TABLE I.

AREA, HOUSES AND POPULATION.

This Table shows for each district and the State of Manipur the area, the number of towns and villages, the number of occupied houses, and the total urban and rural population, male and female. The districts are arranged in this and other tables in the order prescribed by Government.

The total areas of the Province, of British Territory and of Manipur are shown as in the tables of 1911. These represent surveyed areas. The real area of Assam is somewhat greater; but as there are no defined outer boundaries to the Sadiya and Balipara Frontier Tracts, and certain areas added to the Naga Hills and Lakhimpur districts have not been surveyed, only the known settled areas have been shown in column 2 against those districts.

Under orders of Government the areas of districts have been adjusted for inter-district transfers in consultation with the Provincial Director of Surveys and District Officers.

For the purpose of column 3 (number of towns) cantonments have been treated as forming parts of the Municipalities which they adjoin.

NOTE.—Similar statistics for areas smaller than districts are contained in Provincial Table I which is printed at the end of the Imperial Tables.
