On receipt of a Generall Letter from the Hono^{ble} Presid^t &c^a dated the pr^o Inst the Council mett to consider of the best measures we could think of for buying Paddy for stores they having agreed to the sending one thousand Pagodas to the southward for that use if we think it may be had at a cheaper rate then waiting the coming of it in After the same was debated t was resolved in the Negative for the following reasons viz being but low in cash could not conveniently spare so much money not knowing how to be supply d but by land (no money offering upon bills) w^{ch} was hazardous and could the money be sent can have no assurance of its coming out cheaper than what may be bought here in March and Aprill w^{ch} tho somewhat dearer yet is better for keeping and therefore the properest for stores besides have no convenient Grainavvs to lodge it in w^{ch} if ordered may be built by that time

The severall Juncanneers between this Place and Madrass being five in all within about a third part of the way expecting their Tashereifs usall at Xmas which are to each three yards of Sarge a Peice of Bettlas and a Turbitt and nine fanams in money to their Servants tis agreed the same be given to them as they come for it that they may have no pretence to stop our Peons &c^a

Both setts of Merchants being earnest with us to be Tashareift at Xmas as usuall and to deme them what was accustomed might make them dissatisfied twas therefore agreed for encourageing them to bring in as great a quantity of goods as possible for the Bedford to give them their said Tashareife in Yellow Broad Cloth having no other in the Godown fitt for it and it having been always usuall at the same time to Tashareife the Cheife Dubash with three yards of the same as the Merchants receive twas agreed that Vincate Ksnah who acts in said employ at Present do receive the same for his encouragement in consideration of the smallness of his Psy [sic] and Chinnapa the Town Conicoply of Cuddalore serving as Chief Conicoply at the sea custome house there without pay from the Company tis agreed that he be tashareifed with two yards of ditto Cloth as usuall for encourageing his fidelity which hitherto hath been unstained and Sonda Brollojee haveing been lately serviceable to our Masters twas agreed to present him with five yards of fine Sarge to make him a Coate

Eram Rauze & Woode Naique Reddy pays into the R^t Hono^{ble} Companys cash pag^e six hundred ninety four and sixteen fanams being for their first quarters rent of the Bounds ending the ult September last past And Mr Farmer offering Pag^s three hundred and fifty on bill of Exchange on the Hono^{ble} President &c^a payable to Mr William Fraser twas agreed to be received and paid him to defray the Generall Expenses conformable to their Ieave, for drawing small sums on them for conveniency of trade

There being lately arrived from Court a new Harcora who is a kinde of an Inquisitor into all affaires of this Province he sent his servants into these parts to get what he could and in his Circute coming to this Place twas agreed to give him five yards of fine Sarge that his master might not think we wholy slighted his servant which would make him invent some Lyes of us

Serg^t de Bang having a great family and not able maintan them on his bare pay and being sober trusty and faithfull in his Duty is on his humble Request for his encouragement permitted to make a voyage to Collumbo and return to his Duty again in three months but to receive no pay whilst absent

Mr Bulteel being ordered Scavenger of Tevenapatam by the Hon^{ble} President &c^s in August last past and having made provision of carts Buffoloes &c^a for the same as also taken a list of all the houses in Towne under their Number of Gradation as formerly done at Cuddalore amounting to one thousand one hundred and five houses of all sorts including hutches did this day send the same in to us when at Consultation which being considered of twas agreed that he might Collect and receive at present the income thereof (as twas done at Cuddalore) and to collect for the first quarter from the Pr^o October last past

The cheife Gunner representing that there was about ten candy of Country Gunpowder which having been long made was decay'd in strength by keeping twas agreed and ordered that the same be delivered out to be new made with an addition of saltpetre

Jn^o Johnson one of the Gunmen Crew on his Request is discharged the Companys service and Jacob Peeterson another of ditto Crew having not behaved himself well is ordered to be turned out of the service and the Companys Bounds

A considerable number of Weavers lately coming into the Bounds requesting a Place to settle a Town by themselves and having pitched upon one to the Southward of Cuddalore without Porto Novo Gate being high sandy Ground and fit for nothing elce twas agreed to permit them to build their town there and that our cheife Bricklayer line out the streets thereof regularly, so as our guns from the town may clear the same and that no house be built nearer the town

The Deputy Governor reports that on the 31st past month he received of Mr Mountague acco^t his Collections of Customes of Cuddalore Pag^s five hundred also of Manⁿ Gonsalvis &c^a Pag^s two hundred acco^t their arrears of rent of the Bounds for last year

Gungaram Governor of Waldore son of Surrup Sing Governor of Chingee being suddenly to be married of which he wrote to the Deputy Governor adviseing the same and it being accustomed for all friends Relations and dependants to send presents on such occasions and the neglect thereof is esteemed an affront and we being comprehended amongst the number of his friends there being at present a good understanding between us Cannot at present without disobleidging him (which may be of ill consequence to our Masters Affaires) avoid presenting him at this time Which being considered of twas agreed and ordered that the following things with the usuall Compliment be sent him by our Egibb viz

Which with the charges of our Egibb will in all stand in about thirty pag^s wherein have been as frugall as possible considering the quality of the person sent to the occasion of sending and the necessity of continueing a faire correspondence and right understanding with him

The Cooper of this place being lately dead and it being absolutely necessary to have one belonging to the Garrison and James Walker late Cooper of the Advice Frigatt being here who we understand is a sober man and well understands his business twas therefore thought necessary to entertain him in the Gunroome Crew, at the same pay of the late Cooper he refusing to serve under and being rather desreous of going to Madrass

Jn^o Gardner haveing served sometime in the Gunroome and being an artist in Navigation hath since his comeing hither applied himself to the study of Gunnery and is now as our Chiefe Gunner reports well versed therein as also a sober man and we wanting such a person for Cuddalore twas agreed being thought absolutely necessary to entertain him as Gunners mate there and to allow him at present four pag^s per month with a promise to prefer him higher if any vacancey happned which he is satisfied with in hopes of better preferment as it falls tho he could have much better pay to go mate of a ship which he is capable of

Jn^o Drung a soldier designed for the West Coast and three saylors that belonged to the Advice Frygate the first desireing leave to go to Madrass and the latter to be cleared of the service their request is granted

Yesterday noon arrived here the Sarum in Tevenapatam Road and the Master came ashore in the Evening and bro^t a Generall Letter dated the 28th past month on opening said letter the Warehousekeeper was ordered to lade what bales he could in the morning by the Tevenapatam boats none being to be had at Cuddalore that day and to send his orders to the Master of said ship, to receive the Companys bales on board Also the Paymaster is ordered to place Tappies on the Road betwixt this and Fort St George as usuall conformable to the orders of the said Generall Letter

Being mett in Councill the Warehousekeeper reports that he sent off all the boates procureable in Tevenapatam being seaven on each of which he sent six Bales which makes forty two and that he had sent his order to the master of the ship to receive them

And the Paymaster reports that he dispatched the Tappies as ordered and tis agreed to continue to lade the ship with all possible expedition

The Hono^{ble} President &c^a having ordered us to buy up fifty Gearse of Faddy for that Garrison of the best sort for keeping the Country a store and that bro^t in by Land to Cuddalore being the best procureable here for keeping the Land Customer is to take perticular acco^t dayly of the prizes and quantity bro^t in that so soon as considerable quantities come in he advise thereof that he may receive money to buy it for the occasion above mentioned

Receiving advices in our forementioned Generall Letter of Dow d Cawns being within three or four Gentue Leagues of Madrass and that he is suddenly expected at St Thoma and it being not known upon what occasion or whether he may stay or come further this way and the Hono^{ble} President &c^a being apprehensive of troubles order our putting the Garrison into the best posture of defence Wherefore tis agreed and ordered that the Povnt and Gate called Chungee be finished with all possible expedition and that the Mudd wall and Pallasadoes be viewed by the Commission Officers and cheife Gunner that upon their report they may be repaired where there is occasion

And the Storekeeper is ordered to deliver out more saltpetre for making of Gunpowder as fast as the Powder Makers can worke it up and that the Commission Officers Cheife Gunners and Gentleinen of Arms be ordered to be vigilant and carefull in their respective employes and that all things be in a readvness under their respective Charges

Receiveng after 12 Last night a Gen^{ll} Letter from Fort St George wherein we understand that Dow d Cawn by order of the King (as per enclosed Translate of a Husball Hookham from Assed Cawn) has besett Madrass stoping all commerce haveing seized some of their goods & Plundered some of their out Towns threaten ing to attack their workes from whence it is Reasonable for us to Conclude that if he be disapointed of doing farther Mischeif there as we hope and believe he will that he ll endeavour to Revenge himselfe on this Place Therefore tis ordered that we put ourselves into the best Posture of defence as soone as we can according to the Result of last consultation in order whereto tis further ordered that all bricks belonging to whatsoever Persons which are ready burnt be taken for the Comp^{as} use to finish as soone as may be the new Battry and Gate called Chingee and that the Carpenter go about makinge the Gate for the same and that as many Topass soldiers that are Likely men be entertained as offer themselves and that one hundred Stout Peons as our occasions may require be also Listed

- 10TH In the late Deputy Governor Mr Frasers time four morters were ordered to be made two for the Fort and two for Cuddalore for the shells we had in this Garrison as per Consultation of [*lacuna*] two of which were made but the other two for want of Copper could not be then done but Lately some arriveing from Madrass tis agreed that about two Candy of said Copper be bought and that the other two Mortars be forthwith Cast for the better defence of Cuddalore aganst any attempts that may be made by Dow d Cawn

And whereas the last yeai severall of the Council were appointed to Command the severall Points which we think not so convenient as that any of the Council in Cuddalore may repaire to such Places where there may be most occasion for them and the Council at present consisting but of four besides the Deputy Governor two whereof (viz Messrs Ingram & Farmer their Residence being in the Fort and the other two Messrs Mountague and Games at Cuddalore) tis agreed that they who reside at the Fort use all due care for security thereof and the Town of Tevenapatam and those at Cuddalore to do the like there and the Deputy Governoi will be in a constant Readiness to give his assistance where he shall still find most occasion but supposing that Cuddalore will be the Place most likely to be first attackt tis thought requisit that he reside there till ocasion obhldges him Flee where

but that you the Gentlemen of Council who have long resided in the Place will throughly informe the new Dep^{ty} Governour the Present Circumstances of all the Companys Affairs and give your best assistance and advice for the future well being thereof and this wee strictly requie as an Incumbant [sic] Duty upon you

1st Wee recommend to you the care of the Investment of which the Company and the Government here have very much complained and your Place is better Situated for the providing cloth than this Yett considering the Price and goodness of ours here have come out hitherto much cheaper than yours which we hope by the future care of the now Dep^{ty} Governour twill be Effectually remedied And whereas last year by the dearness of cotton which was from 18 to 20 Pag^s per candy and now at 14 as also by means of the many and great Contracts made by all European Nations we were forced to advance 6 per cent which we hope now the Merchants will abate Cotton being 20 to 25 per cent cheaper which noth now encourage us to order an Investment to be made in your Place for one hundred thousand Pag^s according to the List that comes herewith and to enable you to Contract for the same We lade on this ship the Lovall Cooke thirty thousand Pag^s and other Stores as per Invoice and Bill of Lading inclosed, so desire you to hasten the same that we may not want a good Cargoe for the January shipping And we must not omitt to recommend to your care the well sorting washing and Packing of all your Goods

2^{dly} Wee Recommend to you the encreasing and exact Collecting of the Comp^{as} Revenues But lett it be in such manner as mav rather encrease than decrease or drive away the Inhabitants

3^{dly} You are all very sencible of the great Losses and charges the Company have been at in these Parts By means of the late Troubles so that as a Help to regain the same we must desire you to be very thrifty in all sorts of Expences but not in such a manner as to be prejudiciall to the Companys Honour or Interest and whereas the Generall Table was taken away in Mr Frasers time We leave it to your Prudence to revive the same or keep them at Dyett money and if the former we doubt not but that the Dep^{ty} Governour will take a particular care that it be managed with all the good Husbandry immaginable the monthly expences of which all included we order to be remitted hither in the Generall Letter

4^{thly} Wee have sent you on this ship some silk worms (under the care of a Fellow from Bengall and two others that have been Instructed in this Place their wages as per Paymasters List enclosed) of which we desire your utmost care and Industry to promote and incourage the making of silke we doing the same here and find no manner of obstruction but the want of mulberrv trees which wee are daily Planting and hope notwithstanding the Barreness of our soile twill answer the end and if so there can be no doubt twill be much easier effected in your Parts your soile being so much better We have sent to Bengall for People to wind off the silke and shall send some of them to you as soone as they arrive

5^{thly} Wee are very sencible of the ill accommodation the Company have for their Servants and more particularly at Cuddalore which Place is of the greatest Consequence to them, and the Merchants chiefly Resideing there and it being the Place of Trade in these Parts so thõ we don t enjoyne the Dep^{ty} Governour to Reside there Yett we desire that he will frequently visitt and Encourage the Inhabitants thereof And whereas the Company have no Factory fitting for the Dep^{ty} Governour to live in it being so very much run to decay and out of Repaire and the Situation of it being so ill and inconvenient that we can t think it adviseable to be at the charge of fitting it up but there is a house and good Ground of Mr Havnes s which stands very conveniently near the River and upon the highest ground in the town so that in time with some addition it might be made a very convenient Cittadell there being a necessity of having one the Town being for the most part of it well fortified for which reason there must be as many or more of the Military kept at Cuddalore than Tevenapatam so we leave it to you the Dep^{ty} Governour and Council to treat with Mr Haynes for his house and ground if you find it of service to the Company, and advise us thereof

8thly Wee also desire a frequent Correspondence with you and that nothing of Moment happens but that you give us early and speedy advices thereof

9thly Wee desire that it may be a standing order that the Warehousekeeper delivers in an acco^t every month of what goods for Europe he has in the warehouse and that you remitt it us

10thly In our Generall Letter from the R^t Hono^{ble} Company by Mr Roberts we received the following clause Whatsoever goods Merchandize or Commoditys they or any others in the ship bring to the Fort they must pay you for our acco^t ten per cent on the full value thereof Besides freight Custome and Incident charges and must be accordingly deducted out of the Commission if belonging to any of the four and if to any others out of the amount of their goods which you are to observe and collect the Duty Mentioned therein upon all China goods which shall be landed out of the Loyall Cooke and return us an acco^t thereof that so we may remitt the same to the Company
