*Read* Government Order, Finance Department, No. 59, dated the 27th January 1921.

**RESOLUTION.**—The Governor in Council is pleased to sanction the introduction of the provisional time-scale of pay as shown in the accompanying statement for the subordinate Judicial clerical establishments in the Presidency Proper.

2. The scales should be introduced with starting pay at a stage in the new grade equal to present pay or the minimum of a new grade with effect from 1st September 1922, *i.e.*, on the pay payable on 1st October 1922, subject to the proviso that no one should draw less than his present salary.

3. The introduction of the time-scale of pay involves a large excess over the permissible cost. It has therefore been decided to reduce the proportion of posts on the scale of 105—5—140 to posts on the lower scale approximately to 1 to 3 and the number of superior posts should be as shown in the statement. It has also been decided after examination of the work done per clerk in the various Courts to reduce the number of clerks in the lower division. The number of those posts should be reduced as shown in the statement pending further investigation into the matter. The reduction has been made provisionally *pro rata* at five per cent. except for the Ahmedabad, Broach, Surat and Thana Districts in the Northern Division and the Ahmednagar and Ratnagiri Districts in the Central and Southern Divisions, where it has been made at ten per cent. owing to the unsatisfactory results of the examination of the work per clerk in the various Courts in those districts. The District Judges should carry out the reductions with effect from the 1st October 1922 or as early as possible. The statements of work done per clerk in the various Courts should be forwarded for the information and further opinion of the High Court.

4. The District Judges are requested to submit at an early date estimates for advance increments and arrears as though the time-scale had been introduced from 1st March 1920 on the lines laid down in paragraph 7 of Government Circular, Finance Department, No. 438, dated the 25th June 1920.

5. Temporary establishments of the strength of 1 clerk on Rs. 85 and 1 on Rs. 30 for Joint and Assistant Judges and 2 clerks on Rs. 30 each for 1st or 2nd Class Subordinate Judges are sanctioned for each temporary appointment of Joint, Assistant and Subordinate Judge. Permanent men should be deputed on promotion to the posts of Rs. 85 and temporary men should be entertained in their place on the minimum pay of the grade of Rs. 30— $\frac{5}{2}$ —80.

## CIRCULAR.

In their resolution in the Financial Department No. 3585, dated the 8th November 1911 and in their order in the Financial Department No. 2901, dated the 16th April 1919, Government have allotted permanently to the Northern Division for distribution among the District Local Boards, grants of Rs. 1,82,000 and of Rs. 2,14,000 respectively. The former grant is intended for objects other than educational such as the improvement of communications, water supply and village sanitation and the proper equipment and maintenance of dispensaries, the expenditure on roads and bridges having preference in all cases in which additional outlay on such works could be incurred with advantage; while the latter grant is to be devoted solely to the repair of roads.

2. In order to enable the District Local Boards to form an approximate estimate of their probable allotments from the said grants the Commissioner lays down the following general principles on which he proposes to distribute the grants in future.

The grant of Rs. 1,82,000 will be distributed on a combination of—

(1) the average cess receipts of the District Local Boards for the last three years;

(2) demand for new roads or special capital outlay on works of water supply and village sanitation or in connection with the equipment and maintenance of dispensaries within the scope of Government Resolution No. 2185, dated 18th April 1905, and

(3) the amount actually spent by the Board in the last three years out of this grant and also from its general revenues on the construction of new roads.

The grant of Rs. 2,14,000 for the repair of roads will be distributed entirely on (1) cost per mile for repairs, (2) total length of roads in charge of the District Local Board and (3) the actual amount spent by the Board out of the above two grants *and also from their general revenues on the repair and improvement of existing roads.*

3. If it is found that any board is not keen on communications, as evinced by its not spending a sufficient amount out of its general revenues in supplementing the Government grants or if it is found that any Board has not utilized the special grant allotted to it for the repair of roads wholly for the purpose mentioned, the grant to that Board will be reduced in the following year.

**Dear Sir,**

With reference to your letter No. L. C.—173, dated 13th February 1923 (received in this office on the 16th instant), I beg to state as follows :

2. The total length of the Railway from Dholka to Dhandhuka as already projected is 38·27 miles. Of this, the portion from Mile 24 to Mile 31 lies in Limbdi State. The construction of the line, except the Limbdi Section, is in progress, the average progress at end of December 1922 being 0·671. The work in Limbdi State is in abeyance, as the Limbdi Durbar have expressed a desire to pay the cost of constructing the portion of the line passing through their territory, and the matter is under correspondence with them. A draft of the terms on which the Durbar's contribution towards the cost of the line can be accepted by this Company, was forwarded to them through the Railway Board on 16th November 1921. Owing to the protracted delay on the part of the Durbar to accept the terms, the Railway Board, in their letter of 29th November 1922 have instructed me to take in hand such survey work as may be necessary to divert the line outside Limbdi territory but not to do any actual construction pending receipt of their letter (the Railway Board's) further definite instructions. The survey work is accordingly in hand now.

3. As the opening of the line was being seriously delayed and the present working season was already far advanced, I wrote to the Government of Bombay, Political Department, that if no decision could be arrived at in regard to the alignment through the Limbdi State before the end of January 1923, I intended to apply to the Railway Board for permission to finish the railway on an alignment outside Limbdi territory without further delay. Not having received the Government's reply by the date referred to, I have addressed the Railway Board on the 5th instant as stated above and am now awaiting their further instructions.

Read Government Order, Finance Department, No. 59, dated the 27th January 1921.

RESOLUTION.—The Governor in Council is pleased to sanction the introduction of the provisional time-scale of pay as shown in the accompanying statement for the subordinate Judicial clerical establishments in the Presidency Proper.

2. The scales should be introduced with starting pay at a stage in the new grade equal to present pay or the minimum of a new grade with effect from 1st September 1922, *i.e.*, on the pay payable on 1st October 1922, subject to the proviso that no one should draw less than his present salary.

3. The introduction of the time-scale of pay involves a large excess over the permissible cost. It has therefore been decided to reduce the proportion of posts on the scale of 105—5—140 to posts on the lower scale approximately to 1 to 3 and the number of superior posts should be as shown in the statement. It has also been decided after examination of the work done per clerk in the various Courts to reduce the number of clerks in the lower division. The number of these posts should be reduced as shown in the statement pending further investigation into the matter. The reduction has been made provisionally *pro-rata* at five per cent. except for the Ahmedabad, Broach, Surat and Thana Districts in the Northern Division and the Ahmednagar and Ratnagiri Districts in the Central and Southern Divisions, where it has been made at ten per cent. owing to the unsatisfactory results of the examination of the work per clerk in the various Courts in those districts. The District Judges should carry out the reductions with effect from the 1st October 1922 or as early as possible. The statements of work done per clerk in the various Courts should be forwarded for the information and further opinion of the High Court.

4. The District Judges are requested to submit at an early date estimates for advanced increments and arrears as though the time-scale

had been introduced from 1st March 1920 on the lines laid down in paragraph 7 of Government Circular, Finance Department, No. 438, dated the 25th June 1920.

5. Temporary establishments of the strength of 1 clerk on Rs. 85 and 1 on Rs. 30 for Joint and Assistant Judges and 2 clerks on Rs. 30 each for 1st or 2nd Class Subordinate Judges are sanctioned for each temporary appointment of Joint, Assistant and Subordinate Judge. Permanent men should be deputed on promotion to the posts of Rs. 85 and temporary men should be entertained in their place on the minimum pay of the grade of Rs. 30—5/2—80.

Letter from the Collector of Kaira No. L.N.D.—VII-407 dated 5th September 1918:—

“ I have the honour to state that survey No. 563-B of Sunav, taluka Borsad, area 29 gunthas, Government unassessed land, is classed as kharaba on account of Ranchhodji's temple. The temple was managed by one Sadhoo Nityanand Permanand who has relinquished all his rights over the land in favour of the village people. The temple being out of repairs the village people pulled it down. There is an English school at this village which was opened in 1910 and which has been registered and recognised by the Educational Department and receives a grant of Rs. 300 per annum. Owing to the great inconvenience due to want of a proper school building, the village people raised a subscription for the purpose of constructing a suitable school building without any Government aid at their own cost and applied through the Deputy Educational Inspector, Kaira, for a revenue-free grant of survey No. 563-B for the site of the school. The Deputy Educational Inspector, Kaira, recommends to consider the case favourably.

“ 2. The Managers of the English School are willing to abide by the conditions prescribed by rule 16 (1) (a) and (b) of the rules under the Land Revenue Code with the additional condition that the school will be open to children of all classes without distinction of caste or creed. The value of the land as a revenue-free holding comes to Rs. 612-8-0 and therefore according to rule 12 of the rules under the Land Revenue Code sanction of Government will have to be obtained for the revenue-free grant in the present case. As the land is to be used for educational purpose, and the people have come forward with their own funds, I have the honour to request that Government may be moved to sanction the grant of the land in question revenue-free subject only to the following conditions, viz. :—

(1) That the Managers of the school agree to abide by the conditions prescribed by rule 16 (1) (a) and (b), Land Revenue Code ;

(2) that the school will be open to children of all classes without distinction of caste or creed.

“ 3. The vernacular papers are submitted herewith.”

ORDER.—The transfer, revenue-free, to the Managers of the English School at Sunav of the land in question is sanctioned, subject to the conditions mentioned by the Collector in paragraph 2 of his letter.

2. A sanad in Form No. 1 appended to Government Resolution No. 7010 dated 30th August 1905, with the requisite alterations, should be issued in respect of the land.
