Troughton doe goe with the Presidents letter to the Dutch Chief for them, & that they carry a Pardon to be delivered, if they can not be received without it.

The Painters of Trepopulore appearing this day in Councill, say that the Dutch at Pullicherry, have inveigled some of their trade, to leave this place & inhabitt, there, & that they are now pressing with these to doe the same; wherefore takeing into consideration the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. orders for encourageing Painters, Weavers, &c^a. Artists in cloth & painting, the Land Customers of Cuddalore & Tevenapatam, are ordered to value Tappies at 5 Pag^s. per double corge, and such Tappies as are sent to Pullicherry by Land to pay $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent; but there being an order made soon after our arrivall here, that such goods as is sent from hence overland to Porto Novo doe pay 5 per Cent, the same is confirmed, for thô Weavers, Painters, &c^a. Artists may leave this place to be protected at Pullicherry vett we conclude they will hardly goe to the unguarded town of Porto Novo; & the R^t. Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. revenues by Tappies here, being considerable, the Sea Customers are ordered to receive their Custome on the price of $6\frac{1}{2}$ Pag^s. per double corge.

Complaint made relateding to Slaves,

There being a complaint made that severall slaves were brot. from the Ackle Nague's woods to the water side to be exported on Shack Nina Mercons ship which lay at an anchor about 2 miles to the southward of our bounds, & that some of the said slaves were stolen from their relations inhabiting here, & considering that such practices are of evill consequence upon many acctts., an order was signed last night, for Gunner Twyman with four souldiers to goe on board Shack Nina's ship & bring her into the Road of Cuddalore, & the owner on shoar, he being an Inhabitant of this place, & took leave of the Governour lately to goe to Queda.

– SEPTEMBER 1697 –

And in sending last night for one particuler child, that was stolen from hence, our Peons discovered about 22 more, who all declared they had been trapand & kidnapt, & the Ockle Nague's People being conscious of their own villany, run away & left them; & said 22 Persons appearing this day before us in Councill, they were Examind, & ordered to be restored to their severall relations, severall of woh. are inhabitants in the Rt. Honble. Companys bounds.

DAY 23.

Said Shack Nina's ship being ready to goe on her voyage, considering the Capt. Mock-near approach of the Monsoon, it is agreed that he & Captain Mockdum Nina give Shack Nina a bond, that his ship shall not touch at any place on the Coast of Cormandell, give a bond. neither for this voyage nor for future, without leave first had & obtained from the Governour under forfeiture of paying to the Rt. Honble. Company 2000 Pagodas.

The Loop holes of the wall round Cuddalore being too high for the souldiers to make use of, the Paymaster is ordered to gett Coolys to raise the ground in all such places where tis necessary.

The Measurers haveing been often complained of, that they have wronged in measure, & the inhabitants desireing that they might be permitted to measure their Measures be Paddy themselves as in Madrass; Ordered that the Measurers both at Cuddalore & discharged. Tevenapatam be discharged.

30TH.

Whereas some of the inhabitants have imprisoned others for debt; & many Persons times it happens the imprisoned have not wherewithall to subsist; in such cases the imprisoned for debt. Justices of the Choultrys are to make due inquiry, & if they find that the Person or persons is not able to maintain him or themselves in prison, the Justices are to acquaint the Plaintiffs, that they must maintain him or them in Prison, and if they refuse to doe it, the Justices are ordered to discharge him or them from their confinement.
