>. Supra Cargo, and yo<sup>r</sup>. Officers, had brought yo<sup>r</sup>. ship (call'd the Marlbrô) to an anchor under the Islands of Pull-doa, near that port where the Village Trowman is situate, & endeavour'd to corrupt its Inhabitants & others, by open Trafficque & Merchandize w<sup>th</sup>. them, as well as to Establish a settlement there, We found our selves under a Necessity of acquainting you that the Villages situate on the borders of the River Sincquool, particularly Trowman, & also the Islands of Pulodoa, as well as other ports and places upon the West Coast of Sumatra, belong to the Netherland East India Comp<sup>a</sup>. who are Masters of them, and allow none beside themselves to trade, or settle there, having gain'd them as well by force of Arms, as by Compact and by that force will maintain the same.

Having been obliged by our Solemn Oath, which we have taken to be true, & faithfull to our Employers the Netherland East India Company & to maintain their rights & priviledges to the utmost of our power, we charg'd [you on] your com<sup>g</sup>, to an auchor here, to weigh directly, and depart out of their Territorys, and this we did in their name, & w<sup>th</sup>, all mildness, but you slighted our Civility, thô we warn'd y°. of the dangerous consequences that might attend yor. Stay.

Wherefore We now protest against you & every of yo. the aforesaid Capt. & yor. Officers for encroachment upon the Dominions of our Masters the Netherland East India Company, & for all damages that they may sustain thereby; And Furthermore We hope you will caution all other ships of your Nation against coming upon this Coast for the future, least we should be obliged to execute our Masters orders wth. the rigour which they have enjoy'nd us.

Siamers and seems to threaten taking satisfaction if he should happen to meet w<sup>th</sup>. me, I think my self oblig'd to say something in my vindication, and to guard against any damage his malice or madness may prompt him to offer to me or my Employers, in case I should happen to fall in his way.

The underwritten is an attested copy of your part of Cap<sup>t</sup>. Hamiltons letter, w<sup>ch</sup>. relates to my self, where he has taken a great deal of pains to make me appear guilty of breaking the Treaty of Commerce setled w<sup>th</sup>. Siam by Charles the Second, w<sup>ch</sup>. is so far out of y<sup>e</sup>, power of any private person whatever to do, that any one would run a very great risque of his life, that should even have y<sup>e</sup>. Vanity to offer his advice only in any Governm<sup>t</sup>. Affair to w<sup>ch</sup>. I shall say no more than that I am persuad<sup>d</sup>, when y<sup>e</sup>. Hon<sup>e</sup>, considers it could be no interest of mine to be instrumentall in making Cap<sup>t</sup>. Hamilton pay the Customs they imposed upon him, you will be of opinion his accusation proceeds from his discontent in not meet<sup>g</sup>, w<sup>th</sup>, a market for his goods, & the same treatment there as my self, which must be attributed to the King of Siams trading to Madrass, his fear of their making themselves satisfaction in case of ill treatment to their ships hinder'd them from imposing the same duty on the Brittannia last Voy<sup>g</sup>, as they have now done to Cap<sup>t</sup>. Hamilton.

I am now to take notice that he says in one of his paragraphs "for all wch. damages & losses, which have or may come on this part of my Voyage, if meet wth. Capt. Powney, I shall use my powerfullest Eloquence to persuade him to reimburse my Masters" by which no doubt he designs to seize the ship I go to Siam in. Hamilton may be guilty of, & humbly desire yor. Honr. &ct. to permitt the Secretary to enter this letter, wth. the aforemd. one from Capt. Hamilton, to be upon occasion produced hereafter. of happy memory, and the ruin of my Voyage, I think my self oblig'd to acquaint yor. Hon. of it, & wth. the new Stipulations he has setled here for his fellow. Subjects.

IMPRIMIS, That all shipping belonging to the Subjects of Great Brittain, excepting those employ'd by your Hon. or himself shall pay measurage for their ships or Vessels, according to Siam Conscience, for there's no setled rule, and all goods or merchandize imported here by the sd. Subjects of Brittain, excepting from yor. Hon. or himself, shall pay eight & Cent customs in specie, if they are landed, whether they can be sold or no, but if not landed to pay nothing, but the last part of this paragraph was conceded to by the King of Siam the 4th. of the last mo. otherwise we must have paid for our whole Cargo according to the first projection by Powney &ct.

ITEM, whoever buys our goods shall be oblig'd to pay the mony into the Kings. Treasury, that he may deliver us goods out of his Royall Warehouse (when he has any) at his own Establish'd prizes, we'h. at present are higher than Suratt.

And that all English shipping that comes here, excepting those of your Honrs. or his shall be oblig'd to stay one year for the disposing & receiving of their Cargoes, (for silver & gold are prohibited exportation, on pain of confiscation of Ship & Cargo besides slavery to the ships Comp<sup>a</sup>.) that the Ships so remaining may be a pledge for the good behaviour of all their fellow Subjects, if any should dare to take satisfaction of the Siamers, for being robbed & oppress'd by them, and that there may always be victims of bloud & treasure ready to be sacrificed by the Siamers, if any such accident should happen.

All which conditions Capt. Powneys Associates Oia Seneratt & Paipatt would have put upon me wth. the greatest rigour, If I had not us'd both presents & threats to prevent them; Capt. Dalgleish, & I design'd to have address'd the King wth. Petitions & Presents to have these unjust impositions & calamity[s] remov'd, but Mr. Collinson, who Capt. Powney left here to be Seneratts intelligence[r] discover'd our design to him, and next day came an order from the King yt. no Europeans, Moors, or Jentues, except his own Subjects, should approach yt. Palace on pain of One day I discours'd Seneratt about the injustice & oppression we lay under, but he deny'd he had any hand in it; I told him I had ask'd the same question of Paipatt, & that we would give a sum to have it removed, for if it continued, the consequence would endanger a rupture wth. the Company; He bid me go to Seneratt, who could best give an account of its rise; I told Seneratt of it before Collinson, and a few days after Collinson was summon'd to a Court, who gave a declaration, which brought my life ship & Cargo in question; About a week after I was summon'd to another Court, where an impeachment was drawn up against me, that I had told Seneratt before Collinson (and some others who were ready for Witnesses, thô never any one but Collinson was near) that Seneratt, & Paipatt had inculcated ill notions into the Kings head for laying Customs and other impositions on all the British Subjects excepting those aforesaid; I deny'd the whole accusation; My Judge frankly told me that I must take care what I said, for If I was cast I must lose my head, which conditions I was forc'd to accept on for want of other remedy; on weh. Mr. Collinson was sent for to confront me, who declar'd [to the Judge before that what Seneratt had] asserted, was true; but I proved by Seneratt himself, that Collinson did not understand Moors, which was the Language that our discourse was in; I was acquitted by y°. Judge, and the Evidence ridiculed by the whole Court; The Evidences folly, & ignorance (thô no doubt mixed with malice, or his Masters orders) I pity, and deem him far below my resentment, otherwise should have sent him home withot his ears. Among other discourses at our table (which was a common one) same words might have past that for all the Siemers processing was a common one) some words might have past, that for all the Siamers precaution in making us leave our great guns at Bencock, any body that had a mind to disturb yo. repose of this great King, might bring Guns under their ballast, and plague him more than a Spaniard did forty years ago, forcing his way down ye. river in spight of all the Force of Siam, thô ye. King then headed them; Next day Seneratt was master of yo. Secret, and design'd to have persuaded yo. King to make me unlade my ship in

order to Search her, and thô I have ne're a spare great gun (weh. I am sorry for) yet for fear of farther trouble, was forc'd to strike up a pretended friendship wth.

· Seneratt to divert the charges and trouble.

After a most stay at Siam, and finding no appearance of Trade, except on the base slavish conditions aforesaid, and all the doors of Justice fast bolted against us, I sollicited for my Tara, or dispatches in order to try my fortune somewhere else, but could not obtain one in less than two months and a half, thô Sollicited almost every

day.

Before my departure from the City, I thought the Dutch cheif might have some more interest than my self with this pollitick Court, & made an overture of letting him have about thirty thousand rupees worth of Suratt goods at Suratt price, he paying the eight & Cent Custom but after ten days tryall found that nothing but my money paid into the Kings Cash could do, so am forced to leave this glorious Port (as the King styles it) without selling half so much as have paid away in port charges, wherein is one thousand Rup. measuarage for my ship, as & Stipulation aforesaid.

For all which damages & losses, wch. have or may come on this part of my voyage, If meet wth. Capt. Powney, I shall use my powerfullest Eloquence to

persuade him to reimburse my Masters.

And am in great hopes that this foolish brother of the Sun (the King of Siam) who by ill advice has broken our Commerce and opprest us, shall find the Morning Starr has beams eno to attract [ . . . ] glories that Japan sends him this year, & convey them to [ . . . ] Madrass maxims are very good in such cases as ours.

And because we are unjustly debarr'd trading here, and plagued wth. insupportable affronts, & abuses, 'tis but reasonable to undeceive the Siamers, and teach them so much of the constitution of our laws, that their King, nor any subject of Brittain, can alter the establish'd Commerce of Siam withot. yt. consent, & approbation of our Legislature, or those that they have made it over to.

And am in great hopes that this simple King (whose avarice & lazyness, is like to make a revolution in his Country) will be the first that will taste of his folly, and that the complaints of his slaves or subjects, will awake him to bring the Authors of this new Project of Tyranny to condign punishm<sup>t</sup>. some of whose heads are already in no small Jeopardy about my leaving the Country, witho<sup>t</sup>, paying Customs, or at least very inconsiderable for a few Shawls, & dates.

I have two good Chances to incourage me, one about the latter end of next mo. and if that miscarries, I shall call at this barr about yo. beginns. of May for a few teculls, & I hope Capt. Powney, when he comes here, will fall in the snare he has laid

for others.

There's one thing more, that I can't forbear taking notice of to your Hon. a letter of yors. came to Seneratt, & one to yo. King, which were accounted spurious till one came from Powney, and then it was made legitimate about a month after; however Dalgleish had no benefitt by yor. Hon. Certificate, because he once ask'd Seneratt for some mony, he had owed him above a year.

The reasons why Seneratt gave me (when we were good friends) for laying on those Impositions is because Madrass makes the King pay eight # Cent, therefore

we ought to pay as much, & Madrass be clear.

Notry. publick.

I had almost forgott to acquaint your Hon. that when Cap. Dalgleish. Mess. Emmerson & Saunders, & I went to visit the Vizier or Chuckra, He treated yo. Hon. wth. some unhandsome Epithets for writing to Seneratt as Vizier about business of Consequence, & not to him, and he told us if any thing spoiled our business at Siam it would be your Hon. too great friendship wth. such Villains. I am

In order to which ye. 44th. 45th. 46th. & 47th. paragraphs of y°. Honble. Court of Directors' letter \$\psi\$ King William, all relating tion. to that affair were read; The Steps that had already been taken on this side were recited, & the present State of Affairs wth. respect to yo. Country Government fully consider'd, we'n, we think proper to enter here, That the reasons of the Resolutions we shall take may appear full & clear.

Considera-

We first attempted to gain a peaceable possession of Dieu Island, by entering into The Steps that has a Treaty wth. Mauberize Cawn, the Nabob of yo. Subah of Golcondah, in whose district already been Dieu Island lyes, and to give ye. Greater force to that treaty; We sent an Ensign, & taken, & ye. Fifty Soldiers to Metchlapatam who resided there severall months; Mauberize Cawn's of Affairs Officers insisted on having mony advance, in order to engage them in our Interest; relats to Dieu Island But we resolv'd not to launch into any Expence that way, till we had a reasonable remonstrated. certainty of Success: We propos'd to give as far as Five thousd. pagodas in the whole, and should probably have been induced to have gone a little further to carry our point, But we found a much larger sum would be expected whenever ye. busyness was done; By the best light we could get, It would not be much short of a Lack of Rupees; Besides that at that Juncture Mauberize Cawn stood in fear of Sied Hussenally Cawn, under whose immediate Jurisdiction he was and Sied Hussenally Cawn did every thing in his power, to obstruct yo. making good the Grant in the Phirmaund [and gave] out fresh orders to our Nabob Sadatulla Cawn to retake ye. [possessions]; on this view of Affairs we drop't the treaty and determined [to take the]

Warmly; The two Brors. demanded an audience of the King, who being a weak, irres[olute] Prince, had not courage to oppose them, but granted their request & a seeming reconciliation was made; But the two Brothers took an opportunity to seize the King; putt out his eyes & imprison'd him in the Seraglio; from whence they took a young Prince, & proclaim'd him King; But the very same day changing their minds, they deposed & imprison'd him also, and took a Brother of his nam'd Raphiell Oura son of Rapheelcudda, alias Rapheelshan, who was the third son of King Shawallum, and in his name Govern'd for some time; The Revolution happen'd on the 18th. Febry 1718/9; The Brothers kept the [King] under the closest Confinement, not suffering any besides their own [Crea] tures to have access to him, and whenever they remov'd thổ it was only from the Pallace to a Garden of pleasure, they carried him with them & to prevent any further opposition, They destroy'd the late King Furruckseer and all the Princes of the Tamerlane race in the pallace of Delhy, or with [in] their reach to y. Number of eighteen or twenty persons; This provok'd [the] Mogulls & Patans, (two Setts of Mahometans opposite to y. Sieds) & the Rashboots who gather 'd together what forces they could about Agra, and f[ind]ing there a prince of the Royal Blood, They offer'd their Service to car[ry[ him wth. them, if He would accept the Crown, He comply'd wth. their request according to our last advices was march'd out of Agra with an Army of 45000 Horse towards Delhy in order to fight' the Brothers, who ware adventing towards him with the King as their was march'd out of Agra with an Army of 45000 Horse towards Delhy in order to fight the Brothers, who were advancing towards him wth. the King, as their Prison's they having [. . .] the Pallace of Delhy by the Gov's on the following [. . .] left the Pallace one day to visit a Garden of pleasure [. . .] taking the King wth. them, as [has] been already said; [. . .] refus'd to admitt them [. . .] there was another [a few lines lost] This being the Present state of Affairs, the Husbulhookum for the Delivery of Dieu Island, was call'd for, & read; It was observ'd that the Husbulhookum was no more than an order or warrant, sign'd by the Grand Vizier to we Subsh of Geleondeh to deliver up Dieu Island to we English Grand Vizier to y°. Subah of Golcondah to deliver up Dieu Island to y°. English, It being granted to them by the King, but it is not sign'd by the King, nor has it the force of a Phirm. The King who made that Grant is now depos'd, & dead, The Successour has razed his name out of the Royall List, and the Brothers seem resolutely determin'd to vacate all the Grants made to the English by the Phirmaund as appears by the obstruction given to the making them good both at Bengall, and Surat, and also by the Demand made of the redelivery of the Villages on y's. side.

After this Review we think it necessary to observe on the latter part of the 46th, parag. & the beginn<sup>g</sup>, of the 47th, paragraph of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Court of Directors Letter by the King William; The words are as follow:—

"But if after all prudent endeavours as aforesaid, you have not been able "hitherto to get possession of the Island, and do find the Governmt. resolutely bent "to hinder yo". taking possession (weh, we think they dare not resolve on without "new orders from Court) We are not for Gaining it by force, (because we know not "how far the ill Consequences may spread) at least till we can hear from yo, the "certain accot, what benefitt is like to accrue to us if we had it, as we directed in our "last Letters, and before that time, We suppose your people in the Bay to whom yo, "wrote, will have an answer from Court to their Representation [and] let us & yo. "know that they have so, & what is yo. Result.

"We are sorry to read such great sums are giv'n away in Presents to ye. "Country Governmt. That the Nabob Sadatulla Cawn hesitates whether he shall "accept a thousand Pagodas, That Mauberize Cawn must be offer'd wth. his Officers "Five thousand Pagodas, look back into Gov". Pitts time, & since, & you will find "they were much better Husbands for us; Let their Example spur yo. up to copy "better after them, It seems to us as if the Natives apprehended, they discern'd "a difference in ye. administration, and would accordingly make their markets; It "was as much a Custom formerly as now to present on new accessions to ye. Governmt. "but the good Husbandry then was more conspicuous; Let us find you as equall to "the Trust committed to yo. as they were."

A CHARGE EXHIBITED BY THE PRESIDENT & COUNCIL OF FORT ST. GEORGE AGAINST Mr. RICHARD FARMER OF BREACH OF ORDERS, AND SEVERALL OTH2. MISDEMEANOURS COMMITTED BY HIM, DURING HIS ADMINISTRATION OF YB. HONBLE. COMPS. AFFAIRS AS DEPUTY GOVERNOUR OF THE WEST COAST OF SUMATRA, AS EXTRACTED FROM THE SEVERALL LETTERS, AND CONSULTATIONS RECEIV'D FROM THENCE.

FIRST, TOUCHING THE ACCOUNTS OF YE. WEST COAST.

187. THAT Mr. Farmer did send to England on the ship Rochester ye. Original Books containing the West Coast Accounts ending the 30th. of April 1716 unballanc'd without keeping any Copy thereof.

- 2<sup>DLT</sup>. THAT M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer has not kept any Gen<sup>11</sup>. Books at y<sup>e</sup>. West Coast since the sending home the abovemention'd.
- 3<sup>DLT</sup>. THAT M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer has not sent any Copys of the Gen<sup>11</sup>. Books, or other West Coast accounts.
- 4<sup>THLT</sup>. That, it does not appear, That Mr. Farmer ever had the Journ<sup>11</sup>. parcels of all their accounts read monthly in Consultation.

The three first of these articles are a direct violation of the Honbie. Comp<sup>8</sup>. express & repeated orders, and seem design'd to conceal a corrupt management.

The 4<sup>th</sup>. Article is a breach of an order in y<sup>e</sup>. West Coast Consultation of the 4<sup>th</sup>. of Septem<sup>r</sup>. 1717 and seems design'd to prevent any regular enquiry into their management.

## SECONDLY CONCERNG. SHIPS SENT THITHER.

187. That Mr. Farmer detain'd severall ships at the West Coast for severall months unnecessarily, to yo. Honble. Comps. great Loss and damage.

2<sup>plax</sup>. That M<sup>x</sup>. Farmer dispatch'd the ship Hester to London with near half dead Freight notwithstanding he had orders to send a ship to this Presidency.

Both these Articles appear by the following Extract:-

"On the 11th of May 1717 arrd there the Hester from Borneo wth about ten Tons of pepper, The Benjamin the 27th of August, and the Success the 2d of October arriv'd from England; the two last ships were sent to Bantall, and [a few words lost] June for Guard ships, and the Hester dispatch'd for England 11th. Febry 1717/8 about half loaden, whereby the Compt. Suffer the loss of 150 Tons dead freight by the Hester, & 8 mt. demorage by the Benjamin, There could be no such necessity for keeping these two ships so long at Bantall, on account of the Troubles, when Mt. Cooke could quiet all with a small Force in so little time after his arrivall there, & if the Hester had not been kept on yt. Coast, but had been sent to Madrass, would have sav'd the Compt. the loss of all that dead freight, and yt. Benjt. might easily have been dispatch'd in time for England, and thereby have sav'd her whole Demorage; The President likewise being kept unemploy'd for upwards of 18 mos. only one Trip in all that time she made to Bantall, she was so crazy, that she became unfit for Service.

## THIRDLY, TOUCHING THE WARRS, AND THE DANAGES WHICH ENSUED.

- 1<sup>17</sup>. That, the War wth. Padre Pancamar at Bencoolen was occasion'd by M<sup>r</sup>. Farmers misconduct, & Negligence, in suffering those forces to gather gradually near Bencoolen, till they became Strong enô to make their attempt, notwithstanding the timely informations, giv'n him by the Neighbouring Pangarans, and other great men, of Padre Pancamars intentions to do mischeif.
- 2<sup>DLT</sup>. THAT The War at Bantall was manag'd in such a manner as if the design were to permitt Sultan Guilliamot to reestablish himself; the only reason for which seems to be, That M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer was determin'd to oppose, & undo whatever had lately been establish'd on the West Coast, thô so much to the prejudice of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>s</sup>. affairs, as appears by the Following Extract.—
- "About the latter end of Novem. began the Troubles at Bantall with Sultan Guilliamot, whereupon M. Morrice was sent Supravizor there in Jañry following wth. strict orders to obtain a Cessation of arms from Sultan Guilliamott; We cannot but here observe, that the latter more especially was a most Expensive warr to ye. "Comp. to require two Europe ships lying so long there for the relief of the Settlements, and twenty thous. Dollars extraordinary Expence, It seems very evident a plain toous, by what appears to have been done upon M. Cookes arrival there, that M. Farmer might have easily putt an end to those troubles at his own pleasure, if not entirely have avoided falling into them, if proper measures had been taken at

"first, but nothing but a Cessation of arms was to be kept up, at the same time that "Sultan Guilliamott was daily destroying the Country round about them, together "wth. vo. Comps. [a few words lost] protection. By this War is destroy'd abot. Bentall "241200 Pepper trees and about Bencoolen occasion'd by the War there also 26100 "more.

FOURTHLY, TOUCHING THE ENGROSSING OF THE SALT TRADE.

THAT Mr. Farmer in direct opposition to the Establishment of the Salt trade made in Mr. Collets time, & since expressly confirm'd & Order'd both by the President & Council of Fort St. George, & the Honble. Court of Directrs. in England, did engross the Sale of Salt for his own proffit to the loss of the Honble. Compr. and very great oppression of the people, as appears by the following Extract—.

"The Storekeep". has not been permitted to sell any salt out of the Comp's. Godowns, but by Mr. Farmers directions to particular persons in Exchange at 20 Bamboos of Salt for 20 of Rice, & 24 of Salt for 48 of Paddy, and for ready mony at 25 P Cent advance, after wth. it has been retailed in ythe buzar as appears by the Consultation of the 23d of May 1718 at the extortionate price of 4 bamboos of Salt for a Dollar, which must necessarily breed a great deal of discontent & uneasiness among the People to find they had lost the liberty they formerly enjoy'd, of buying it out of the Comp's godown at the usuall price abovemention'd, and in all probability was one cheif occasion of the Troubles wth. happen'd at Bencoolen, besides this is a direct breach of ythe Comp's orders.

FIFTHLY, Touching the Buildings, Fortifications, & Revenues.

187. That Mr. Farmer has neglected to keep ye. Buildings in due repair, & to carry on the new Buildings, order'd & begun at Moco Moco.

2<sup>DLY</sup>. THAT M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer has put y<sup>e</sup>. Comp<sup>a</sup>. to an unaccountable expence in raising a turf Wall, at Bencoolen, and approving a like work begun at Bantall by M<sup>r</sup>. Morrice witho<sup>t</sup>. orders from Bencoolen, which is a direct breach of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>a</sup>. order, That none of y<sup>e</sup>. Settlements under this Presidency shall begin any buildings of value without orders from hence.

3<sup>LT</sup>. THAT M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer bought a brick House of M<sup>r</sup>. Ellill on y<sup>e</sup>. Comp<sup>s</sup>. acco<sup>t</sup>. witho<sup>t</sup>. orders and w<sup>ch</sup>. seems to be altogether useless.

4<sup>THL7</sup>. THAT, M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer lessen'd the Comp<sup>3</sup>. revenues by giving up y<sup>c</sup>. Gaming license, and the duty on Anchorage of prows, without leave from this Presidency, and witho<sup>4</sup>. any apparent reason.

The particulars under this Head are more fully Exprest in the follows. Extract.

"After the disturbance Padre Pancamar and the Orangoonys had [one line "lost] with Turf Walls, and trenches wch. were Order'd to be made quite round the "whole Fort, the wall 10 foot broad, and 8 foot high including the breast Work, "and the ditch to be 15 foot broad, as enter'd upon th[eir] Consultation of the 10th. "Decem. 1717, this work was finish'd, and compleated as Mr. Farmer advised the "Court of Directors the Hester, and that there should be no further expence, "nor would it require any future expensive repairs, as being a durable and lasting "Work.

"Nevertheless there was Doll's. 756!. 2. 97, afterward laid out upon it, and the breastwork was not half finish'd when M'. Cook arrivd there, we'd was daily falling down, as fast as they could rear it up, and near half of it is since wash'd down by the rains as is particularly [mentiond.] in their Diarys and Consultations.

"The whole charge of this durable and lasting work doth not amount to less "than Doll's. 11178. 2. 67. besides this there is another piece of work of the same "kind has been carrd. on at Bantall by Mr. Morrice, web. was begun without any "orders from his Superiours thô the[ir] approtation was obtain'd afterward and "the workmen at bôth places paid for their work in goods of Mess's. Farmer and "Morrices.

"We cannot but observe from their Consultations, & Lett". there has been a "gen". Neglect of the buildings ever since Gov. Collet quitted the place but what "reasons Mr. Farmer can give for his Neglecting so long [a] time the care of those "at Moco Moco, which were in so good a forwardness, we cannot well understand.

"Mr. Ellill (as is enter'd upon their Consultations of the 9th. of Augst. 1717) having built a neat brick house near the Fort cover'd wth. lead wch. he is willing to dispose of to the Comps. at prime Cost t'was agreed and order'd to buy said house and the Materials expended thereon be charg'd to yc. Comps. building, and [...] Dollrs. should be paid Mr. Ellill being so much besides laid out by him on sd. house, for China Carpenters, plumbers [&ct.] this House stands close under the south bastion of the Fort, it is altogether useless, and perhaps must be pull'd down when they come to work on that part of the Wall.

"We must also here take notice of his giving up the Gaming license and "anchorage of prows, which must contribute a little towards the support of the heavy charge of that Settlement, and therefore ought not to have been giv'n up, unless the continuance of it was truly attended with great inconveniencys, or very "ill consequences web, it doth not seem to be.

6<sup>THLY</sup>. TOUCHING GOODS PROPER FOR CLOTHING THE [...]

That M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer has in direct breach of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>s</sup>. orders, charg'd the payment of the buggeese soldiers, & Malay workmen in mony, whereas those payments were order'd, and had always been made in cloth out of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>s</sup>. Warehouse to their considerable proffit, for w<sup>ch</sup>. no reason appears, but the taking that proffit to himself by paying the Buggeese &c<sup>t</sup>. in his own cloth, and receiving into his own cash the mony charg'd, as by the follow<sup>s</sup>. Extract.

"There doth not appear to have been Issued out of the Companys Warehouse to the Paymaster as was usuall for payment of the Malay Workmen and Buggeesee, any cloth from yo. time of Mr. Shyllings Suspension in June 1717, to the 21st. of August 1718, as appears by the Consultation of that date, and their Warehousekr. and Paymasters accounts, while Mr. Ellill continued Paymaster who in all appearance have been supply'd wth. Mr. Farmers goods all that time as likewise the cloathing the Slaves, were goods bot of Mr. Farmer in August 1717 & March 1718, and amount to Dollrs. 2500 P and more in proportion than the last clothing deliver'd out of the Comps. Godowns in Septr. last 1718, all which is directly contrary to the Comps. positive orders, and what they have frequently forbid to be practis'd.

7THLY. TOUCHING THE SUSPENSION OF MESS. SHYLLINGE AND GARRET.

That Mr. Farmers prosecution of Messrs. Shyllinge & Garret seems to be unjust in the whole, the proof that is alledged for some parts being very suspicious, and other parts of the charge, being evidently fictiticus, and without any Foundation, but the malice of ye. prosecutors; That his Treatment of their persons was barbarous and inhumane; That his sending them from thence to England was a direct breach of ords and that his Secreting or sending away all the Originall account renders it beyond all doubt, that himself was conscious of the foulness of the whole proceeding, all web appears from the following extract.

"Mr. Shyllinge as appears by their Consultation of yo. 27th. of June 1717, was charged with having defrauded the Company of Rylls. 8588: 36, in his paymasters employ, and by an account Currt. entred after their Consultation of the same date, they have brought him in debt to the Compa. Roylls. 21555: 2:15 for which he was Suspended the Honble. Compa. service, and his Effects soon after Seiz'd.

"How far he may be culpable we cannot truly learn, since M. Farmer hath sent away all the necessary papers to England and no books of Accompts having been kept up which renders it impossible to examine into this Affair further then

"what we find upon their Consultations where there are Sev". Articles wherein "Mr. Farmer must have Injured Mr. Shyllings & principally in yo. method taken to "make out ye. "Companys Warehouse on Accot of his debt to Mr. Farmer hath made an unjust "dividend thereof he have taken much ye greatest Part of ye. Course Goods for his own Accot. which will yelld Sixty or Seventy &Ct. advance or more & ye. fine "Goods were dd. ye. Compe. on Shyllings Accot. in part of his debt which will never yeild near ye. Prime Cost, & for ye. Hermitage house which was likewise in partnership between them, he allows him much less than his real moyety of ye. "Cost first & Last who after have. allow'd Seven hundred Dollrs. it was not honestly "done after his suspention to make his own price for it, & what reason Mr. Farmer "could have for concealing any papers of Mr. Shyllings as he did & Some of "Importance as notes for mony due to Mr. Shylling from Rawlings & Sev1. other "papers to a great amo'. till they were after some time & trouble spent to get "them taken from him seems very Strange in ye. Same manner as Mr. Shyllings was "Mr. Garret (who arrd. there on ye. Hester from Bentall 28 Octobr. 1717) charged to have defrauded ye. Company, of Dollre. twelve thousand & Eighty Eight two sucas "& nineteen Cash while he Acted in ye. Paymrs. Employ provd by a survey made of "what had been expended in that time & ye. Sev". depositions as given against him "hy Mr. Shyllings for which he was likewise suspended ye. Comps. servee. & ordd. "to be confind as by their Consul: of ye. 6 November 1717 & both Mess"s. Shylling "and Garret withot. have. adjusted their Accots. were sent to England ye. former "upon ye. Rochester & ye. other upon ye. Hester which is a direct breach of ye. "Comps. Ords. in ye. 48th. Paragraph of their Lett. # ye. Avarilla dated ye. 15 " Jañ: 1713.

"Hereupon Mess". Farmer, Ellill & Morrice engaged themselves in Bonds und, ye. penalty of 1000 Doll. to stand by each other in case any alteration might happen to be made amongst them from Fort St. Geor. on Accot. of ye. Suspention of these two Gentlemen web. Mr. Farmer was very earnest to conceal by offering his Oath that there were not any such Bonds or other papers of Mess. Shylling & Garret & Ellill in his possession till ye. discovery of them proved ye. Contrary.

"He must be conscious surely of some Injustice done them that he should "thus engage himself wth. Messrs. Ellill & Morrice in bonds to assist each other in opposition to y. Governmt. of Fort St. Geor. his Accot. from Fort Marlbro as well as it was possible to be stated there is herewth. deliverd yor. Hon. &ct."

FIRST, That when Mr. Morrice was at Bantal as Supravizor he began an expensive work of Raising a Turf Fortification there without ordrs. from Bencoolen, & Contrary to ordrs. from Fort St. Geor. & Seems to have been undertaken for his own private benefitt by paying the workmen wth. a Cargo of Goods he carry'd with him, as # y.

following Extract—
"We find upon the Consultation of y°. 30th. May 1718 that Mr. Morrice "while he was there had Entred upon builds. a Turf Fortification round ye. Factory " a work of ye, same kind as that at Murlbrô Fort web, began to fall before it was "half finish'd & therefore provd altogether Useless and could be no defence to ye. " place he must needs see by what had been done at Marlbrô before his departure "how Expensive & needless Such a work would be besides it is contrary to former "ord" web. require that they should at Bentall proceed in no new buildings more than what was absolutely Necessary to preserve ye, health of ye, people & this was done as Mr. Morrice affirms wth. ye. Depty. Gov" leave alone and afterwards "approv'd in a Gen". Lettr. from Marlbrô dated ye. 26 Febry. 1717/8 but no where "mentiond in ye. Consultations which in all appearance Seems to have been undertaken upon Accot. of ye. Cargo of Goods web. he carry'd thither wth. him in ordr. by "this means to dispose thereof to yo. workmen.

SECONDLY That Mr. Morrices managemt. of ye. War with Sultan Guilliamot was evidently designd for ye. resteration of ye. said Sultan Guilliamot in opposition to the late Establishmt. confirm'd from Fort St. Geor. to ye. Apparent prejudice of ye. Hon [ble.] Comps. Affairs as \$\to\$ y. follows. Extract.

"We observe ye. Endeavours he us'd for Establishing a Peace wth ye. Country Governmt. & inspects. all Accots. for wch. purpose he was sent thither whose "Secret Managmt. therein & endavours to conceal all Accots. & papers relating "thereto as appear by the Consultation of 30th. May 1718 is a plain proof he was "Conscious of have taken some ill Steps his Lettre to Sultan Guilliamot earnestly "Entreats. & inviting him to accept of yo. Kingdom wth. great assurance of yo. Hon "Comps. favour when he was plundring and destroying ye. Country round about them and his great Concern to conceal these Letts. by so Stifly denying what "afterwards upon a Search found in his possession among his papers plainly discover "a design of restoring Sultan Guilliamott withot any pretence of reason for so doing but on ye. Contrary to ye apparent ruin of ye. Comp. Affairs in that Kingdom, his "pretence also of being sick to Excuse his neglect of inspecting yt. Accou. & Settling "what might be amiss when it was well known to yo. Contrary by Capt. Graves & others who were then present there is as unaccountable as it was Unjust to Stop ye. " ballances of those Accots for so long time withot any reason yt we can find for it.

THIRDLY That Mr. Morrice was guilty of ords. a most barborous Murther on ye. body of two Malay men in cold blood as Py. following Extract-

"We must now take Notice of an Attestation given by Capt. Graves & three " of his Officers of a Murther committed by Mr. James Morrico while he was "Supravizor at Bentall in Cold blood upon ye. Persons of two Malay men prisoners "of War one of we". had his fingers cut off Joint by Joint & then his head; ye other had head cutt off at first they add that after ye fact was committed Mr. Morrice " oblig'd Sultan Cutcheel Buzar to condemn them. Such actions as these are highly " provoking & Wicked & consequently not to be suffer'd."

FOURTHLY That Mr. Morrice enterd into a Combination with Messrs. Farmer & Ellill in opposition to ye. Governmt. of Fort St. Geor. in case of prosecution from thence on Accot. of their Treatmt. of Messrs. Shylling & Garret as Py. follows. Extract-

FIFTHLY That M<sup>r</sup>. Morrice Joind w<sup>th</sup>. M<sup>r</sup>. Farmer in his unjust Prosecution of Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Shylling and Garret and is answerable first both to the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Company as that Affair was managed in many Respects directly contrary to their ord<sup>rs</sup>. and also to the Gentlemen themselves when they shall have an oppertunity legally to recover Damages for the Injurys Sustaind and also for all other irregular misconduct of M<sup>r</sup>. Farmers in which he joynd as a party.

Treasure, Books, papers &ct. but in transporting the Comprs. Slaves from thence [to] Batavia, the said Boat was by them run ashore and lost web, being the only thing of value he had saved from the hands of Malays, and cost him near 1000 Spanish Dollars, he hopes Your Hon. &ct. will take this addition to his misfortunes into Your consideration, and make him some allowance for the same, she having been actually employ'd in the Honbie. The Honble. Court of Directors in their Gen<sup>II</sup>. Letter by the King William having been pleas'd to take notice of the decay in their Customs, I beg leave to lay before yo<sup>r</sup>. Hon<sup>r</sup>. &c<sup>t</sup>. the reasons of it, w<sup>ch</sup>. indeed will be no more than a repetition of w<sup>t</sup>. I have w<sup>th</sup>. great concern been oblig'd verbally in severall Consultations to acquaint this Honble. Roard w<sup>th</sup>. and the Spring, its too well known arise[s] from the long drought we have labour'd under, but I think it necessary to particularize on this occasion, that the affair may more clearly appear at home to prevent any aspersions.

#### And First

It is well known that most sorts of Bengall Goods have differ'd near 40 \$\varphi\$ Cent from what they us'd to be, and even at these prizes few or no buyers, and the Quantitys imported much less than usuall. The Pattans, that [w]ent to S'. Thomâ, us'd to be our cheif Import<sup>rs</sup>. and thô some time after our President persuaded them to return, yet in Consideration of their having paid Customs there, I was oblig'd, (and the Board Agreed) that they should have some favour shown them in ye. Custom.

Secondly, The Elephants imported here for these two years last past, were not of half the Value they us'd to be, by reason the Ownrs. would gladly have sold them, at any rate almost, rather than maintain them at so great an expence, for rice is their Cheif dyett.

Thirdly, There us'd to come yearly from Ganjam, and our northern ports, a great number of grain Vessels, we'h. the drought that had reach'd those ports, now prevented, and thô many Vessels were persuaded to come hither wth. Grain from the Southwd. yet it was thought convenient for the encouragement of others to import their grain here to be very moderate in the Customs, and thô we took five P Cent upon what we Valued it at yet we agreed that valuation should be at a medium price.

Fourthly, The Persia & Surat trade have faild, and by the drought & Lowness of the Markets of those ports, there has been but little goods imported from either of those places.

The truth of what I have here asserted is so well known to yor. Honr. &ct. that I need not add any thing more but my assurances of being

Books to England on Ship Rochester was thrô. the Provision<sup>11</sup>. accompts. affirming that they were so erroneous that they could not be Ballanc'd as may be seen by his remonstrance at that time presented to the Board, and M<sup>r</sup>. [Hi]ngton then likewise producing his Storekeep<sup>rs</sup>. accots. wen, were so scratch'd & alter'd by M<sup>r</sup>. Shilling in entering one sort of Stores for another that he declar'd 'twas impossible for [him] to bring up his Storekeep<sup>rs</sup>. accots. or ever make up his remains on the spott, wen. I think was very proper the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>r</sup>. ought to be Wittnesses of, as they could not agree wth, the Gen<sup>11</sup>. Books that the blame might not hereafter be thrown on me as my neglect in detecting s<sup>d</sup>. affair sooner however as their safe arrivall in England takes off the danger as might be objected, shall submitt to the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>rs</sup>. determination in that affair.

The Gen<sup>11</sup>. Books was order'd to be Copy'd by the Bookkeep<sup>r</sup>. w<sup>ch</sup>. if not done was not my fault it being impossible to be expected that any at the head of affairs can thrôly inspect into all the Gentlemens Employs thô by the King William and the George Brigantine the Consultations, Letters and other Acco<sup>15</sup>. were remitted to Fort S<sup>t</sup>. George, as also a Letter of advices by Cap<sup>t</sup>. Norgatt in the Elizabeth to Gov<sup>r</sup>. Collet, but not the Gen<sup>11</sup> Books w<sup>ch</sup>. were behind hand on my arrivall, & being to begin on a new footing it requir'd time to bring them up w<sup>ch</sup>. was impeded by the troubles in the Country, thô often call'd on the Bookkeep<sup>r</sup>. to do it, I have gone thus farr in answering in general to the 4 articles of the first head but it can't be expected in reason I should be able to decend to particulars barely by memory w<sup>th</sup> out any help or assistance of my Papers, or the respective Diarys or Consultations of those times, it will be excusable on the aforesaid reason.

CONCERN. SHIPS SENT THITHER & TOUCHING YE, WARRS.

The reason for sending the Europe Ships to Bantall, was of absolute necessity for the preservation of the Hon<sup>blo</sup>. Comp<sup>ys</sup>. Settlem<sup>ts</sup>. in those parts, the Sold<sup>rs</sup> at Bantall were most of them sick, and we had none to spare them from Fort Marlbrô Cap<sup>t</sup>. Irving & M<sup>r</sup>. Newcome being both out w<sup>th</sup> several partys, the one aginst Padree Parremar and the other at Cattown wherefore was obliged to send them to supply the place w<sup>th</sup>. Provisions and other necessarys, the Command<sup>rs</sup> having orders to assist them with men out of their Ships according to their Charter party agreem<sup>t</sup>. w<sup>th</sup> the Hon<sup>blo</sup>. Comp<sup>y</sup>. w<sup>th</sup> out w<sup>ch</sup> countenance & assistance from those Ships those places must have suffer'd wherefore hope my good intention herein will meet w<sup>th</sup>. the best construction from Yo<sup>r</sup>. Hon<sup>r</sup>. &e<sup>t</sup>.

As for dispatching Ship Hester to England wth.out compleating her Lading, it was occassion'd by the troubles in the Country, and her bringing but ten Tons of Pepper from Benjar towards her Lading, we agreed to dispatch her home conformable to Honble. Compys. orders to dispatch those Ships first that had lain longest on demorage, and her time being near out the Commandy. would not stay any longer then the expiration of his Charter party time, we prepar'd to get our Letters, Consultations &ct. ready to be sent home by said Ship & hope that Affair is not so much a peice of misconduct but upon considerations of the several reasons & misfortunes wth. at yt. time occur'd, to disappoint our expectation of a sufficient quantity of Pepper, as we should certainly have had, had not been for the troubles in the Country, I may be excusable (as design'd for the best) before our Honble. Masters to whose decision shall readily submitt.

As to the troubles occassion'd by Padree Parreamar it happen'd thus, Capt. Irving told me there was a Padree who liv'd inland wth. the Oran Gunno's, that had Pepper in his Country, had desir'd to come to Bencoolen, & thinking it might be of service to the Honble. Comp's. by procuring & promoting the Pepper trade, was thought convenient to permitt him, the first time he came to the Fort, he assur'd me that he had Pepper, Wax &ct. in his Country, for weh. Commodity I agreed to take of him as much as he could procure at the same rate as the Honble. Compr. paid at Fort Marlbrô, giving him ten Dollars as an earnest to secure all the Pepper he could bring, at his first coming he brought but few People in his retinue who went away to bring the Pepper, about a month after he return'd wth. some Pepper to Bencoolen, when the Oran Gunno's came down every day in small parcells, every one bringing Pepper, Wax or some what else for sale, by wch. means their numbers encreasing gave us suspicion of some ill design, upon wch. I desir'd Capt. Irving to go to him at Bencoolen, to know the meaning of his bringing so many People wth. him, and to tell him I wanted to speak wth. him at the Fort. Capt. Irving brought answer, that ye. Padree said that most of the People had brought Pepper and other things for sale and that the rest came out of respect to him wth. all saying that he would come to me in the Evening, accordingly he came from Bencoolen towards the Fort wth. a great body of Men arm'd we'h. being apprehensive of not thinking it safe to permitt ther e near approach, we beat to Arms, and plac'd a Gun to clear a bridge by we'h. they must pass if they attempted by force to come in, after weh. Capt. Irving was sent to

said Padree to acquaint him that if he would come in wth. a few attendants he might, otherwise 'twas not allow'd him, Capt. Irving mett said Padree on the other side of the Bridge, and deliver'd said message, who upon hearing our Drums beat, and seeing we were prepar'd for him he seem'd much surprized and told Capt. Irving he would come to the Fort, next morning wth. a small retinue provided Capt. Irving would come to Bencoolen, and stay at his house as an Hostage for his safe return weh, he of his own accord promis'd to do and accordingly next morning went, and found the Padree endeavour'd to evade his coming to the Fort as agreed on, and by some means or other getting intelligence that the Padree had some ill design against him and seeing the Oran Gunno's getting their Weapons ready, he went out as upon some Business, and retir'd towards York Fort where a small Guard constantly resides, by the time he had well gott there he heard some fireing woh. was done by the Gunno's upon our Buggeeze guards, weh. they return'd, upon this Capt. Irving came riding to Fort Marlbro crying out to Arms, on web. the Soldrs. were order'd out to meet the Enimy under the Command of Capt. Irving, and Capt. Gorden wth. about 50 Men accompany'd him in that expedition where on the plain near Bencoolen, they mett wth. some party of the Oran Gunno's, who resisting our People, several of them were kill'd & others endeavouring to escape over the river were destroy'd by our Inhabitants.

About the same time that the Padree was at Bencoolen, Sultan Guillamott enter'd the Country to the Northwd. and march'd as far as Cattown to joyn Rajah Quaso, after whom Mr. Ballet wth out any orders from Marlbro sent out Capt. Jeddree wth. the whole force of the place w<sup>ch</sup>. gave encouragem<sup>t</sup>. to Rajah Mansore likewise to enter the Country w<sup>th</sup>. a strong body of Men and to proceed to Bantall, and he not only burnt the Buzar there, but drove all the people away except Rajah Gondong, the 4 Dattues and a few other Malays who stood by Sultan Cutcheel, all the rest of the Country declaring for Sultan Guillamot, web. reduc'd the place to such extremity, that we were obliged to take any measures we could to secure it, till such time as force might be spared for their assistance weh. was impossible to be done at that time as has been before related, wth out I should have manifestly expos'd Fort Marlbrô to the like danger by divesting it of its whole strength wherefore was obliged where we had not force to oppose them, to use faire means wch. was the occasion of that proceeding (and not according to the hard construction of opposing y°. Establishm<sup>t</sup>. as setled from hence) and it had so good an effect that they not only got provisions in their great extremity, from the Enemy, but likewise preserv'd the Peppr. Plantations in the Country, for the [re] was not one destroy'd during that cessation, thô the contrary is aserted, but that destruction happen'd afterwards when Capt. Irving by Mr. Cooks order was sent against Sultan Guillamott, to drive him up into the Country web. made him desperate, and occassion'd that mischeif and loss to our Honble. Masters, the circular Letter found by Capt. Jeddree at Sublatt fully explains the occassions of the Warr, in woh. Padree Parremar was in confederacy, a translate of said Letter is remitted to the Honble. Compy. for their perusal to whom desire to be referr'd on this head.

## Touche, the Salt Affaire.

I must beg to be excus'd if I deny the charge laid against me under that head, for I never endeavour'd or design'd to engross the Salt trade, but always gave the liberty to Malays, China Men and others, who would bring in grain to receive Salt in Exchange at the setled rates, woh. I take rather to be a supporting than opposing sd. establismt. and I hope if the bringing Rice and Paddy is thought such an advantage to that Setlemt. I might have the liberty of making some small advantage thereby as well as all other persons under the Honble. Compys. protection at the same rate as they did espeically when I was inform'd by the Storekeepr. (who was the first proposer of it) that 'twas a thing that usued to be done and some advantages made thereby, however it was never so farr given into, as to give any reasonable grounds to that supposition of its being the occasion of the troubles in the Country, for its sufficiently known they arrise from another cause, besides 16000 or 17000

Bamboos of Salt, cannot be of that consequence (w<sup>ch</sup>. if it was bought at 25 \$\to\$ Cent) to prejudice the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>ys</sup>, affairs since it was the Customary price on all Country Goods, sold to their Serv<sup>ts</sup>, out of the Godowns w<sup>th</sup>.out asking what they did w<sup>th</sup>, them besides there was a third part of that quantity dispos'd of and I then gave M<sup>r</sup>. Kington the then Storekeep<sup>r</sup>, repeated Orders to deliver Salt to the Malays &c<sup>t</sup>, on the afor[e]said establishment of w<sup>ch</sup>. I have Wittness, w<sup>ch</sup>, w<sup>th</sup>, the aforesaid reasons I hope sufficiently clear me from the imputation of the 4<sup>th</sup>, head as well as in Your Hon<sup>rs</sup>, &c<sup>t</sup>, Judgment, and I doubt not but it will do the same in the opinion of our Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Masters, whose goodness and encouragem<sup>t</sup>, have sufficiently experienc'd and doubt not still the same continuance.

# Touche. YE. BUILDS. FORTIFICATIONS & REVENUES.

After the troubles with. Padree Parramar to prevent another attempt of the like nature, and to defend the Honbie. Compys. Estate, Setlements and Servts. lives and having nothing to trust to but a rotten paggar wth in three foot of the Buildings wch. were all of Timber and other combustible matterialls, 'twas agreed by aprobation of all the Council as well as the Pangorans and Dattues, and thought of the utmost importance to erect a Turf Wall for the safty and present defence of the place as well as security of the Buildings from fire, wet might have been easily effected by the Enimy by night, and since 'twas impossible to have waited on such an emergency for orders from Fort St. George, I wholy remitt this affaire to the consideration of the Honble. Compy, not doubting but they will rather be induc'd to approve of said charges, than that I should have hazarded the loss of their whole Estate on the West Coast for want of such a work, for had the head Setlemt. fell, the rest must of course web, were dependant on it, and then the whole blame would have inevitably fallen on me, for not using all manner of meanes for its preservation, of two evils human prudence directs us to the least wherefore hope for the favourable censure of the Honble. President &ct. on his head.

The like work at Bantall was absolutely necessary the Buzarr being their burnt, and the whole Country against them, so that they could not command a quarter of Mile of Ground, and their Paggar in so weak a condition that hoggs and horses came in and out at pleasure (and in some places ready to fall) by weh, the Malays might get in by night, and if not cutt them all off, yet set it on fire, according to their accustomary way of doing mischeif, besides the weakness of the [ir] Garrison weh, could not be reinforc'd at that time by us for the reasons aforesaid, of Mr. Newcome's and Capt. Irvings being out in the Country weh, all the people we could possibly spare, and if my word may be att all credited, I take the liberty to assure ye. Board we had so much to do at our own Doors, thro: the occassion of the unhappy troubles in the country, that it was not in our power to help them weh, made it necessary for them to do the best they could for the defence of that place the Workmen being paid in Mony and Goods as Customary.

The Buildings were not in a very good Condition on my arrival w<sup>ch</sup>. the Paymaster had orders to repaire continually on their report of a want thereof, w<sup>ch</sup>. I take to be the usual method taken in such matters, having issued out mony sufficient for that purpose, as will more throughly appear, recourse being had to the Paymaster's Acco<sup>to</sup>. charg'd on the head of Repairs at Fort Marlbrô and the same at Moco Moco, w<sup>ch</sup>. was never stop'd nor hinderd, but the troubles in the Country prevented the bringing in Materials, for carying on said work, w<sup>ch</sup>. is all the reason I ever was acquainted w<sup>th</sup>. for its not proceeding forward.

The Brick house bought of M<sup>r</sup>. Ellill was thought to be of use on many occasions but especially in case of an accident whereby we had been obliged to have brought Provisions &c<sup>t</sup>. up to the Fort, for it was the only Brick building we had near for security of such things, w<sup>ch</sup>. was one motive, thô the Cheif was its being built by M<sup>r</sup>. Shylling (of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>re</sup>. Materials, as we afterwards found w<sup>th</sup> out any Order or leave from the Board) for M<sup>r</sup>. Ellill, and in the latter part of M<sup>r</sup>. Shyllings time, on a difference between them it was charged to him, but he not having

wherew<sup>th</sup> all to pay for the materials, I was the rather induc'd to consent to the payment of what he had layd out thereon, than that the Comp<sup>y</sup> should receive from their Interest therein, and on the other side I think it would not have been just, to have taken it wholely from M<sup>r</sup>. Ellill w<sup>th</sup> out making him satisfaction for his part w<sup>ch</sup>. was desir'd but at prime cost, w<sup>ch</sup> is the true reason of that purchase and shall humbly submitt to Your Hon<sup>r</sup>. &c<sup>t</sup> favourable and candid censure.

As to the Gaming License, on my arrival the Pangorans brought me several Papers, w<sup>ch</sup>. the Supervisors and Deputy Gov<sup>rs</sup>. had granted and Confirm'd that priviledge for many years, they then said that if the Gaming License was taken from them, they would let all their Pepper Plantations run to ruin w<sup>ch</sup>. they said they would have done on M<sup>r</sup>. Shyllings taking it from them but being advis'd that a Deputy Gov<sup>r</sup>. was come they bore it in hopes of a redress and finding them resolutely bent to have persisted in their design 'twas then thought fit by the majority of the Board to grant them their ancient priveledge as at large inserted in our Consultations on that affaire w<sup>ch</sup>. is transmitted to the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>r</sup>. and as for the Anchorage on Prows w<sup>ch</sup>. was esteem'd as a hardship by the China Men and the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>rs</sup>. Orders being to encourage them as much as possible, to draw them to the place I can't say any more thereto for want of the liberty of surveying the necessary papers relating to that affaire, it being so long since the transaction of that affaire, that tis almost impossible I should be able to give an acco<sup>t</sup>. thereof by my memory.

Touch<sup>6</sup>. Goods s<sup>b</sup>. to be D<sup>b</sup>D in Paym<sup>r</sup>. to y<sup>e</sup>. Buggeezes, Malay workmen and Cloath<sup>6</sup>. the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>xe</sup>. Slaves.

I beg to be excus'd from saying anything to this Article, wherein the Paym<sup>t</sup>. of the Buggeeze and Malay workmen is said to be made by me in Cloth, before I have the Inspection of the Books and Papers relating thereto but this I can say, that I [know] of no inovation that way, but everything in that kind was transacted according to the usuall manner, as I believe the Acco<sup>ts</sup>. will make appear when compar'd on w<sup>th</sup>. another.

The Slaves not being cloathed wth. Goods from the Honble. Compys. Warehouse, was occassion'd by the Warehouskeepr. report to the Board, that he had not proper Goods of the Compys. for that purpose, therefore he was Order'd in Council, to purchase them were he could and believe the Honble. Compy. cannot be against by those sorts of Goods of one any more than another and had they not been Cloathed twice a Year as usuall, their clamours as well as disorders might have proved of ill consequence, in their desertion as well as other ways, every Body knowing the difficulty of keeping them in due obedience from running away upon any discouragemt.

# Touch of the Suspens of Mess s. Shylling & Garret.

The suspension of Mess<sup>rs</sup>. Shylling and Garret for sundry abuses by them committed against the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>y</sup>. and pursuant to my Covenants w<sup>th</sup>. my Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Masters, of sending home any that were detected of defrauding them, they were sent to England to acquit themselves before the Directors, w<sup>th</sup>. the depositions, vouchers and charge against them, none of the Counc<sup>11</sup>. the n making any objection, leaving this affair to the determination of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>y</sup>. to w<sup>ch</sup>. shall submitt, and as to my offering M<sup>r</sup>. Newcome a present of 400 P<sup>s</sup>. to the best of my Memory I solemly declare I never desir'd M<sup>r</sup>. Ellill so to do nor had I any reason for it, as to the Dividend of Goods in partnership w<sup>th</sup>. M<sup>r</sup>. Shylling I thought it but reasonable to take the Course Goods I brought w<sup>th</sup>. me from Fort S<sup>t</sup>. George for my proportion.

As to the hermitage house, for my Moiety M<sup>r</sup>. Shylling charg'd me 700 P<sup>s</sup>. w<sup>ch</sup>. upon examination the whole was found to cost but 800 P<sup>s</sup>. said house was bought by me at publick Outcry for 700 P<sup>s</sup>. w<sup>ch</sup>. upon laying the case before they thought it but reasonable to allow M<sup>r</sup>. Shylling 100 P<sup>s</sup>. more and to take the house to myself.

The papers of M<sup>r</sup>. Shylling was in my Custody to recover some Debts from the Malays, in order to pay his Creditors and not kept thrô any fraudelent design, as appear'd by my delivery of the Mony Bills w<sup>th</sup> out con[s] traint.

As to the Bonds between Mess<sup>18</sup>. Ellill, Morris and myself they were made only for the defence of each other, in a fair just and hon<sup>ble</sup>. way, as reference being thereunto had will appear, and not in opposition to the Governm<sup>t</sup>. of Fort S<sup>t</sup>. George, the nature of said Bonds will demonstrate whether their was any necessity, for my offering to take an Oath to conceal them.

GENTLEM'S.

Having answer'd the charge exhibited against me, in the best manner the present posture of my affairs will permitt, and having no asistance from my papers, books or any thing but my memory, w<sup>ch</sup>. thrô this 12 months trouble and removealls has been so much harrast, that its next to an impossibility I should be able to do it to that effect, and in my own defence so fully as I intended, yet I leave the whole decision of these affairs to the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>y</sup>. and the Laws of my Country, therefore having been dismist the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Comp<sup>ys</sup>. service by You I demand the liberty to go to England by the first Ship, to seek a redress for those losses and hardships I have met w<sup>th</sup>. in the discharge of my Duty.

That one Thousand Spanish Dollars should be paid to [me] at the rate of 15 Dollars & ten Pags. in consideration and full satisfaction for a vessel belonging to me wch. was taken up by Mr. Thoa. Cooke and Council of the West Coast to preserve the Honbie. Compys. Treasure and Stores from the hands of the Natives, on the expulsion of the English from thence wch. said Vessel was ran on Shore by their Slaves in going from Bencoolen to Batavia and lost, and Whereas They have made the condition of the aforesaid payment such, that in case the Honbie. Compy. should disapprove there making me that allowance, I would oblige myself to refund the whole or any part thereof as they shall think to order.

I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors or Administrators for the Complyance herew<sup>th</sup>. and do acknowledge to have rec'd the Sum of six hundred sixty six Pag<sup>s</sup>. twenty four fanams (being in full of one Thousand Spanish Dollars at the rate at 15 Dollars & ten Pag<sup>s</sup>. as allow'd me) of the Hon<sup>ble</sup>. Presid<sup>t</sup>. & Council aforesaid in Fort S<sup>t</sup>. George this sixth day of July One Thousand seven hundred and Nineteen. I say rec'd & me.

Board w<sup>th</sup> and the Spring its to well known arrises from the long drought we have labourd under but I think it necessary to particularize on y<sup>1</sup>. Occasion that the Affair may more clearly appear at home to prevent any aspersions.

# -FORT ST. GEORGE, JULY 1719—

First its well known that most sorts of Bengall goods have differ'd near forty P Cent from wt. they usd to be and even at these prizes, few or no Buyers, and the quantities imported much less then usual.

The Pattarrs that used to be our cheif importers went to St. Thoma and thô some time after our Presidt. perswaded them [to] return yet in consideration of their having paid Customs there I was obliged (and the Board agreed) that [they] should have some favour shown them in the Custom.

SECONDLY The Elephants imported for these two Years last past were not of half the Value they used to be by reason the Owners would gladly have sold them at almost any rate rather then maintain them at so great an expence (for Rice is their cheif diet).

THIRDLY There used to come Yearly from Ganjam and our Northern Ports a great Number of Grain Vessells, web. the drought that had reachd those parts now prevented and thô many Vessells were perswaded to come hither wth. Grain from the Southward, yet it was thought convenient for the encouragement of all others to import their Grain here to be very moderate in the Customs and thô we took 5 P Cent upon what we valued it at yet we agreed that Valuation should be at a Medium price.

FOURTHLY The Persia and Surat Trade have fail'd and by the drought and lowness of the Marketts of those Ports, there has been but little Goods imported from either of those places.

The truth of what I have here inserted is so well known to Your Hon. &c. that I need not add anything more but my assurances of being

Estate will come out deducting Funeral Charges yt. he may recover the cost of Suit Orderd to be paid in the Mayors Court since it is no more then wt. he consented to at St. Thoma.

In obedience to your order of the 21st. ulto. we shall now lay before your Hon. &ct. an account of the Salt provisions, a store of which has been always thought necessary to provide annually for the Security & Service of the Garrison, and for sev11. other occasions.

The Store we had remaining in May 1715 wth. what we recd. by the Mary Buoyer that year from Bengall was 12 Casks of beef and 43 Casks of pork and the year following in 1716 we recd. by the King George and Prince Frederick from thence four Casks of beef & 25 Casks of pork, web. is 16 Casks of beef and 68 Casks of pork the whole amounting to Pag\*. 2167. 35. 5. of web. by the Stewards report, and a Survey thereupon taken in March 1716/17 there was found eleven Casks of beef and 15 Casks of pork decay'd and spoild amounting to Pags. 660. 20. 11. and was accordingly wrote off in our books to Proffit & Loss.

Upon this loss it was resolv'd to demand no more salt provisions from Bengall, but that for the future what was absolutely necessary for the Garrison, should be pack'd up by the Stewd. here, which in all likelyhood will prevent any more such considerable losses, since by experience our provisions salted, and pack'd here is found to keep better, than what we have lately had from Bengall of which there is two Leaguers of beef, and 161 Leaguers of pork more dedcay' & spoil'd, which

In obedience to yor. Commands I have survey'd all the Fortifications and buildings in the Honbie. Companys bounds at Fort St. David, with Mr. Thos. Wright the Paymaster and Mr. Thos. Launce the Gunn and Surveyour there, and find what done, and remaining to be done Vizt.

At the Fort in ye. North East Bastion the Govrs. house, Servants lodgings, with those for the military, the Gunroom and Armory, Storehouses, and Godowns finish'd, there remains the Square opposite to the Sorting place to be built, with the needfull Godowns Cookroom &ct. the foundation of wch. is laid, and the timber work ready; In the Sorting place that part to the Southward I find very much decay'd for want of being well timber'd; there are prisons and other necessary Godowns wanting along the North Curtain, where the old barrucks for the Soldiers now stand; The East Curtain & South East bastion not yet begun, but the Parapet of the South Curtain compleated; the two Gate ways are to be made new, and a bridge to the Front gate when the Moat of water is cleansed and over the back Gate is to be built the Chappell; a proper building for workmen is made 76 yards distant from the North East bastion with rooms for the Sub Paymr. the Stores and workmens tools; the bridge between the Fort and the Callaway is so much decay'd, that it requires to be new built; on the side of the ditch towards Tevenapatam town some fences of Caldera, Milkhedge &ct. to be made to keep the water from the Town, and also to defend the part going from Body Chittys choultry to Upliwaddy.

At the garden the walls round are finished A new stable wth a room for the Groom, and horse furniture is made for 24 horses, the old one tumbling down, there's also rebuilt the upper part of the small lodging room, on the South West Side of the

garden where the White Aunts had destroy'd the buildings; opposite to the North West may be made a pidgeon house, in the room of that pull'd down in the Fort, to make the buildings uniform.

There's wanting a verando at each Side of the Garden gates to Shelter the Soldiers.

The wall of the burying place in ye. Callaway is compleated.

The edge of the bounds is secur'd well by the hedge and Palmeira trees, being well grown, and clos'd together, and y<sup>c</sup>. points that way would have been min'd as yo<sup>r</sup>. Hon<sup>r</sup>. &c<sup>t</sup>. order'd, but for apprehending of danger by that work of their falling down, but upon reviewing them I find it practicable; I likewise observe that the middle and tail points lie open and liable to Surprize, w<sup>ch</sup>. may be remedy'd by building a small brick compound.

The Guard house at Trepopilore is in a falling condition, and according to order should have been remov'd to the edge of the bounds if other necessary work had permitted so that remains to be done, & herew<sup>th</sup>. I present a draught.

Chemundulum Choultry is a Guard of twenty men and an Ensign, but lies very open, and consequently in danger of being Surpriz'd, which may be remedy'd by building a small wall round it.

Upon reviewing Condapah Choultry I find it very much out of repair.

There is a Choultry at Bandipollam built to secure the cloth from the Weather, and other accidents; The Guard at Bandipollam is in a very bad Condition, and requires at present a yearly charge to keep the mudd Walls in repair, we if faced with brick would Secure it, and put a stop to that Expence.

The Fortifications in Cuddalore I find as follows, The Ravelin at Mollimo, The Demi Ravelin at Porto Novo wth. the Porto Novo Point; the room for the Ensign, and the Curtain wall from thence to Chillumbrum point finish'd; Chinjee point is rebuilt, & the Curtain from thence to Trivadee, and to Golcondah finish'd, the Gateway is remov'd as was order'd, and the Guard house wth. ye. officers Lodgings, prisons &ct. for the Main guard, compleated, Golcondah, and Dieu Points wth. the Curtain all finish'd, and the Wall from Dieu to Metchlapatam point carry'd on four feet high; The round Redoubt is to be demolish'd and the materials brot. to this work.

There now remains to be done Metchlapatam and Vizagapatam Points, near the Ferry boat wth. a Ravelin near the Factory; Porto Novo Gate to be alter'd, and Chellumbrum Gate to be remov'd, Chellumbrum bastion to be rais'd, and min'd wth. Trivadee & Vizapore and Magazines at every other bastion all round; The Curtain wall to be rais'd about two feet from Chellumbrum to Chingee, and a foot bank to be made all round.

The ditch on the West C. Side of Cuddalore to be cleans'd.

The Factory and buildings adjoining thereto remain to be done, and the old Warehouses will serve for part of the foundation of that Ravelin.

The Land Customrs. choultry and burying place compleated.

The Doctor complaining for want of room for sick men in the Hospitall, the addition he requires to have made will cost about Four hundred pagedas.

FOURTHLY. That the Inhabitants of the Petta [shall be] clear of paying Quit rent or the like [to] the Honble. Comp<sup>a</sup>. for 3 years from the 1<sup>st</sup>. of Febry 1717/18, at the Expiration of w<sup>ch</sup>. they request the stated duty of Quit rents [...] fanams each house Pann. & 3 fa<sup>s</sup>. each.

FIFTHLY. That the Poligars be p<sup>d</sup>. from that time [...] fanam for each house, and the like for [each] shop  $\mathfrak P$  ann. & no more.

SIXTHLY. That the Houses grounds and all other Appurtenances of the Pagoda there be made free from all dutys whatsoever, as also [the] Braminy, and other the Servants of the said Pagoda.
