## **NATIONAL PRIZE COMPETITION SCHEME FOR PROMOTION OF LITERATURE FOR CHILDREN**

### **Genesis of the Scheme**

With a view to promoting the production of good books for children, the Government of India initiated a scheme for the award of prizes to authors of children's books (or manuscripts) of outstanding merit in all the modern languages of India. The first prize competition under the scheme was organised during 1954-55. The State Governments were requested to invite books for children (including manuscripts) from publishers and authors for award of prizes. Ninety-eight books were received from the State Governments and, on the basis of the recommendations made by the reviewers, 18 prizes of Rs. 500 each were awarded to the best books selected in eight languages, *viz.*, Assamese (1 prize), Bengali (2 prizes), Hindi (8 prizes), Malayalam (1 prize), Oriya (1 prize), Tamil (1 prize), Telugu (3 prizes) and Urdu (1 prize). The results of the competition were announced in January 1955.

### **Second Prize Competition**

The Second Prize Competition was organised during 1955-56. In this competition also, books and manuscripts were received by the State Governments in the first instance. Entries for the competition were confined only to those books which were published during the period 1953-56. The State Governments were requested to set up Children's Literature Committees for reviewing the entries received and to forward six best books in each language to the Ministry of Education. It was also decided that the books received should be divided into two groups—those meant for children of 3-6 years and those meant for children of 7-14 years.

The books recommended by the State Governments were again reviewed by the Ministry of Education through panels of experts set up separately for each language. The results of the competition were finalised on the basis of the merit gradation lists prepared by the reviewers and twenty-three authors of outstanding books/manuscripts were awarded prizes of the value of Rs. 500 each. The details of the prizes were Bengali (2), Gujerati (2), Hindi (6), Kannada (2), Malayalam (1), Marathi (2), Oriya (2), Punjabi (2), Tamil (1), Telugu (2), and Urdu (1). The results of this competition were announced in October 1956.

### **Third Prize Competition**

The Third Prize Competition was announced in February 1957. In this competition, the procedure of the scheme was revised and the rules of the competition were also modified. The entries in Hindi, Sindhi, and Urdu languages were received by the Ministry of Education direct and were examined by a panel of three independent reviewers. The books/manuscripts in other modern languages of India were received by the State Government concerned and were also reviewed by a panel of independent reviewers appointed by the Central Government on the

recommendations of the State Government. The translations of outstanding foreign books were also made eligible for entry into the competition. They were not entitled to any prize; but copies of selected books were to be purchased for distribution to schools.

At this time, a prize scheme for children's books was also being implemented by the Hindi Division of the Ministry and five prizes of the value of Rs. 1000 each were being awarded to outstanding children's books in Hindi. As the *modus operandi* of both the schemes was the same, the Hindi Division's scheme was now amalgamated with this prize competition scheme for children's literature and the number of prizes under the scheme was raised.

In order to help the Ministry of Education in the conduct of the competition, a committee known as Children's Literature Committee was set up in January 1958\*. Taking into consideration the merit gradation list and the reports of the reviewers, and on the recommendation of the Children's Literature Committee, 22 prizes of Rs. 500 each were awarded in this competition. Its details are Assamese (2), Bengali (2), Gujarati (2), Hindi (5), Kannada (1), Malayalam (1), Marathi (2), Oriya (1), Punjabi (1), Sindhi (1), Tamil (1), Telugu (1), and Urdu (2). The results of the competition were announced in March 1958.

#### Fourth and Fifth Competitions

The Fourth and the Fifth Prize Competitions were organised during 1958-59 and 1959-60 respectively on the same lines as the Third Competition. The following prizes of Rs. 500 each were awarded:

\*It was reconstituted in December 1959 with the Secretary of the Ministry of Education as its Chairman.

The results of the Fourth and Fifth Competitions were announced in March 1959 and November 1959 respectively.

#### Sixth Prize Competition

The Sixth Prize Competition was organised in 1960-61, and on the recommendations of the Children's Literature Committee, the number of prizes was raised to 30—15 prizes of Rs. 1000 each and 15 of Rs. 500 each. The Government of India, however, reserved the right to withhold any prize announced without assigning reasons.

The Children's Literature Committee, which meets annually to finalise the results of the competitions and to advise the Ministry of Education in all matters pertaining to the development of children's literature in the country, scrutinised the reviews of books entered in the Sixth Prize Competition and recommended the award of 5 prizes of Rs. 1000 each and 23 prizes of Rs. 500 each (the total number of awards being 28). The prizes were awarded in the following languages:—

The results of the competition were announced on the 14th November, 1960, *i.e.* the Children's Day.

#### Seventh Prize Competition

The announcement of the Seventh Prize Competition was made in January 1961, the number of prizes announced being the same as in the sixth competition.

The Children's Literature Committee which met in November 1961 to finalise the results of the competition, examined the books and manuscripts recommended by the reviewers and decided to award 7 prizes of the value of Rs. 1000 each and 21 prizes of the value of Rs. 500 each. Thus the total number of prizes awarded under the competition was 28. The details of the awards are given below:—

The results of the competition were announced on the 14th November, 1961, i.e. the Children's Day.

### **Eighth Prize Competition**

The Ministry of Education has recently announced the Eighth Prize Competition of books for children under this scheme. Entries in Hindi, Sindhi, and Urdu languages, will be received by the Ministry of Education direct. Entries in Assamese, Bengali, Gujerati, Kannada, Kashmiri, Marathi, Malayalam, Oriya, Punjabi, Tamil and Telugu, are to be submitted to the respective State Governments. Prizes would be awarded only to the authors of books/manuscripts which, in the opinion of the Government of India, are of outstanding merit. The amount of each prize will be Rs. 1000 and the total number of prizes to be awarded shall be specified from time to time by the Government of India who have reserved the right to withhold any prize announced without assigning any reasons. The age-groups for which books would be considered are 5—8 and 9—14. The last date of receiving entries in the Ministry of Education as well as in the State Governments is 1st May, 1962. The detailed rules of the prize competition may be seen at Annexure I.

### **Purchase of Prize Winning Books**

The Government of India purchase not more than 2000 copies of each prize-winning book subject to two conditions: (1) the illustrations, printing and get-up of the book should be satisfactory; and (2) the price of the book and all other terms of purchase (such as discount allowed, etc.) should be acceptable to the Government of India.

Orders for the purchase of the prize winning books are placed with the publishers by the Ministry of Education and the publishers are required to supply the books direct to the State Governments according to a distribution list prepared for the purchase. Payments of the bills for the books purchased are made after acknowledgements have been received from the State Governments to whom the books have been submitted.

In order to advise the Ministry of Education in the fixation of price for bulk purchase of each book, a Technical Committee has been set up. It examines each book and determines its price.

Copies of most of the prize-winning books from first to fifth prize competitions have been purchased and distributed to the schools, children's libraries, etc. through the State Governments. A few books of IV, V and the majority of books of VI competitions, which remained unpurchased so far, are now being purchased. The prize winning books of VII Prize Competition will also be purchased in due course after their prices for bulk purchase have been determined by the Technical Committee.

The total expenditure on the scheme is about Rs. 100,000 per year and is met by the Government of India.

### **Decentralisation of the Scheme**

It has now been proposed, in consultation with the Children's Literature Committee, to decentralise the administration of the scheme to the State Governments in certain particulars. The main object of the decentralisation is to simplify the existing procedures and to eliminate delays. The decentralised scheme will be implemented with effect from 1962-63.

### **Conclusion**

The Children's Literature Prize Competition is organized annually to encourage the production of suitable literature for children. It is gaining popularity and has done a good deal to improve children's books. It is hoped that the books which will be entered in the future competitions will show a better standard of production and help in the education of children who are the future citizens of the country.

## ANNEXURE I

### CHILDREN'S LITERATURE EIGHTH PRIZE COMPETITION FOR

The Ministry of Education announces the Eighth Prize Competition of books for children under the scheme "Production of Literature for Children and Teachers". Authors and publishers who are interested in Children's Literature may submit interesting and attractively brought out books (this expression will also include manuscripts) suitable for children.

#### 2. Prizes

- (1) Prizes shall be awarded to the authors of books which, in the opinion of Government, are of outstanding merit.
- (2) The amount of each prize shall be Rs. 1000/- (Rupees one thousand only) and the number of prizes to be awarded shall be specified by Government from time to time; provided, however, that Government shall have the right to withhold any prize announced without assigning any reason.
- (3) The Government of India reserve the right to pay 20% of the Prize money in the form of National Savings Certificate or Treasury Savings Certificate or Small Savings Certificates.

(2) Five copies of every book entered for the competition shall be submitted.

(3) Each individual entry should be accompanied by a treasury chalan of Rs. 3/- (if submitted by an author) or Rs. 5/- (if submitted by a publisher). The amount should be deposited in treasury or sub-treasury under the Head "26-Education Miscellaneous Literature for New India". Where no treasury or sub-treasury exists, entry fee may, as a special case, be remitted by a crossed postal order in the name of Education Officer (Section B-3), Ministry of Education, Government of India, New Delhi. Remittance by means of cheques, cash or money orders will not be accepted. Entry fee once deposited shall in no case be refunded.

(4) Each entry should be accompanied by the following information/declaration certificate in English or Hindi either typed or clearly written on the back of title page of every copy of book/manuscript submitted.

- (i) Title of the book with its meaning.
- (ii) Age-group for which the books is meant (a) 5 to 8 and (b) 9 to 14.
- (iii) Name and address of the author (if Government servant whether a gazetted or a non-gazetted officer, designation, name and place of office.)
- (iv) Name and address of the publisher.
- (v) Year of publication.
- (vi) Language.
- (vii) Whether original work or translation (in case the subject matter of the book is based on some other book, the original source should be mentioned).
- (viii) Lowest price at which the book can be made available to the Government for bulk purchase of 2,000 copies (other terms, as for example, trade discount, sales tax, freight etc, should also be specified).
- (ix) Number of the treasury chalan.

(5) Each entry must be accompanied by a declaration signed by the person participating in the competition in the following form:-

"I have read the rules of the competition and agree to abide by them and I also hereby certify that this book has not received



a prize in any competition conducted by the Government of India/State Government or any organisation with the help of funds received from a Government Department”.

### Signature

(6) Entries must reach the officers mentioned on page 2, on or before 1st May, 1962. Entries received after the last date will not be entertained. Deficiencies in the application, if any, may, however, be rectified for which a grace of 15 days may be allowed.

#### 4. Eligibility for the Competition

(1) The competition shall be open to all citizens of India subject to provisions in respect of Government servants mentioned in sub-rule (2) below.

(2) Officers and staff of the Ministry of Education, Government of India, and their dependents shall not be eligible to take part in the competition. Other Government servants may participate in the competition provided they obtain necessary permission of their departments.

(3) Textbooks shall not be eligible for the competition—“A textbook means a book prepared specifically for class room instructions”.

(4) Translations, reproductions or abridgements of other books, without proper authority from the person holding the copyright of the original, shall not be entertained.

(5) Only books published within two years prior to the date of the announcement of the competition i.e. during 1960–62 shall be eligible for entry. Reprints of books whose first edition was printed earlier than this prescribed period shall not be admissible for the competition.

(6) Books written by authors who are not alive shall not be admissible for the competition.

(7) Entries submitted for an earlier competition shall not be admissible. Translation of a book which has won a prize in the earlier competition is also not admissible.

(8) Government publications in which the copyright rests with the Government of India or the State Government publishing the book shall not be eligible for the award of prizes; but copies of books selected may be purchased.

(9) Books which are printed in newsprint shall not be eligible.

(10) No book which has received a prize in any competition run by the State Government or Government of India or any organisation with the help of funds received from a Government Department or any International Competition shall be eligible for being entered into this competition.
