Read a Generall Letter from the Honoble. the Governour and Councill of Negapatam dated the 8th Instant N.S.

This day was laid before Us a draught of the House designed in the Garden which was approved of, and the Care of the building of it, and the inspection thereof was referred to Mr. John Bridges Pay Master and Ensigne Robert Reay to whom it is earnestly recommended that all imaginable good Husbandry and Thriftiness be used, and Particularly that the materialls of the old House be expended in the building of this new one.

Whereas by an order from the President and Councill of Madrass, Serjeant Carter is ordered to officiate as an Ensigne in this Garrison, Severall Petitions was presented to Us, vizt. Daniel German, Job Smith, William Campier and John Jones, the two former requesting to be made Serjeants or their pay to be advanced to Marshalls pay which Wee takeing into Consideration are of opinion 'tis properer to advance their pay to four pagodas per Month, they being not qualified for the office of a Serjeant, and there being a want of Serjeants in this Garrison, ORDERED that William Campier and John Jones be made Serjeants in this Garrison, the former to officiate at the Fort and the other at Coodalore.

The Merchants this day attended in Consultation according to Summons, to give their answer about the Investment, when they acquainted Us that the present Scarcity and dearness of Cotten in the Country disabled them from undertakeing it upon the same prizes that were given them the last Contract, and that except Wee would advance to them Tenn per Cent upon the Severall Sorts of Goods in the last Contract, they could not bring in the Company's Cloth up to Muster and be savers, which Wee takeing into Consideration are of opinion not to offer them anything more than the last prizes without order from the Honoble. President and Councill of Madrass.

Two Hundred large planks about 18 and 20 foot long and between 2 and 3 Inches thick this day offering for sale at Thirty pagodas per Hundred and the Company haveing occasion for them. ORDERED, that they be bought for the Company's [use] and that the Deputy Governor pay sixty Pagodas for the same, and that the Storekeeper take care of them.

President and Councill of Madrass dated the 14th Instant & pursuant to the directions therein Wee have already lodged Letters in the Hands of the Governors of Negapatam & Trincombar, directed to the Supra Cargoe or Captain of any Europe ship, adviseing that the six ships seen off Madrass the day of the date of the abovesaid letter, were Dutch, and bound to the Southward, in order to precaution them from being intimidated which may occasion their standing so farr off to Sea to avoid them as may endanger their over shooting the Fort of Madrass.

Read a Generall Letter from the Honoble. the Gov<sup>r</sup>. of Negapatam adviseing that the Parr mentioned in our Letter of the 20th of May last, and laden with Goods belonging to the Merchants Inhabitants of this Place, and seized by the Dutch resideing at Collesgrepatnam, was by order from the Honoble. the Governour of Zelon &c<sup>a</sup>. Council of Columbo released, with all her Goods from the arrest she lay under, and delivered into the Hands of the Master of the said Parr, for account of the concerned.

Read a Generall Letter from the Honoble, the Governor of Trincombar adviseing that the Letter Wee sent him inclosed directed to the Supra Cargoe or Commander of any English ship, he had received, and would pursue our request in sending it on board if any such ship appeared in sight of their Port.

The Deputy Governour reports to Us that last Night he had received Information that the French at Pondicherry had sent to Sea a small vessell with two Masts Carrying five Gunns and had put on board her sixty Europeans and Forty blacks with a great quantity of all sorts of ammunition and Provisions, the vessell is commanded by Captain Bouyno and the souldiers by Captain Legondy, which give Us great reason to suspect she's bound a Cruizing. Wee have therefore thought Convenient, and its hereby ordered, that a letter be immediately writ to the Honoble, the President and Council of Madrass to advise thereof and since it is impossible for Us to receive timely directions from them, and in Consideration that we have no advices of the arrivall of Europe ships, Persia ships, and others expected, We therefore think it highly necessary, and 'tis therefore ordered that a Generall Letter be wrote the Honoble, the Governours of Negapatam and Trincombar, and inclosed there in Letters to the Supra Cargoes or Commanders of any English ships requesting that if any should appear in sight of their Ports, they would be pleased immediately to send them on board, in which letter it's ordered that advice be given of the abovesaid vessells being sent to sea by the French for their precaution & to prevent being surprized, 'tis also ordered that Cattamarans be laid both to the Southward and Northward of this place with the same advices.

Mr. James Lyde Late Storekeeper on Satterday last was unfortunately drowned going to swimm in Trevendiporum River, and having left no will as yett appears or impowered any body else that We know of to Officiate in his Affairs in case of his Mortality, 'tis therefore ordered that the Pay Master Mr. John Bridges with the assistance of Mr. Richard Harrison do take an exact Inventory of everything belonging to the said Mr. Lyde and that the same be putt up at Outcry or otherwise disposed of for the most they will yield and that they also take an exact account as far as they shall be able from his own accots. or they can learn otherwise of what Money or Goods he has sent to Sea, & of all Debts that are due to him & likewise of all owing by him to others and afterwards to lay the same before Us in Consultation to be entered accordingly, out of which they are to deduct his Funerall Charges, and in said account enter the Particulars thereof.

It is also ordered that Mr. Duke Faunce do Assist as Storekeeper in the roome of Mr. Lyde deceased and that he take a Particular account of the remaining Stores and See if they do agree with Mr. Lydes account remains.

ORDERED that Captain Manuell De Silva's Son be permitted Padre Paule De Saa's Assistance so soon as he arrives, according to an order received in the abovesaid Letter.

Mr. Edmond Mountague this day tendering Us Sixteen Hundred Pagodas, and We being at present in want of money to defray the Garrison Charges, for last Month, 'tis Agreed Wee accept the same, and give him our bill on the Honoble. President &cs. Councill for the same Summ; out of which it's Ordered that the Deputy Governour pay the Pay Master Fourteen Hundred to defray Charges Garrison for last Month.

Wee haveing information, and it being attested to Us that Jacob Derick said, had he had opertunity he would have run away with the abovesaid Four Men, who was answerd by some that stood by, he ought [not] to talk at that rate, & if he did they would acquaint the Deputy Governour, to whom he answered, he did not Care if they did, which discourse. We apprehend may be of evill Consequence, & not to be talked in a Garrison, & have therefore ordered, that he receive one and twenty Drubs at the post with a rattan, & be imprisoned one week in the Cock House, & for to encourage others to like faithfullness it's ordered that John Beasor & John Bailee, who gave Us the Information, be made Corporals, & have Corporal's pay, to commence the primo next Month.
