That all Shopkeepers whatsoever that makes use of any measures & weights shall likewise appear at the Choultry to give in their names & the places where they sett up their Shop that a Register be kept of their names, the places where they keep their shops, & the number of measures & weights deliver'd to every one of the Shopkeepers, as likewise of those us'd at the Banksalls and Choultrys for the better Inspection of the Justices.

3dly. That at any time if any shopkeepers be call'd & order'd to produce the measures & weights which has been deliver'd to him & he does not produce them all, but conceals them under pretence of their being lost, he shall be liable of being punish'd at the discretion of the Justices as it will be thought he may have lessen'd the measures & weights.

4thly. That there be a reward appointed for those persons that will discover to the Justices of any frauds that may be practis'd either by the Farmers or Shop-keepers by making use of false measures and weights especially any without the Companys chop.

5thly. That if any measures & weights breaks that they be immediately brought to the Choultrys by those persons to whom they belong and others to be returned them with the Companys chop.

6thly. That there be no other measures & weights us'd but what are made of iron & brass & those weights to be distinguish'd by having a Mallabar & English Character putt upon them.

7thly That as the Honble. Company was at the Charge of making measures & weights when they had the Cornmeeters Duty in their own hands, that the Farmers now of that said Duty shall be at that Charge of making new measures & weights when they are wanted.
