PREFACE.

The Handbook of the Government of India Presses, of which the present edition is the first under this title, is in fact a revised edition, corrected up to the 30th June 1929, of the Handbook of the Central Printing Office, published in 1899. The latter publication should now be regarded as obsolete.

2. The new publication has been treated in a manner similar to the former Handbook, covering similar ground, and generally setting out the administration of the Government of India Presses. The salient features which have been added to the present edition of the book are the incorporation of classified tables of the personnel, with their salaries, of the various presses, and the addition of Appendices embodying all relevant Government orders relating to internal administration.

3. The Handbook is essentially a guide for the management of the presses and for the use of the controlling authorities.
