This comes by the Bonetta Sloop which after taking in the remaining Madeira & Redwood will proceed with Supplies of Cash to Vizagapatam & thence to the Bay

The Swallow Sloop sailed hence the 29th Ultimo

We approve of your appointing Mr George Stratton as Clerk of the Market

The President has received a Letter from Capt Clive advising of his having engag'd and defeated Ruzza Allee Cawn near Covereepauk He is master of their Cannon and ammunition and so many having been killed and taken Prisoners that we imagine it must disconcert their plan so much as render them Incapable of taking the Field soon, & as Conjeveram is in Mahomed Allee's possession, this is a proper time to send capable People on the survey of the Poonamalee Country that we may thereby be enabled to Judge what damage it has sustained

The Moors are ever averse to paying Money this is the Case in regard to the Tripoty Revenue which by Knavish Shenavass Acherloo has so long detained, inclosed is a Letter from the Nabob to Sampetrow on this Subject if fair means are fruitless compulsion must be made use of

We now send You a supply of Rupees fifty thousand (50,000) which with what may be paid in Account Broad Cloth will we hope serve your purposes till the Arrival of the Europe Ships

Lead bearing a tolerable price you will put up to sale three hundred Candies and send us as soon as possible fifty Candies

Having appointed Mr James Wilson Surgeon at Vizagapatam He will proceed there on this Sloop

Agreeable to your desire the consignments of Bullion for your settlement shall be sent in the specified proportions the marking the Arcot Rupees might we Imagine be a disservice to our mint therefore shall omit it

The Gunpowder by Boneta with the severals by Ship Fort St David are duly received

We now dispatch this Sloop to Fort St George there to take in the remainder of Madeira Wine and Redwood, afterwards to proceed to Vizagapatam with a supply of treasure for the Northern Settlements & then to the Bay

Inclosed is Indent for sundries which you will please to send Us by such conveyances as offer

Being unacquainted with what is customary to be paid for Military & Stores sent from place to place, We must desire your Hon^r &c will please to settle it and pay the same to the Owners

The Reinforcement you have been pleased to send will prove very Beneficial to our Affairs which are much altered for the better and will we hope shortly terminate with success Your Hon^r &c may be assured that we shall not only return these but what came out by the last Years ships also

Advices from Bombay mention that the Shaftsbury had proceeded to Telli-cherry to be dispatched Home, This Place as well as Surat continue in Trouble Letters from Anjengo of the 12th Ultimo advice that our Hon^{ble} Masters Ship the Stretham from England the 26th May, in company with the Wager and Prince George were to sail from Tellicherry to Bombay the latter end of January, That the Escourt & Prince Henry were expected, that the former would be dispatched from Anjengo, but it was uncertain whether they should be able to load the latter

Sloop Porto Bello is arrived from the Eastward, being in a very bad condition we design to send her to Pegue to Refit and return her to you in September

The Warwick sailed from hence the 13th and from Madrass the 24th Ultimo for England

We have already supplied You with the several stores and woud have you take an Exact survey of the Garrison & report the same to us our affairs here have taken a favourable Turn and if they continue so shall by a future Conveyance send You a Reinforcement of Military

Inclosed is a Lieutenants commission for John Seaton, We expect to hear his Behaviour will merit this mark of our favour

Mr Robert Goodere having returned to Europe by Ship London from Bengall, you will settle his Account with the Company & send it us We observe in your quick Stock He stands Debtor Pagodas 2035-3-3

As no one has administered to the Estate of Mr John Churchey, you will according to the Companys orders dispose of his Effects at Publick Outcry, collect such Effects as may be due what may be the Ballance of his Estate you will pay into the Companys Cash advising us of the same

It is with pleasure we observe the Friendly Offices of Viza Ram Rauze, embrace all opportunities of cultivating this good Understanding, with this comes a Letter from the President, to him, and a small Present, which you will forward

We have appointed Mr James Wilson to act as Surgeon at your Place

We have received your Letters of the 4 December 6th & 20th January

You mention to have sent Us One hundred Bales of Callicoes by Sloop Dragon, The Syrang says He received no more than ninety five, in transporting them on board the Warwick Capt Webb insists upon there being but ninety four We have represented this to the Company requesting that if it should appear otherwise to advice Us when you will be Credited for it

By this Sloop Boneta bound to Vizagapatam, we have sent for the use of your settlement Pagodas Ten thousand which you may send for as your occasions Require it will not be in our Power to send you any further supply till the Ships are arrived from Europe

Acquaint Mr Charles Hopkins that we have allowed him twenty Pagodas per Month for his Extraordinary Expences

No successor being yet appointed to the Government of Rajahmundrum, We are unable to form any judgement how our Affairs may go on for this Reason and the hourly Expectation we are in of advices from Home, We cannot at

present say anything to your making a Factory at Coringee as you Inform us Viza Ram Rauze will let that place with the several Districts adjoining you have our consent for taking it on condition you can farm the same to substantial People in the same manner as Suncra Pollam and the Company be no Sufferes [sic]

The Muster of the French Cloth sent us in Extraordinary bad & the price high, but its beyond dispute well known that when all Incident Charges are deducted the Merchant finds his Advantage in dealing with us preferable to the French, Its certain a good deal of bad Cloth is manufactured in the country about you the whole good and bad was generally brought to our Factory, and what refused there was carried to the French as yours and their Merchants are all of the same Familys & whilst this is the case We have no reason to complain

As the Country is unsettled We would have you be very Circumspect, keep no more Money than you have Occasion for and if you suspect any troubles send your Cloth to Vizagapatam

You will look up on it as a standing order that your annual Books be sent up in September and that you will write us monthly the material at the same time forwarding your accounts

When our Affairs admit which we hope will be soon we shall send a supply of Military to Vizagapatam for the Northern Settlements in General

Since Writing the foregoing We have received your letter of the 15th Ultimo and as Conveyances offer shall send you such part of your Indent for Wares and stores as we are able to spare from our own Occasion

The One hundred forty seven Bales of Stree Vencatashum are safe arrived when resorted we shal transmit You the Accot

We are glad to find your business goes on without Interruption at Banda Malanka We imagine the French will not drop their Illegal pretensions to Narsapore River, but by a Change of Affairs Orders from Europe or Compulsion from us, therefore have already approved of your renting that Place, we were the more induced to this from an Assurance that it might be farmed to the Country People without loss, the Government of Rajahmundrum being vacant leaves us still to wait and see whether the Successor may support our Affairs according to our Phiramaunds, The Friendly Assurances of Viza Ram Rauze give us great Reason to believe you will not be molested and if we find our Factory there is to be settled on good Terms, shall take it into Consideration

The Success the Nabobs affairs has been attended with here gives us hopes we shall be shortly able to send you some military, at present what force we have are all abroad and we impatiently wait to hear of an Engagement at Trichenopoly if this ends in our favour we shall immediately send stores and Men to Vizagapatam

By this Sloop Boneta goes a chest containing ten thousand (10,000) Madrass Pagodas for the use of your settlement which will enable you to carry on your Investment Briskly After the Arrival of the Ships from Europe We shall send you a further supply

You will take care to provide for the Security of our Hoñble Masters Effects, It will not be prudent to keep a large Quantity of Cloth or money with you whilst the country is so unsettled On any Emergency send it to Vizagapatam

We depend upon your good conduct and Circumspection in our Hoñble Masters Affairs and that you constantly advise Us of the Needfull

You must look upon it as a standing Rule that your Annual Books be sent up in September & that you write Us monthly your Accounts

All Our Honble Masters Shipping of this Season bound to this Coast and China and the Bay are Safely arrived and We are in expectation of Seeing the Delawar Soon with a Cargo of Slaves from Madagascar.

Your Favour of the 29th October with the Bombay Packets did not arrive with [us till] the 24th Instant, We suppose the Inland troubles may have [delayed] the Pattamars considerably but as they have been so long as fif[teen days on] Journey which is Usual[ly] perform'd in fifteen or [twenty days] believing the fellows must have loiter'd away [a good] there-fore must desire the favour you [will enquire into the cause] of Emergency [] [] Conseq[en] [] as soon as We can be at a Certainty We shall not fail to give you immediate notice

On the 31st October We had a very violent Storm here which has done a vast deal of Damage to the Countiy all about and drove out of the Road all the shipping then lying here being the Colchester Delawar & Brilliant Snow belonging to the Hon^{ble} Company and some Country Vessells, the Colchester has since put into Fort St^t David in a very shatter'd Condition without Masts and the Greatest part of her Cargo Damaged which was almost Compleated But of the others we have yet receiv'd no News, The Delawar and Brilliant were to have been dispatched the day after for Fort Marlbrô The Colchester is now refitting but We are in doubt whether she will be capable of proceeding to Europe this Season
