INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

The census, the statistics of which are embodied in this volume, was taken on March 18th, 1921.

The figures for the detached tracts of Central India, namely Nandwai, belonging to Indore State, and Gangapur to Gwalior State, which are situated in the Mewar Agency, are included, as before, in the statistics of the Mewar State, in the Imperial Tables and excluded from the Provincial Tables.

The figures for Nimrol village, situated in the Gwalior Residency, have been excluded from Dholpur State in the Imperial Tables and included in the Provincial Tables.

The figures for the Pargana of Sambhar held jointly by the Jaipur and Marwar Darbars, have been divided between the two States half and half in the Imperial and Provincial Tables.

The figures for areas under British Administration in Rajputana excepting the Abu District, are included in the Imperial and Provincial Tables in the statistics of the States in which they are situated.

A new District *viz.*, Abu has come into existence under British Administration in Rajputana. It is made up of the area leased out to the Government of India by the Sirohi Darbar. Its figures have therefore been shown separately in all the Tables and not included in the Sirohi State as in 1911.

Ajmer and Merwara, hitherto treated as two separate Districts, have this time been dealt with as one single district for the reasons given in note 4 to Table I.

The 22 inhabited villages, belonging to the Marwar Darbar and 92, belonging to the Mewar Darbar, which are all situated in the Merwara Sub-Division (District of Ajmer-Merwara) and administered on certain conditions by the British Government, have been excluded, as in 1911, from the Ajmer-Merwara figures in the Provincial Tables.

The optional Tables XIX and XX, prescribed by the Government of India, have not been compiled for Rajputana and Ajmer-Merwara.

The optional Table XXI-B has been compiled for Rajputana and Ajmer-Merwara.

In addition to the Tables prescribed by the Government of India, two special Tables have been compiled this time *viz.*, (1) XI-B showing immigration by age periods and selected birth places, castes and occupation for the City of Ajmer only and (2) XVII-B showing population following selected occupations by sex and age periods for all the Capital Towns in Rajputana and Ajmer-Merwara excepting Abu, Kishangarh and Lawa.

Detailed statistics of area, houses, population, religion, and literacy for the various administrative units (that is—Parganas, Tahsils, etc.) in the States and Districts, will be found in the Provincial Tables I and II at the end of this volume.
