## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The principal streams passed are the Nāri and its affluents which are crossed several times in the first 24 miles; the Gandakindaff between Bābā Kach and Kuchāli; Dāda and Kuriāk between Dalūjāl and Spintangi; Loē Lahr and Sarē Lahr between Spintangi and Sanri; Sūr wām, Shahēdar and Punga between Harnāi and Shāhriḡ; Ambōh, Khōṣṭ and Dirḡ *māndza* and the Zhizhgai, latter between Māngi and Kach and the Kākar Lora. The last part of the road between Kach and Pishin is in good condition. The water-supply along the whole route is obtained from running streams or from springs and is generally good and abundant. The water at Kach is considered laxative. There are bāzārs at Sibi, Spintangi, Harnāi, Shāhriḡ, Khōṣṭ and Pishin and shops at Nākas, Māngi and Kach, where ordinary native provisions in limited quantities are procurable. For supplies in large quantities, and for fowls, eggs, milk, sheep and goats, fuel and fodder at these places, and for supplies at all other places previous notice should be given to the tahsildārs through the P. A. concerned. The country between Sibi and Spintangi lies in the Sibi Sub-division, from Spintangi to Kach inclusive in the Shāhriḡ tahsil of the Sibi district and Gharkai and Pishin in the Pishin tahsil of the Quetta-Pishin district.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Road, partly metalled and bridged, but impassable in winter owing to snow especially near Ziārat. The highest pass (8,600') on any cart-road in Balūchistān crossed at Ziārat Tsuri (c. 4 m. from Ziārat). Between Kowās and Smālan it was traversed on their way to Persia in 1614 by Richard Steel and John Crowther, English merchants, who mention Dureus or gates of mountains (apparently Dhrē Tangi), Coasta or Kowās and Abdūn or Hamadūn. Ruins of three villages known collectively as Sēh Kōṭa and separately as Kāravān, Rāni and Dōm Killas are seen in Wuni valley, 4 miles from Chautēr. Gandak and Sarāntangi lie in Quetta tahsil; Kach, Kabān and Ziārat in Shāhriḡ (Sibi district); Chautēr and Smālan in Sanjāwī (Lōralai district). Khansamas are stationed at Kach, Kabān and Ziārat from May to September. Water good and abundant at all places, but at Kach, laxative and at Gandak, scanty. Ātā, grain, fuel and native provisions are procurable from shops at Kabān, Ziārat and Chautēr (May to September), Smālan (½ dozen permanent shops) and Kach (1 permanent shop), fodder, eggs, fowls and milk obtainable at Ziārat (May to September); for other places previous notice to tahsildārs concerned through P. A. necessary. During season conveyances run between Kach railway station and Ziārat; baggage camels can be reserved on application to thānēdār, Ziārat.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The track lies mostly over *paṭ* and is easy going in ordinary weather, but becomes difficult and indeed almost impassable after heavy rain. Mal lies within the Sibi tahsil, and Shāhpur, for purposes of political control is included in the Sibi subdivision. The intermediate stages lie in the Lahri Niūbat of Kalāt, but the P. A., Sibi, exercises political control over the Dōmbki and Kahēri tribes. There are villages and banias' shops at each stage, and ordinary native provisions and fodder are obtainable in small quantities, for larger quantities previous notice should be given to the P. A., Sibi. Limited drinking water is obtained from wells, and the quality is said to be fair except at Thēri, where the water is brackish. For troops intending to use this route, previous notice should be given to the P. A., Sibi.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Up to Dinghān the country is open and easy. After this the path enters the hills and turns in an easterly direction to Lōṭi, whence it takes a southerly direction as far as Kabōdrāni; after Kabōdrāni it again turns in an easterly direction. Sibi and Mall lie in the Sibi tahsil of the Sibi district, the country from Thēri to Lahri is in the Dōmbki country, from Dinghān to Khajūri in the Bugṭi tribal area, and thence onward in the Mazāri (Panjāb) limits. In ordinary years grass and fuel are obtainable at each stage.

Previous notice for supplies should be given to the P. A., Sibi, for places between Sibi and Khajūri (inclusive), and to the Deputy Commissioner, Dēra Ghāzi Khān, for the other stages.

An alternative route, which lies in comparatively more populated and better cultivated country, would be from Lahri to Phulēji (Kahēri village c. 16 m.), Shāhpur (Bugṭi levy post and a Sayyid village. c. 21 m.), Shahr Karam Khān in the Nasirābād tahsil (c. 18 m.). Sanri levy post in Nasirābād (c. 19 m.), Malguzār (c. 15 m.), a village in Nasirābād, Puchār Adya (c. 20 m.), a village in the Kashmōr circle of the Jacobābād district, Shāhwāli (c. 18 m.), a Mazāri village in the Dēra Ghāzi Khān district and Rōjhān (c. 18 m.). ## XXV.—TRAVELLERS' BUNGALOWS'

There are three kinds of travellers' bungalows in the district—(i) dāk bungalows, (ii) rest-houses and (iii) Political, Civil and Military Works inspection bungalows:

Officials drawing Rs. 100 per mensem and over, N. C. O.'s and private gentlemen, are entitled to accommodation in a dāk bungalow on payment of one rupee a head for every 24 hours, with half and one-fourth fees for short stays not exceeding six and two hours respectively; in a rest-house the charge is eight annas with half fees for less than five hours. Officials in superior service drawing less than Rs. 100 per mensem and European soldiers are entitled to shelter in a special room set apart in the compound on payment of one anna a head for every 24 hours, with reduced fees for lesser periods as above. Servants are housed in out-houses; sepoy, police, etc., in the adjoining shelters or bardāshtkhānās, free of charge. One anna and six pies a day are charged for every horse tethered in the compound of a dāk bungalow and rest-house respectively. Eight annas a day is charged for each tent pitched in the compound by a person not using the dāk bungalow; four annas is charged for each wheeled vehicle, palanquin or tent and one anna for each horse, package, box, etc., remaining more than 24 hours in the compound before or after the arrival of the owner. In dāk bungalows the khansama supplies food at the prescribed rates (soldiers at half rates) and also cooks provisions furnished by travellers on payment of eight annas a day per head. In rest houses travellers must make their own arrangements for supplies and cooking but where possible the man in charge provides wood, etc., on payment. None but Government officers, travelling on duty, can stay in a dāk bungalow for more than 48 hours if other officers require accommodation, unless specially permitted by the officer in charge.

These bungalows are specially reserved for departmental officers on tour. The gazetted officers of the department owning the bungalow have prior claims to accommodation in order of seniority; subject to this rule, the officer in charge of a bungalow may lend it, without payment, to any gazetted officer of any other department travelling on duty, and may also permit others to occupy it, when available, for a period not exceeding seven days.
